NUMBERG, Nov. 22. (JTA) - Documentary evidence of the Nazi Government's his for systematic annihilation of the Jows of Europe was presented at today's sesand the war crimes trial here by Major Frank Wallis, on behalf of U.S. prosecutor Miss Robert H. Jackson

Jackson Says Nazis Faratically Committed to Annihilate Jews

Major Wallis' presentation followed the line taken by Justice Jackson yestery in his opening address in which he charged that "the most savage and numerous miss planned and committed by the Nazis were those against the Jews."

"It is my purpose to show a plan and design, to which all Nazis were fanaunily committed, to annihilate all Jewish reople," Justice Jackson said. "The persewhich of the Jews was a continuous and deliberate policy. It was a policy directed thist other nations as well as against the Jews themselves. Anti-Semitism was prosted to divide and embitter the democratic peoples and to soften their resistance to te lezi aggression."

The conspiracy or common plan to exterminate the Jew was so methodically and throughly pursued that, despite the German defeat and Mazi prostration, this Mazi aim argely has succeeded, he stressed. British Zionists Pledge Continued Fight on White Faper at Emergency Conference

LOHDON, How. 22. (JTA) -- An emergency conference of the British Ziomist lightanian last night adopted a resolution expressing "deep disappointment" with the liller of the British Government to chrogate the White Paper, and said that it would its with Jews overywhere who are determined never to acquiesce in a policy which is liked and "submits the Jewish national home to racial discrimination."

The rejection of the request by Fresident Truman and the Jowish Agency that 10,000 Jews be admitted to Felestine immediately is a breach of the clearly expressed plays of the Labor Party, and exposes the surviving Jews of Europe to further suffering the resolution said. While welcoming the close association of the United States in the future of Felestine, it points out that the facts economing the position of keny and Felestine are well known.

The hope is expressed that the two governments will ensure that the findings of the inquiry commission are not prejudged, that the committee reaches its decisions whickly, and that while the investigations are proceeding, Jewish immigration into election will not be retarded.

While welcoming any measures which will safeguard the position of Jews in all countries, the resolution declares that the tragedy of European Jewry is due to implesses and dispersion, and that a solution of their problem can only be found in fulfilment of the pledges contained in the Balfour Declaration.

IN RUSSIA WHO "FEEL POLISH" WILL BE WELCOMED IN POLAND, AMPASSADOR SAYS

BUENOS AIRES, Nog. 22. (JTA) — A Jewish cultural club in the Buenos Aires and of Villa Crespo was attacked this week by a band of armed hoodlums, it was remarked today. Jews who defended themselves against the attackers were arrested.
