MES ADOPTS PALESTINE RESOLUTION; IDENTICAL WITH RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY SENATE

MASHINGTON, Dec. 19. (JTA) - The House of Representatives today overminimity passed the Palestine resolution by voice vote, with only a few mays, after show and a half debate. The resolution is identical with the Wagner-Taft resolution sorted two days ago by the Senate.

A last minute move by Rep. James Wadsworth, Republican of New York, to remuit the resolution to the Foreign Affairs Committee, was defeated by a vote of 13.56. Hadsworth had previously expressed great fear, during the debate, that the massage of the resolution might cause a wave of anti-Semitism, which he deplored.

The resolution was supported in speeches by Rep. John W. EcCormack, majority lader and Rep. Joseph W. Martin, minority leader, both of Massachusetts; Rep. Deniel Hood of Pennsylvania, author of the resolution; Rep. Herman P. Eberharter, also of Emsylvania; Rep. Edith Nourse Rogers, Republican of Massachusetts; Rep. Clare Booth me, Republican of Connecticut; and Rep. Sol Bloom and Emanuel Celler, Democrats of New lat, Opposing it were Reps. Victor Wickersham of Oklahoma, Smith of New Jersey and liller of Hebraska.

# Cognizance Taken of Anglo-American Commission on Falestine

A report on the Palestine resolution submitted to the House by the Foreign Mairs Committee, which had unenimously adopted the measure yesterday, said that cogmance had been taken of the appointment of the Joint Anglo-American Committee on Abstine. The report commended the President for his interest in the matter, but ex-Pessed the opinion "that it is appropriate and timely for Congress to give expression to its view on the need for the restoration of Palestine as the Jewish National Home-

The resolution, the report stated, "reflects a long series of authoritative suressions of American policy and the views of the American people on the subject of abstine. It pointed out that passage of the resolution would provide opportunity for egress to express itself forthrightly on the horrible plight of the Jews of Europe."

"The need for a Jewish homeland where the Jewish survivors of persewios, can live and breathe as free men and women and where they can establish a free and democratic commonwealth is greater than ever, the report said. "Your committee | feels, therefore, that the time is at hand when the long standing pledges to the Jewish people should be fulfilled.

#### EXECUTION OF SYNAGOGUES CITED AT NURLIBERG COURT IN CASE AGAINST NAZI STORM TROOMERS

NUMERIEERG, Dec. 19. (JTA) — The case against the Nazi Storm Troops, the storious Brown Shirts who were the bulwark of the Hitler movement during its rise to wer, was presented to the court today by U.S. prosecutors, who cited their destruction of synagogues, Jewish shops and Jewish homes, and their mistreatment and murder of thousands of Jews.

One brigade of Storm Troopers, the evidence disclosed, destroyed 35 synapuss during the wave of anti-Jewish rioting throughout Germany in November, 1938, unir the direction of the Nazi party.

Ccl. Robert Storey told the court that the Storm Troops victimized Jews in the early days of leazism, and, later, murdered tens of thousands. Documents and captured photographs depicting the terrorism visited upon Jews were introduced as evictors.

## STISH DELICATION CALLS AGAIN ON ARGENTINE HINISTER; ASKS HIM TO CHECK OUTBREAKS

BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- A delegation of the DAIA, central Jewish Presentative body, has again called on the Minister of Interior to discuss means of fasking enti-Semitic incidents during which Jews walking in the streets have been placed by Peronists.

The general impression prevailing here is that the Minister of the Interior, this Urdapilleta, is sincerely interested in curbing anti-Jewish outbreaks, but the Mice officials do not follow his instructions.

It was reported here today that Dn Frederice Centoni, political boss of San Frovince and one of Peron's key political advisors, said in a speech delivered at recent banquet, during which he commented on anti-Jewish demonstrations carried out pro-Feron elements, that "it is a pity that a substantial number of Jews were not illed. It would have served to frighten the others.

# FORIER HUNGARIAN CABINET MEMBERS GO ON TRIAL CHARGED WITH DEATH OF 500,000 JEWS

BUDAPEST, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- A pro-Mazi triumvirate under whose direction mir 500,000 Hungarian Jews were murdered or deported to concentration or labor camps, three they were either gassed or worked to death, went on trial here today.

