ERATISLAVA, Slovakia, Aug. 30, (JTA) — Here than 5,000 Jewish partisans are killed in Slovakia during the underground struggle against the Germans, it was mealed here today by Salomon Weber, president of the Slovakian Jewish Committee, is an interview with the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphia Agamay.

Beside the local community, Jews are distributed over Slovakia as follows: 2,000 in Kosice; 1,500 in Presov; 1,000 in Zilina; 1,000 in Michalovee, and roughly 500 each in Topolachy. Blohovee, Dun-Streda, Mitra, Humenne, Komarno, Bardiob and Irava. The remainder are in various smaller villages.

city. Several hundred Jews are being fed in public kitchens. Flans are under way to re-establish the Jewish Home for Aged, a Jewish orphanage and a Jewish sanatorium.

Of the 130,000 Jews who lived in Slovakia before the war, 70,000 were deported by the Gormans to extermination camps, hr. Weber estimated. He believes that 10,000 Jews emigrated legally from Slovakia before the mass-deportations started and 15,000 left the country illegally. The 5,000 Jowish partisans who were killed participated in the resistance movement during the last few months of the German cocupation, the Slovakian Jowish lander pointed out.

700 Jewish Writers, Artists Died in Warsaw Chetto, Delegates from Poland Report

Allied military authorities in Brussels made it possible for the Jewish Brigade to thin the Jows from Belgium to Paris where they will stay in the Hotel Juteting maintained by the French Ministry for Repatriated Deportees, until they leave for Marseille fire where they will sail on September 2nd.

BUNITY OF BUDGET RESEARCH COMMITTEE FAVORS ADVISORY BUDGETING, BLAUSTEIN DECLARES

NEW YORK, Aug. 80, (JTA) -- The principle of advisory budgeting, which will be presented for approval at the 1946 General Assembly of the member agencies of the famel of Jowish Federations and Welfare Funds, has the support of a clear majority of the members of the Budget Research Committee, its chairman dacob Blaustein said in a statement issued today.

Mr. Blaustein made this comment in reply to a statement by the newlystems Committee to Oppose National Eudgeting, that the Eudget Research Committee which as appointed by the Council board of directors to conduct a fact finding survey had noted overwholmingly against the proposal.

hr. Diaustein charged that there are other errors in the press release of the bposition Cormittee, but added that it is premature to discuss them at this time. The decision of the Council to present the issues of advisory budgeting to the 1946 Secral Assembly will allow all interested parties sufficient time for the domoratio Process of consideration and crystallization of opinion, he said. Meanwhile, the subject will be properly and objectively presented by the Council to the member committee and it is hoped that they will be permitted to exercise—and will exercise—their own judgment based on their needs without undue pressures from forces outside the communities.

"The Council also plans in advance of the Assembly to confer further and fully on the issues involved with national and overseas agencies." Mr. Blaustein continued. "To say the least it was premature at this time for any one of these agencies to have stimulated the oreation of an opposition committee."

MERICANS WHO DISCRIMINATE AGAINST JEWS ARE NAZIS, BISHOP OXNAM SAYS: CONDEMNS BIGOTRY

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- A plca for Americans to bewere of the seedlings of intolerance, bigotry and greed prevalent in the United States is made by Bishop G. include Oxnom, president of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America, is signed criticle in the October Issue of The American Magazine.

Bishop Oxnam says he wishes it were so, as "we contentedly imagine new that terms is destroyed and the vicious leaders of the Nazi party dead or imprisoned, that this has prished from the face of the carth." But, he writes: "Nazism is not merely collitical philosophy or a system of government. It is a condition of the human hert, a state of mind. It is man's inhumanity to man masquerading in a brown or a bleck shirt, or even in the white collar of respectability. This state of mind breeds sin, bigotry, intolerance, selfishness, greed, cruelty, Godlessness. In Gormany we see keism in full flower-a poisonous flower. We saw it in its organized form. In acrica we see only its little seedlings, here and there, unrecognized for what they see, Beurre of them.

"The man who excludes a Negro from any of the privileges of this democracy, the connives with a real-estate agent to exclude a Jew from a neighborhood, who sets upbarriers against any human being because of his race or his creed, is a Nazi. He is an opprossor of peoples, an enemy of froedom, a bigot. He is laying the foundation for lymchings, riots, and the enslavement of his fellow man."

