CAIRO, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- King Farouk today invited Chief Rabbi Haim Nahoum Mari to an audience during which they discussed the anti-Jewish riots which have ocand in Egypt during the last few days.

Chief Rabbi Reveals He Warned Prime Minister that Jews Fear Ricts

The official attitude of the Jewish community here to the anti-Jewish riots: the week-end was expressed today by Chief Rabbi Fahoum, in a special statement the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

"I am concerned with the riots," Rabbi Nehoum said, "only by reason of the exthe to which they have caused prejudice against religious and cultural institutions of be which community. One of our greatest synagogues has been descrated and illaged, and our scrolls of law, which our people have preserved for thousands of wes, have been destroyed and burned. "As far back as Thursday evening," the Chief Rabbi disclosed, "I had an inter-ing the Prime Minister Nekrashy Pasha. Field Marshal Lord Gort, who resigned last week as High Commissioner of Palesis, tony left here for Britain by air.
