THE SURROUNDED JEWISH SETTLEMENTS AFTER BLASTING OF TWO COAST GUARD STATIONS, 14 WOUNDED

TEL AVIV, Nov. 25, (JTA) -- Police today clamped down a tight curfew on two Jewish colonies and threw heavy cordons of troops around three others as an aftermath of explosions which blasted two coast guard stations last night.

According to an official communique, a small party of armed Jews placed explosives at the base of the Givat Olga coast guard station, near Tel Aviv, shortly after 1 a.m. After the explosion, the attackers opened fire with automatic weapons, wounding a British sergeant and three Palestine constables. About a half-hour later another group of Jews attacked the coast guard station at Sidi Ali, near the Jewish settlement of Herzlia, using high explosives and automatic rifles. Here ten British and Arab police were wounded.

A short time later, large detachments of military police arrived at Herzlia and nearby Ramanna and ordered residents to remain at home. Troops also surrounded the settlements of Rishon Le Zion and Shefaim and ordered settlers who had gathered in neighboring colonies to disperse. A Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent who telephoned Shefaim was told that everything was quiet, but that the settlers feared an incident might develop. About 4,000 troops are dug in around both colonies.

The colony of Givat Haim, not far from the Givat Olga station, was also cordoned off by troops, equipped with tanks and armored cars, while airplanes circled overhead. Latest reports say that the inhabitants are still refusing demands that they allow troops to enter, presumably to search for persons connected with the explosion. An attempt to reach the settlement by telephone was unsuccessful.

A broadcast by the secret Voice of Israel radio tonight said that the two stations had been warned before being attacked in order to avoid loss of life, and charged that "these posts were for use against free immigration." Both had been active in the hunt for 200 immigrants from the Greek vessel Demetrios, who were landed Friday morning.

Meanwhile, it was revealed today that in one of the most daring raids recently carried out in Palestine, seven or eight men, said to be Jews, used forged documents to gain entry into a Royal Air Force installation near Lydda airdrome in broad daylight last Thursday and got away with a large quantity of arms.

Hebrew Newspapers Suspended for One Week by Palestine Authorities

JERUSALEM, Nov. 25, (JTA) -- The Hebrew newspapers "Davar" and "Hamashkir" have been suspended for one week by the Palestine Government, it was announced today.

"Davar" was suspended for publishing a cartoon which showed young children in hospital beds after the Tel Aviv rioting and a doctor represented as saying "what good snipers, they hit such small targets." The other paper was suspended for publishing a report of an alleged statement by Doctor Arieh Altmann, Revisionist leader, which declared "the political offensive of the Jewish people will destroy Britain's policy of duplicity." "Davar" stated tonight the cartoon had been submitted to censorship.

BUENOS AIRES JEWISH GROUP PROTESTS TO AUTHORITIES AGAINST INVASION BY POLICE

BUENOS AIRES, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- The Young Men's and Young Women's Hebrew Association today sent a protest to Interior Minister Felipe Urdapilleta against the invasion of its headquarters last night by armed police ostensibly searching for guns. Several of the organization's members were arrested, and persons in the building were insulted, the protest said. Those arrested were subsequently released.

The police action followed an evening of rioting by persons supporting Col. Juan Peron for president. After demonstrations in the center of the city, they marched into the Jewish quarter, shouting anti-Semitic remarks and manhandling passers-by. Several Jews were severely beaten. Police did nothing to halt the rioting, intervening only to arrest Jews who offered resistance to the hoodlums.

BRITISH TROOPS ARREST JEWISH LEADERS IN BELSEN CAMP FOR PROTEST ON PALESTINE POLICY

BERLIN, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- Leaders of the Central Jewish Committee in Bergen-Belsen, in the British zone in Germany, have been arrested for protesting against the new British policy on Palestine, it was revealed in a report received here today from the committee.

The Blue-White Zionist flag was mishandled by British military policemen and thrown onto a heap of garbage, the report said, and a crowd of Jews, including many women, which gathered when a police car arrived to take away those arrested, were beaten by British military police with rubber truncheons.

The arrests were made on Nov. 16, when the protest against the Bevin statement was to have been submitted to the British authorities in Belsen during the distribution of Red Cross parcels scheduled to take place on that day. However, the German administrator of the camp, G. Grande, notified the military police of the plan and later appeared with British M.P.s who he asked to arrest Marian Lipke, the president of the Jewish Committee.

As soon as they arrived, the military police immediately removed banners bearing inscriptions in English reading "Open the Gates of Palestine," which had been erected by the displaced Jews. Then, acting on the advice of the German administrator, they arrested not only the president of the Jewish Committee, but a number of other leaders of the committee and several of its personnel. They then took the Blue-White flag from the office of the committee and threw it into a pile of garbage sixty feet from the office.