SOUTH AFRICAN NATIONALISTS AGITATING FOR EXPUISION OF GERMAN-JEWISH REFUGEES

JOHARNESDURG, South Africa. Aug. 30. (JTA) -- German-Jewish refugoes who are admitted to South Africa on temporary visas after they fled from the Nazis, and these permits were extended during the war, are concerned over the increasing agitatic by nationalist elements, who are demanding that the refugees be custed.

Eany of the Jowish immigrants sorved in the Union's armed forces and others have established successful industries and commercial enterprises. Host of them want to become naturalized, but there is a great deal of opposition. The refugees are placing their hopes on Prime Minister Smuts and his United Party, since Smuts has frequently voiced his sympathy with and admiration for, the Jews and is aware of their contributions to South Africa.

WER 16,000 JEWS, TEN PER-CENT OF CANADA'S JEWISH POPULATION, JOINED ARIED FORCES

HONTERAL, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- The War Efforts Committee of the Canadian Jewish Congress has revealed that 16,550 dows are listed on the committee's records as having joined the armed forces of the Dominion since 1939.

Of those 10,116 joined the army, 5,870 the Royal Canadian Air Force, and 5% the Royal Canadian Navy. They represent nearly ten persont of the Canadian Jew-ish community and do not include the Canadian Jews who enlisted in the Jevish Brigade or other units of the British army, the American forces or other United Mations cervices.

Jovish casualties recorded by the committee total 776 and 122 have been smarded honors and decorations including the Distinguished Service Order, the Order of the British Empire and American and Fronch decorations.

ESTIGHT OF DARTHOUTH COLLEGE RESIGNS, WILL ISSUE STATEMENT ON "JEWISH QUOTA" ISSUE

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- Dr. Ernest Martin Hopkins, president of Dartnuth College, who endorsed and defended the quota system under which the number of kish students in Dartmouth is arbitrarily limited, has resigned, but the status of the nuts system is still unclear.

However, it is understood that a statement on the question will be issued by in Hepkins prior to Nove 1, when the new president, John Slean Dickey, director of its State Department's Office of Public Affairs, takes over.

THE TOWN OF JEWISH INLIGRANTS TO ARRIVE SINCE END OF WAR LANDS IN FEILADBLEHIA

HHIADELPHIA, Aug. 50. (JTA) - The S. S. Magallanes, first ship bearing with immigrants to arrive in the United States since the end of the war, decked here like yesterday with 63 refugees from Portugal and Spain.

The arrivals were met at the pier by representatives of the Hias, whose sister organization HLAS-ICA had assisted them in obtaining visas and transportation.

ZHISH CONGRESS MAKES ARKANGEMENTS TO SEND FOOD PARCELS TO INDIVIDUALS IN POLAND

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- The World Jewish Congress today announced that initividuals wishing to send food parcels to relatives in Poland and Czechoslovakia can to so through the offices of the Congress here. The parcels will be sent from Sweden.

The announcement said that an advance payment of \$9.00 will be required for such parcel which will contain seven pounds of food. The contents of the parcels are re-determined by Swedish regulations and are identical.

PAREL SAMUEL COMEN DIES; WAS DIRECTOR OF UNITED SYNAGOGUE FOR 27 YEARS

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- Funeral services were held here today for Rebbi Samel Cohen, director of the United Symagogue of America for 27 years, who died at his home yesterday after a lengthy illness. Le was 59. Dr. Cohen was born in Slutsk, hussia, in 1886, and came here as a child.

One of the first advocates of the idea that the synagogue could be a community center for all age groups and not just a house of worship, Rabbi Cohen personally helped to establish 150 such congregations. Under his leadership the United Synagogue grow from an organization of 40 congregations, when he became director, to use of 1,200 at the time he resigned last Docember 51.

EERL BOTWINIK, JEWISH WRITER, DIES IN NEW YORK; FUNERAL TODAY

NEW YORK, Aug. 30. (JTA) -- Funeral services will be held tomorrow for berl botwinik, Jewish writer and columnist for the Jewish Daily Forward since 1914, who died yesterday at Beth Israel Hospital after a prolonged illness. He was 60 years old.

Hr. Botwinik was born in Russia and came to the United States in 1965. He was the author of several plays and of a book of short stories. He was one of the founders of the Jewish Writers Club and the Jewish Playwrights League.
