jmise refugees at la spezia call off eunger strike; promised a "different status"

IA SPEZIA, Italy, April 11. (JTA) -- The more than 1,000 Jewish refugees who are being held here aboard the Italian ship "Fede," and prevented from proceeding to Palestine, last night ended their hunger strike, which lasted 75 hours.

The strike was suspended until April 19 following a two-hour meeting with Marold Laski, chairman of the British Labor Party, who promised to take up the case of the detained refugees with Ernest Bevin, British Foreign Secretary, and report his exision by that time. Fending Bevin's ruling, the refugees were promised a "differant status" by British Captain Hills of Allied General Headquarters.

The leaders of the refugees presented the British officer with the following four demands: 1. The Italian guards should be removed from the ship; 2. The refugees should be allowed free access to the city of La Spezia; 3. Newspapermen should be permitted to visit the ship freely; 4. The four Italian officials who were arrested for displaying sympathy with the detained Jews should be released.

While not committing himself on all points, Hills indicated that these demands will probably be accepted by higher authorities. The presence of an official from the british embassy who came from Rome to attend the conference with the refugees gave the agreement an official character.

Over 80 Faint During Hunger Strike: Two Men Attempt Suicide

The suspension of the hunger strike climaxed a grim day furing which over eighty men and women fainted. Two men tried to hang themselves on the gate of the pler. Dr. Boris Schwartzman, one of the passengers, said that the continuation of the strike might have resulted in an epidemic, possibly typhus, because of the weakened physical condition of the strikers.

The refugees agreed to accept food provided by the Joint Distribution Commit-40, so that their own food supplies can be saved for the Palestine trip, which they are now confident they will be able to make. The food which the J.D.C. will supply to the refugees will include matzohs and other Passover necessities.

Meanwhile, the refugees today received messages of encouragement from Jevish organizations in the United States and Palestine stating that everything possible is being done to secure the release of the "Fode."

The Jevish National Council of Palestine cabled to the refugees that the Hanny will not relax in its efforts to bring you to the Homeland." The World Jewish Congress told the refugees in a cable that it is intervening with the British and Merican governments.

PALESTINE JEWS CALL CENTRAL STRIKE IN SYMPATHY WITH IA SPEZIA REFUGEES

JERUSALEM, April 11. (JTA) -- The Jewish National Council of Palestine today decided to call a general strike and a one-day fast for next Sunday in sympathy with the more than 1,000 Jewish refugees detained at La Spezia.

Meanwhile, Chief Rabbis Herzog and Uziel today cabled to King George of Great hritin appealing for his personal intervention to secure permission for the refugees to proceed to Falestine. Similar appeals were cabled by the Chief Rabbis to Prevident frame and Brittah Prime Minister Attlee.

The Histadruth, the Palestine federation of labor, cabled the British Labor Party, the American Federation of Labor and the C.I.O., the World Federation of Trade Minons in Paris and the Socialist Party in Italy asking them to assist the Jews detailed on board the "Fede."

The decision to call a general strike and a fast was taken at an extraordinary setting of the Jevish National Council, with the participation of representatives of all loading Jevish organizations. The meeting also decided that a number of selected Jevish leadors should start on a hunger strike tomorrow, to last until the refugees at La Spezia are permitted to proceed to Falestine. (The decision was taken before the Council Learnes of the decision by the refugees to suspend their hunger strike until April 19.)

MAZI POLICE HEAD WHO DIRECTED KILLING OF JEWS SAYS HE WAS UNAWARE OF ATROCITIES

NURMERG, April 11. (JTA) -- Ernst Kaltenbrunner, chief of the German Security Police, under whose direction millions of Jews were murdered in Eastern Europe, told the International Military Tribunal today that he was unaware of the stemination of Jews for many months and, when he learned of them, he had protested to Hitler concerning the policy of Gestano chief Heinrich Himmler.

Despite the laughter with which the audience greeted these denials, Kaltonbruner also claimed that he was not responsible for ordering the Lutwaffe to bomb the Jevish camps of Landsberg and Muchildorf which was charged in an affidavit by Bertus Gerous, his former secretary. After Serous allegedly sabotaged the order, and averated the camps destruction, Kaltenbrunner ordered the Landsberg Jevs to be sent to Bachau where they were to be poisoned, while the Muchildorf prisoners were turned over to the Gestapp for rilling.

first U.S. VISAS GRANTED TO DISPLACED JENS IN GERMANY BY CONSULATE IN FRANKFURT

FRANKFURT, April 11. (JTA) -- The HIAS announced today receipt of the first 15 imigration visas issued by the United States consulate here. Visa number one went to 17-year-old Marta Ickowic, whose entire family was mordered in Oswiecim. She received a HAS corporate affidavit and will be placed with a family in the United States.

Visas were also granted to Berek and Dora Braunstein and their nine-year-old daughter Bins, who will live with Berek's brother in Manchester, Tennesse. Recently married Anna and Eliaz Chaja also received visas and will live with Anna's family in Detroit. The other nine were assigned to young men and women between the ages of 16 and 25.

