106 EAST 41st STREET, NEW YORK 17, N. Y. BI-PARTISAN RESOLUTIONS ON PALESTINE INTRODUCED IN BOTH HOUSES OF CONGRESS

MASHINGTON, Oct. 11. (JTA) - Two Senators and two Congressmen introduced M-mertisan resolutions today in the Senate and House calling for free immigration of Jess into Palestine, and for an international commission to deffectuate the immediate transfer of the Hebrew people of Europe to Palestine."

The Senators are Francis J. Meyers, Democrat of Pennsylvania, and Charles W. Tobey, Republican of New Hampshire. The Congressmen are Andrew L. Somers, Democrat of New York, and Bertrand N. Gearhart. Republican of California.

It is expected that the resolutions will be referred to the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Senate and the Foreign Relations Committee of the House for consideration. The text of the resolutions, which are identical, reads as follows:

"The United States shall use its good offices and take immediate appropriate masures to the end that Falestine shall be re-opened at the earliest possible moment for free entry of Hebrews into that area, and that there shall be full opportunity for colonization and settlement on the land by the Jewish people, and that Palestine ultimtely be established as a free and independent democratic state with full citizenship rights for its inhabitants without discrimination based on racial or religious fectors.

"Pending the setting up of governmental mechinery to effectuate the establishment of Palestine as an independent democracy and to aid the people of Palestine in so doing, our executive department is urged to take the initiatory steps in conjunction with other interested United Mations to set up a supervisory international commission to effectuate the immediate transfer of the Hebrew people of Europe to Palestine and to insure peaceful and orderly processes in securing these ends.

AMBIERTON DENIES THAT U.S. DIPLOMATS IN MIDDIE EAST HAVE BEEN SUMMORED BY TRUMAN

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11. (JTA) -- Official sources today denied a report that President Truman has summoned American diplomatic representatives from Middle Eastern countries for a conference in connection with the Pelestine situation.

It was pointed out that Lowell C. Pinkerton, U.S. Consul General in Palestine, was here on leave from Jerusalem, and that the U.S. envoys to Egypt and Saudi Arabia had arrived here for periodic State Department consultations. George Wadsworth, U.S. envoy to Syria and Lebanon is due here about November 1 for similar consultation. These visits, official sources emphasized, were in the nature of State Department routine and no general consultation was going on.

The War Department today denied to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency a report published in a New York newspaper that Walter Lichtenstein of Chicago has been named an assistant to Judge Simon Rifkind who has been appointed civilian adviser to Gen. Eisenhower on Jewish affeirs.

and raid military depot in palestine; escape with weapons and ammunition

BRUSAIEM, Oct. 11. (JTA) — A large party of ermed Jews raided a military training depot near knowth this morning and, after overpowering the guards, escaped with 218 rifles, 15 machine-guns, 220 bayonets, steel helmots, uniforms and ammunities. They fled in trucks stolen from the depot.

Meanwhile, 20 Jewish youths, including two girls, were today found guilty by a Stitish military ccurt in Haifa of illegal possession of arms. Sentences will be imposed on Tucsday. The defendants were arrested on Aug. 16 at an overnight bivouach they had set up near the colony of Benjamina. Folice found two rifles, several submethinguns, four hand grenndes and a quantity of ammunition secreted marrby. The secured maintained at the trial that the arms did not belong to them, and defense counsel cointend out that the place where they were found was open to anyone.

Police are still hunting for 208 "illegal immigrants" who escaped from the ithlit internment comp yesterday. The police were reinforced by British troops, an idditional 3,000 of which landed in Haifa yesterday.

The secret "Voice of Israel" station, which began broadcasting for the first time on Tuesday evening, last night said that the liberation of the Athlit internees sets effected by an armed band of over 1,000. The broadcaster stated the Athlit break and the battle between police and Jews in Tel Aviv, yesterday, marked the beginning of a priod of active resistance. "The Jews will no longer tolerate the deportation of their brothers from this ocuntry, whatever measures and whatever force are used," he

The newspaper Haboker today charges that while the authorities are devoting all their energy to halting the immigration of Jews, hundreds of Arabs are entering reliefine illegally from neighboring countries, especially Egypt, without hindrance. The paper says that many of them have already, found employment in military camps, and have even established a camp of their own near the colony of Ness Ziona. They are earning much more than what they could in Egypt, the immigrants say.

The Syrian border police today were given orders to short anyons trying to cross the Palestine-Syrian border, following the arrest of four Jews who were attempting to cross into Palestine from Syria. A Reuter report from Damasous says that the four are in protective custody and are being questioned as to the routes used by immigrants attempting to get across the Palestine frontier from Syria. The Syrian Government today refused transit visas to 105 holders of Palestine visas who are in Istanbul.

