ME KIPPUR SERVICES HELD IN YOKOHAMAS OLDEST CHURCHS SOLDIER BLOWS THE SHOFAR

YOKGHAMA, Sept. 17. (JTA) - For the first time in the history of Japan, the more of the rising sun heard the shofer blown by an American soldier at the concluding of Yom Kippur services tonight, which were attended by several hundred Jewish men if the U.S. armed forces.

The church was offered for the Jewish High Holy Day services by Pastor Rauk Einste who lived in the United States for twenty years. A congregation of soldiers, silers and marines, some of them with sidearms, attended Kol Nidra services last light and the all day services today.

DERATED JEWS IN SHANGHAI CROWD MAKESHIFT SYNAGOGUES FOR KOL NIDREI SERVICES

SHANGHLI, Sept. 16. (JTA) — About 8,000 of the 14,000 Jewish men, women and dildren liberated from Japanese interament home tonight crowded into seven rooms with had been cleared of beds and furniture and converted into temporary synagogues, a that they might attend Kol Nidrei services.

SETS AND OTHER SOUTH AFRICAN LEADERS HAIL JEWISH CONTRIBUTION TO WAR EFFORT

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, Sept. 16. (JTA) - Prime Minister Jan Christian ints end members of his cabinet stressed the reat contribution made by Jews throughof the world to the Allied war effort, in messages issued here on the cocasion of the High Holidays.

The Prime Minister said: "In the great struggle to which South Africa, toster with other freedom-loving nations, contributed, the Jews of the world and of such Africa played their part. It is with a feeling of deep gratitude that I send god wishes for the New Year to our Jewish comrades-in-arms and our Jewish friends merally.

Minister of Justice Colin Steyn, declaring that "Jews had made far more than the proportion of sacrifice," said: "Hard as many people were hit, they were hit the brest. In every field of war activity they contributed at least their proportionate Mare, and on every battlefield sacrificed their sons in as great a proportion as any nse. The time has come for them to receive a practical reward. I trust that the Unitations will realize that the time is overdue for the creation of a free and inderendent Jewish state in Palestine.

MUSH REPRESENTATIVE WILL ATTEND TRIAL OF MAZI COMMANDER OF BERGEN-BEISEN CAMP

LONDON, Sept. 16. (JTA) -- Alec Easterman, British Jewish leader, has flown to lumsburg in Gormany to attend the forthcoming trial of Joseph Kramer, Nazi commandant of the Bergen-Belsen camp, who is to be tried as a war criminal, it was announced tolay by the World Jowish Congress. Easterman was provided with transportation by military authorities.

The Congress also announced that it has received an invitation from the contral committee of Jowish refugees in Germany to send a delegate to the first conferthe of Jewish displaced persons, which is to be held in Bergen-Belson on Sept. 25.

The invitation revealed that the meeting will map plans "to erect a monument to the thousands of Jews who have died since their liberation, and will discuss the Tofugees present problems and their hopes and plans for the future.

IAMON, Sept. 16. (JTA) -- A wave of suicides will coour among the displaced is still held in camps in the Anglo-American zones in Germany, if they are not reduced from the camps soon, a leading UNGA official warned today in a report on his sit to the parts of Germany held by British and American forces.

The official described the situation of the Jews in the camps as "most terriis." He said that the food there is inadequate, the hygienic conditions bad, and the
smle "shockingly low" as a result of prolonged idleness. Anti-genitism, he reported,

They are beaten and maltreated by anti-Semitic Poles, and one can hear conmat shouting of slogans such as: "We want a democratic Poland without Jews," or here wasn't enough fire to burn all the Jews up in the German extermination camps."

"There is evidence of open unrest against the Jews in many assembly centers of the displaced persons," the UNRA representative stated. He stressed the desire of the Jews to go to Falestine. "They are in great despair, and if nothing is done to resue them, there will be a wave of suicides emong them as the winter approaches," the desired.

MISH AGENCY HAS NOT RECEIVED ANY INDICATION BRITAIN FLANS TO ACT SOON ON PAIESTIME

IONDON, Sopte 16. (JTA) — Jewish Agency circles have received no intination that a decision on Palestine is imminent, although they here that the Agency's strong agreementations in recent weeks stressing the urgency of the problem will result in the specing up of plans for its solution, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today.

It is understood that the Agency representatives confined themselves to preming the demands formulated at the World Zionist Conference when they saw Colonial Binster George Hall a short time ago. They did not have an opportunity to discuss with him ways of implementing these demands, the JTA informant said. The reports of disged government proposals concerning Palestine's future status, such as partition, which have appeared in the press recently are purely speculative, he stressed.

The Ankara radio today confirmed a report that Britain is building large airfields in Palestine with the intention of transferring its air forces now based in lass Exyt and Porsia, thus making Palestine the center of British security for the edire Middle Easte

The Chiro radio today reported that a meeting of the Arab Farty in Palestine his adopted a resolution demanding the return of the ex-hight and other excluded Arab Laders to Palestine. The meeting also passed a resolution requesting that Falestine Naim closed to Jowish immigration, and docided to send delegations to all meighboring has countries to mobilize the support of those governments for the Falestine Arabs.

The Peris redio reports today, in an Arabic breadcast, that Tufik el Suidi, resident of the coonomic committee of the Arab league, has visited the El Ramlah rein of southern Palestine, where he delivered an address promising that the Beague all support the demands of the Palestine Arabs, and appealed to the Arab population to modernize its economy. He also visited Jaffa, where he was welcomed by the mayor, and pointed out that the Palestine Arabs are the first line of defense of the whole but world.

ELGRE AGAINST ANTI-SEMITISM WITHDRAWS STATEMENT ON ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS IN POLAND

PARIS. Sort. 16. (JTA) - Three days after it had sent a formal protest to the Polish embassy here concerning the recent anti-Jewish disturbances in Poland, the Regue Against Anti-Semitism today issued a statement, signed by its chairman Bernard becache, withdrawing its protest for the time being.

Lecacho s statement said: "On the basis of unverified information the central comittee of the League Against Anti-Semitism recently protested against manifestations hich allegedly cocurred in liberated Foland. Fending results of an inquiry into the torses of this information, the central committee wishes to state that it good faith has been imposed upon, and it expresses its regrets." In its protest, the beague charged that not only Nazi agents but also numbrous Poles who were not under the influence of Mari propaganda participated in the riots.
