THE PORT OF "ILLEGAL" JEWISH IMMIGRARYS REPORTED TO HAVE LANDED IN PALESTING

10000N, Oct. 24. (JTA) — After a six-day voyage from Italy in a 250-ton all schooler, 173 Jewish "illegal" immigrants landed by rowbcats "somewhere on senset of Palestine" on Monday according to a report from Jerusalem by Routers, the sense agency.
