AD OF VIENNA JEWISH COMMUNITY DURING GERMAN OCCUPATION ARRESTED AS COLLABORATOR

BUCHAREST, July 11. (JTA) -- Dr. Richard Lowenhertz, who was president of the wish community of Vienna during the German occupation, has been arrested on charges being a collaborator, it was learned here today. In his place the government has prointed Profs. Heinrich Schurr and Ben-Zion Lazar.

News of Dr. Lowenhertz' arrest was revealed by Dr. Ernest Marton, Internaional Red Cross representative for central Europe, who has just returned here after tour of Austria, Hungary and Czechoslovakia.

Dr. Marton said that there were 1,000 full Jews remaining in the Austrian apital. Two-hundred are technicians who were used as forced labor in German war lants, while the other 800 were in hiding until Vienra was liberated. An additional 400 Jews are expected to return from Theresienstadt, Dr. Marton was told. He said hat there are also about 6.000 part Jews in Vienna.

No relief work has started for needy fews there as yet, but funds have been eceived from the Joint Distribution Committee representatives in Budapest to open reief kitchens and to establish an esylum for aged persons, who comprise most of the surivers. Dr. Marton disclosed that for the first time since the "anschluss," a memorial ervice was held at the grave of Theodor Herzl last week, on the forty-first anniverary of his death.

Most of Hungarian Jewish Children Killed in Oswiecim

About 40,000 dewish deportees have already returned to Hungary, the Red Gross epresentative said, and another 80,000 are expected. Ho ver, no Jewish children are o be found in any town or city in the country, with the exception of Budapest. The hildren were mardered, by the Germans, together with hundreds of thousands of adults, t the Oswiecim death comp.

The Hungarian JDC representatives have been given financial assistance to sedy Jews, Dr. Marton said, but the funds at their disposal are not sufficient to meet the urgent needs of the tens of thousands of destitute persons. The JDC, he continued, is planning to establish producers and consumers cooperatives and organize agricultural colonies, but implementation of these plans depends upon help from abroada

Jewish communities throughout Hungary are beginning to revive, Dr. Marton found, and many have begun rebuilding destroyed synagogues. However, there is a great learth of spiritual leaders as most of the Hungarian rabbis were exterminated in conpentration camps. All sections of the Jewish community, he said, are working together and pre-war differences have been forgotten to a great extent.

In Slovakia, from where almost all Jews were deported, the surviving Orthodox Jews are without leaders. Relief work has been started by a Zionist leader, M. Neumann, no has just returned from Oswiecim. He has established a "Jewish Assistance Commit." es," which has opened two relief kitchens and two sanitoriums, but both funds and happlies are urgently needed.

In Bratislava, which was the capital of the Nazi puppet state of Slovakia, 11 the synagogues are still a mass of ruins. A Jewish school has been established y a Rabbi Leibovics. The problem of property belonging to surviving Jews which is own held by Slovaks has not yet been settled satisfactorily, Dr. Marton stated.

In Prague, however, the government is extending liberal aid to Jews passing hrough on their way to their home countries. Many of these come from Theresienstadt, here there were still 8,000 Jews as of July 1. There were about 30,000 Jews in heresienstadt when the camp was liberated by the Kussians.

CHMAN CONFERS WITH JEWISH LEADERS IN ROME ON SPECIAL NEEDS OF ITALIAN JEWS

ROME, July 11. (JTA) -- Director General Herbert H. Lehman of the United ations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration met today with leaders of Italian ewry to discuss the special relief problems of the Jews of Italy.

A Jewish spokesman presented a request for special UNRRA aid for Italian ewish refugees and Jews from other countries who are now here. He said that their seds could best be met in separate Jewish camps, or in special sections of the refuse camps. He pointed out that with 1,000,000 Italian refugees returning from all arts of Europe, the \$5,000,000 allocated by UNRRA for refugee work in this country ill not go very far, particularly for the Jews, who have been stripped of all their esources. Mr. Jehman agreed to consider these proposals, but made no commitments.

The conference was arranged by Benjamin Brook, Joint Distribution Committee epresentative here, and was attended by Guiseppi Nathan, president of the Union of talian Jewish Communities; Vitale Milano, president of the Rome Jewish community; affaele Cantoni, commissioner of the Milan Jewish community and leaders of other principal Jewish institutions.

EWISH COMMUNITY IN POLAND WILL NOT EXCEED 250,000 AFTER ALL SURVIVORS HAVE RETURNED

LONDON, July 11. (JTA) -- The Jewish community of Foland is not expected to moved 250,000 persons when all survivors have returned, it was stated here today by epresentatives of the Warsaw Government.

Dr. Edward Dreznik and Dr. Henry Kolodziejski, members of the Polish finance ommission which came here to take charge of Polish assets in Britain, also told a roup of prominent Poles here that 7,000,000 Polish citizens were killed by the German including 5,250,000 dews.

The Lublin radio today broadcast an announcement by the Central Committee of Polish Jews denying rumors that the Polish Government has not agreed to the return of Polish Jews now in Russia. It quoted the Soviet-Polish repatriation before which as signed last Friday, and said that "returning Polish Jews will receive the same sesistance from the state as all other-Polish mationals, while the Central Committee of Polish Jews will give all possible help to returning Polish citizens of Jewish pationality."

