## RITISH PARLIAMENT DISCUSSES SOVIET BAN ON ANGLO-U.S. INQUIRY COMMITTEE IN BALKANS

IONDON, March 4. (JTA) -- The British Government was asked today to lodge a protest with Moscow against the action of Soviet military authorities in barring the aglo-American Inquiry Committee on Palestine from Hungary and Rumania.

Capt. Leonard David Gammans, Conservative member of the British Parliament, the suggested that such a protest be made, insisted that the action of the Soviot untherlities was an unfriendly act "in view of the fact that more Jews are alive in impary and Aumania than in any other part of Europe."

Minister of State Philip J. Noel-Baker, replying, said that the representations wild not serve any useful purpose, since the inquiry committee had already left surope. He added that the matter was discussed with Soviet officials and that sales were made to secure entry of the committee into Hungary and Rumania, but the associations were not successful.

#### CAIRO GENERAL STRIKE FORCES ANGLO-AMERICAN INQURY BODY TO POSTPONE HEARINGS

CAIRO, March 4. (JFA) -- The Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry on Palestine was compelled to call off its scheduled hearings today because of a general strike which parelyzed Cairo. The strike was called to protest the death of Egyptions killed by British troops during the rioting here on Feb. 21.

The committee plane to hold final hearings here tomorrow, at which a spokesman for the Iraq Government will be heard, as well as representatives of the extremist Wollem Brotherhood, the Ageb Union; the Moslem Youth Organization and, perhaps, spokesmon for Arabs in Libya and Tunisia:

# Jewish Agency Draws Up List Of Persons to Testify At Inquiry Committee

JERURALEM, March 4. (JTA).-Members of the political department of the Jevieh Agency met today at Dr. Chaim Weizmann's home in Rehoboth and drew up a list of Joviah representatives who will testify before the Anglo-American inquiry committee when it starts hearings here on Friday.

The list will not be made public before Thursday, but it is understood that it includes representatives of all Jevien groups in the country, political as well an othercial and industrial. Whe. Binnche Dugdale, niece of Lord Balfour an outspoken pro-Zionist, is also expected to testify. She arrived in Palestine today.

# MANIAN OFFICERS GO ON TRIAL IN BUCHAREST FOR MASSACRE OF 40,000 JEWS IN ODESSA

BUCHAREST, March 4. (JTA) -- General Michail Barkan, former prefect of the robot district in Rumania, and five others went on trial here today for anti-Jev-sh crimes.

The defendants are charged with the murder of 40,000 Jews in Odessa and the sportation of 13,000 Jews from the Derohoi area to Transmistria. Of the latter group, aly 6,000 survived.

#### ECHOSLOVAK JEWS CAN VOTE ONLY AS SLAVS; NO LONGER CONSIDERED A MINORITY

PRAGUE, March 4. (JTA) -A new electoral law just adopted by the Czechoslovak arliament limits the franchise to citizens of "Slavonic nationality," thus, in rinciple at least, degriving those who previously claimed Jewish nationality of the int to vote.

In practice, however, since the Government no longer recognizes a Jewish incrity, the Jews will have the right to vote as citizens of Czechcalovakia. Jewish saders are understood to be making an effort, however, to restore the franchise to was as such.

(A report from Frague received in Jerusalem says that 84 Czech Jews who rewrned to Czechoslovakia from Falestine last November, were robbed by a band of usso-German deserters near the Czech-Austrian frontier, and stripped of their clothes and money. The robbery was reported in a letter from one of the repatriates to his on in Falestine.)

# 0,000 ARABS ENTERED PALESTINE ILLEGALLY. GOVERNMENT REPORTS: MANY ARE IN HAIFA

JENUSALEM, March 4. (JTA) -- There are at present more than 10,000 Arabs in alestine who entered the country illegally, an official Government estimate revealed today. Most of these illegal immigrants are concentrated in the Haifa district, the Covernment said.

