INSCOVERNMENTAL COMMITTEE TO SEEK SETTLEMENT OF STATELESS JEWS IN LATIN AMERICA

PARIS, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- The possibility of resettling displaced Jews in minus countries, including South America, will be investigated by the Intergovernmental Committee for Refugees, it was amounted here last night by Sir Herbert Emerson, directs of the Committee.

The announcement was made at the concluding session of a three-day conference of the members of the Committee held here. Sir Herbert stressed the great help given to the Committee by the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration and by the Joint Distribution Committee. Several members expressed the opinion that all possible efforts should be made to encourage refugees from Germany and Austria to return to their hamolands.

The conforence adopted a resolution authorizing the administration of the Comdittee to negotiate for the absorption of its functions by the Sceial and Economic funcil of the United Nations Organization. The resolution was adopted following no-difference from the British Government that it intends to urge the General Assembly of the UNO to take such actions.

TL AVIV. Nov. 23. About 200 of the schooner's passengers had already disembarked and escaped maightoring Jewish settlements before the landings were discovered by the patrol The frenty who were still on board were taken to the Athlit internment camp, after gerek vessel made an unsuccesful attempt to flee.

The schooner was brought into Haifa and its crew arrested. Under a law proskited several weeks ago, the Palestine Government may confiscate the ship, and fine milits owners and the crew. Yesterday a district court sentenced three Lebanese interes to 18 months imprisonment for attempting to smuggle in a group of Jews.

The British authorities are reported to be using aircraft, destroyers and may in a move to halt illegal entry of Jows. Meanwhile, the military commander in sifa and Galilee districts has ordered that the curfew confining persons to their ms after sundown be continued outside of municipal areas.

Another Jewish group today voiced its determination to assist "illegal" immistien. A national conference of the left-wing Hashomer Hatzair adopted a resolution ssiling the Bevin statement and declaring that it will "maintain and defend immigrato by all means," and calling on the entire Jewish community to rally around the demi for the immediate issuence of 100,000 immigration certificates. WARSAW, Nov. 23. ES IN FRANCE CLAIM 1,000,000,000 FRANCS SEIZED BY VICHY NOT YET RETURNED

PARTS, Nove 23. (JTA) -- Some 1,000,000,000 frances seized in 1941 by the lity Government from Jowish bank accounts and property holdings and remitted to the lits as "compensation" for German soldiers killed in France, have not yet been restored to their rightful owners, it was learned today.

This amount was paid by French banks to the Caisse des Depots et Consignations (special Treasury Department for money and property in trust), which still release to refund it for lack of instructions from the Government. WESHINGTON, Nov. 23. (JTA) -- The establishment of the joint Anglo-American thy commission on Palestine should in no way preclude or delay the admission of MANO kew to Palestine as requested by President Truman; Secretary of State James F. Secontive committee of the American Jowish Committee; and Dr. John Slawson, its state rice-president.

Feinting out that the Fresident's request has the full support of all Jewish and of Americans of all faiths, the Committee representatives declared, in the probability of the British Government to admit 1,500 Jews per month thelly inadequate and urged the United States Government to centimue to press for teleption of President Truman's recommendation which they termed a compelling nesting for the saving of human lives.

The American Jowish Committee further urged recognition of the Balfour Declamin and the terms of the Mandate for Palostine, which, they stressed, was entrusted that Britain by fifty nations and approved by the United States. "Humbreds of bushes of Jows immigrated into Falestine, and substantial investments were made, beset of faith in the pledges of the Mandate, "the memorandum stated.

Declaring that there is no irreconcilable conflict between the interests of wires and the Jows in Falestine and that the entire Near East will benefit from the situme in that country of a thriving economy and demogratic self-government, the limitee stated that "with good will on both sides and a firm attitude on the part of witted Mations, harmony can prevail."

The Committee approved the terms of references for the Anglo-American Joint Entire which provide for its inquiry into the situation of Jows in European counties where they have been victims of Mazi and Fassist persecution. It said this provided mas "in the spirit of the United Mations Cherter which seeks to promote and enumy respect for human rights and for the fundamental freedoms for all without distants as to mae, language or relibion." The Committee said that "the United States in the States and States are fully in the responsibility of providing immigration opportunities for known Jows."
