MUSH COVERNMENT DEVOTES LARGE PART OF INDICTMENT OF NAZIS TO EXTERMINATION OF JEWS

WARSAW, Oct. 17. (JTA) — A 40-page brief submitted by the Polish Government the Hillid representatives who will prosecute the 24 top Nazis who are to be formalhinked in Berlin temorrow, contains a large section devoted to the Nazi exterminating dems in the camps and in the ghettos established in Poland, it was reported has tdays

The Government charges the Nazi leaders with direct responsibility for the assemihilation of Polish Jewry, with destruction of synagogues, killing of rabbis, kiting of Jewish property and torturing millions of Polish Jews to death.

The Germans established about 200 places of internment and more than 1,000 lesses of slaughter in Poland, it was revealed here today. The number of Jews killed the - toth Polish and those deported from other occupied countries to Poland - is stituted to be more than four million by a special department established by the Government for the purpose of gathering material concerning Nazi atroities in Poland.

WINNERT OF ALL MAZI RACIAL MEASURES DECREED IN STATE DEPT. DIRECTIVE TO EISENHOWER

ESHINGTON, Oct. 17. (JTA) — The abrogation of all Nazi measures establishting ininination on grounds of race, actionality, creed or political opinions, is said in a State Department directive to General Eisenhower regarding the military gament of Germany, made public here today.

The directive streames that any person who participated in racial persecutions ediscriminations is to be treated as an active Nazi and not as a "nominal participat in party activities" at the same time, it opdered the immediate release of all mass in the American zone "detained or placed in custody on grounds of race, namilty, creed or political opinions," and instructed that they are to be treated as defined persons.

Special efforts were ordered to save documents, files, books, plans, scientifi, inhetrial and other information belonging to "institutes and special bureaus deming themselves to racial, political, militaristic or similar research or propaganda."

BRACED HERSONS MUST BE TAKEN OUT OF CAMPS, HARRISON DEMANDS, REPLYING TO EISENHOWER

HILDELPHIA, Oct. 17. (JTA) -- Earl G. Harrison U.S. representative on the Exceptent and needs of displaced persons, especially Jews, in Germany and Austit, today issued a statement replying to Gen.
