ROF, EINSTEIN OPPOSES JEWISH STATE; SAYS BRITAIN STIRS CONFLICT IN PALESTINE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11. (JTA) -- Prof. Albert Einstein, testifying today before the Anglo-American Inquiry Commission, said he was against a Jewish State, but not for the same reasons as Lessing Roserwald. He urged, however, that the bulk of the Jewish refusees in Europe should be brought to Palestine.

Emphasizing that he believes there will be no peace totween Jews and Arabs as log as the British rule Palestine, Prof. Einstein cherged Britain with violating the basic responsibilities undertaken in the Balfour Declaration.

Asked by British merbers of the committee if he advocated sending Jews to Palestine even though Arabs might shoot, and whether the Americans should take over blestine from the British, Prof. Einstein replied that the administration of Palestime should be international. He emphasized that he holds Americans responsible for what the British are doing in Palestine.

Difficulties between Jews and Arabs were largely artificially created by the British, he declared. He griticized the British colonial policy as based on the principle of "divide and rule," and charged the British administration with using the ex-bitti of Jerusalem to foment trouble. As a former admirer of the British, he had come to his present convictions only after inner struggle, he testified.

Asked by Dr. Frank Aydelotte, one of the American members of the committee. as to what he would do if Arabs resisted the immigration of Jews from Europe into Palestim, Prof, Einstein replied that "this will not be the case if they are not ineited. Questioned by Dr. Aydelotte concerning political versus cultural Zionism, he stated: "I was never for a political state."

Judge Joseph C. Hutcheson, American chairmen of the inquiry commission, then asked Prof. Einstein whether the Palestine problem could be handled other than on a political basis. It was to this question that the Jewish scientist replied that he was against a Jewish State, but not for the same reasons as Rosenwald.

Asked by Judge Butcheson why it was to Britain's interest to foment discord hotmon Jews and Arabs in Palestins as he had sharped, Einstein saids "I will be very glad to be wrong." To a questice by Dr. Ayds lotts as to what authority should have jurisdiction over Palestins, he said that be favored a government which would do best for all mon concerned, whether Jews or Arabs. Commissions like the inquiry committee, he added, were only a smake screen to show good will, without there heing any intention of following the advice given.

First Arab Representatives Testify Defore Committee; Oppose Immigration

Prof. Philip Hittl and Dr. Thalil Total, both of the Institute of Arabaineriom Affairs, tostified before the domnittee on the Arab attitude towards the Falestine problem. Both British and American members of the committee questioned Dr. Totah sharply after he had maintained that Espace feared Signist aims and that Zionian had prevented the granting of democratic government in Falestine. A member of the British delegation referred to Dr. Totah's threat of Arab cooperation with other powers, if not satisfied by the British, as "blackmail" and said that Britain had had some experience of that sort during the war.

Says Arabs Will Never Agree to Establishment of Jewish Commonwealth

Dr. Hitti, who is professor of Semitics at Princeton University Goolared in the course of semewhat heated questioning by a larger than usual number of the committes merbers, that the Arabs would never agree to the satablishment of a Joulan commonmenth and that the Zionist point of view could only be imposed on the Arabs by force, conceding also that the imposition of the Arab view could be solely through forces.

Judge Butcheson, emphasizing the need for quick, humanitarian action to "relieve the hideous suffering of the pitiful remmants" of European Jews and "in recognition of what they have endured," saked if the Arabs would not extend a generous reception to the 100,000 Jewish displaced persons in Europe. Several times he re-phrased his question, saking if the conception of a Jewish state disappeared, whether the brabs would oppose "the great humanitarian purpose of aiding refugees from Europe to go to a place where a sympathetic welcoms swaits them."

Hitti termed Hutcheson's question "hypothetical." He declared so much emotion has been stirred up, blood spilled and tension areated, that "no matter how much you tell the Arabs, and in the name of mercy, you cannot override that background. Jewish imagration into Palestine is an attenuated form of conquest." Hitti said that as an imprisan citizen he urged opening the doors of the United States to Jewish refugees, and characterized many of the "Christians" supporting opening of Palestine as actual arti-Senites who do not wish more Jews in this country.

Frank Buxton, American member, rather sharply asked Hitti if he favored opening the gates of the United States while simultaneously closing the doors of Falestine. Bitti replied with an emphatic affirmative that he would "absolutely check immigration into Palestine from now one." To Buxton's further question as to what the Arabs would consider evidence of Zionist surrender of their political ambitions in Palestine, Hitti replied, if they declared themselves as willing to be citizens of a few based on the cristing population, with allowance for natural reproduction.

Sir John Singleton, in an unusual display of feeling, declared that he "studderod" for the state of the world at Rittl's assumption of the impossibility of Arabs and Jews finding mutual understanding.

Inquiry Committee Will Complete Hearings on Monday

The inquiry committee will complete its hearings on Monday, it was learned here today, and will sail for England four days later. Heny members of the committee today expressed approval of the helpful attitude of the testifying organizations.