Meanwhile, many of the thousands of Jews who are still in the Belsen camp gathered together and voiced their protest against the German administrator. The military police then let loose with their rubber truncheons, striking at random at men and women.

Several hours later, British troops, led by Grande, returned to the camp and arrested another member of the Jewish Committee, two young chalutzim and three Jewish girls, without explanation. They later returned, for a third time, and searched the office of the committee, seizing several typewriters, correspondence files and accounting ledgers.

No information concerning those arrested can be obtained, except it is known that during their interrogation at the headquarters of the military police, one was struck twice by a German policeman in the presence of a British officer.

REPORTS OF EXTERMINATION OF JEWS IN NORWAY AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA PRESENTED TO NUREMBERG TRIBUNAL

NUREMBERG, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- The Norwegian Government has presented to the Allied Military Tribunal here a special report on the cruelties inflicted by the German occupation forces upon Jews in Norway, it was learned here today.

The report emphasizes that although no Jewish problem existed in Norway and the Jews constituted only a small fraction of the population, the Nazi Government in Berlin ordered their deportation and the confiscation of their property. After enumerating the barbarities committed upon the Jews in Norway, the report says that about one-half of the entire Jewish population in the country was sent to "unknown destinations" by the Gestapo, and only thirteen of them returned to Norway from extermination camps in Germany and Poland after the collapse of the Nazi regime.

Col. Bedrich Eger, Czechoslovak member of the Allied War Crime Commission, today told the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that he has presented a lengthy report on Nazi mistreatment of Jews in the Protectorate. Specific charges of mass-deportation and mass-extirmination of Czechoslovakian Jews are levilled by the Czechoslovak Government against Konstantin von Neurath, former Foreign Minister of Germany, who was appointed by Hitler to head the Protectorate.

Witnesses Testify at Dachau Trial on Flogging of Jews

DACHAU, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- Grim details of the daily flogging routine at the Dachau concentration camp, and of living prisoners being included in cargoes of dead, destined for the crematorium, were unfolded during the week-end at the hearing of charges against forty persons concerned with running the camp.

Alphonse Polles, a native of Luxembourg, told the court he saw a Polish Jew sitting up and talking among a heap of corpses at the door of the crematorium, and that one of the accused then took a hauling pole from a cart and beat the Jew to death. Polles explained that he had been one of a working party detailed to unload trains arriving at Dachau with dead and living prisoners. He and his colleague took several of the living to hospital, but were often sent back with live prisoners to the crematorium wards. Many of the bodies had gunshot wounds he said. He had no personal knowledge of any of the living being cremated.

Describing daily floggings in the camp, Wolfgang Furrer, a Swiss, said that a 60-year-old Jewish prisoner was fastened to a whipping post and beaten by two block leaders, after which one of the accused joined in with a cat-o-nine-tails until the victim was unconscious, and was hurled to the ground in a pool of blood.

All the women prisoners of a Dachau subsidiary camp were compelled to witness the hanging of five men, Riva Levy, a pretty 29-year-old Jewish woman from Lithuania told the Court. The five men were hanged for cutting up a blanket to make foot covers. Riva was a prisoner at Kaufering subsidiary camp. She described how her father was so badly beaten that he was sent to hospital and finally left camp on an "invalid transport." She never saw him again.

Dr. Selman Greenberg, a Lithuanian wearing the Jewish badge on his neat suit, testified that one of the accused, Johan Victor Kirsch, was the most brutal. On arrival of Greenberg's transport, Kirsch delivered a speech to them. "Filthy Jewish swine, you must know that from now on you will eat the bread of Dachau," he said. "That means if you do not do your duty you will go to hell before your time. Do not think that Germany will lose the war. If Germany loses the war, you will not live longer. Anyway, Germany is not going to lose the war - the world is more likely to come to an end." Elderly people were so badly handled by Kirsch that 75 died in one month, Greenberg said.

TOLERANCE IS ESSENCE OF TRUE AMERICANISM, TRUMAN SAYS IN MESSAGE TO RABBIS

NEW YORK, Nov. 25. (JTA) — Emphasizing that "the spirit of toleration is of the very essence of true Americanism," President Truman, in a message to the Institute on Judaism and Race Relations held here today at the Jewish Institute of Religion, expressed the hope that "the deliberations of the Institute will be fruitful of wise counsels and constructive action to promote better relations among all races in the world."

Speaking for the Commission on Justice and Peace of the Central Conference of American Rabbis, which sponsored the conference, Rabbi Ferdinand M. Isserman of St. Louis outlined the purpose of the Institute, which will be in session for two days and will conclude with a declaration of principles on race relations. He said that the Jews, "whose fellows have been the victims of racial myths and false racial teachings," know from bitter experience the ugly menace of racial hatreds, and how easily they can be exploited. "We feel it our primary duty to alert the world against this poison, and to point the way for decent fellow human beings," he stressed.

