## Tol Aviv Mayor Protests Locting by British Soldiers

Hayor Israel Rokach today reported at a session of the Tel Aviv municipal and that he has submitted a strongly worded note to the military authorities promite the fact that British soldiers looted Jewish property during the disturbances the city last week. The meeting adopted a resolution declaring that the Bovin name is a betrayal of the Belfour Declaration and of the Falestine Mandate.

The resolution pointed cut that the Bovin policy is a "death sentence" to surviving Jows in Europe who wish to proceed to Palestine. It protested against sides attempt to create a distinction between Jows and Zionists. "The city of Tel Mr, tigether with all Jows of Palestine and with the Jewish people, will oppose by all mesures at their disposal the Bevin policy, the resolution said.

VIENNA, Nov. 20. (JTA) -- Asserting that little has been done since the mation of Austria to restore Jews to their former jobs and to return their prothe Vienne Jewish community today submitted a memorandum to the Ronner Governtentaining the following demands:

- 1. The Government should include Jews on all commissions which will decide mustion and reparations for Jews.
- 2. Jewish civil service employees should be reinstated, and assigned the which normally would be theirs by now had they not been custed.
- 5. Jews ousted from private employment should be reinstated immediately, receive the same salary and seniority as non-Jewish employees who were not disised.
- 4. Jawish-owned homes and other real estate should be restored to their forgamers, as registered in 1938, before the Auschluss.
- 5. Former Jewish enterprises which are still "aryanized" should be immeattly returned.
- 6. Where it is not possible to return former Jewish-cwned property, the mes should be recompensed.

The memorandum also asked that special taxes be levied upon Mazis responsible hasts of cruelty against Jews, and also that the Government issue a decree holding its collectively responsible for damage suffered by Jews or Jewish-owned property.

## WILES JEWS IN GERMANY DECLARE HUNGER STRIKE IN FROTEST AGAINST BRITAIN
