MA. MEDS ESTINATED AT \$58,350,000 FOR 1946; EDWARD WARBURG ELECTED CHAIRMAN

MEN YORK, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- The sum of \$58,350,000 will be needed by the but Distribution Committee to carry on its activities in 1946, and to make possible belief work in about fifty countries throughout the world, it was arrounced today the Sist annual moeting of the J.D.C., held at the Hotel Commodere, with Jewish lead-from all parts of the country in attendance.

The meeting elected Edward M.M. Warburg chairman of the Joint Distribution wittee. Paul Warburg. Ers. Felix M. Warburg and James N. Rosenberg were elected mary chairman. All other officers were re-elected.

Eye-witness reports on the situation of the displaced Jews in Germany and on meds of the Jews in other European countries were given by Dr. Joseph Schwartz, Rosen director of the J.D.C., Edward Warburg and Rabbi Judah Nadich, chief Jewish Eprin in the European Theatre of Operations and former special adviser on Jewish Mans to Gen. Eisonhower.

The year 1945 saw the Joint Distribution Committee work in more countries, the mre sufferers, and provide more relief than any other year," Dr. Schwartz said. the J.D.C. has spent nearly \$28,000,000 overseas this year. All over the world Jews me taked back to health from starvation, helped to start life anew. Dr. Schwartz Describes Flight of Jews from Poland to U.S. Zone in Germany

Declaring that during his recent visit to Poland he found not more than \$000 Jews, most of whom are now fleeing from the ocuntry, Dr. Schwartz said: "Antimitism in Poland, which the government is attempting to stamp out, but has been unable to, has caused thousands of Jews to flee to the relative safety of the American some themany, and the consequent overcrowding there has made conditions even more serious. thland, less than a month ago, I saw thousands of homeless, destitute Jows walking Mit. always westward, trying to reach the American some, where they hope to find betby conditions.

"Nearly \$1,000,000 in relief supplies were shipped to Poland in 1945, where by 80,000 Jews are alive out of a pre-war population of 3,300,000, he continued. Wer years of personution and systematic starvation, the health of the survivers in Man is seriously undermined. Nearly one-third of them suffer from tuberculosis, and dost all require immediate help.

MESS AGREE TO ALLOW POLISH JEWS TO PASS THROUGH THEIR ZONE EN ROUTE TO U.S. CAMPS

EERLH, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- British military authorities here have agreed to maternad their order preventing the reception of Jewish refugees from Poland in a majent comp at Hesslingen, on the frontier between the Russian and British zones, which a conference with American officers. The refugees have been streaming such here to the British camp, en route to more permanent quarters in displaced permanent in the U.S. zone.

The conference rollowed the refusal by the British, on Friday, to admit 120 him laws to the Hesslingen camp. The refugees, who arrived from Berlin in UNRA who, were ordered by the British military authorities to return.

During the last six weeks more than 6,000 Jews escaped from Poland into the balls rome and reached Berlin. As the number of Jews reaching Berlin from Poland is increasing daily, with me than 200 arriving every day, UNRRA is now attempting to send about 2,500 of them the American zone on a special refugee train. However, the British military authorises been announced that they will not permit transit of the train through the British con unless U.S. Military Headquerters at Frankfurt will give definite assurances in the refugees will be accepted in the American some.

By bindowing Jewish refugees from Poland from entering the British zone, the bitish military authorities are following a policy of preventing displaced Jews from waits potential emigrants to Palestine. British Press Reports Increased Flight of Jews from Poland to Berlin

LONDON, Dec. 9. (JTA) -- Reports published during the week-end in the Lonits press indicate that Berlin is being flooded with Polish Jews, fleeing in large numits from the anti-Semitiem of Polish actionalists.

Their number is so great, the Daily Kail reported, that Anglo-American control officers have had to turn to their governments for guidance in handling the sitation. It is estimated that 200 of these rofugess are arriving daily after a long tain ride through the Russian zone of occupation. Already thousands of them have maked Berlin and there are no signs of the traffic slackening.

The newly arrived Jews are quoted as saying that many more will follow them at that the flight will not helt until every Jew is cut of Poland. Polish mationalits they say, have revived the old cry of "Poland for the Polish." 11.4. IK'S

ERUSAIEM, Dec. 9. Conditions of Jews in the American zones still vary greatly, according to Man. Elsewhere, he reported, conditions are worse, because the Jews are scattered humler groups in many towns where they are dependent on the understanding of the military government officials.
