ARABS REPORTED PLANNING TO DISCUSS PALESTINE QUESTION WITH TRUMAN IN WASHINGTON

LONDON, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Prime Minister Attlee will probably visit the United States before Christmas to discuss the Palestine question and other matters of common interest to the United States and Britain, it is reported today in the London press. The report adds that the Prime Minister's residence would neither deny nor confirm that he is planning to visit President Truman.

Recent suggestions that Jewish immigration be diverted to Cyrenaica or Tripolitania to avoid conflict in Palestine are rejected in a letter to the Times by William Kennedy Shaw, former civil affairs officer of the British military administration in Tripolitania. Shaw writes that settlement there would also be "at the expense of the Arabs," and stresses that the country is semi-desert and can only absorb a limited number of immigrants.

Amwar Nashashibi, speaking for the Arab office here, declares in the Manchester Guardian today that the White Paper can be altered only by force. The only solution of the Palestine problem, he says, is to grant the Jews already there cultural and religious freedom, while the refugee problem is settled by the world, not the Arabs. Nashashibi also rejects partition, asserting that it would sow the seeds of a new hundred-year war.

PALESTINE GOVERNMENT BLAMES JEWS FOR DEPORTATION TO LIBYA DURING DISTURBANCES

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Palestine Government is preparing a "blacklist" of Jews who will be deported to Cyrenaica or Tobruk if disturbances break out, the secret Jewish transmitter, "Voice of Israel," charged today. The broadcast asserted that no list of Arabs is being prepared.

It also accused two British officers of the Palestine police of circulating among the Arab settlements, warning the villagers to "take good care - the Jews are rising to attack you." The Arabs have, so far, not yielded to this incitement, the broadcaster said. Referring to the expulsion from Palestine of Constantine Poulos, a news agency correspondent, he said that Poulos was ousted because he wanted to tell the world the "entire objective truth."

Forty "illegal immigrants" among the 1,003 refugees who arrived here last week aboard the Rumanian steamer Transylvania were transferred today to the Athlit detention camp after a minor crisis developed on board the vessel when the passengers refused to disembark unless all were released by the authorities.

When a crowd of several thousand waiting outside the port area heard that some of the immigrants would not be released, they pushed towards the dock where the Transylvania is berthed and would not leave until they were forced to do so by police and fire brigade units.

The disembarkation concluded after representatives of the Jewish Agency and the Histadruth assured the refugees that the 40 who had no certificates would be allowed to enter the country until their status could be determined.

JEWISH COLONISTS IN POLAND HOLD FIRST CONFERENCE; INVITE OTHER JEWS TO SETTLE ON LAND

WARSAW, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The first conference of Jewish farmers who have settled recently in the part of Silesia acquired by Poland from Germany has concluded in Bytom after adopting resolutions appealing to Jews to settle in Silesia.

It was reported at the conference that there are 34 Jewish agricultural settlements in Silesia, occupying about 2,250 acres and possessing 300 heads of cattle, in addition to horses, pigs and poultry. They had a fairly good crop this season, which is the first since they settled there. Their yearly production of milk will amount to 70,000 quarts.

The production of the Jewish farms in Silesia provides about thirty per cent of the requirements of the Jewish population in the entire province, it was reported at the conference. The Polish Government, it was announced, is ready to give the Jews another 100 estates for settlement, and will clear them of Germans. The conference sent greetings to the Jewish colonists in Palestine and addressed an appeal to the Polish Government to continue its fight against the anti-Jewish activities of reactionary elements "who are hindering Jews in organizing their life on a sound basis."

The Polish Press Agency reported today that the eighth conference of the United Zionist Democratic Party Council) had approved a resolution calling for collaboration among Zionist religious organizations. Another resolution emphasized the need for immediate election of members of the Ichud to the Jewish Central Committee of Poland and to provincial and local committees.

At a meeting of Jewish writers and journalists which took place here recently it was decided to raise a special fund for the publication of works of Jewish writers which were destroyed by the Nazis during the occupation. It was also decided to publish a monthly literary magazine to enable the surviving Jewish writers to resume publication of their work.

GEN. EISENHOWER IS ASKED TO FORM NAZI LABOR UNITS TO RESTORE BERLIN JEWISH CEMETERIES

BERLIN, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- A project providing for the formation of a work detail of former members of the Nazi party to reset tombstones in the four Jewish cemeteries in Berlin, which were desecrated during the Nazi regime, and to clean up the cemeteries, has been submitted to Gen. Eisenhower by Chaplain Judah Nadich, it was learned here today.

Tombstones were overthrown or broken by the Nazis and general disorder created. In addition, the Nazis had a small number of non-Jewish Germans buried in these cemeteries, some of them in graves of Jews.

ENGLAND CHARGED WITH SPREADING FALSE REPORTS ON MISTREATMENT OF JEWS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA

PRAGUE, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Prague radio today stated that Czechoslovak Jewish leaders have condemned false reports of alleged ill-treatment of Jews in Czechoslovakia as "obviously emanating from Hungarian sources."

The Czechoslovak Home Minister today told the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that according to official statistics compiled by the authorities, the number of suicides in Prague from June 1st to the end of September only totalled 216, of whom two were Jews. This denies a previous report that about 7,000 repatriates, largely Jews, had committed suicide since their repatriation.

COUNCIL OF JEWISH FEDERATIONS SAYS NATIONAL ADVISORY BUDGETING WOULD BE VOLUNTARY

NEW YORK, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds today announced that the proposal to establish a national advisory budgeting service will definitely be voted on at the forthcoming General Assembly which will be held early in 1946 in a city yet to be selected.

