# TRANSPORT OF JEWISH REPUGEES DETAINED IN ITALY: TAKEN OFF TRAIN BY LOCAL POLICE

ROME, April 18. (JTA) .. A transport of 116 Jews, said to be an route to Pales-, was detained today by local authorities at the Udine railroad station, in North-Italy. They were taken off the train although they were in possession of railway kets to Trieste.

## ST 150 BERLIN JEWS WILL EMIGRATE TO AMERICA HEXT MONTH: MORE TO FOLLOW

HERLIN, April 18. (JTA) -- About 150 Berlin Jews will be included in the first pment of immigrants admitted to the United States under President Trumen's direce, Carlos Warner, American consul at Berlin, told the Jevish Telegraphic Agency

Despite a shortage of skilled personnel, office equipment and legal documents. ich has existed for several months, emigration procedure vill be speeded up after first transport leaves early next month, Warner said. He stated that the full pthly quots would be dispatched to the United States in future months.

MARSEILLES, April 18. #### MANS FRANK PLEADS CUILITY TO MASS-MURDER OF JEWS IN POLAND AT NURFMEERG TRIAL

NUREMBERG, April 18. (JTA) -- Admitting that he had participated in the extermination of Jevs, Hans Frank, Nazi governor-general in Poland, said here today that at will take 1.000 years for Germany to rid itself of the guilt for these crimes.

The first of the 20 defendants to freely admit his role in murdering millions of European Jews, Frank, in reply to questions by his counsel, asserted that during the five months of testimony which has been presented here since the trial began he has become aware of all the atrocities committed by the Mazis, and "I feel terrible milt within me.

"If Adolf Hitler drove the German people to this course, the evidence of which we have seen, then I, too, must accept responsibility," he continued, adding that "I manut allow that responsibility should be pushed on smaller men." The man who became nown as the "butcher of Poland," denied he had been responsible for the establishment of concentration camps, but admitted he had ordered the creation of guettos.

#### PRACTIE DECREE ON RESTORATION OF JEWISH PROPERTY WILL BE EXTENDED TO SLOVAKIA

PRACUE, April 18. (JTA) -- The central government decree providing for the estoration to Jews of property confiscated by the Mazis, which up to now has been perative only in Bohemia and Moravia, is to be extended to Slovakia, it was learned oday.

An agreement to this effect has been reached as a result of current negotiations etween officials of the central Government and Slovak authorities on a number of basic roblems affecting Czech-Slovak relations.

The text of the agreement on property restoration will be submitted shortly to resident Benes and his cabinet for approval. Slovak Jewish circles hope that it will esult in speeding the return of Jewish property, which has been lagging in Slovakia.

# TALIAN GOVERNMENT WILL NOT HINDER DEPARTURE OF LA SPEZIA REFUGES, SAYS PREMIER

ROME, April 18. (JTA) - The Italian Government will not hinder the departure run La Spezia of the "Fede," on which 1,040 Jewish refugees plan to sail for Palesine, Premier Alcide de Gasperi today told a Jewish delegation headed by Dr. Umberto schon, representative of the Jewish Agency in Italy. Instructions to this effect have seen issued by the Ministry of the Interior, the Premier revealed.

Premier de Gasperi also told the delegation that he had ordered the Italian mbassador in London to call upon British Foreign Minister Ernest Bevin to secure perission for the "Fede" to leave Italy.

JERUSALEM, April 18. (JPA) -- Plans have been completed for the British Army to perate Palestine's strikehound railways, it was understood in Jerusalem toright. If he strike remains unsettled railway operating companies of the Royal Engineers will agin to move essential freight in a day or two.

#### S EXTERMINATED 1.500.000 JEWS IN BYELORUSSIA DURING OCCUPATION, MOSCOW REPORTS

MOSCOW, April 18. (JTA) -- More than 1,500,000 Jews were exterminated by the is in Byelorussia during their occupation there, it was revealed today in a report based by the Soviet Jewish Information Bureau.

