REFUGEES DELIAINED AT LA SPEZIA CALL HUNGER STRIKE: INSIST ON SAILING FOR PALESTINE

LA SPEZIA, Italy, April 9. (JTA) -- The 1.040 Jewish refugees who were detained here as they were preparing to embark on the Italian steamer "Fede" for Palestine, today were on the second day of a hunger strike in protest against the anthorities refusal to permit the ship to depart.

The refugees, who are confined on the "Fede," announced their determination to remain until the ship proceeds to Palestine. Only children under 17, of whom there are a handful, and pregnant women numbering about 100 of the 340 women aboard, are exempt from the hunger strike.

Jewish community leaders here have telegraphed to the Pope, as well as to the American, British and Soviet ambassadors at Rome, and members of the Anglo-American inquiry committee now meeting at Lausanne, appealing to them to intervene on behalf of the detained refugees.

Dr. Umberto Nachon, representative in Italy of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, left today for Genoa to confer with officials of the Allied Commission resarding disposition of the refusees. He visited the passengers yesterday and reported that they were maintaining discipline and good spirits even in the midst of the hunger strike. The passengers have raised the Zionist fleg alongside the ship's Italian emblem.

Police Chief Russo of La Spezia today told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that had the refugees told him they were Jews, he would have allowed them to proceed without any interference. He explained that the police halted the lorries on which the refugees arrived for embarka; on because they thought the Jews were fascists for them the authorities were hunting. The suspicions of the police, he stated, were heightened by the fact that the refugees refused to answer any questions. For want of better quarters, since La Spezia is a badly battered city and port, the police put the refugees aboard the craft on which they intended to sail for Palestine.

Allied Commission Emberrassed; Jews Remove Vital Parts of Ship's Engines

Parlier reports had stated that the Italian authorities had arrested the refugees and had halted the ship on orders from the Allied Commission. Actually, the Allied Commission is now apparently embarrassed and is seeking to persuade the refugoes, who came here without documents from all parts of Europe, to accept the status of displaced persons and to consent to be removed to a camp at Chiavari, a town near La Spezia. The passengers, however, have rejected all the blandishments of the authorities, reiterating their threat to sink their ship, and to drown with it, unless permitted to sail.

Further evidencing their determination to resist all efforts to move them, the passengers have removed vital parts of the ship's engines making movement imposuible in the event the authorities try to transport them abound the craft to some place other han Palestine. The engines, however, can be repaired within two hours should the interities relent and permit the Feder to sail for Palestine. A 25-year-old Rumanian, Moshe Feldmen, is providing strong and colorful lead-

NUREMBERG COURT TO PREVENT WAR CRIMINALS FROM USING TRIAL FOR ANTI-SEMITIC PROFESANDA

NURMERIC, April 9 (JTA) -- Following a charge by U.S. Prosecutor Robert Jackson that the defense was seeking to use the International Military Tribunal as a "sounding board" for its anti-Semitism, the court decided today to appoint a special official to pass on the relevance of all material submitted for printing by defense attorneys.

Jackson's ire was aroused by material printed by the court's presses for Alfred Rosenberg, which contained what he described as "violently anti-Samitic and irrelevant rubblah." He said that "the United States cannot print and disseminate this violent anti-Semitism. The defense believus we are here to try the issue of the causes of anti-Semitism, with this tribunal as the sounding board. The issue is not Rosenberg's philosophy, but we are charging the murder of four to five million Jews."

Eans Lemmers, former chief of the German Chancellory, admitted yesterday that many thousands of German Government officials knew of the Nazi policy to exterminate the Jews. Called as a defense witness, Lemmers testified that in 1942 Goering received orders from Hitler for the "final solution of the Jewish question," and that the Reichsmarshel had passed these orders on to Heinrich Heydrich, at that time deputy chief of the Gestape, for execution. Lemmers insisted that he did not understand the meaning of the term "final solution."

He was the first defense witness to confess that hundreds of Nazi leaders had been charged with the responsibility for executing the "final solution" and that they in turn passed these instructions on to hundreds and thousands of other lesser officials.

VIEHNA JEWS ELECT NEW COMMUNITY COUNCIL IN FIRST ELECTIONS IN EIGHT YEARS

VIENNA, April 9 (JTA).—In the first free election in eight years, the Jews of Vienna yesterday voted overwhelmingly to retain the present administration of the Jewish community.

Of the 36 seats in the Jewish community council being contested, 33 were won by

the cendidates running on the joint list supported by most of the groups within the community. About 65 percent of the 4,090 persons eligible to vote participated in the elections.

The new council will meet within the next few days to choose a president of the council. It is almost certain that the incumbent, David Brill, will be re-elected.

