MESIANS CLOSE BORDER TO JEWS ESCAPING FROM FOLAND; ACT ON ALLIED DECISION

EERLIN Dec. 254(JEA) -- Acting on a decision taken by the Kommandantur, in mich the American, British, French and Russian military authorities are represented. the Soviet authorities have closed the frontier through which Jews escaping from Pohad have been entering the Russian zone of Berlin en route to displaced persons sums in the American and the British zones.

The decision was taken lest Friday, when it was also decided to evecuate about 1.000 Polish Jews from Berlin into the three western somes of Germany, Forty-eight bors notice was given by the Russian authorities before closing their border.

As a result of this drastic measure, which caused consternation among displaced dews in the American and British zones, who were expecting to be united with saviving relatives from Poland, about 800 Polish Jews were arrested yesterday in the Bussian zone and transferred to the Magdeburg prison. Other Jewish refugees were greated on the frontier.

The general feeling here is that the British and the American military offitials in Germany do not comprehend the tragic situation of the Jews in Poland. Some of them are trying to create the impression that the Jews are fleeing from Poland because they are stimulated by Zionist propaganda to do so, and also because of the let that they do not receive sufficient protection from the Folish Government against unti-Semitic terror. Upen and camouflaged anti-Jewish sentiments are noticeable among must of the British officers and even among some Americans. Only the French display my deep humanitarian understanding for the Jews who are escaping from Poland, it ms stressed by responsible Jewish observers.

#### MISH BODIES IN PALESTINE DEMAND REPATRIATION OF JEWS DEPORTED TO ERITREA

JERUSAIRH, Dec. 25. (JTA) - Repetriation of the nearly 300 Palestine Jews confired is a British concentration camp in Eritres, and a ban on future deportations wre demanded today at a plenary session of the Jawish Mational Council.

A similar demand will be submitted to the Government by the municipalities d lel Aviv and of Petach-Tikvah, following resolutions to this effect adopted yestarday by the municipal councils of the two cities.

The resolutions also requested the appointment of a public commission to retomsider the arrest of imposent persons in Falestine. In presenting this request, the ayers of Tel Aviv and Petach-Tikvah will point out to the Government that mimerous wish families have been ruined by arbitrary arrests made only under the authority of subordinate police officers.

A group of 140 Bulgarian Jews, one of the last groups to be admitted under the Maite Paper quote, landed here today from the Rumanian vessel Fransylvania.

# MINTER OF HATREL AND PERSECUTION URGED BY FORE IN PROGRAM FOR LASTING PEACE

ROLE, Doc. 25, (JTA.) -- Outlawing of "all hate and persecutions," as one of the final final preroquisites for a true and lasting peace, was urged, yesterday by the Pius in his annual Christmas message.

## ETISH NATIONAL ASCENBLY OF PALESTIFE TO LEST NEXT MONTH TO DISCUSS POLITICAL FROBLEMS

MERUSAIEM, Dec. 25, (JTA) -- A special session of the dewish dational Assembly of Paloctine (Assertath Haniwcharim) will be convened towards the end of next math for a discussion of the political problems facing the dews of Palestine and also bedgetary matters, it was decided today at a meeting of the Jewish Mational Council, which is the executive organ of the Assembly.

### MILED ARAB LEADER, BROUGHT BY BRITAIN TO EGYPT, SEEKS RETURN TO PALESTIME

CATRO, Dec. 25, (JTA) -- Jamal Husseini, former Falestinian Arab leader who was exiled to Rhodesia in 1941, today declared that he intends to return to Palestine. Busseini was flown here, last week, from Rhodesia in a British military plane.

"If the Palestine Government refuses me permission to enter the country, I will take the matter to court," he said. He announced that he would be leaving for Beirut on Jan. 2, and from there will make his formal application to the Palestine Government for ro-admission. In Palestine, he added, he will work with the "rab "igher Committee and "help defend the "rabs in the country."

# MARR OF "STERLI GROUP" SAYS HE WILL COOPERATE WITA OTHER RESISTANCE OR AMIZATIONS

GRUSALEM, Dace 25, (JTA) -- Friedman Tellin, leader of the Fighters for the headen of "sreel, with whom the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency spoke for hours, at a secluded spot "scommerc in Falestine," declared that his organition, which is popularly known as "the Stern Group" is ready to a cooperate with the therefore the resistance groups, the Haganah and the Irgun Zvai leumi, in a working greenst similar to the French liberation movement.

"Such an agreement," he stated, would certainly increase the effectiveness of Jewish action and strengthen our striking power. Possibly one or both of the other resistance groups may fight only up to a certain point, until certain objectives are gimed-granting of 50,000 immigration certificates, for example, but our struggle manot end there. So long as there is a fight against British rule, we will fight. If they lay down their arms anywhere along the line, before the final goal is reached, we will continue the fight."

Yellin said that his fighters are gaining new support and sympathiners daily, and more people now understand us. He said they broke away from the Irgun Zwai Isuin September, 1944, because we felt that the war offered an excellent opportunity the free Falestine by striking at the British. #### Denies Kis Organization Maintained Contact with Enemy During War

He denied the charge that his group had any contect with the enemy during the war, as well as the statement that not members of the organization came from Folland. "Our membership is made up largely of young people born in Palestine," he said, "and they have a feeling for Palestine which is peculiar to them. It is their home. Our source front line is composed of such young men -- they are our fighters. Our series held is made up of older people. Also, whereas in other Jewish resistance magnitations the members devote only a limited part of their time to liberation activities, our members give all their time to the party."

he said that, as is the case with other similar movements, "we are organized in small groups. We one member knows more than five others, save in the case of some of our fighting units." "he added that his group is preparing for a long, hard fight; that money and arms are being collected unrenditingly; that "when the time comes, we stall strike hard and fiercely," and that "I hope the American people will understands

"Through our activities of the past few years," he explained, "we have sought to bring the Jewish question to the immediate attention of the world. The assassination in Cairo last year of Lord Moyne, the British resident minister in the Middle Last, was an act in that direction. We have also sought to set an example for the Jewish people — showing them that only by fighting and struggling can their hopes be whieved and a Jewish state won. We feel that we have succeeded in both our aims. In addition, we have made the Falestine government show its true colors — as a vicious instrument aimed at the permanent subjugation of the Jewish people."