The report said that "of the 1,800,000 Jews who lived in Byelorussia before the there are now only about 300,000." It emphasized that the terror practiced by Nazis in such cities as Minsk, Gemal, Vitebsk, Polotsk, Oraha and in other towns byelorussia, "are beyond human imagination."

The report added that large-scale rehabilitation work is now being conducted the surviving Jevish and non-Jevish population in Byelorussia, and that similar k is going on in Lithuania, especially in the cities of Vilna, Kaunas, Klapeida, ki and Ponievezh.

## DED NATIONS BODY GETS JUNISH AGENCY VIEWS ON SEPTLING OF REPUGEES IN PALESTINE

IONDON, April 18. (JTA) -- A seven-point memorandum outlining Jevish demands a regard to the refugee problem was submitted by the Jevish Agency to the United ions Committee on Refugees and Displaced Persons, it was announced here today, memorandum asks:

- All Jewish refugees and displaced persons desiring to go to Palestine, ald be assisted by the United Nations to do so.
- 2. Steps should be taken by the United Nations to facilitate the immediate assign of 100,000 Jewish refugees to Palestine.
- The United Nations should provide assistance to the Jevish Agency in obhing travel documents, transit visas and transportation for refuxees.
- 4. Jevish displaced persons should be supported from international funds upon ir reaching Palestine, and until they can secure employment.
- An adequate portion of the funds available from reparations should be set be for immigration and settlement of displaced persons in Palestine, and that money ed at the disposal of the Jevish Agency.
- Other financial sources, such as the property of Jews who died heirless,
   Id be used to supplement funds from reparations.
- 7. Arrangements should be made for the Jewish Agency to act in an addisory city to members of the United Nations on all matters relating to the estilement alestine of displaced Jews, as well as to cooperate with the U.R. Economic and al Commoil on matters concerning refuges immigration to Falestine.

## OLISH JEWS BEING REPAIRLATED FROM U.S.S.R. ERINGING 300 TORAHS TO POLISH COMMUNITIES

MOSCOW, April 18. (JTA) -- Polish Jews who are now being repatriated from the J.S.S.R. to Poland are bringing with them 300 torahs in addition to many other relitions books, which they acquired during their ster in the Soviet Union.

Representatives of Jevish groups recently asked the mixed Polish-Soviet restriction commission for permission to take the torahs and prayer books with them had they were repatriated. The commission agreed and issued orders to that effect to all frontier stations.

The majority of the torahs were obtained in the Altai region of southern Siberia. Many purchases were made in the cities of Irkutsk and Tobolek. Some of the religious books were donated by the local Jewish residents. Polish Jews who lived in Bukhara are bringing with them 30 torahs, most of which were the gift of Bukhara Jews. The torahs have a great historical value. Jews from Samarkand are returning with more than 50 torahs.

More than 1,400 Jevish children from Polish children's homes in the U.S.S.R. are among the repatriates, the Central Committee of Polish Jevs announced here. They fill be placed in Jevish institutions in Poland. A new evacuation home for Polish and Jevish Polish orphans living with Russian families has been established at Lagorck, near Moscow. From Zagorck the children, who are chiefly Jevish, will be sent in parties to institutions in Poland.

## PALESTINE JEWS WILL BOYCOTT GOVERNMENT CENSUS UNLESS OBJECTIVITY GUARANTEED

JERUSALEM, April 18. (JTA) -- The Palestine Jevish community will not participate in the population census for this Autumn unless it is given adequate guarantees that the census will be absolutely objective, the executive committee of the Jevish National Council has annumed.

It revealed, at the same time, that it has suggested to the Palestine Government that a date be fixed for elections of officials of the Jerusalem municipality. The city has been administered by a Government-appointed board since last year when the municipal council was dissolved following failure of Jews and Arabs to agree on the should be managed mayor of the city.

