HER EXPETED PLANNING TO DISCUSS PALESTINE QUESTION WITH TRUMAN IN WASHINGTON

LOMON, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- Prime Minister Attlee will probably visit the Minister States before Christmas to discuss the Palestine question and other matters of manisterest to the United States and Britain, it is reported today in the London man. BERLIN, Oct. 29. THEL OF JEWISH FEDERATIONS SAYS NATIONAL ADVISORY BUDGETING WOULD BE VOLUNTARY

NEW YORK, Oct. 29. (JTA) -- The Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare is two announced that the proposal to establish a national advisory budgeting sall definitely be voted on at the forthcoming General Assembly which will be the selected.

"Twice approved by referendum—by the member agencies of the Council in Elem by the Board of Directors in 1945—the adoption of national advisory budget—intuit to operation a national method of reviewing the financial requirements attached and overseas agencies," the announcement said. By definition this is to be in by a committee acceptable both to the member agencies of the Council and to the simuland overseas organizations.

"It would function very much in the way that the well-organized federation has committees function: as an 'impartial and objective group concerned primarily in reaching equitable decisions which would be helpful to fund raising and to local history procedures'," the statement continued.

"The Committee would not take over the responsibility of the agencies in sping out their own programs. The definition states that the 'national and overseas spaiss would see! The proposed attent advisory budgetary committee 'would then review the budgets and, after objections at therough study, would attempt, together with the national and overseas agentis, to arrive at joint decisions on the amount of funds required to carry out the spinite programs. Where joint decisions could not be reached 'the Committee would this the welfare funds as to the part of the agency's budget and program of work this had been agreed upon and would present both sides of the major items of differents.

"The Committee would not set or recommend local quotas. It would suggest up mational minimum needs of each national and overseas agency. These national goals will be recommended - in an advisory way - to the welfare funds. As heretofore, and committy would have to decide for itself which national and overseas agencies the vishes to include in its welfare fund, and what its allocation to each beneficiary shall be. In other words each community would continue to retain full power to make its can budgetary decisions."