JEWISH EMPLOYEES IN TEL AVIV POST OFFICE GO ON STRIKE; ASK HIGHER WAGES

TEL AVIV, April 9.(JTA) -- A strike was declared today by more than 400 Jevish clarks and engineers employed by the postoffice. They are asking higher wages and better working conditions. The strikers have appealed to post office engleyees at Jerusalem, Haifa and other Palestinian towns to stand by, ready for a general strike, if the demands are not met.

This afternoon 300 postal and telegraph workers in Jaffa and workers of the power plant at Rehovoth also went out on strike. Telephone workers and operators are also expected to join the strike in Tel Aviv and Jaffa if the government does not yield to the demand of post office employees.

115 JEWISH ORPHANS LEAVE BRITISH ZONE IN GERMANY FOR PALESTINE

MUNICH, April 9. (JTA) -- A transport of 115 Jewish orphans liberated a year ago from the Bergen-Belsen camp, left Hamburg today for Pelostine. They were the first children in the British zone to receive Palestine visas. They are between 6 and 16

EN. MORGAN SAYS 100,000 DISPLACED JEWS COULD BE TRANSPORTED TO PALESTINE IN ONE MONTH

GENEVA, April 9, (JTA) -- Lt. Gen. Sir Frederick E. Morgan, UMERA director in ermany, today told the Anglo-American inquiry committee, which is now preparing its eport in Lausanne, that all the 100,000 displaced Jews in Europe could be transported o Palestine within one month, it was learned here.

All indications point to the fact that the members of the inquiry committee are ividing their report into two parts. One part deals with the interim solution of the alestine problem, while the second concerns the long-range solution.

On the recommendations for dealing with the immediate problems, there seems to e no differences of opinion among the members, except that the American members want o have all the displaced Jews admitted to Palestine by the end of the year, while the ritish want to spread out the 100,000 over a period of years. Essentially there is one agreement among all the members on the necessity of abrogating the white Paper estrictions on Jewish immigration and land purchase.

There are serious differences however, with regard to the long-range solution of he Palestine problem, with the following three plans under consideration: 1. Refirmation of the Palestine Mandate: 2. Proclamation of Palestine as a bi-national tate of Jews and Arabs; 3. Partitioning of Palestine into separate Jewish and Arab tates. While only a minority of the committee is at present in favor of partition, he possibility of favorable action on this proposal is not excluded, it is believed interested circles here.

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- An urgent appeal to the United Nations Committee on efugues and Displaced Persons now meeting in London and to the Anglo-American inquiry omnittee, now deliberating in Switzerland, to assure to the displaced Jews in Germany and to Jews in Eastern European countries "emigration to the places of their choice, noluding Palestine," was made tonight by Judge Simon H. Rifrind, at the first annual seting of the New York Chapter of the American Jewish Committee, at the Hotel Bilt-Dre.

Judge Riftind, who recently returned from Europe where he acted as advisor on wish problems to the U.S. military command, declared that "among the displaced Jews a Germany and Austria there is substantial maninity on this proposition; they want quit Europe. That continent is to them a graveyard of memories. They have chear he road of their own salvation. It leads straight to Palestine. He power on earth an divert them, because they are prepared to accept death rather than surrender."

The meeting was attended by several hundred leading members of the New York Jevah community. Ralph E. Samuel, who presided, was re-elected chairman of the N.Y. hapter. Alanin. Strootk, vice-chairman of the executive committee of the American which Committee, delivered a report on the recently held London conference of Jarish reganizations, in which some 70 delegates of Jevish bodies in 13 countries particle.

Mr. Stroock, who was chairman of the program committee at the conference, declared but there was unanimous agreement on coordinated action by Jevish organizations in Tious countries designed to essure equality for all in the peace treaties soon to concluded with former enemy countries and on implementation and enforcement of human rights provisions in the United Nations charter.

HOUSE GETS RESOLUTION ASKING U.S. TO WITHHOLD RECOGNITION OF TRANSJORDAN'S INDEPENDENCE.

WASHINGTON, April 9. (JTA) -- Accusing Britain of "sabotaging" the Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry on Palestine "by presenting it with the independence of Trans-

can Committee of Inquiry on Palestine "by presenting it with the independence of Transjordan as a fait accompla". Representative Emanuel Cellor, New York Democrat, on the floor of the House today introduced a concurrent resolution asking that the United States Government withhold recognition of Transjordan as an independent state and request all members of the United Nations to take a similar stand.

The resolution emphasized that Britain's action is a "violation of the solemn terms of the mandate over felestine which includes Transjordan" and also violates the Anglo-American convention of 1924 "which protects the rights of American citizens in all of felestine, including Transjordan, and which precludes unilateral infractions of its terms by the parties signatory."

The resolution also charged that by unilaterally granting independence to Transjordan, Britain violated the United Nations charter. The attempted bestowal of independence upon Transjordan is contrary to the purpose of the Anglo-American Committee of Inquiry on Falestine," the resolution points out.

