ENTSH DELEGATIONS IN MARSAW ASK FOLISH CADINET MEMBERS TO CURB ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS

MOSCOW, Aug. 27. (JTA) - Three Jowish delegations, representing the Central Committee of Jows in Poland, called upon members of the Folish Cabinet in Warsaw and wied additional protection for Jewish life and property in connection with the entiwhich disturbances which have occurred in various parts of the country, it was reported today in a Yiddish broadcast over the Warsaw radio.

One of the delegations, which called on Dr. Wladyslaw Kiernik, Minister for helic Administration, was received "in rather an unpleasant atmosphere," the broadcast reported. When the delegation brought to the attention of the Minister that a recent conference of the Polish Feasant Party had adopted anti-Semitic resolutions, he denied that this was true. The reasants in roland, he said, are not interested in the Jewish question.

The interest of the reasant is centered in the forthcoming elections and in land reforms, he declared, adding that the only elements in Foland stirring up antiwish feelings are the underground army still maintained by leaders of the former iolish Government-in-Exile in London. He promised that all those guilty of participating in anti-Jewish outbreaks will be punished.

A similar cromise was made by Dr. Henryk Swiatkowski, Minister of Justice, to another Jewish delegation. He assured the Jewish leaders that severe punishment has already been meted out to participants in anti-Jewish disturbances, and added that a decree designed to ourb anti-Jewish activities is now under discussion by the Cabinet and will soon be promulgated.

Col. Miskewski, Under-Secretary of State for Fublic Security, upon whom the third Jewish delegation called, said that the strongest possible measures are being taken to prevent any further anti-Jewish disturbances. He emphasized that special precautions have been taken to protect Jewish children's homes and other Jewish institutions. He also revealed that Gen. Witold, the Commander-in-Chief of the Polish Militie, last month issued special instructions outlining measures which are to be taken by local militia forces to protect Jews from anti-Semitic groups.

THERE GOVERNMENT DECIDES TO CONVERT PROPERTY OF MURDERED JEWS INTO JEWISH RELIEF FUND

LOHDON, Aug. 27. (JTA) -- The Greek Government decided that all property left by murdered Jews in Greece for which no heirs are found will revert to a special fund for the relief of the Greek Jewish community, the Greek Information Office in London announced today. Details of the administration and scope of the fund will be worked out laters .

The decision constitutes an important deviation from present policy, which provides that the property of all persons who were the victims of aggression reverts to the State if no claimants show up.

PERIDENT OF JEWISH COMMUNITY IN VIENNA UNDER NAZI REGIME FOUND IN FRAGUE HOSFITAL

ERAGUE, Aug. 27. (JTA) - Dr. Richard Lowenhertz, head of the Jowish committy in Vionna during the Nazi cocupation, who was reported to have been arrested by the Russian military administration upon the entry of the Red Army into the Austrian mital, is now a patient in the Jewish Hospital here and intends to return to Vienna asken as he recovers.

In an interview with the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Dr. lamberts said that he left Vienna when the Russian troops started to move into the city. He then started on an adventurous and difficult trip to Frague during which he was placed in the Jewish Hospital upon reaching here.

"I am very proud of the fact that I helped 136,000 Jews to emigrate from astria during the Nazi regime," Dr. Lowenhertz said. "I succeeded in getting that out of the lands even though the Gestape arrested me several times. Shortly before the Germs retreated from Vionna, there were still 6,000 Austrian Jews and 15,000 deported imperian Jows in Austria. The Germans made an effort to exterminate them even during the last few days. Two hours before leaving Vienna, German soldiers raided shelters merching for Jows. In one celler off Fuorstergasse, the Gestapo men discovered seven were all executed them on the spot."

COUNCIL OF JEVISH FEDERATIONS FOSTFONES VOTE ON ADVISORY BUDGETING PROJECT TO 1946

NEW YORK, Aug. 27. (JTA) -- With the lifting of ODT travel restrictions, the 265 Jewish fedorations, welfare funds and community councils, members of the Council of Jewish Fedorations and Welfare Funds will decide on the establishment of a mattenal advisory budgeting service at the 1946 General Assembly of the Council instead of through a mail referencement, it was announced today by William J. Shroder, chairman of the board and Jacob Blaustein, chairman of the Budget Research Committee.

By previous agreement the subject of advisory budgeting, in the event that the board favored the proposal, was to be decided by a General Assembly of the Council. The fune 1945, the board voted in favor of the proposal by an everwhelming majority. RES WANT SHARE OF U.S. CURPENCY COLLECTED BY AMERICAN ZIONISTS FOR PALESTINE

MAFFA, Aug. 27. (JTA) — A monorcordum urging that Arabs share in the dollar errenty collected by Zicniet funds in the United States, if such monies are epent in terica for merchandise to be sent to Palestine, was submitted today by the Arab Camber of Commerce to the Palestine Government.

The demand is based on the recent decision of the Falestine Government to slow the Jewish Agency to spend part of the funds collected in the United States for compilities needed in Palestine, providing that these commodities cannot be purchased in Egland. The Arab momorandum requests that American currency cleared by the Palestine Ireasury Department for Palestine import, even though collected by Jows in the United States, be allotted not only to the Jows, but also to the Arabs in proportion to the numerical strength of each community.

