BRA TO TAKE OVER ALL CAMPS FOR DISPLACED PERSONS IN BRITISH ZONE IN GERMANY

LOHDON, Nov. 30. (JTA) -- British military authorities today signed an agreemst with the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration which provides that all the camps for displaced persons in the British some will be turned over to TREA.

The camps will be taken over gradually in view of the fact that UNRRA faces a partage of personnel. The first phase is expected to be completed by Dec. 31 and the find process will be completed by February. The British army will continue to be resmaible for supplying food, fuel, clothing and accommodation for the camps.

The Commander-in-Chief of the British Army of the Rhine will retain overall merrision in all matters affecting the displaced persons. Their actual return to thir native lands will remain the responsibility of the military authorities, but MEM is to make recommendations for repatriation.

Acting on the advice of Judge Simon Rifkind, named by Freeident Trumen to thy the position of displaced Jews in Germany, the representatives of the American wish Conference, American Jewish Committee and the Jewish Labor Committee who are m in Germany investigating the situation of the Jews in the camps, agreed not to mis individual reports of their findings. They will confer with Judge Rifkind before ming their reports public, it was indicated.

MISH DELEGATION PROTESTS TO ARGENTINE MINISTER AGAINST ANTI-SEMITE ACTIVITIES OF POLICE

EURNS AIRES, Nov. 30, (JTA) -- A delegation of Jewish leaders today called won Gen. Felipe Urdapillets. Minister of the Interior, and protested to him against the recurrent anti-Jewish disturbances here.

The delegation complained that twenty policemen broke into the Y.M.H.A. preuses on Hov. 24, and arrested several people there. The Jewish leaders requested that the Minister institute an investigation in order to establish the responsibility d the police so that the guilty may be punished.

STEE HATIONAL COUNCIL DENTES JEWS FIRED UPON BRITISH SOLDIERS IN PALESTINE

ERUSAIEE, Nov. 30. (JTA) — The Jewish National Council of Palestine today tot direct issue with the new Palestine High Commissioner, Sir Alan Cunningham, who makedy amounced that British troops were fired upon last Monday in the Jewish settlement of Givat Hayim before they opened fire, killing six Jews and wounding many there.

A statement issued by the Council flatly denies the charge. The statement manites that the Jews who tried to break through a cordon to Givat Hayim were entirely unharmed. It reads:

"After careful and minute investigation of the events which occurred in or are first Hayim on how, 25, the National Council is satisfied beyond any possible that that the party of some fifty Jews who tried to break through to Givat Hayim magniful unarmed, inasmuch as sticks were being carried by them. None of the member of the settlers who assembled there had firearms or any other weath, nor were any arms discovered among them."

LONDON, Hov. 30. (JTA) -- Jamal Husseini, who was jailed by the Palestine terment in 1933 and 1934 for instigating anti-Jewish riots, and who was charged nu being one of the ring leaders responsible for the massacres of Jews in Palesthe in 1956-37, will be released from internment in Rhodesia where he has been confind by the British since 1942, Reuters reports today.

WASHINGTOF, Nov. 30, (JTA) -- Senator Owen Brewster, Republican of Maine, thank the British Government in a speech in the Senate today for intending, through the Aglo-American commission on Palestine, "to saddle the American Government with the mail responsibility for British policy without any intention of allowing the United whas an effective voice in deciding Palestine's future."

The Senator declared that the British Government has never asked the use of british forces in Palestine, contrary to reports which he said the British have apread. It british argument of Arab violence, Brewster said, is morely being used as an excuse from tundetuking a policy which the British do not want to execute.

Assignment by the United Nations Organization of the Palestine trusteeship to intain is the intention of the British, Brewster alleged, Under such an arrangement, scalared, Great Britain would be freer to pursue its own policy in Palestine than we sting as the mandatory of the League of Nations. He paid tribute to the "expending progress accomplished through the consecrated labors of the Zionist organization" in Palestine throughout many years, declaring he could testify to these accomplishments from his visit to Palestine this year.