Former Senator Guy M. Gillette of Iowa, president of the American League for a Free Palestine, announced that the organization would ask the State Department to bring before the United Nations the subject of the independence of Transjordan.

reports on anti-semitism in poland are exaggerated, polish minister says in Washington

WASHINGTON, April 9. (JTA) -- Jan Stanczyk, Polish Minister of Labor and Public Welfare, said reports of anti-Semitism in Poland were exaggerated by Polish Jews leaving the country for the United States zone of Germany, in an understandable effort to provide reasons for their emigration.

He explained to a press conference at the Polish Embassy that the 80,000 surviving Jevs in Poland "do not want to live in their own cemetery," that some wish to go to Palestine, that others are too old to begin creation of a new life in a devastated country, and therefore "understandably" exaggerated the degree of anti-Semitism. He said that murders by some criminal bands for purposes of robbery are attributed to ideological reasons.

"We are accused of having too many Jews in high administrative posts," he said, declaring that a high number of "very able Jews" hold important government and industral positions. He cited the Minister of Industry and Deputy Ministers of Labor, Shipping and Foreign Trade, and Justice, as wall as the very responsible post of Undersectary of State for the Prime Minister.

The chief source of anti-Semitism is among the small tradespeople who fear the competition of returned Jews, and emong anti-Government and anti-Rassian "conspirators" no use anti-Semitism to conceal illegal activities, Stanczyk said.

000 Jewish refugers from Europe Land in New York; Majority are women

HEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- Hore than 300 Jewish refugees from Europe arrived here yesterday on the Swedish ship "Drottningtolm" which brought 800 passengers on her first post-war trip to this country. The majority of the Jewish passengers were women liberated by the Allied armies from various Hazi camps.

The Yaad Patrals, an American Jewish orthodox relief group, today announced that ts representatives in Switzerland have succeeded in bringing out of Poland 223 homeless evish children. Of them, 150 will be housed, fed and educated in the orthodox Jewish gradition in Czechoslovskie and 73 in France, the announcement said.

CONSTRUCTION ON HEBREW UNIVERSITY MEDICAL SCHOOL EXPECTED TO BEGIN SHORTLY

NEW YORK, April 9. (JTA) -- Construction on the New Hebrew University medical school on Mt. Scopus in Jerusalem is expected to begin within the next few months, Sir Leon Simon, chairman of the executive committee of the University, disclosed today.

Pointing out that of the 15,000 Jevish physicians in the sections of Europe which were occupied by the Nazis, only about 300 can be accounted for, Sir Leon said that the new medical school will furnish a source of doctors for the devasted European Jevish communities and for the entire Middle East. About 50 students will be admitted yearly during the school's first few years, but it is hoped eventually to train 200 annually, he said.

The faculty for the school is being recruited here and in Europe, Sir Leon revealed, but the institution will be run along Anglo-American lines. A board of American Jewish physicians will act as advisors at present, a \$4,000,000 campaign for the school is under way in the United States.

GERALD L.K. SMITH. "AMERICA FIRST" HEAD. SENTENCED TO 60 DAYS IN JAIL

CHICAGO, April 9. (JTA) -- Gerald L.K. Smith, head of the America First Party, was yesterday sentenced to sixty days imprisonment for contempt of court. The charge arcse from his issuance of a statement attacking the jurisdiction of the court during a disorderly conduct trial in which Arthur Terminiello, suspended Alabams priest, was convicted and fined.

The original disorderly conduct charges filed against Terminiello, Smith, and Fred Rister, Smith's aids resulted from a meeting organized and addressed in Chicago by the three. Terminiello and Smith's publicity agent, Don Lohbeck, still await sentencing on the contempt of court charge.

In sentencing Smith, Judge John V. McCormick said: "If the conduct of you and your associates in and toward an American court of law affords a test of your attitude toward other American institutions, it behooves Americans to look squarely at the philosophy which confronts them."

BENT BRITE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE PLEDGES ALL-OUT SUPPORT FOR TRUMAN CONSERVATION PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, April 9. (JTA) -B'nni B'rith women will attempt to relly all-out support for President Trumen's food conservation program and will collect 1,000,000 signatures throughout the nation pledging complete support of the food savings drive, her Arthur G. Laufman, president of the Women's Supreme Council of B'nai B'rith, amounced at the conclusion of the group's annual three-day meeting here.

Mrs. Laufman, representing the B'nai B'rith women, received the Treasury De-Partment's "Distinguished Services Rendered" citation for the sale of \$291,238,000 worth of war bonds during the war. Mrs. Carmel Gilbert, president of the B'nai B'rith women in England, addressed the meeting and described the British food conservation system. She is visiting this country to obtain financial assistance for the support of refuges children in England.
