THE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE ADOPTS RESOLUTION ON PALESTINE; WANTS FREE IMMIGRATION

MASHINGTON, Dec. 12. (JTA) -- The Senate Foreign Relations Committee, by a m of 15 to 1, today adopted a Palestine resolution based on the Wagner-Taft resoluim which has been under consideration for some time. The dissenting vote was cast bleator Tom Connally, chairman of the committee.

The resolution urges the United States Government to use its good offices with me initial Government to secure the free immigration of Jews to Palestine "to the maxm of its agricultural and economic potentialities.

The resolution also asks for full opportunity for Jewish colonization and imicroent in Palestine so that the Jews may freely proceed with the upbuilding of histins as the Jewish National Home and, in association with all other elements of boulation, establish Palestine as a democratic commonwealth with equal rights rall inhabitants.

The text of the resolution reads as follows:

"Whereas the Sixty-Seventh Congress of the United States on June 30, 1922, unimously resolved: 'That the United States of America favors the establishment in Alestins of a National Home for the Jewish people, it being clearly understood that whing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of Christian wall other non-Jewish communities in Palestine, and that the holy places and relihas buildings and sites in Palestine shall be adequately protected;

"And whereas the ruthless persecution of the Jewish people in Europe has derly demonstrated the need for a Jewish Homeland as a haven for the large numbers who in become homeless as a result of this persecution;

"And whereas these urgent necessities are evidenced by the President's repart for the immediate right of entry into Palestine of one hundred thousand additiond lewish refugees;

"And whereas the influx of Jewish immigration into Palestine is resulting in in improvement in agricultural, financial, hygienic and general economic conditions;

"And whereas the President and the British Prims Minister have agreed upon appointment of a Joint Anglo-American Committee of Enquiry to examine conditions a selectine as they bear upon the problem of Jewish immigration and the Jewish situaim in Europe and have requested a report within 120 days;

Therefore be it resolved by the Senate the House of Representatives concurthat the interest shown by the President in the solution of this problem is here-Toursended, and that the United States shall use its good offices with the Mandatory wer to the end that Palestine shall be opened for free entry of Jews into that counTo the maximum of its agricultural and economic potentialities, and that there all is full opportunity for colonization and development, so that they may freely set with the upbuilding of Palestine as the Jewish Mational Home and, in associativith all elements of the population, establish Palestine as a democratic commonwith in which all men, regardless of race or oreed, shall have equal rights.

Adoption of the resolution was welcomed here by Emanuel Neumann, acting presint of the Zionist Organization of America." I hope that the resolution will be adopted to be sente at an early date, he said. "It should serve to reaffirm and clarify position of the United States with regard to Palestime. MENT OF JEES FIEEING TO MUNICH FROM EASTERN EUROPE DESCRIBED BY JTA CORRESPONDENT

MUNICH. Dec. 12. (JTA) - This capital of Bayaria almost overnight has beme the center of continental European Jewry. Pogrom conditions in Poland, the un-Meddliness in Hungary and other countries toward the Jews and the fear of further per-Entions of those eastern Jews who survived Hitler and returned to their homelands wave caused thousands to leave and to converge on Munich.