The Hebrev press and Jevish leaders today protested the refusal of British illitary authorities to allow male settlers from nearby colonies to replace, temcrarily, the men of the colony of Biriyn, who were "arrested Friday, following an Alleged attack on an Arab Legion camp in the vicinity of the colony.

The officer commanding the Galilee district allowed 20 settlers from neighoring villages to work in Biriya during the day yesterday, but they were compelled to return to their homes at nightfall, leaving the colony without protection.

The press also reports that J.J. Somerville, Assistant District Commissioner in the Nazareth area, has been advising Araba not to sell lands to Jevs. Somerville is quoted as declaring at an auction of Arab lands, which were purchased by the Jeviah Estional Fund, that "I cannot comprehend how you tolerate the transer of Arab land to Jevs."

# ERITISH CIVIL LIBERTIES GROUP ASKS OUTLAWING OF FASCIST PROPAGANDA AND ACTIVITIES

#### OND JEWS IM SHANGHAI SLUM IN DESPERATE NEED OF BUISING: LOOK FORWARD TO EMIGRATION

SEANCHAI, March 4. (JTA) -- The 14,000 Jews surviving in the Hongkew alum section Stanghei, which the Japanese turned into a ghetto during the war, are still deseately in need of clothing and housing, although they are being fed by the Joint tribution Committee and UNHAA, an investigation by a Jevieh Telegraphic Agency respondent reveals. Most of the refugees are deeply concerned over the possibiliar of smigration and Te-establishing themselves in other countries.

With immediate food relief being provided and clothing promised by UNERA totals, the most pressing problem still to be solved is housing. The majority of refugees live in crowded camps, in various sake-shift buts and in scartily furbed basement apartments. These housing arrangements have one thing in common-act of elementary sanitation and of even the most primitive conveniences. With general housing shortage that arists in Shanghai, there seems to be no hope of oving the Jews from their hovels and furnishing them with living quarters which mean any degree of comfort and sanitation.

The morale of the Jews is suffering because they cannot begin to rebuild their es until they are enabled to entgrate to a country of their choice. Apparently y a few of them desire to remain in China and be absorbed within that nation's may, lost of the others are faced with the problem of no capital to start them in a new country, and the older people fear that their ability to work will not up to the standards required to make ends meet in a new country. All of them want provide for themselves and be done with relief, but few can find means of accompaning this aim.

# IS EXTRACTED 17 TORS OF GOLD FROM TESTE OF 4,000,000 VICTIMS AT OSWISCIM DEATH CAMP

LONDON, March 4. (JTA) -- The Mazis extracted 17 tons of gold from the teeth of is 4,000,000 people, mostly Jews, whom they gassed at Osviccim, the London news-are covering the trial of Bruno Tesch at Hamburg reported today.

The statistics were given at the trial by a Rumanian Jewiah doctor, Charles immed Bendel, who was an immate at the camp from 1943 to 1945, and who estimated to more than a million people were gassed during the time he was at Oswiccin.

### A.H.C. VOTES TO REMAIN WITHIN AMERICAN JEWISH CONFERENCE; NEUTRAL ON ZICHISM

CINCINNATI, March 4 (JTA) -- By an overwhelming majority, which was later size unanimous, the delegates to the 39th council of the Union of American Hebrew engregations, meeting here, voted to remain within the American Jewish Conference hat affirmed the action of its executive board in its relations with the Conference.

The motion to register the unanimous woto of the council was made by Rabbi man J. Schachtel of Houston and seconded by William H. Fineshriber, of Philadelphia, we well-known anti-Zionist leaders of the American Council for Judaism. The actual ote on the two questions, the continuance within the Conference and the affirmation of the interim actions of the board, showed a majority of about six to one.

The resolution voted upon, which defined the Union's position on political ionism as neutral, declared that "the Union recognized the right of each individual o determine his own attitude on this controversial question." The resolution adopted as a reaffirmation of the action taken by the executive board at its meeting in bicago on January 18, 1944 which each?