Chief Justice Villiam Fitzgerald, who was appointed several months ago to act is a one-man inquiry committee to look into the machinery of the Jerusalem municipality, is known to have made his report, but the Colonial Office and the Palestine Government have so far not divulged its contents. It is learned, however, that he made the following recommendations:

Jerusalem should be divided into three Independent boroughs - a Jewish, embracing the entire Jewish quarter in which there are about 90,000 inhabitants; on trab, comprising the Arab quarter, which has about 30,000 residents; and an "international," taking in the 01d City, in which there are approximately 30,000 Moslems and Christiens, and 2,500 Jews.

Each borough would be headed by a person of the respective dominant nationality, with the "international" area administered by a Christian Eaclishman, assisted by representatives of Mealem and Jewish religious institutions. The three boroughs could be made a general numicipal administration, via a budget to cover matters conscribe the entire city, which would be headed in yearly rotation by an Arab, a Jew and a Briton.

# SOVIET AUTHORITIES WILL PERMIT BEN GURION TO ENTER RUMANIA TO ADDRESS ZIONIST PARLEY

EUCHAREST, April 18. (JTA) -- Soviet authorities in Rumania today granted an entry permit to David Ben Curton, chairman of the executive of the Jevish Agency, who is now en route from Palestine to Paris. He will participate in the conference of the Rumanian Zionist Federation which will be held here next month.

The Rumanian Government has announced the restoration of all rights and titles to Jacob Rosenthal, formerly in the Rumanian diplomatic service in Washington, who is now in the United States. Mr. Rosenthal was dismissed in 1938 when the anti-Semitic Goog regime came to power.

#### COMMUNAL SEDERS MARK FIRST POST-LIBERATION PASSOVER CELEBRATION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA

FRACUE, April 18. (JTA) -- The first post-liberation Passover to be observed here, and the first free celebration since 1938, was marked by communal seders in Jew-ish communities and institutions throughout the country and family gatherings.

One large seder was held in the Jewish orphanage on Belgian Street here, where a kosher kitchen was established for the first time. Two hundred persons whose families were murdered by the Nazis attended an orthodox seder at a kosher restaurant, presided over by Rabbi Victor Vorband of the Vaad Hatzela of the United States.

In Slovakia the celebration had more of a pre-war atmosphere since more orthodox Jove survived in that part of the country, and supplies of Passover foods were more available despite the fact that there are thousands of impoverished Jews in Slovakia.

Because of the great demand for matzohs and the many who could not pay for their rations, the price of matzohs in Slovakia was about 60 crowns (\$1.20) per kilogram, as compared to 25 crowns (.50) in Bohemia and Moravia, and wine was also more expensive. The Yaad Hatzala distributed free supplies of matzohs, eggs and other foods to many of the needy.

# Passover Greetings from U.S. Jews Conveyed to Bulgarian Jewry by JDC Aide

SOFIA, April 18. (JTA) -- Passover greetings from American Jews were conveyed to the Jews of Bulgaria yesterday at a ceremony in the Central Synagogus here attended by 2,000 persons, which was addressed by Arthur Fishzohn of the Joint Distribution committee.

Mr. Fishzohn disclosed that distribution of JDC supplies will begin here within few days. He reviewed the present and war-time activities of the organization and uestions concerning relief needs here.

While expressing gratification at the recent action of the British in promising La Spezia refugees entry into Palestine, the petition expressed the "prayerful hope the British Government may be inspired to change generally its harsh policy reing to the barring of Jews from their national homsland."

Copies of the petition are being sent to President Truman and both Houses of ress.

He was a delegate to sever-orld Zionist Congresses and attended the sessions of the Jewish Agency. He has several visits to Palestine and was intimately associated with the leadership of Histograph.

For ten years he has been Sational President of the League for Lebor Falestine he United States and Canada, and was formerly associate editor of the Jewish Fron-He is also vice-chairmen of the Commission on Public Affairs of the Central Connec of American Rabbis, a member of the Council of the World Union for Progressive Ism, and deputy member of the administrative committee of the Jewish Agency.