"Twice approved by referendum--by the member agencies of the Council in 1941 and by the Board of Directors in 1945--the adoption of national advisory budgeting would put into operation a national method of reviewing the financial requirements of national and overseas agencies," the announcement said. By definition this is to be done by 'a committee acceptable both to the member agencies of the Council and to the national and overseas organizations.'

"It would function very much in the way that the well-organized federation budget committees function: as an 'impartial and objective group concerned primarily with reaching equitable decisions which would be helpful to fund raising and to local budgetary procedures,'" the statement continued.

"The Committee would not take over the responsibility of the agencies in carrying out their own programs. The definition states that the 'national and overseas agencies would...as heretofore, determine what their budgets should be.' The proposed national advisory budgetary committee 'would then review the budgets and, after objective and thorough study, would attempt, together with the national and overseas agencies, to arrive at joint decisions on the amount of funds required to carry out the specific programs.' Where joint decisions could not be reached 'the Committee would advise the welfare funds as to the part of the agency's budget and program of work which had been agreed upon and would present both sides of the major items of difference.'

"The Committee would not set or recommend local quotas. It would suggest only national minimum needs of each national and overseas agency. These national goals would be 'recommended - in an advisory way - to the welfare funds.' As heretofore, each community would have to decide for itself which national and overseas agencies it wishes to include in its welfare fund, and what its allocation to each beneficiary should be. In other words each community would continue to retain full power to make its own budgetary decisions."

JUSTICE JACKSON WANTS SPEED AT NUREMBERG TRIAL; BELSEN TRIAL DELAY PROTESTED IN HAMBURG

NUREMBERG, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Justice Robert H. Jackson, chief war crimes prosecutor for the United States, said today at a conference that he expected the trial of the twenty-four chief Nazi war criminals to start here Nov. 20.

"I will do my utmost to prevent the proceedings being dragged out as at Belsen," Jackson said. "Speed of the trial will depend, however, on the rules of procedure laid down by the tribunal and also on the defense counsels' attitude."

As the Belsen trial entered its seventh week today at Luebnurg, signs were posted in the industrial districts of Hamburg demanding that the trial be hastened. "Hasten Justice" and "Death to the Belsen Men," the posters read.

JEWISH WEDDING CEREMONY TAKES PLACE IN BRUNSWICK HOTEL ROOM FORMERLY RESERVED FOR HITLER

FRANKFURT, Germany, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- A Jewish wedding took place today in the room formerly reserved for Adolf Hitler at the Lorenz Hotel in Brunswick. The bridegroom was a London Jewish soldier J. Sampson. The bride was a 22-year-old Jewish girl from Poland, Bela Danasz, who was deported by the Nazis from Lodz to Oswiecim. The marriage ceremony was performed by Major I. Levy, a chaplain in the British Army.

SENATOR TAFT SUPPORTS ESTABLISHMENT OF U.S.-BRITISH SURVEY COMMISSION ON PALESTINE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio, who, together with Sen. Wagner of New York, has introduced a resolution in the Senate calling for restricted Jewish immigration into Palestine, today said that he would support the establishment of a joint American-British commission to study and determine how many Jews can and should be admitted to Palestine.

The Senator said that he understands that the British Government was asked to create such a joint commission the functions of which will be to determine how many Jews want to go from Europe to Palestine, and how many can find homes in Europe.

Taft's suggestion followed publication of a letter sent by Sen. Josiah Bailey, Democrat of North Carolina, to Secretary of State Byrnes, in which Bailey objected to U.S. participation in a solution of the Palestine problem, and said that he would fight on the Senate floor any move to commit us to guarantee Jewish immigration or the establishment of a Jewish state there.

WORLD MIZRACHI CONFERENCE CONCLUDES IN PALESTINE; RABBI BERLIN RE-ELECTED PRESIDENT

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The world Mizrahi conference, which has been meeting here for the past week, concluded today, after re-electing Rabbi Meir Berlin president of the World organization.

The conference voted not to accept Dr. Judah L. Fishman's resignation as the Mizrahi representative on the Jewish Agency executive and named Rabbi Wolf Gold to replace Dr. Aaron Bardt as its representative in the Agency's political department. The delegates adopted a budget of \$1,200,000 for the coming year and passed a resolution urging the Revisionists to rejoin the World Zionist Organization.

Leon Gellman, president of the American Mizrahi, who delivered the closing address, demanded that the orthodox Zionists start preparing immediately for the forthcoming elections to the World Zionist Congress and that they send representatives to Jewish communities throughout the world to inform them concerning the Mizrahi program. He also urged that a \$4,000,000 loan be floated to finance Mizrahi's projected activities.

ARGENTINE GOVERNOR LAUDS ACHIEVEMENTS OF JEWISH COLONISTS; VISITS JCA SETTLEMENT

BUENOS AIRES, (JTA-Air-mail) -- The work of the Jewish farmers in Argentina and the achievements of the Jewish Colonization Association there were lauded by the Governor of Entre Rios province, General Humberto Scsa Molina, during a visit to the higher settlement, one of the newest colonies, whose settlers are mainly Jewish refugees brought by the JCA from Germany shortly before the outbreak of the war.

"Seeing your work on the land," the governor declared in a speech to the settlers, "I am happy to find it a confirmation of my impression that the opinion that Jews can act only as businessmen is wrong. At the same time, I find that the colonization work accomplished by the J.C.A. is a serious and patriotic accomplishment. You may continue your task in peace with the assurance that on this land no restrictions and privileges of any kind exist and that all inhabitants are considered on the same level of complete equality."