"The Union, continuing as a member of the American Jewish Conference, declares to sense of fellowship with all Israel and will associate itself with all worthy at practical efforts designed to ameliorate the tragic plicit of world Jewry and coasist in reconstruction of those communities that have suffered from the savages of Mast Agreemy.

"Because in the congregations of the Union there are divergent opinions on the aestion of Zionism, the Union recognized the right of each individual to determine is own attitude on this controversial question, and therefore the Union refrains rom taking any action on the Palestine Resolution adopted by the American Jewish onference. We call upon our congregations and their members to rally loyally to the upport of the Union so that its great and noble work may continue to enrich the printual life of American Iereal."

# Silver, Nonsky Urgs Participation; Rabbi Lazaron Leads Opposition

Rabbi Fineshriber in seconding the motion to make the action of the delegates maninous said: "the overwhelming opinion of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations to remain within the fold of the American Jevish Conference. My main objection to conference has been that it was largely a paper organization. Maybe, with the spact of the Union behind it, it will be a forceful dynamic figure in Jewish life he world over." In the debate preceding the action, principal addresses in favor f the conference were delivered by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, President the Conference of American Rabbis, and Henry Monsky of Omaha, 60-chairman I the American Jewish Conference.

The major presentation of the case against remaining within the conference was ade by Rebbi Morris Lagaron of Baltimore who, in asking the Union of American shows Congregations "to be neutral in action as well as in word," derived that participation in the American Jevish Conference was not true neutrality." The mandment, which called upon the Union to withdraw from the conference, was introduced y Richard Sloss of San Prancisco.

Rabbi Silver, in urging participation within the conference, pointed out that minority in a legislative body such as the Congress of the United States would not lithdraw from the Congress if they were outwored on an issue. He similarily urged

e Union not to withdraw, even if it could not subscribe to the Palestine resolution the Conference. To withdraw, said Rabbi Silver, "would not be a contribution to ity of democracy."

Mr. Monsky, drawing an analogy between the Union and the B'nai B'rith both of ich organizations, because of their diverse membership, had not taken a stand on a Jevish commonwealth issue, warned the delegates that to withdraw from the conference would "to isolate the UAEC from Jevish life,"

## Jewish Community Must Not Be Split By Controversy Over Zionism, Freehof Says

Predicting that "England and the United States will soon present a definite bution for the problem of Palestine and will press for the adoption of that solution as a permanent decision of the United Nations Organization," Rabbi Solomon B. reshof of Pittsburgh emphasized that it is the function of the Synagogue to be abderting and mediating influence" in the fight between Zicnist and anti-Zioniste.

We must be careful not to change the structure of American Jewish life in a controversy over Zionism, because the future of Israel all over the world is way dependent upon American Jewry, not only for what we send oversees, but for what are here at home; no matter how important the controversy is, the stability of seriesn religious life-in which the Union of American Hebrew Congregations plays so mortant a part—is a vital factor in world Jewish future." he said.

Dr. Freehof, said that he believed that the ultimate Anglo-American proposals a Palestine will "be a solution which will have the strongest guarantee of permanence." sacfar as the Jews are concerned, said Rabbi Freehof, the "solution may be a little ses than Zionists ask for and it may well be more than anti-Zionists would wish, but atther will be able to do much about it. Neither will send guerillas to wage war gainst the decision of the United Nations Organization. The decision will be fairly sceptable and afterwards will be accepted."

The issues were defined last night in a town meeting discussion in which the articipants were Rabbi Joshua Loth Liebman of Boston, Rabbi Irving F. Reichert of un Francisco, Issae Heller of New Orleans and M.M. Dannenbaum of Houston. Robert . Goldman presided.