Meanwhile, in the midst of all this violence and tension, 25 pioneers from the colony of Near Haoved took possession today of over 1,000 acres of Jewish National Fund led at Yakuk, near Tiberias, and began proparing for the erection of a settlement which will house fifty ex-servicemen and their families.

REPRESENTATIVES OF JEWISH AGENCY CONFER WITH PALESTINE HIGH COMMISSIONER IN JERUSALEM

JERUSAIEM, Oct. 11. (JTA) -- Representatives of the Jewish Agency and of the Vewish Mational Council today visited High Commissioner Lord Gort and conferred with him on a number of urgent questions.

A group of fifty-five Jewish immigrants arrived in Haifa today from Yemen. They were transferred for control to the Jewish Agency's hostel at Kirjyath Mozkin.

LONDON, Oct. 11. (JTA) -- Asked for an assurance that armed resistance to the prin Palestine would be met with "full rigor", Colonial Secretary George Hall stated in the House of Commons today he could make no full statement before receiving a result on recent incidents in Palestine.

The question was raised by Lord Winterton in connection with the escape from the Ahlit camp of 203 Jewish "illegal immigrants." Hell told the House of Commons that according to latest information the 208 have so far evaded arrest, but that a full investigation was continuing.

"It appears," he reported, "that a large number of armed Jews attacked the imit electance camp for immigrants between one and one thirty yesterday morning. Buy were armed with rifles, pistels and daggers. Some were in police uniforms, Four tapeary constables on guerd were seised and beaten with rifle butts and bound and paged. One Arch was seriously hurt and one Jewish temperary constable was tied up but at seriously injured.

"Over 200 illegal immigrants were released apparently with inside knowledge. Here immigrants who had presumebly refused to accompany the escapees were bound and gaged. Of these one Christian woman died of suffocation. (The Palestine press reportdute the woman was a German disguised as a Jewesse)

"The party then escaped in the direction of Mount Carmolo The police took imediate action to seal the Carmel Range. One police party which proceeded to establish a read check was fired upon and ambushed by Jews arms d with rifles, sub-machine passed grandos. The police truck was overturned and I regret to say a police contains shot dead. Next of kin have been informed. One arab constable was seriously wunded and a Jewish corporal slightly wounded," Hall declared.

MAND DRAFTING LAW AGLINST ANTI-SEMITISM, ATTORNEY GENERAL REPORTS IN LONDON

LONDON, Oct, 11. (JTA) -- The Polish Government in Warsaw is drafting a law ming anti-Jewish incitement a punishable offense, Dr. George Sawicki, Attornay General of Poland and chief prosecutor at the trial of the Nazis who murdered 1,500,000 Jews that there at Majdanek, revealed today at a press conference arranged by the Allied War Priss Commission.

Dr. Sawicki attributed the recent anti-Jewish excesses in Foland to the activities of "political adventurers." These elements, he said, are exploiting the antiseitic feelings which existed even before the war and were intensified during the five pers of German occupation through Nazi propagands.

EARLITY OF FRENCH JEWS PREFER TO REMAIN IN FRANCE; FOREIGN-BORN WANT TO EMIGRATE

ERIS, Oct. 11. (JTA) — Ffench Jews, although they became more "Jew conscious" during the German occupation, do not expect to emigrate from the country, Max Statechalk, director of the overseas department of the American Jewish Committee, told Fress conference here today. He revealed that among 3,000 formal applications for edignation, covering about 6,000 persons including children, ninety-eight percent were from foreign-born Jows, most of whom came to France after 1933.

Hr. Gottschalk said that he found the Jewish situation in France better than it was several months ago. He expressed the opinion that "widespread anti-Sentiism has no general nor serious character" in France. French Jewish organizations, he deekred, are watchful of anti-Sentiism, but so far have found no cause for concern.

RISEN INPATES GO ON HUNGER STRIKE TO PROTEST DECISION TO CUT THEIR RATIONS

LOMDON, Oct. 11. (JTA) — A person who arrived from Belsen today said that the instessment on a one-day hunger strike this past Sunday to protest the camp admistration's decision to stop the distribution of Red Cross parcels and restrict the instes to local rations.

The protest began with a march through the camp area by most of the residents, as carried placards and banners. Otherwise, the strike passed peacefully, and there were no incidents. As a result, however, it is understood that the camp authorities my reconsidering their decision.