In preparation for the declaration, the Institute will hold six round table discussions today and tomorrow with a number of scientists, teachers, rabbis and laymen participating. The discussions will deal with the teachings of Judaism and race relations, with science and race, the law and improvement of race relations, and with the removing of racial frictions in the modern world.

LEGISLATIVE CURBS ON SUBVERSIVE GROUPS ASKED BY JEWISH VETERANS; CALL FOR JEWISH STATE

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J. Nov. 25. (JTA) — Resolutions demanding federal, state and municipal legislation to curb the activities of organizations aiming to cause discord among the American people on the basis of differences in race, creed or color, and urging the Senate and the House of Representatives to prevent further subversive utterances by Sen. Theodore Bilbo and Rep. John Rankin were adopted today at the 50th annual convention of the Jewish War Veterans of the U.S., meeting here.

The delegates urged the opening of the United States to immigration, pointing out that the quotas of the last five years were not filled because of the war, and requested President Truman to insist on an open door to Palestine "to the end that Palestine may become a Jewish National State." This is the first time in the history of the organization that a resolution calling for a Jewish state in Palestine was adopted.

Other resolutions called for investigation and action by the Senate "looking toward the expulsion" of Bilbo for his divisive utterances; asked legislation barring the use of the mail to anti-Semitic and other anti-democratic propaganda and denying the use of the Congressional franking privilege for the distribution of such material; and asked the Veterans' Administration "to deny the privileges of the G.I. Bill of Rights to colleges and other institutions which discriminate on the basis of race, creed, or color. Maj. Maxwell Cohen, of Boston, was elected national commander.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC READY TO ADMIT ADDITIONAL JEWISH IMMIGRANTS FROM EUROPE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25. (JTA) — The Dominican Republic, where several thousand Jewish refugees have been living since 1940 in the colony of Sosua, is ready to admit additional Jewish immigrants, according to an announcement released here yesterday by the Dominican embassy.

It pointed out that chaotic conditions existing in some European countries have brought hardship and danger to thousands of Jews, and that the Dominican Republic was willing to offer a haven to those endangered for racial or religious reason.

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF AMERICA OPPOSES RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM

NEW YORK, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- Dr. Robert Gordis, president of the Rabbinical Assembly of America, today announced the issuance of a statement by the Executive Council of the Assembly, opposing the introduction of sectarian instruction and observance of religious festivals into the public school system on the grounds that religious education is not a responsibility which the state or any state agency can assume or discharge with success.

The statement said that the public schools cannot do justice to all religious ideologies and still achieve the main general goals of education; that such formal instruction would tend to identify the school system with particular denominationalisms; and that such a program might bring into the education system all the evils involved in a union of church and state.

BRITISH LABOR VOICES DISAPPOINTMENT AT TRUMAN RETREAT ON PALESTINE IMMIGRATION

NEW YORK, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- Resolutions expressing disappointment at President Truman's failure to insist on the immediate admission of 100,000 European Jews to Palestine and affirming its solidarity with the Jews in Palestine "in their determination to resist all efforts to reduce them to a permanent minority," were adopted today at the closing session of the 22nd annual convention of the National Labor Committee for Palestine attended by more than 3,000 delegates.

Other resolutions voiced disbelief that Foreign Minister Bevin's statement on Palestine expressed the views of the British people and insisted that the planks in the Democratic and Republican platforms on Palestine be carried out. A quota of \$3,000,000 for Histadruth activities in 1946, double the amount spent last year, was adopted. The incumbent national chairman, Joseph Schlossberg and national secretary Isaac Hamlin, were reelected.

In a message read to the convention, William Green, president of the A.F. of L. declared: "I call once more upon Great Britain to agree to the immediate admission into Palestine of 100,000 displaced Jews from Europe." Other messages from leaders in American life included greetings from various Senators and governors of many states, Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, and Henry A. Wallace.

MOVING TO SETTLE 30,000 JEWISH REFUGEE ORPHANS IN BIRO-BIDJAN LAUDED IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Nov. 25. (JTA) -- Stating that the achievements in the Jewish Autonomous Region, Birobidjan constitute one answer to some of the immediate problems of rehabilitation of European Jews, United States Senator Harley M. Kilgore last night praised the accomplishments of the Ambijan committee which is conducting a campaign to settle 30,000 Jewish refugee orphans in Birobidjan, in an address delivered at a dinner at the Hotel Roosevelt, in honor of Mr. M. M. Gousev, chairman of the Amtorg Trading Corporation.

James N. Rosenberg, American Jewish leader, also lauded "the notable humanitarian work of Ambijan, especially in helping the Jewish refugee war orphans." Messages expressing similar sentiments were sent to the dinner by Secretary of Commerce Henry A. Wallace and Prof. Albert Einstein, and read by J. M. Budish, chairman of the administrative committee of the Ambijan organization.