## .D.C. WORK IN GERMANY NOT AFFECTED BY TRUMAN'S LICENSING OF RELIEF AGENCIES

NEW YORK, March 4. (JTA).-President Truman's designation of eleven national slief agencies as the Council of Relief Agencies Licensed for Operation in Germany splies only to the specific agencies included in the list and interested in relief or German civilians and will not offect the extensive relief and rehabilitation proma carried on for Jewish survivors and displaced persons in Germany by the Joint latribution Committee, it was emphasized today in a statement by Dr. Joseph C. Hyman, Locutive vice-chairman of the J.D.C.

Dr. Hyman noted that some confusion has arisen in view of the announcement that the Council of Relief Agencies will be the only recognized organization in the United fates for handling American contributions for German civilian relief. Since the Joint Istribution Committee, major American agency on behalf of distressed Jews overseas, as not included in the list, Dr. Hyman said, inquiries have been directed to the LD.C. concerning continuation of the J.D.C. program in Germany.

More than \$13,750,000 has been spent by the Joint Distribution Committee for the relief and rehabilitation of Jews in Europe during the first quarter of 1946, the regamization has disclosed. A total of fifty thousand letters from displaced Jevs in sups in Germany and Austria to relatives abroad has been processed through the JDC's aris message center, the JDC also reported.

## AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE WARNS QUINN DECISION MAY HELP SPREAD OF UNDEMOCRATIC IDEAS

NEW YORK, March 4. (JTA) -- The New York City Board of Education's exoneration of Miss May Quinn, who was charged with spreading anti-Semitic, anti-Negro and anti-alien propagands in the city schools, has been attacked in a statement by Ralph E. Sammel, chairman of the New York Chapter of the American Jeviah Committee, who warned that the "trifling penalty imposed on Miss Quinn for dereliction of duty" may be interpreted "by blas-minded teachers" as an encouragement to "bring anti-democratic theories" into classrooms.

Mr. Samuel called upon New Yorkers not to permit the Quinn case to be "forgotten" and declared that the American Jevish Committee vill press further action against the Beard's decision by "supporting the campaign of the United Parents' Association." Meanwhile, parents at the new school to which Miss Quinn was transferred have protested to supervisory educational officers and have picketed the school demanding Miss Quinn's dismissal. Some parents have amnounced that they will not sermit their children to sit in Miss Quinn's classes.

A project to study group and race prejudices in children has been instituted by the American Jewish Committee and is being carried out at the Institute of Child Welfare of the University of California, Dr. John Slawson, executive vice president of the committee announced today. The various influences affecting the spread of prejudice and the age at which it begins to manifest itself are the primary aims of the study, which is being carried on among 160 children all of whom are approximately 17 years old and have been under observation by California University studenters since birth.

#### WORLD JEWISH CONGRESS INITIATES "ADOPT A FAMILY" PLAN: PERSONALIZED RELIEF PROGRAM

NEW YORK, March 4. (JTA) -A "personalized" relief plan, wherein families in America and elsewhere will "adopt" families overseas by communicating with them and sending them food and clothing, has been instituted by the World Jewish Congress, the organization announced today. The Congress is compiling a list of the needlest cases.

Dr. Moshe Polakievicz, member of the advisory council on European Jevish affairs of the Congress, departed yesterday for La Paz, Bolivia, on the first leg of a tour of South American countries. Dr. Polakievicz, who last year visited various Central American Jevish communities, will confer with organizations affiliated with the World Jevish Congress on political, economic, and cultural problems confronting them. From Bolivia he will proceed to Chile, Columbia, Ecuador, Peru, Uruguay, and Venezuela.

# MEXICAN ZIONIST ORGANIZATION CONDUCTING FOLL ON THREE MAJOR JEWISH QUESTIONS

MEXICO CITY, March &. (JTA) -- The Zionist Organization of Mexico is conducting a poll to ascertain the opinion of Jews toward three major Jewish questions, the organization has aumounced here.

The questions asked all Jevish men and women over the age of 18 are: 1. Do you favor immediate abolition of the White Paper; 2. Do you favor free immigration into Palestine under Jevish control; 3. Do you favor a public statement to the United Sations Organization on the rights of the Jews to Palestine.