INTER-PARTY PARLEY TO DISCUSS RESTORATION OF JEWISH PROPERTY PLANNED IN SLOVAKIA

ERATISLAVA, April 11. (JTA) -- In a letter today to Adalbert Winterstein, presented of the Union of Jevish Communities in Slovakia, to-Chairman Joseph Lettrich of the Slovak National Council, who is also chairman of the Democratic Party, revealed that he is prepared to convene an inter-party conference to draft a program for restoring confiscated Jevish property.

Lettrich said that he considered the claims of Slovak Jevs for property restition to be just and desired that a solution of the problem be reached as soon as possible. At the inter-party meeting, which would probably consist of representatives of the Democratic and Communist parties, which share control in Slovakia, Jewish spotemen would be invited to present their demands, he added.

(The Bratislava newspaper Pravda, official orga; of the Slovak Communist Party, in an issue which has just arrived in New York, says that the question of large agricultural estates confiscated from Jews by the Nazi pupper regime must be treated in line with the land reform laws adopted by the Government. It mrges that since it has been decreed that a person may own only the amount of land which he or his family can untitwist themselves, Jews should be allowed to reposses as much of their former property as they can now work, and should be compensated for all other holdings, which should be divided among the peasantry. Jewish estates which have already been percelled out among peasants should remain the property of the new owners, the paper says, but the former owners should be peid an officially prescribed price.)

Slovak Jeva are encountering other difficulties besides that of recovering their property. Under present Czechoślowak law, a "political reliability" certificate is needed by those applying for citizenship and other legal documents. Jeva who assert that they always were of Slovak nationality are forced to prove that they so indicated in both the census of 1938 and that of 1939. Even if they can do so, but if they listed Emmarian or German as their mather tongue, they are considered of German or European autionality.

JEMISH ROLE IN REBUILDING POLISH STATE LAUDED BY OFFICIALS AT LODZ CEREMONY

10DZ, Poland, April 11. (JTA) -- The part played by Jews in the anti-German underground and in reconstructing a democratic Polish state was lauded here by official speakers addressing the opening coremonies of a home for Jewish youth.

The Jevish committee here has up to now registered 38,000 Jews, of whom 48 percent had returned from concentration comps, 17 percent from hiding places with friendly foles, 10 percent from the forests and partisans units and 25 percent from the WESR.

FRANCE STEAMER SAILING FROM MARSKILLES WEST WEEK WITH 1,000 PALESTINE IMMIGRANTS

PARIS, April 11. (JTA) -- The French steamer Champollion is lessing Margellles on April 17 for Palestine, carrying approximately 1,000 Jewish refugees from eight combries, about two-thirds of whom will be children, it was announced here today.

The transportation is being arranged by the Jevish Agency, with the JTC paying for the refugees' passage, and the HIAS financing their transportation to Marseilles by rell from various points in Europe.

MURICAN JENS LAUDED IN PALESTINE BY DR. GRANOVSKY FOR THEIR SUPPORT OF ZIONISM

TEL AVIV, April 11. (JTA) -- American Jewry is proud of the Palestine Jewish community's achievements and will stand by and assist the Jews in their struggle to stablish a national home in Palestine, Dr. Abraham Granovsky, managing director of the Jewish National Fund today told a press conference here, reporting on his recent what to the United States.

Dr. Granovsky expressed appreciation of the reception accorded him in America and pressed Judge Morris Rothenberg's leadership of the American J.N.F. He said that the Limits movement in the United States was making great numerical strides, and pulmed out that even the non-Zionists were insistent that Palestine represented the may rossible solution for the homeless Jews of Europe.

Discussing his visit in America, Dr. Granovsky said he was impressed by the smallarity of the American spirit and the spirit of "new Palestine." He hailed Ameria smpathy with the Jewish cause and said that both the U.S. and Palestine were seeking a "better world of positive creative achievement."

MEM YORK, April 11. (JTA) -- A resolution urging that the forthcoming World Monist Congress be held in the United States, and not in Palestine as scheduled, was depted here at the national conference of the United Zionist-Revisionists of Ameria, which takes in the New Zionist Organization, the Jewish State Party and the formatisation aroun of Zionists-Revisionists.

The conference adopted a platform for the elections to the Congress suggestme, among other things, that "the Congress must proclaim the necessity of establish-Ws Provisional Jevish Government to be entrusted with the administration of the restanceatic Jevish Republic." A budget of \$600,000 was adopted by the conference of the next six months.

Canadian Zionists Request Congress Be Held in United States

(JTA) -- Asserting that the contemplated release of Haj in al hasseini, ex-mufti of Jerusalem, would involve the French Republic in a violain of the United Nations pledge to prosecute all war criminals, henry Monsky, chairm of the American Jevish Conference, teday cabled French Foreign Minister Georges that urging detention of the Arab leader.

INTERCOVERNMENTAL REFUGEE BODY HEAD SUGGESTS BASIS FOR DEFINING "REFUGEES" AND "DP'S"

LONDON, April 11. (JTA) -- Definitions which would provide a basis for placing persons in the categories of "refugees" or "displaced persons" were presented to the United Nations Committee on Refugees and Displaced Persons today by Sir Herbert Emerson, chairman of the Intergovernmental Committee for Refugees.

