RAGUE, Aug. 29. (JTA) - The Czechoslovak Government today announced that

Specific regulations covering restitution of property confiscated by the Geras will be outlined in one of these decrees. Another decree will settle the question a compensation to be paid by the state for damages caused by German persecutions bring the Mazi occupation of Czechoslovakia. A third decree will allow a missing peron to be declared dond without waiting the usual legal period of five years,

The latter is especially important for relatives who seek to establish their nights to the property of massacred Jews. It is also of importance for surviving Jewish men and women who may want to re-marry after establishing that their wives or hushams were exterminated in deportation camps.

Twenty trucks carrying food and medicaments provided by the Joint Distribution Committee arrived here today from Stockholm by way of Denmark. Two-thirds of the wassport will be sent to Slovakia where the Jews are in dire need. The remainder will b distributed among Jows in Bohemia and Moravia.

The Prague Jewish community was permitted today to start the publication of enthly magazine in the Csech language, which will have a press run of 4,000 copiese. It the same time, anti-Somitic articles continue to appear in the press in Slovakia, specially in Cas, a Slovak democratic daily newspaper published in Bratislava.

DEBUGUT HAR VETERANS EXCLUDE JEWS FROM MEMBERSHIP; JEWISH CITIZENS PROTEST

LONDON, Auge 29. (JTA) - The Association of the Citizens of Lummbeurg in bitain today sent a mossage of protest to Grand Duchess Charlotte against inclusion of an anti-Jowish clause in the statutes of the Association of Ex-Servicemen of Luxemtwo which restricts membership to "Aryans" only-

The message stressed that more Jows fought for luxembourg proportionally than there are Jows in the Duchy and called the servicemen association's act a "fascist gesture." A copy of the message was sent to british Foreign Minister Ermst Bevin.

ENISH DELEGATION FROM BULGARIA ARRIVES IN LONDON; WILL DISCUSS RELIEF PROBLEMS

LONDON, Aug. 29. (JTA) -- A delegation of four leaders of the Jowish Consistory in Bulgaria, lod by Jacques Nathan, vice-chairman of the consistory, arrived here today.

The delegation will discuss problems of Bulgarian Jewry with representatives of Jewish relief organizations and other groups interested in restoration of Jewish life in Bulgaria. It is composed of two Zionist Laborites and two Communists.

MANUSION IN AUSTRIA MAKES IT DIFFICULT FOR JEWS TO REGAIN THEIR FORMER DWELLINGS

VIENNA, Aug. 29. (JTA) -- Austrian Jows returning from camps or underground Missuts are finding great difficulty in regaining their former apartments and businessas because of the confusion which reigns here.

Immediately after the Russian entry into the city, it was easy for Jews and others to reclaim their old apartments and places of business merely by applying to leal officials who custed the Nazis in residence. In cases where a business had dispected, the Jew was permitted to obtain another one in a similar line. Several thousand such transfers were made.

However, after the establishment of a central bureau to handle such questions, the decisions of local councils were amulled and, in some cases, Maris were protected. In addition, a decree was issued stating that all such transfers were not yet legal, and that the new owners held the business in trust and would be responsible for its similatration and its stock. It has now been proposed that all of these transfers be declared illegal, and those few Jews who succeeded in re-possessing their own businesses are worried for fear they may lose them again.

The problem is made even more complicated by the fact that octogories of "qualified" and "unqualified" Nazis have been set up, a survey by the Religious News Series establishes. Persons who joined the Nazi Party between July 1, 1933 and March B, 1936, or held a high position after 1938 are considered "qualified," while people we joined the party only after 1938, and never held important positions are "unqualified." Those falling into the latter category are being allowed to rotain their positions and dwellings.

Jowish community officials, who are completely overwhelmed by the immensity of the problem, are faced with the double job of finding apartments for people returning from concentration and labor camps and also for 6,000 Jews married to non-Jews, who had been allowed to remain in Vienna, but who had been confined by the Naxis in subtandard dwellings, many without baths or adequate cooking facilities.

The problem of reuniting the many Austrian and Vienness Jews who have spread throughout the world is being tackled by a private organization calling itself the "Austrian Information Office for Jews." This body, which has government sanction, will stempt to answer queries directed to it from any part of the world concerning the whereabouts and fate of Jews who were deported by the Masis or forced underground. It has set up offices at Johannessasse 3/9 Viennes, 1.

MEW YORK, Aug. 29. (JTA) - President Truman's recent statement with regard to Pelestine and its implications were discussed at a session of the American Zionist Regrency Council held here yesterday, it was announced today by the Council.