Verious comments were heard here today over the incident which took place yesterday at the hearings, between Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and Lessing J. Rosenwald following the latter's testimony in behalf of the imprior Council of Judaian, in which he stated that Zionian involved dual allegiance between falestine and any other country of which June were citiesns.

WAR DEPARTMENT SAYS U.S. ZONE IN GERMANY REMAINS OPEN TO FLEEING POLISH JEWS

MASHINGTON, Jan. 11. (JTA) - The War Department today told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that its policy with regard to Jewish refugees from Poland who flee to the Apprican zone in Germany is not to close the borders to such migrants.

Emphasis was placed by a Department spokesman on the difficulties crising from an unexpected influx of Folian-towish refugees into the American some, but unusual stress was given to the sympathetic understanding and appracch of American officials charged with this problem.

The assurances by the War Department were given in comment on a cable received by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency from Berlin yesterday, which said that U_sS. military sutherities in the American sector of the city had ordered the registration of Polish-Jewish pregnant women, as well as women with young children, who have been admitted to a camp in the U_sS. zone in Ferlin, in accordance with an order providing that Jewish remembers husbands are still in the Russian zone of the city should be returned to the Eussian scotor.

Explains Order To Move Refugees from American Sector

The spokesman said that an order to move refugees from the American sector in berlin to the Russian sector came in the form of an agreement of the Berlin Kommandatura. It was decided that because there was such a great number of refugees in the American sone that had gone over from the Russian sector, that the Russian would seek these out and cere for them in a special shelter camp, he stated. The plans for this special camp were set up, but when the word got around that these people were to be remuted in the Russian sector of Berlin, the refugees apparently assumed that they were to be sent comewhere and they "evaporated." This means, the spokesman said, that the United States must get them back in the camp so they can be acared for. "But," he added, they won't force anybody to go unless they want to go.

(The New York Post, in a cable from Berlin, reports that there are about 300 prepart Jewish women and nursing mothers in the camp in the American some in Berlin. About 700 more Polish Jews have reached the U.S. zone from the Russian some in Berlin during the last few days. "Washington has still to answer the urgent requests for guidance which have been going forward since Hovember," Lendall Poss, the surrespondent of the Hew York Post, said in his cable. "Until word somes from home, no me here will take the responsibility for shapping the waifs to the permanent camps in the American some."

LARGE STORE OF CLOTHING STRIPPED PROLIMERDERED JETS BY HAZIS FOUND IN POLAND

1007, Jan. 11. (JTE) -- A large store of clothing and linen belonging to Jews excuted in Hazi death camps has been found near the town of Kossalin, in the section of Garmany recently coded to Poland, it was announced three. The clothing, which was tripped from Polish and Hungarian Jews, contained a great many personal papers and chotographs, which are being classified by the information department of the Lods district Evenment.

The Jewish religious community council reports that it has discovered 37,000 religious books and 150 Holy Scrolls hidden in the section of Lods which formerly housed the ghetto.

ON EN KILLED, SEVERAL INJURED IN ARAB ATTACKS IN FALESTINE LILITARY CAMPS

DEMUSALEH, Jan. 11. (JTA) -- One Jew was killed and four seriously injured late yesterday when they were attacked by a group of Arabs who accused them of being responsible for the murder of an Arab worker. The assault occurred at a military comp mer Lvida.

At the same time, four Jews were slightly injured at a camp near Ghaza by 20 arabs who stole their clothing and money. A Jewish businessman was held up by Arab robbers near Bethlehem, yesterday, and beaten.

The melee at the Lydda camp occurred with the discovery of the body of an arab worker who had been missing since last week. From what information is available, it is believed that the Arab, who had in his possession 150 pounds with which he was planning to purchase a wife, was abducted by an Arab bandit band. However, as soon as more of his murder was received several of the Arab employees at the camp spread the runor that he had been killed by the Jews.

The dead dow is Joseph Barkais, 42. Those injured seriously enough to require haspitalization are Airon Gertal, Leon Turkenfeld, M.W. Solwarts and Hanan Moskovits.

FALESTING HIGH COMMISSIONER CONFERRING WITH COLONIAL OFFICE CONCERNING ARAB BOYCOTT

JERUSAIEH, Jan. 11. (JTA) -- High Commissioner Sir Alan Cunningham is conferring with the Colonial Office in London on steps to be taken with report to the boycett of Jewish goods from Palestine proclaimed by the Arab League, an official communique revealed today.

The communique said that discussions with London were necessary because the boyott is of "direct concern to the Mandatory Power, which is responsible for the well-being of all the peoples in Palestins."

Jewish groups have been pressing for several weeks for action by the Government, and the Hebrew press has published several sharp attacks on its failure to act sainst the boyootte

Capt. Warchalance of the Greek wassel Demotrics, which, last Movember, landed about 200 "viseless" Jews in Falestine before being apprehended by British patrol craft, was today sentenced to two years imprisonments. His crew of five was acquitted, but will be detained until they can be deported to Greece.

Description of several synagogues by police hunting for terrorists was protested today in a letter sent the Impector-General of Falestime Police by the chief rabbimate. The letter also charged that police had searched the phyloderies of down who were at prayers when the raids occurred.

