LONDON, Oct. 28. Arabs Quit Government Commission in Protest Against Parity with Jows

All five Arab members of the War Economic Advisory Committee today submitted barresignation. They gave as their reason the Government's maintenance of perity bitten Arabs and Jews, despite alleged assurances to the contrary, and demanded that the basis of representation on all boards should be two to one in flavor of the Arabs woulding to their proportion of the population.

CHICAGO, Oct. 28. (JTA) -- Gen. George S. Patton, Jr. in a letter made publar bar today formally denied anti-Jewish remarks attributed to him by John O'Donnell, in Jur Daily News - Washington Times-Herald columnists.

In a letter to Joseph Wilner of Washington, D. C., father of four service, to of whom died in service, Gen. Patton said: "I am glad to have the opportunity stagorically denying that I have ever made any statement contrary to the Jewish or state religious faith. I am a sincore believer in the Supreme Being and have never tarfered with or even examined into the religious or racial antecedence of the men I am the honor to command. My sole effort has been to provide victorious soldiers who makes their country and defeat the enemy with the minimum loss to themselves."

Wilner, one of whose sons Capt. John Wilner was killed while serving with the hird Army under Gen. Patton, had cabled the General that he was "deeply distressed the injustice being done your reputation," when the O'Domnell column appeared on this, and pointed out that the "whole implication of article is that you are guilty if estimates contrary to the fair-mindedness which my son's correspondence described. TREE HITLER PRISON CONVERTED INTO FIRST KOSEER SLAUGHTERHOUSE IN GERMANY

(JTA) -- The Bavarian fortress of Landsberg, in which Hit-Er wrote lein Kampf during his imprisonment following the abortive Mazi putsch of 183, has been converted into the first slaughterhouse for kosher beef in Germany, lami Alexander S. Rosenberg, of New York, a JDC representative in Germany, reported tway.

SE IN POLAND REVIVE CULTURAL LIFE: RE-OPEN SCHOOLS WHICH WERE CLOSED FOR SIX YEARS

TAPSAW, Oct. 28. (JTA) - After an interval of six years, during which the stridestroyed the entire Jewish educational system, a Jewish school opened this week in leds. MONIST GROUPS FORM YOUTH COMMITTEE TO SHEED TRANSFER OF CHILDREN TO PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Oct. 28. (JTA) -- With lerge numbers of homeless and orphaned Jewaldren in Europe in urgent need of immediate transfer and resettlement in Palests, a fouth immigration Coordinating Committee has been formed to coordinate activities and information in the United States and to act as an advisory and consultative in the promotion of fund-raising in this country for Jewish youth immigration to lasting, it was announced today.

The committee was formed at the request of the Youth Aliyah Department of the United Palestine Appeal, Hadassah, Mizrachi in Organization and Pioneer Women's Organization.

In a statement issued jointly by the organizations which constitute the new thit mas pointed out that within the past ten years approximately 15,000 children he writes and so of oppression have been brought to Palestime under the acgis of limiting. Hadassah has contributed more than \$6,000,000 to that programs. The mass longerioner's Organization has raised through the "Child Resoue Fund" \$450,000 since limits. The Microchi Women have sent \$150,000 to Palestime for similar activities since 1945.

The United Palestine Appeal, as the medium through which American Jewry par-Hights financially in the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home, is responsible the basic settlement activities in Palestine which have made possible the absorpim of the children into the structure of the Jewish homeland.