The majority of the members of the Council were of the opinion that the Presient's fear that 500,000 American soldiers may be needed to prevent Arab disturbances in Relatine if the country is preciaimed a Jewish State, was due to false notions ministed in Washington on the strength of the Arabs and on American interests in the Ear East. The Council decided to take urgent measures to present the situation in the proper light. A special committee of experts was named to deal with the question of Ziemist political action in the United States.

(The New York Times in a cable from Paris today reports that Emir Abdul Illah, Regont of Iraq, who is en route home from the United States, has voiced his comtry's opposition to increased Jewish immigration to Palestine. In a statement to the Times' correspondent, the regent said: "No Arab will agree with any suggestion for an increase in the Jewish population of Palestine. The number already there is mifficient. All Arab nations must object in principle and I believe that our Government will protest to the United Mations against any such moves.")

The meeting also considered a cabled request from the World Zionist Executive that it separate the activities of the Zionist Exergency Council from those of the affice of the Jewish Agency in Weshington so that the Council would not interfere with the work of the Washington office of the Agency. The request was opposed by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, president of the Council, and other members of the Council. It was pointed out that American Zionist representatives alone must represent Zionist interests vise-wis the U.S. Government. It was decided to cable to the World Zionist Executive urging it not to undertake any steps in the direction of Washington representation until the American Zionist Council, together with the eight members who were appointed at the recent World Zionist Conforence to supervise Jewish Agency activities in the United States, make definite recommendations.

Mrs. Judith Epstein, president of Hadassah, reported that Hadassah's national bard has decided to domand from the next World Zionist Congress representation in the World Zionist Executive. Such a demand was submitted to the recent World Zionist Conference in London and was rejected.

Change in British Government Left U.S.Zionists Unprepared, Dr. Silver Reports

NEW YORK, Aug. 29. (JTA) -- The American delegation at the World Zionist Conference was left unpropared by the unexpected fall of the Churchill cabinot and the election of the Labor Government, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver reported vestorday at a sestion of the national emputive of the Zionist organization of America at which other members of the delogation gave their views on the outcome of the conference Silver saids

"The American delegation originally came to London with a plan for organizing a united protest of world Jewry against the Churchill government in its treatment of a united protest of world Jewry against the Churchill government in its treatment of the Palestine problem. Dr. Silver asserted that while the Conference was punctuated by a major wrists - such as the withdrawal of the Mizrachi from the executive and the temporary

Afternoon between Fen Gurion and Weizmann - the parley adjourned on a note of harmony mi unity. He stated that the American delegation made a number of major contributions to the conference; all members were united on a basic Zionist program, and that this stitude helped to strengthen other groups at the conference to an extent which was reflected in the political commission, of which Dr. Silver was the chairman. The deliminations of the political commission reaffirmed the maximum Zionist program in clear and sharply defined line by reasserting in a resolution the creation of a Jewish late in an undivided Palestine - a resolution unanimously adopted by the conference, b. Silver stated.

The meeting of the executive committee preceded a public meeting at the bid Fonnsylvania, at which the Zionist leaders told an audience of 1,200 that all mileations point to the fact that intensified activities with regard to Palestine are to expected soone.

Dr. Israel Goldstein reported on the situation of the Jews in camps in Germy, most of whom, he said, want to go to Palestine, and disclosed that while in London he had discussed the Palestine problem with Harold laski, chairman of the British Labr Party. Laski expressed the opinion that cooperation of the United States would play a large part in bringing about a solution of the problem favorable to the Zionists, the ZOA wresident said.

Emanuel Neumann stressed the importance of the action taken by the conference in reaffirming the Biltmore Resolution, inasmuch as it was the first international gibering since the outbreak of the war to take a definite position. He praised Pr. Walstain's offorts in helping to consolidate the General Zionist from at the conference and the organization of a strong General Zionist World Confederation in which the ZOA and Hadassah in America will play a vital rols.

Daniel Frisch, another member of the American delegation, cautioned against placing too much reliance on the change of the government in England in the expectation that it will spell speedy realization of Zionist aims. He charged that the new Colonial Secretary's attitude toward the Jewish people is "not of a nature that should me us rejoice even though his assistant, Mr. Creech Jones, is a true and tried friend of Jewish Palestine."

In an assount of his visit to Palestine, Dr. James G. Heller declared that blestine has wrought a miracle in recreating Jewish lives and in the transformation of barren land into fertility. He stressed the contrast of Sewish fertility and the barrenness of Arab lands, indicating that there are tremendous stretches of land available for cultivation. Dr. Heller particularly dwelt on the feeling of "at home" and freedom animating the Jow in Falestine. In no country did he note such a spirit of ride, freedom and at homeness as in Palestine, he said.