DISPLACED JEWS WILL HOLD TWO-DAY CONFERENCE IN MUNICH; ALL CALIPS REFRESENTED

FRANKFURT, Jane 11. (JTA) — A conference of elected representatives from all Janish displaced persons camps in the American zone in Germany will be held in Munich on January 20 and 21 under the suspices of the Central Committee of Liberated Jews in Payeria,

The confereme will discuss the problem of the Polish Jews and their effect on the local area, the Palestine situation, and other problems of vital interest to the displaced Jews. Delegates to the conference will be chosen on the basis of one per sach 500 Jews, of whom there are approximately 40,000 in the American zone. David Ben Gurion, chairman of the executive committee of the Jewish Agency, will attend the meeting.

Dr. Nahum Goldmann, also of the Jewish Agency, has already arrived in Manich, where he reported that a bill is now being drafted for the Greater Messe district of Germany providing reparations for Jews. This plan would be carried out throughout the entire American compation some, by James.

MAI HINETER OF ECONOMICS DIRECTED CONFISCATION OF JEWISH PROPERTY. NUREMEERG TOLD

NURSIMERG, Jan. 11. (JTA) - Walter Funk, German Minister of Economics, was responsible for execution of the measures which drove Jews from German economic life and stripped them of their possessions, U.S. prosecutor Lieut. Heltzer charged today before the International War Crimes Tribunal.

Lieut. Meltzer introduced an address delivered by Funk in Berlin on Nov. 15, 1938, in which he said that none cannot exclude Jews from colitical life and let them work in the economic sphere. The economics chief attributed the Masi-sponsored destruction of Jewish homes and shope the provious week, due to the fact that the German people were dissatisfied with the speed with which Jewish property was being expropriated.

"The complete elimination of Jews from the sconome as already been decreed in George's laws covering various aspects of German sconomic life, Funk said, reporting that Jews had been excluded from stock exchanges, banks and almost all large businesses and industrial enterprises.

He announced in conclusion that of the estimated 7,000,000,000 marks worth of poperty held by Jews, 2,000,000,000 had been "transferred to Garman possession."

ARCENTILE FRESIDENT TELLS JEWISH DELECATION GOVERNMENT WILL CURB ATTACKS ON JEWS

BURNOS AIRES, Jan. 11. (JZA) - President Arturo Farrel today assured a delegation of Argentine Jewish leaders that his government would take researcs to pretent repetition of the attacks on Jews which have cocurred with increasing frequency during the past few months.

The delegation, consisting of Dr. Moises Goldman and Ricardo Dubrowsky, president and vice-president respectively, of the DAIA, central body of Argentine Jesus, conferred with the President for a half-hour, at his invitation.

They discussed various aspects of the situation of the Jews here, and recalled their recent protests to the Government concerning the assaults on Jews and Jewish shops by Peronist thugs.

MINERESSIONAL CONDITTEE TO QUERY GERALD L.K. SMITH ON HIS SOURCES OF INCOME

MANIBIOTON, Jan. 11. (JTA) -- Gerald L.K.Smith, anti-Semitic leader, has been ordered to appear the end of this month before the House Committee on Un-American Activities and testify as to the sources of income of his America First Party, it was remailed here today by the Committee's counsel Ernie Adamson.

"We intend to find out what Smith is doing and why," he said. "We want to mow the source of his income, and if his operations are those of a regular political prty. If so, then we want to know if he is complying with the laws governing party attivities. It, Adamson said the committee intends to inquire into the financial status of several similar organizations.

EN YORK COURT CONVICTS THREE FASCISTS FOR ARRANGING ANTI-JEWISH STREET RALLY

HEN YORK, Jan. 11. (JTA) -- Three well known anti-Serites, who participated in the first anti-Series street meeting to be held in New York since the end of the mr, were found guilty yesterday of unlearful assembly in Queens Special Sessions Court. By fee sentences ranging from six months to three years.

The three, whose meeting was held on Oct. 6, are Errest Elmhurst, one of the defendants in last year's sedition trial in Washington, Homer Maerts, a leader of sub-mrive groups in Chicago and Eurt Mortig, who was associated with the German Bund, long the writenee offered at the trial was a pamphlat entitled "Jewish Ritual Murder," which was characterized by Judge Henry Curran as one of the "most victous, venomous and hate-inciting I've ever seen." SOFIA, Jan. 11. (JTA) -- Pointing out that the United Mations' efforts to establish a just and new order throughout the world cannot be successful without a definite solution of the Jewish problem, the United Zionist Organization of Bulgaria closed its first post-war conference here today with a call for United Mations' support of Jewish efforts to establish a homeland in Falsatime.

Other resolutions adopted at the closing session included the expression of them to the present Sulgarian government for the freedom it has granted to the Jewith minority, and the hope that the Sulgarian people through their government will support Jewish mational aims. The conference also sent greetings to the soldiers of the surroun, British, and Soviet armies and to members of the verier Brigade, and mailed the efforts of American Jews in their fight against the White Papers.
