MACSED ON HATFA FORT AND NORTHERN PALESTINE: TEL AVIV COUNCIL HITS EGYIT RIOTS

IMUSAIEM, Nov. 4. (JTA) -- A curfew covering all sparsely settled sections of othern Palestine was proclaimed tonight. Persons living in such areas were ordered temin indoors between 5,30 P.M. and 5:30 A.M.

The curfew, which is apparently aimed at curbing attempts at sabotage, will be word also in Haifa port and the industrial area about a mile east of the port, in-Main the terminus of the pipeline from Iraq, the oil refineries and the Palestine Metric Corporation. A curfew on vehicular traffic outside municipal boundaries was keed last Thursday, following outbreaks here.

CARO, Nov. 4. (JTA) -- The Cairo Jewish community today tentatively set this bring as a day of mourning and fasting to protest the anti-Jewish riots which realtd in an estimated \$1,000,000 damage to Jewish stores, homes, synagogues and instithis here caused the death of six persons and the wounding of over five hundred.

In the meantime, a request will be made to the Egyptian Government for an of-Sidel apology, as well as assurances that stringent measures will be taken to prevent Recurrence of anti-Semitic violence.

Police today suppressed minor disturbances here as rioters sought to extend the wheats into the fourth successive day. Patrols are guarding all main streets to prebut further violence.

VIENNA, Nov. 4. (JTA) -- A memorandum charging that Mazi-confiscated property binging to Austrian Jows is not being returned to them and that Jows returning from description camps are being discriminated against by public officials was presented related to the hoedquarters of Gen. The memorandum pointed out that the former Jewish owners of confiscated enterplies who were named temporary administrators of their own businesses immodiately after the liberation of Vienne by the Russians, have been removed and the "aryanizers" with the Germans have been re-installed. It reiterated charges that "cryanized" with theatres have been taken over by the municipality instead of being restored to the owners.

The Jewish community esks American assistance in securing return of Jewish property generally, and help in obtaining from the Government over 100 buildings formerly blogging to the community.

SHE AGENCY WILL MEED \$3,500,000 THIS YEAR FOR 7,000 REFUGEE CHILDREN IN PALESTINE

No children now under the care of the youth immigration department of the Jewish was Kaller Kaplan, the Agency's treasurer, cabled today to the newly formed Youth immigration Coordinating Committee here.
