F ARGIO-ALERICAN INQUIRY COMMISSION ANNOUNCED: ASKED TO FINISH JOB IN 120 DAYS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10. (JTA) -- The membership of the twelve-man Anglo-Ameriminute Commission on Palestine, the formation of which was announced by President from and British Foreign Minister Bevin on Nov. 13, was made public today, simultamily in Washington and London.

The commission was asked to complete its work withon 120 days, if possible. milient Truman's press secretary, Charles G. Ross, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency but the 120 days would begin when the commission actually started its work, which, he mid would depend on the body itself.

The two chairmen, who will rotate the position, are, for the United States, keph C. Butcheson, judge of the Fifth Circuit Court at Houston, Texas, and, for Engmi, Sir John Singleton, Judge of the King's Bench Division of the High Court of Justhe in London.

ENTINES IN LANDSBERG CAMP FOR DISPLACED JEWS CRITICIZED BY ALLIED CORRESPONDENTS

IAMPSEERG, Germany, Dec. 10. (JTA) -- Conditions in the Landsberg camp for inlated Jews were condemned today in a statement issued by a group of American and the correspondents who arrived here during the week-end from Nuremberg. Included the group of seven was a correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

All the correspondents came to the conclusion that the problem of the dispart Jews will not be solved unless the directives of Gen. Eisenhower concerning dispart persons are carried out. MES REACHING U.S. ZONE IN GERMANY WILL BE CARED FOR, STATE DEPARTMENT SAYS

WASHINGTON, Dec.10. (JTA) -- The State Department today told the Jewish Telephic Agency that Jewish refugees from Poland, once in the American zone in Germany, mill be cared for and will not be expelled.

inti-Jewish Terror Reigns in Warsaw, Lodz, Lublin; Jews Continue to Flee

LONDON, Dec. 10. (JTA) — The London press today continues to feature news be Berlin of the increasing influx of Jews fleeing from Poland because of anti-Semitieuror.

The Daily Mail reports that underground groups opposing the present Polish moment in Warsaw have taken a vow not to leave a single Jew elive in Poland. The na Krajowa," one of these organizations, announced that it will not disband until alad is completely "judenrein".

Jews who reached Berlin from various cities in Poland during the week-end reski that systematic pogroms are being carried out all over Poland, including Warsaw, ski sai Lublin, where most of the surviving Polish Jews are concentrated. Masked Mp, using machine guns, are attacking Jewish homes, the refugees said.

The News-Chronicle reports from Berlin that an UNRRA transit center for Jew-Minugees, which has room for 300 people, now has 1,200 Jews from Poland crowded that. They sleep four in one bed and receive meager rations, but are not complaintude they are happy to get out of Poland.

REMAN ZIONISTS ASK 1,600 PAIESTINE CERTIFICATES; 1,000 FOR CHALUTZIM

TEL AVIV, Dec. 10. (JTA) -- Addressing a public gathering here today, Dr. In Eillel Silver disclosed that while in Palestine, he received a cable from the Paletine office of the Jewish Agency in New York requesting 1,600 Falestine immigration wificates, including 1,000 for Chalutzim.

Dr. Silver refuted the allegations that American Jews are not interested in stilling in Palestine. He said that the Jews in the United States were shocked by stilling Secretary Bevin's statement on Palestine. "The bulk of American public opinion is for a Jewish State and I am sure that President Truman will be with us when the delitin comes," he stated.

At a luncheon given by the Journalist Association to members of the Jewish emy emeutive, Dr. Nahum Goldmann said that "an anti-Zionlet solution of the Falestone frolten is unimaginable," because the Jews are now a strong factor in the Middle list. A temporary solution which disregards the Zionlet demands may be imposed, but sly for a short time, if the Jews of Palestine remain determined as they are now, and it may succeed in rallying the bulk of world Jewry around the Yishuv in its struggle, a stated. IMPON, Dec. 10. (JTA) - A full-dress debate on the Falestine issue took in the House of Lords today following the announcement of the composition of the plantican inquiry commission by Foreign Secretary Bevin, in Commons.

He demounsed the Unite Paper and instant for refugees. The White Paper, he said, was a contradiction of the Balweleration and was condemned in advance by the Feel Commission.

At the same time, Lord Samuel emphasized that he considers it a "false step" on burt of the Zionists to ask for a Jewish State. The Balfour Declaration, he argued, its promise a Jewish State, but an opportunity to create conditions under which in twess of time it might be possible to establish a Jewish State. He denied that which not absorb more immigrants, declaring that its population could be wish or trebled. He emphasized that 100,000 Jews went to their death in gas chammin Europe, who could have been saved if admitted to Palestine.

Welcomes American Partnership in Solution of Palestine Problem

The archbishop of York, who is a member of the House of Lords, warned against a 'm-Christian, irrational anti-Semitism which is noticeable even in England," and unled to Jewish leaders to ourb anti-British attacks by speakers and writers, which will lead to a dangerous reaction in this country. Britain, he added, sympathizes with these, and wishes them to get a home where they can develop their culture and live by persecution.

Lord Cranborne, former Colonial Einister, appealed to the Zionist leaders to thiologo in Palestine. He said that he found no trace of anti-Jewish bias among which of the Colonial Office during his administration, and expressed the belief in the anti-British feelings are not representative of the wast majority of Jews.

Lord Strabolgi appealed to the British Government to take steps to halt the blest anti-Semitism in Poland which is now forcing Jews to flee to Germany. He said at the Falestine problem would be solved only when Palestine is given a dominion stable by the Britain and the United States invite Russia to participate in the hydrodenerican inquiry commission on Falestine.