Facing the Peoples Court are former Minister of the Interior Andor Jaross, first Under Socretary of the Interior Lezlo Baky, and the one-time Secretary of State in the Interior Hinistry, Lezlo Endre. In a statement to the court, Endre pleaded that he was not responsible for its marders, because he could not foresee what would follow deportation of the Jews. PARIS, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Representatives of Jewish student groups in twelve contries not here today at the first conference of the Union of Jewish Students to be laid since the outbreak of the wer. After discussing the multitude of problems facing with students, and most Jews, in Europe, the meeting adopted the following resolutions:

Brief addresses of welcome were delivered by Judge Leon Meiss, representing the Jewish Consistory and a Miss Himes from UNRIGA. A cabled greating from Prof. Alast Einstein was read.

# TEST JEWISH RELIGIOUS PROGRAM OPENED ON HUNGARIAN RADIO

BUDAMEST, Dec.19. (JTA) -- The first Jewish religious program on the Hun-Frian radio was inaugurated today with an eddress by Chief Rabbi Hevesy.

"This is a great day considering the tortures, deportations, and assassinations of Jews a year ago," Rabbi Hevesy declared. "The Hungarian radio's gesture is a topeful sign of better days." The half-hour program will be presented weekly.

# THER ACCUSES ERITAIN OF CAUSING TENSION IN FALESTINE; CALLS FOR AMERICAN CHALUTZIM

CLEVELAND, Doc. 19. (JTA) - Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, who returned from abstine last night, said today that "the sole tension in Palestine today is caused breat Britain's; illegal interference with the free entry of Jews into the country." It is said time, he appealed for American chalutzim to help develop Palestine's removes. In a statement issued here Dr. Särver said;

"I found the Yishuv more normal than I was led to anticipate, busily at work at full of post-war plans for rapid development and expansion. Within a decade or two labeline stands to revolutionize the economic life of the entire lear East, if the smitpoket of political and economic restrictions which confine it today, is remain.

"Everywhere there is a great demand for American goods, machinery, and takinical skill. Above all, for American chalutzim to come and make their contribution to the next phase of the country's progress. The Yishuv asks of American Jewry today at only financial support, but also gift of hand and mind.

"The sole tension in Palestine today is created by Great Rritain's illegal iterference with the entry of Jews into the country, hundreds of thousands of whom as mocking at its gates. All the clashes have been with the police and military frees of the country, not with the Arabs. An equilibrium of strength has already then stablished which the Arabs understand and respect. All the noise and the rioting are the work of non-Palestinian Arabs outside the country.

"The Yishuv is resolved on two things: to protect at all costs, and regardless of sacrifices, those who seek the sanctuary of the Jewish National Homeland, and tessept no final solution which will whittle down the national rights of the Jewish wole in Priesting.

"The Vishuw is disciplined, more united than ever before, and in a determined and militant mood. It was bitterly resentful of Bevin's statement and of the Joint kmission of Inquiry. It was also beffled by President Truman's contradictory attitude. I am sure that it will be greatly heartened by the action of the Congress of the United States, which it was awaiting with keen eagerness.

# ECRETARY OF WAR LAUDS JEWISH CHAPLAINS AT CONFERENCE; 311 SERVED IN WORLD TAR II

WASHIMITON, Dec. 19. (JTA) — Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson today build the contribution of the Jowish chaplains to the morale of the United States stricemen in all theaters of war, emphasizing that "no chaplain had a harder job than to Jowish because he served a group that was widely scattered throughout the armed trees." CAIRO, Dec. 19. (JTA) -- Mombers of the Palestine Arab Higher Committee me reported today to have urged the Arab League not to cooperate with the Anglo-perion inquiry commission on Palestine until the ex-Mufti of Jerusalem is permitted preturn to Palestine.

At the same time, it was reported in a broadcast over the Cairo radio that the Council of the Arab League had unanimously edopted a decision to approach various generates in Europe in order to obtain the return to Palestine of Arabs exiled for phitted reasons. The proposal came from three leaders of the Palestine Arabs now in the connection with the activities of the League.
