ENVIOUSED IN THE LAVIV; TROOFS FIRE INTO CROWLS; GOVERNMENT OFFICES SET AFIRE

BLAVIV, Nov. 14. (JTA) -- A rigid curfew was clamped down on Tel Aviv toattituding the wounding of a number of Jews by British troops who fired into a law of demonstrators, ten of whom were hospitalized.

The curfew, which restricts all inhabitants to their homes, will continue for windefinite period, until the military authorities order it lifted.

At least twenty other Jews were injured here by club-swinging police as demonstrations were held throughout the country during a twelve-hour general strike called broats the Dritish Government's statement of policy on Falestine. Several policessee also hurts.

The troops fired after groups of Jewish youths had set the government district dissuers on fire and stoned police who rushed to the scene. The troops tried at first to disperse the crowds by firing into the air but later were ordered to fire distription to the demonstrators.
