MISSIE MEDS AND CAN ABSORB MORE PEOPLE, EXPERTS TESTIFY AT WASHINGTON BEARING

MASHIEGTON, Jan. 13. (JTA) -- Palestine needs a larger population for the constructive effort from which both Jews and Arabs would benefit, Dr. Walter C. Lowderrik, assistant chief of the Soid Conservation Service of the U.S. Department of Agrisiture, testified yesterday before the Anglo-American Inquiry Committee, which will emelude its hearings here tomorrow.

The Jordan Valley irrigation project, he said, is as practical as any similar repet in Southern California. He lauded the Jewish colonists in Palestine for their importing land. Through application of modern technology, he stated, they increased substituty per agree and per man thus enlarging the world food supply and improving standards throughout the Middle East.

Dr. Abel Wohlman, professor of sanitary engineering at Johns Hopkins University and chairman of the Palestine Economic Board, told the committee that the present 10,000 irrigated acres in Palestine could, through the projected hydroelectric developmi of the Jordan, be increased by 650,000 acres at a cost of less than \$200,000,000. This is not a grandiose schame but a grand scheme, he said, a bankers undertaking mich would pay out at three percent in under 50 years."

The project can be developed in eight stages, he said. Results of the first stage would be evident within the first five years and other results in ten years. A min-muth growing season, he said, would ensure success of the project. Dr. Wohlman emasted that the purpose of the project is to recapture lamis historically fertile. decessing costs, Wollman said the first stage would nost approximately \$25,000,000, and ther stages could be developed at a more moderate cost. As alternative financing wwes, he presented government or joint government-private financing.

James Hays, engineer of the Palestine Economic Board, presented to the committo a technical outline of the Jordan project. His explanation of the plan for use of the larger with irrigation aroused the committee's interest. Henry W. Bayshore, of the Alestine Economic Board and for 39 years with the United States Bureau of Reclamation, upressed the view that amortisation of the project in forty to fifty years at the parant would make an appreciable difference to the water user.

Rev. Daniel A. Poling, representing the Christian Council on Palestine and the invious Palestine Councities, said that Christian Zionists in the United States favor the stablishment of a Jewish commonwealth in Palestine. # HESTER POLICE HUNTING FOR JEWS WHO ROBBED \$140,000 FROM TRAIN; ARREST 17 IN HADERA

ERUNAIEI, Jan. 13. (JTA) -- Folice today were continuing their search for stand of 50 to 70 Jews who yesterday held up and robbed a train of \$140,000 at a deserted spot near the Jewish settlement of Hadera.

Immediately after the robbery, police and military contingents were rushed to the scene, and a curfew was imposed on the eastern part of Hadera and adjoining areas, missing inhabited sections. A thorough search was conducted today and 17 Yemenite less in the Nachliel quarter of the settlement were detained for interrogation. The surfew was lifted later, except for the Machliel section.

According to an official communique, about 70 Jews, including some women, attack the train after it had been deraited by a land mine explosion. One group enquet the escorting policemen, while another forced British reilway officials to surmour the payroll. The robbers, who were reported to have spoken English and Hebrew, manded one British and one Arab policeman.

Twelve Jewish youths who were arrested on barges near Hertzlia, last Movember, a supplicion of having sided in landing "visaless" immigrants, were today informed that they will be held for another six months in the Latrum detention camps.

The Palestine Arabs medical association has appealed to Palestine Arabs to broth Jewish doctors "since the Jewish medical profession is primarily interested in furthering Zionist aims." It also urged Arab doctors not to prescribe Jewish manuscribed preparations,

# THE STATES REJECT FROPOSAL TO FLACE PALESTIME ISSUE BEFORE UNITED NATIONS ORGANIZATION

HEW YORK, Jan. 13. (JTA) -- Zionist leaders today reiterated their oppositim to the Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry on Palestine, and also voiced their dyeticus to a reported British plan to submit the Palestine issue to the United Natius Organization.

Addressing a meeting here of the National Zionist Administrative Council, Dr. Na Silel Silver, ZOA president, said that any proposed solution by the inquiry committee which recommends admission of a certain number of refugees into Palestine at the rice of liquidating the objective of a Jewish State would be rejected.

Dr. Enamuel Neumann, who was one of the leaders of the Zioniet delegation the tetified before the committee last week, said that the Zioniets still believe the committee can do nothing but stall, and added that the proposal of Foreign teneury Bevin that the UNO assume responsibility for Falestine is "emother move in spalaged and claborate run-around of which the Jewish refugees are the immediate with. He criticized President Truman for having "lent himself to this game," adding that the Fresident's record on the Falestine question "is most confusing."

The meeting ratified a resolution proposed by the ZOA executive committee to apper the strengthening and continued Punctioning of the American Jewish Conference. Helse approved a plan for the enrollment of an additional 250,000 members, and the alse of at least 1,000,000 "sheke le" so as to provide a large American representation the Merid Zionist Congress slaved to be held this Summer. ## OSE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE MAPS PLANS TO AID 45,000 ORPHANED JEWISH CHILDREN

GENEVA, Jan. 15. (JTA) -- Plans to aid 45,000 orphaned Jewish children of Surope, many of whom are still in convents or living with Christian families, were formulated here at the first post-war international conference of the OSE, Jewish health sections.

Stressing the fact that the several thousand surviving Jewish children in Polad are threatened by tuberculcais, Dr. S. Herssenhorn, vice chairman of the Central Committee for Folish Jews, who arrived here from Warsaw to represent the TOZ, an affiling of the OSE, said that 80,000,000 slotys - about \$800,000 - will be required within the next six months by the TOZ to carry out its functions. He emphasized that the TOZ is responsible not only for the health of the surviving Jews from camps and ghettos, but also for the care of 18,000 demobilized Jewish soldiers.

"Relief organisations abroad," he said, "must realize that old clothing will not save the doomed Jewish survivors in Foland. The TGZ needs each on the spot, which will enable it to buy food and other necessities."

Jews in many of the displaced persons' camps in Germany lack warm clothing, resulting in an accelerated death rate from tuberculesis, Dr. Joseph Weil, a director of the GES, told the conference. He said that it was not too late to set up sanatoria to are for the many sick emong the Jewish refugees.

#### 1575 DO NOT SEEK EMIGRATION FROM WEST EUROPEAN COUNTRIES, HIAS DIRECTOR REPORTS

NEW YORK, Jan. 13. (JTA) -- The need for large scale Jewish emigration from Central and Eastern Europe to Palestine and other overseas countries was emphasized here today in a statement issued by Isaac Z. Asofsky, exceutive director of the HIAS, Estrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Scolety, who has just returned from a six-week study of conditions of displaced Jews in various European countries. He emphasized that was in Western Europe do not desire to emigrate.

"With few exceptions, the native Jewish population of France, Holland and Beljum do not seek to emigrate from these countries, Mr. Asofaky said. There are no
visible signs of anti-Zemitism in these countries, although for a short time after V-B
by there were local manifestations of anti-Semitism in France. But these were conlimed to individuals who resembed the necessity of returning homes and other property
which had been conflicated from the Jews by the Hanis and had found their way into the
hands of some Frenchman. But great progress has been made in the re-transfer of such

On the other hand, German Austrian and Polish refugees, and displaced Jews (merally who are scattered in temporary havens all over Europe, face a bleak and hopeless future unless early stops are taken to enable them to emigrate to Falestine and other countries where they can set up permanent homes, kr. Living conditions in the refugee camps have improved comewhat, but are still unsatisfactory, and the danger of epidemics brought on by lack of sufficient food, clothing and fuel is still great.
