IN HIS PACING TRIAL IN PALESTIME: CHARGED THEY "INTENDED" TO RESIST POLICE

TEL AVIV, Nov. 28. (JTA) -- About 160 Jews who were arrested Honday during to British invasion of several Jewish settlements near Tel Aviv will be tried shortly, mofficial communique announced today.

British troops last night arrested 70 members of the Mayan settlement of the long laccabi, and about 100 settlers from the Zikhron Jacob colony. They had attended trail conference and were unable to return home due to the curfew regulations. After king held all night in barbed-wire enclosures, they were transferred today to the Hilit camp.

The communique announcing the forthcoming trial of the 160 Jews said: "These we were traveling in trucks and buses and were returning from the area of Givat Haim, titus they had gone with the apparent intention of offering organized obstruction to the police.

Authoritative Jewish circles, meanwhile, challenged the accuracy of an offidal communique on the disturbances at the colony of Hogla, where six Jews were killed, that stated that the settlers had opened fire on the troops, using automatic weapons ad rifles.

A careful inquiry on the spot, these sources said, disclosed no evidence of is dess having fired upon the troops. They cited the fact that the communique makes m mention of any casualties suffered by the soldiers, and that no firearms were found m any of the hundreds of Jews detained for questioning.

WHILE WARTS TO LIQUIDATE ZIONISM, BEN-GURION TELLS JEWISH NATIONAL ASSERBLY

ERUSAIEM. Nov. 28. (JTA) -- Sharp criticism of Foreign Minister Bevin's absent on Palestine was voiced here today at an extraordinary session of the Asseth Haniyoharim, the Jewish National Assembly, called to formulate the attitude of sisting Jewry toward the new British policy.

leading the attack against Bevin was David Ben-Gurion, chairman of the execuin committee of the Jewish Agency. He declared that after analyzing Bevin's statet, it becomes clear that its real aim is a desire on the part of the British Governmt to liquidate the White Paper together with Zionism; to liquidate the Jewish nation m to deal with Jews as individuals; to liquidate the Palestine Mandate and replace it an occupational regime under international trusteeship.

Charging that Bevin's statement prepares the ground for the slaughter of Jews shlesting, Ben-Gurion said: "We are interested in an alliance with democratic Engin, which has vital interests in this hemisphere, but we reject any policy designed bliquidate our existence and our aspirations. Upon the graves of our comrades in amm, I say to Bevin: 'I am not an Englishman, nor do I know if the British people aw you authority to treat the Jewish people in this way, but we know you have forces tow disposal. We do not want to be killed, we want to live. We believe we, too, is the right to live like the British and other peoples. But we, like the British, is something more precious than life itself. We cannot forego three things - freedom imigration, our right to rebuild the desolation of Palestine, our independent polital future in this land. For these three things we are prepared to die'."

Ben-Gurion denied Bevin's allegations that there is a conflict between the m and the other nations in the Middle East. "We see our efforts going hand in hand the great historical needs of the Middle East and we are fulfilling a great hishis task in the Hiddle East, he declared. The Zionist labor leader also criticized Bevin's statement on the following mint: "1. There is no mention of the Labor Party's pronounced policy for Falestine; 4 It does not mention anywhere the Jewish people, but instead it employs all sorts turns like Jewish community or Jews; 3. The concept of the Jewish National Home is disappeared. Bevin speaks only of a Jewish home; 4. What is also missing from amis statement is the problem of the homelessness of the Jewish people.

The latter vigorously denied that Jews fired om British soldiers during the clashes this week in the Jewish settlements. MES KILLED, 100 WOUNDED IN PALESTINE WITHIN FORTNIGHT; BRITISH SUFFER NO CASUALTIES

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28. (JTA) -- Dr. Altert Einstein was revealed yesterday to be been the first scientist to concern himself with the potentialities of the atom himself indict affect the United States, at a hearing before a special Senate Committee.