ESTINE'S TRADE WITH U.S. WILL INCREASE AFTER WAR, SAYS COMMERCE DEPT. REPORT

WASHINGTON, July 11. (JTA) -- Palestine's trade with the United States is ested to increase considerably after the war, according to a survey by the Departto of Commerce, released today.

A large surplus of dollars is foreseen for post-war Palestine, chiefly from with of a flourishing diamond-outting-erd-polishing industry, established during the , from investments and from individual and institutional contributions, and developm to fithe tourist industry. The study of post-war trade prospects in Palestine, yet and Iraq, was made by Robert Barr, and is printed in the *Foreign Commerce Week-

The survey points out that there is a tendency toward decreasing importance the United Kingdom in Palestine's foreign trade, and increasing importance of the ited States. American organisations interested in the continued progress of Palesne, states Berr, are prepared to invest large sums in the future, as they have in past. Estimated United States institutional remittances to Palestine from 1939 to 43 averaged 1,853,000 Palestinian pounds annually, and individual remittances 7,000 pounds. The equivalent of 2,500,600 pounds in dollars annually will accrue to lestine, Barr suggests, provided "stable political conditions can be achieved."

The diamond-outting-and-polishing industry has assumed an importance in lestine's balance of payments comparable with the pre-war citrus industry, according Earr. Citrus exports, which constituted about 75 percent of the total pre-war merandise exports, two-thirds going to the United Kingdom, disappeared during the war, ad have only recently been resumed on a very limited scale. Exports of polished amonds, eighty-eight percent of them sent to the United States, comprised forty period total merchandise exports in 1943, the study reveals.

USE BODY APPROPRIATES \$250,000 TO LIQUIDATE FEFC; AGENCY'S SUPPORTERS PLAN FIGHT

WASHINGTON, July 11. (JTA) — The House Appropriations Committee, in a furher move to kill the FERC, today reported out the original War Agencies Approprialons Bill with an amendment providing for \$250,000 for complete liquidation of the EFC.

A possibility of saving the agency, despite the parliamentary maneuvers by buthern Congressmen to kill it, was seen today in the promise of Rep. Everett M. irksen, Republican of Illinois, to introduce another amendment designed to commit to House to agreement with the Senate amendment to the bill. This provides \$250,000 or the coming fiscal year without specifying that the appropriation must be used for iquidation of the FERC.

AR DEPARTMENT AND RISENHOWER VOICE SYMPATHY FOR SUFFERINGS OF JEWS UNDER NAZIS

LONDON, July 11. (JTA) — The Wer Department's and General Eisenhower's appreciation of and great sympathy with the sufferings of the Jewish people under erman tyranny, were expressed today by the headquarters of the United Kingdom base of the U.S. Army.

Its statement was contained in a message voicing its hope for the success of a consert given tonight at Albert Hall by Yehudi Menuhin, noted Jewish violinist, or the benefit of the Jews of Europe, under the auspices of the World Jewish Congress.

NADIAN NEWSPAPER PAYS TRIBUTE TO JEWISH SERVICEMEN; HITS LACK OF RECOGNITION

TORONTO, July 11. (JTA) -- A glowing tribute to the Jewish officers and men rving in the Canadian armed forces has been paid by the Toronto Globe and Mail in an itorial noting that Capt. Eenjamin Dunkelman, of the Quean's Own Rifles, had been warded the Distinguished Service Order. The editorial says in parts

"It is not generally realized that there were more than enough Jews in the madian armed forces to form an entire division. These patriotic citizens fought as illiently and as bravely as those of any other race... It is regrettable that inclerant Canadians have been prone to scoff at the service and sacrifice of fellowitiens of the Jewish race who maintained the great traditions of their people in the present struggle against Nazism. Too often Gentiles have feiled to recognize the oyalty, industry and military genius of Jewish soldiers and airmen, whose bravery and accomplishments did not suffer in comparison with the fighting qualities of any of the combatants in the war theatres of Europe.

"Acting Major Dunkelman, DSO, is typical of the Canadians whose qualities are so warmly acclaimed by the people of Holland, Belgium, France and Italy when they ere liberated from the German yoke. Jewish Canadians, whether serving on land, one are in the air, were among the most effective fighters in the armies of the Allies."

20 PALESTINIAN JEWISH WAR PRISONERS FREED FROM GERMAN CAMPS ARRIVE HOME

JERUSALEM, July 11. (JTA) -- Two-hundred and twenty liberated Palestinian risoners of war arrived here today. They were greeted by representatives of Jewish astitutions, military authorities and a Red Cross delegation.

Among the prisoners' relatives who came to meet them was a youngster of five he had never seen his father. His first words, after an initial embrace, were: "Pa, id you kill Hitler?"

ig three urged to take steps to facilitate rehabilitation of European Jewry

NEW YORK, July 11. (JTA) -- An appeal to the Big Three to assist in the rehalitation of the Jews of Europe, to help shape national and international laws to outswanti-Semitism, and to secure the establishment of a Jerish national home in Palesine has been sent to President Truman by the Jewish Peoples Fraternal Order, it was mnounced today. The appeal also expressed support of the demands embodied in the penorandum submitted to the United Nations conference at San Francisco by the American swish Conference.