Reambile, the economic interests of Arab citrus growers have led them to split with political leaders who are opposing the proposal that a joint Arab-Jewish elegation go to London to discuss the position of the citrus industry. The extremist politicians, such as Dr. Hussein el Khalidi and Abdul Hadi, object to the delegation because it involves Arab-Jewish cooperation.

However, in an open letter today to the influential Arab newspaper Falastin, its growers point out that, firstly, the Colegation is not a political one; secondly, if Arabs sit side by side with Jews in municipal councils, why can they not do so in true delegations; and, leatly, they argue that the Arabs cwm 140,000 dunams of groves with an annual output of \$8,000,000 which is an important part of the Arab mational income. "If only the Jowish growers go to London, they will have a free hand there," the letter emhasises.

EWISH INTERNEES FROM MAURITIUS GET HOMES AND JOES IN FALESTINE; 160 WILL EMIGRATE

ERUSAIEM, Aug. 27. (JTA) — Seven of the 1,308 interness from Mauritius the arrived here yesterday aboard the S.S. Franconia were resting today in Madassah Depital, while 160 who do not plan to settle in Falestine are in an UNERA camp here, where they will remain until they can emigrate overseas. Homes and jobs for the others are being arranged for by the Jewish Agency.

On the journey from Mauritius, which marked the last lap of a five-year edyssey which took the refugees from Europe to Asia, to Africa and back to Asia, two ersons, Abraham Folkman, 57, of Vienna and Martha Levi, 76, of Dansig, died and an infant, Franconia Mathilda Hadassah Silberg, was born.

Spectators who witnessed the disembarkation were moved to tears as families which had been separated for five years were reunited, and elderly men and women, who could hardly walk, were helped down the gang-plank. The vessel was met by representatives of all the leading Jewish institutions of Falestine, who revealed that 126 internees had died at Mauritius, fifty ahildren had been born and over 250 had enlisted in the Allied forces, including 58 in the Jewish Brigade.

The refugees' exils on Mauritius began early in 1941 when they were approbended attempting to land illegally in Palestine. Despite vigorous protests by the Jewish community they were sent to Mauritius, since it was impossible to send them back to beir countries of crigin, which were Nazi-controlled.

10,000,000 UNITS OF FENICILLIN PRODUCED MONTHLY BY JEWISH SCIENTIST IN TALESTINE

MERUSAIEM, Aug. 27. (JTA) — Dr. Baruch Levin, who has begun producing penitillin in Palestine, described to reporters today how his small laboratory here turns out 10,000,000 units of crude penicillin every month. He said that four times as much stall be produced if additional facilities were available.

Dr. Levin is able to produce only penicillin which can be used externally, because of his limited laboratory facilities. However, even with this limitation, pysicians report extraordinary results have been achieved with both human beings and minds. Over 100,000 cows, for instance, have received penicillin injections as an sid in preparing diseases to which they are subject.

MERMINATION OF ALL EUROPE'S JEWS DECIDED AT BERLIN PARLEY OF TOP NAZIS IN 1940

LONDON, Aug. 27. (JTA) -- The extermination of all the Jews in Europe was decided upon at a conference in Berlin, in 1940, attended by Adolf Hitler and other high-raking Nazis, according to the testimony of Dr. Hans Mayer, former commander of the ghetto in the Polish town of Pabianiae, where 8,000 Jews were confined.

Mayer, who is now in the hands of American military authorities, told correspondents that the conference was attended by Heinrich Himmler, Joseph Goebbels, Reinlard Heydrich and other Nazi leaders, the London press reports today. They drew up a plant undur which all those unfit to work would be gassed, while others would be used for forced labor until they were too weak to continue, when they, too, would be mardered, layer said.

AGENTINA TO EMULATE U.S. IMMIGRATION SYSTEM; JEWISH COMMUNITY CENTER ESTABLISHED

BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 27. (JTA) — Argentina is planning an immigration quota spaten patterned after the one now in use by the United States with the exception that the largest quotas would be assigned to Latin countries followed by Saxon, Scandinavian, and Slav nations, in that order, while Germen immigration will be forbidden. Immigration of Jows will be guided by their individual nationality.

Government representatives today attended the opening by the Jowish community here of a communal building the erection of which cost over a million posse. The building will serve as a Jawish community center and will house the rabbinate and the offices of several Jawish institutions.

FRANZ WERFEL DIES IN HOLLYWOOD: FIED HERE IN 1940 TO ESCAPE NAZIS

HOLLYWOOD, Aug. 27. (JTA) — Frank Werfel, Czech-Jewish poet, dramatist and newelist, died here last night after a heart attack. Werfel, who was 54, had been suffering from a heart allment for several years.

Bost known in the United States for his novels "The Forty Days of Mass Dagh" am "The Song of Bernadette," Werfel came here to live in 1940 efter a heir-hreath stone from the Mazie, whom he had fought for many years. He had been in America pre-ficusly, in 1955, when Max Reinherdt produced his "Eternal Road," a pageant based on the Old Tostaments.
