MHEST ACTIONS COMMITTEE REJECTS MOTION ASKING RESIGNATION OF JEWISH AGENCY LEADERS

JERUSAIEM, Dec. 13. (JTA) -- The Small Zionist Actions Committee today rewild a motion that Dr. Chaim Weismann, president of the Jewish Agency, and the entire moutive of the Agency resign in protest against the new British policy on Palestine. he motion was offered by the Jewish State Party and by the Left Poale-Zion Party.

The Committee, at its final session here, did not adopt any decision on the section of whether or not to cooperate with the Anglo-American Inquiry Commission on histine, but voted to leave this decision to the executive of the Jewish Agency.

On the other hand, the Actions Committee approved a statement adopted at the anday extraordinary session of the Jewish Agency executive, emphasizing opposition whe new British policy on Palestine as outlined recently by Foreign Secretary Bevin. It points out thats

- 1. The Bevin statement maintains the British White Paper which was condemnd by a competent international authority as a violation of the Palestine mandate and with was also repudiated by the British Labor Party as a breach of faith.
- 2. The document limits Jewish immigration into Palestine for an indefinite priod and simultaneously provides for consultation with parties which have no lawful muntance in the matter and which have pledged themselves to oppose any Jewish immigation.
- 3. The Bevin statement leaves intact the land laws under which the greater put of Palestine is closed to Jewish settlement and which represent a measure of ratial discrimination against Jews without any parallel in the democratic world.
- 40 The Bevin statement prejudged the findings of the Anglo-American inquiry Menission since Beyin declared that Palestine itself is not capable of even grappling it the solution of the problem of the homelessness of Jews in Europe.
- 5. The Jewish Agency regards Bevin's statement as irrecommiliable with the allow Declaration and with the obligations imposed upon the British Government by the hlestine mandate.

The statement of the Jewish Agency reaffirms its "uncompromising opposition" to the White Paper policy, whether in its original or in any modified form. "The Jewin Agency upholds the moral title of every Jew impelled by material or spiritual urge to settle in Palastine as of right, the statement says. The Agency reiterates its fusionental conviction that the reestablishment of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palastine and the restablishment of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palastine is compatible with the full protection and the promotion of the interests of its Arab imabitants and with the development of friendly relations with the neighboring states.

"The Jewish people," the statement continues, "must reject any political settlement in Palestine which degrives it of its basic and internationally recognized

# BITISH, FRENCH SIGH AGREEMENT TO AID EACH OTHER IN MIDDLE EAST, INCLUDING PALESTINE

LONDON, Dec. 13. (JTA) -- The British and French Governments have signed in agreement to help one another on all questions affecting the Middle East; including legs, Falestine, Transjordan, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Syria and Lebanon, it was reported by today,

The main portion of the agreement deals with settlement of Anglo-French differences in Syria and Lebanon, and provides for the simultaneous evacuation of Syria by British and French troops. The British troops will regroup in Palestine, which has been the center of British military might in the Middle East.

# THE CASE FRESENTED AT NURE MEERG TRIAL COURT SEES FILM OF NAZI ANTI-JEWISH HURALITIES

NUMERICANG, Dec. 13. (JTA) -- The frightful story of how the Germans and prominimograins exterminated 540,000 Hungarian Jews in little more than a year was premid today by American prosecutors to the Allied War Crimes Tribunal, which is trying is laders of the Nazi Government.

Major Walsh, who presented the "Jewish case," told the court that no crime shistory was as cruel as the Masi persecution of Jews. He presented a huge volume feridence, including a diary of Hans Frank, Nasi Governor of Poland, in which the ministion of all Jews was urged. One entry in the diary revealed that in December, Ma, Frank sent a memorandum to Hitler asking his permission to seize all Jewish home brishings in Paris and in all occupied western countries.

The horror endured by the Jews of Hungary was disclosed in detail in a stateme obtained from Dr. Reszoe Kastner, a leader of the Zionist organization in Budams, and head of the Jewish Agency's relief committee there.

# 450,000 Hungarian Jews Killed By Germans 80,000 Jews Exterminated by Rungarians

As soon as Hungary was boounted by the mans, special Gestapo units arrived in Budapest for the purpose of liquidating the wis. The unit was headed by Adelph Eichmann, the Gestapo "specialist" on Jewish af-Mrs, who was born in the German settlement of Sarona, near Tel Aviv, in Palestime.

# EME GETS PAIESTIME RESOLUTION FROM FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE; QUICK ACTION URGED

WASHITTON, Dec. 13. (JTA) — Senator Robert F. Wagner late yesterday filed report in behalf of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, in which he stated that its Relatine resolution, which the committee passed, reflects, in its opinion, a long mais of authoritative expressions of American policy and the views of the American maps on the subject of Falestine.

"The war is over and the need for a Jewish Homeland where the Jewish surviwrs of these persecutions can live and breathe as free men and women, and where they as establish a free and democratic commonwealth, is greater than ever. Your commitbe feels therefore that the time is at hand when the long standing pledges to the Jewish people should be fulfilled.

## Senator Connally Says He Opposed Resolution at Truman's Request

In a statement issued last night, Sen.Tom Connally, chairman of the Foreign blations Committee, and the only member to oppose passage of the resolution, said he did so at the request of Fresident Trumane. "President Truman made it quite clear to made to the Foreign Relations Committee that he did not desire the passage of any resolution on the subject at this time," Sen.Commally said. "He reported that it would be insavisable. He stated that the passage of any resolution would greatly embarrass him in his international conferences seeking a solution. # American Jewish Conference Asks Semate to Act on Resolution

NEW YORK, Dec. 13. (FTA) The Interim Committee of the American Jewish Conference, meeting in all-day session at the Hotel Biltmore today, called upon Congress to act without delay upon the Wagner-Teft resolution on Palestine.

"We hope that the Senate will vote promptly and favorably upon this resolution," the Interim Committee declared. "It reflects the oft-reiterated sentiment of the American people in support of unrestricted Jewish immigration to Palestime and of which aspirations in relation to that land. Through this resolution, the Senate foreign Relations Committee again asserts the overwhelming American belief in the validity of the principles of the Balfour Declaration and the Falestime Mandate, and its disapproval of the British White Papers."