CECHOSLOVAK JEUS VIHO CLAIMED GERMAN NATIONALITY MUST APPLI FOR "CERTIFICATE OF LOYALTY"

EAGUE, Oct. 11. (JTA) -- Czechoslovak Jews who claimed German nationality befor the mar must obtain a certificate of loyalty before they can become Czech citiss, in scordance with a recent decision of the Government, which is attacked in a letter spearing in the publication "Gime and Tide."

Defending the ruling, several Prague papers today point out that it is based as Presidential decree of Aug. 2, which stated that all persons who declared themelves of German nationality will lose their Czechoslovak citizenship, and must apply to the process authorities if they wish to recein it.

The papers say that it would be a mistake to suppose that there is any racial discrimination involved in this, or that such discrimination will be practiced in reged to any other similar matters.

STITERIAND WILL ALLOW REPATRIATED REFUGEES TO TAKE ALONG TOOLS AND MACHINES

GENEVA, Oct. 11. (JTA) — The first transport of tools, sewing machines and tathools to be sont by OkT to Jews in Germany left here today for Landsberg, Favaria, there a workshop has been established to train 300 students.

EVILE ENISH POPULATION OF RUMANIAN TOWN MURDERED BY NAZIS; RE-INTERRED IN JASSY CEMETERY

MSSY, Rumania, Oct. 11. (JTA) - The fate of the entire Jewish population of the town of Souleny, near Jassy, all of whom were deported in 1941, has now been disclosed, revealing that they were massacred to the last man.

All 600 were buried in three mass graves, an official investigation disclosed. Since it was impossible to separate the corpses, they have been re-intered in a common grave in the Jewish cemetery here.

WELD ESHISH CONGRESS PRESENTS \$20,000 TO VATICAN IN RECOGNITION OF RESCUE OF JEWS

NEW YORK, Oct. 11. (JTA) -- The World Jewish Congress has made a gift of 2,000,000 lira, the equivalent of \$20,000, to Vatican charities, it was disclosed toby by Dr. A. Leon Kubowitzki, secretary-general of the World Jewish Congress, who retured recently from a visit to Europe.

A check for this sum was presented by Dr. Kubowitzki, following his reception by Pope Plus XII, to Monsignor Giovenni Battista Monthin, Acting Secretary of State at the Vetican, in recognition of the work of the Holy See in securing the rescue of Jews from Resist and Nazi persecution, which entailed considerable expenditures. The gift as made, he said, at the request of the Union of Italian Jewish Communities. A contribution of a similar sum had been made by the World Jewish Congress prior to the liberation of Italy to the Italian Resistance Movement which was instrumental in saving Jewish lives.

(The Swiss newspaper Berner Tagwacht criticizes the World Jewish Congress gift to the Vetican, declaring that "when the remnant of European Jewry lives in despite and in need, there is no reason for making such gift to the wealthiest institution in the world.")

EL-CONGRESSMAN ROCERS, RETURNING FROM EUROFE, URGES SUPPORT OF TRUMAN APPEAL TO ATTLEE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11. (JTA) — Licut. Will Rogers Jr., former Congressman from California, in his first public statement since his arrival from Europe two days ago, was full public support to reinforce President Truman's appeal to the British Labor Computer to open Palestine to the surviving 100,000 Jews in the American zones in Carany and Austria.

"It will be a crime against the United Nations" Rogers told a press conference, if these people, the first victims of Hitlor, are not allowed to go to the land of their thoice when they have no homeland of their own." Rogers, who said he is connected with the American Committee for a Free Palestine, expressed his opinion that Arab expectation to increased Jewish settlement in Palestine is mainly British inspired "on account of oil."

Having visited several camps for displaced persons near Frankfurt about two barbs ago, Rogers said he was gratified that the Harrison report corroborated his obstrations on the desire of the majority of the Jewish refugees to go to Palestine. & declared that in the camps he saw, the DP's, mostly Jews, were tracted as "semi-pisoners," were kept behind barbed wire and olothed in regged American uniforms.

He emphasized that a permanent solution of the problem of Jewish survivors in Surope could only be reached through sattlement in Falestine. Asserting that anti-Smitism would increase if they were kept in Europe, Rogers said it would be bound to seep over to the United States.

BOLIVIA WILLING TO ADMIT LIMITED NUMBER OF JEWISH AGRICULTURAL WORKERS

Li PAZ, Bolivin, Oct. 11. (JTA) -- Bolivia is prepared to admit a limited maker of Jowish immigrants, provided that they can prove that they have worked on the lend and possess \$2,500 in cash, machinery or tools, Under-Secretary of Information Dr. Rigoberto Armeza told the JTA today. He denied that Bolivia's immigration has discriminate against Jews, but pointed out that the quota of Jewish immigrants is almost exhausted. There are 5,000 Jewish refugees residing here.