"Refugees" would be defined as persons who had left their country of nationality or residence through fear of loss of life or liberty or because of religious or recial persons. "Displaced persons" would be those who were obliged to leave their nees by reason of World War II or were displaced inside their own countries by deliberate action of the enemy.

Whatever definition is finally decided upon, Sir Herbert said, there should be no distinction made among the various groups, and all needing help should receive it. He stated that whether a refugee was technically stateless or possessed the passport of a country to which he did not wish to return was irrelevant. He stressed, however, that while the refugees and DP's should have the right to refuse to return, the Governments of the countries involved should not be entitled to refuse them entrance.

SIDNEY HILLMAN ASKS ADMISSION OF 100,000 JEWS TO PALESTINE, AEROGATION OF WHITE PAPER

NEW YORK, April 11. (JTA) -- The immediate admission of 100,000 displaced Jews to Palestine and abrogation by the British Labor Government of the "infamous White Paper of its Tory predecessor" was demanded here last night by Sidney Hillman, president of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, and American delegate to the World Federation of Trade Unions, in a speech before the annual dinner of the Clothing, Woolens, and Allied Trades Dirision of the United Jewish Appeal.

Hillman, who recently returned from a tour of Germany and Austria, said that the displaced Jews "almost without exception, were living from day to day with a single hope-to emigrate to Palestine-the only spot in the whole world where they can hope to resume living as human beings." Declaring that the British Government holds the Palestine Mandate as a trust for which it is responsible before the democratic world, Hillman said the fate of the displaced Jews "is not something for Britain to dispose of in the own marrow national interest."

ARMY CANNOT SOLVE PROBLEM OF JEWISH DP'S, DR. BERNSTEIN REPORTS AFTER EUROPEAN TRIP

MEW YORK, April 11. (4TA) - "The Army is trying to do a humane job for the displaced persons in Germany, but is confronted with an impossible situation," Rabbi Philip 5. Bernstein, former chairman of the Army and Many Religious Activities committee of the Jovish Welfare Board, said here today following his return from a tour of England, Prance and Germany.

Dr. Bernstein, who went to England to participate in the United Palestine Appeal campaign there, declared that the Army was providing food and sufficient housing to maintain the DP's, but that the Army was not "equipped by training or function to deal sympathetically and effectively" with psychological and spiritual problems confronting the displaced persons. He cited the recent Stuttgart raid by German policemen in which one Jew was killed and four wounded as evidence of such shortcomings.

RUMAN STILL PAYORS PEDERAL PAIR EMPLOYMENT LEGISLATION; HE TELLS PRESS CONFERENCE

WASHINUTON, April 11. (JTA) -- President Truman told his press conference today that he still favored federal FEFC legislation, adding that state bans on discrimimation could be emacted at the same time.

EVISH VETERARS AND WAR WORKERS TURNING TO FARMING, AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY REPORTS

NEW YORK, April 11. (JTA) -- Jewish war veterans and former civilian war soriers make up the majority of American Jews who are now turning to agriculture, Dr. abriel Davidson, managing director of the Jewish Agricultural Society, which aids sews in settling on the land, reported today in the organization's forty-sixth annual report.

Citing the war record of Jevish farmers, Dr. Davidson points out that not may did Jevish farmers increase production on the land, but that in some eastern and sid-vestern communities they supplied a higher percentage of soldiers and sailors than the general farm population. A "spot check," conducted by the Society and the National evish Welfare Board in sections of Michigan, Connecticut and New Jarsey containing typical Jevish farm settlements, revealed that 7.5 percent of Jevish male farmers setween the ages of 18-14 joined the armed services as compared with the national farm verage of 6.2 percent.

Dr. Davidson's report discloses that 95 percent of all Jewish farmers who setled on the land just before World War II and during the var years have remained at heir new occupation. The report also declares that the Jewish farm population of parly 150,000 men, women and children is in "a healthy and prosperous situation."

The Jevish Agricultural Society has expanded its activities within recent ears, Dr. Davidson reveals. During the past year the Society opened a vestern office in Los Angeles where the Jevish population is growing and "where the outlook for new gricultural settlers is bright." During the last decade the organization has settled j.000 people on land throughout the country, and more than \$10,000,000 in farm loans are been hant since the inception of the Society, the report said.

Oldsst Jewish Agricultural School Opens Summer Session, Celebrates 50th Anniversary

NEW YORK, April 11. (JTA) -- The National Farm School, the oldest Jewish farm chool in the U.S., today announced the opening of registration for the summer session numencing in June.

The school, which is near Doylestown, in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, is celerating its fiftieth anniversary this month. In a message of greating commemorating its establishment, President Truman recently wrote: "The origin of the National Farm chool is as interesting as its subsequent history has been notable."

The school has established a counselling service for veterans who wish to tudy under the C.I. Bill of Rights. Each student, who must be a high school graduate, a required to do agricultural work as part of the school curriculum. For this work he credited with \$600 toward his maintenance and tuition costs.

R. ICHACY SCHMARZBARF, PORMER DEFUTY IN POLE EXILE PARLIAMENT, TO MAKE HOME IN U.S.
