106 EAST 41st STREET, NEW YORK 17, N. Y. PALESTINE ARAB STRIKE PASSES QUIETLY: ARAB LEADER SUMMORED BY HIGH COMMISSIONER

JERUSALEM, May 3. (JTA) -- The nation-wide strike of Palestine Arabs in protest against the findings of the Anglo-American Committee passed without serious incident today, although a clash between fanatical students and British police at Damas. cus Gate in the Old City threatened for a time to precipitate a major outbreak.

During the day, Jamal Husseini, president of the Arab Higher Committee, and Ahmed Shukeiri, another leader of the Committee, conferred with High Commissioner Sir Alan C.Cunningham. Shukeiri told the Righ Commissioner that the Arabs felt the in-quiry committee's report was a severe breach of promises made to the Arabs and assert-ed that the Arabs would defend their rights and have, in fact, already started to organize their defense. He told reporters, after leaving Covernment House, that his statement to Sir Alan was in the nature of an ultimatum.

Husseini, who was summoned to the High Commissioner's headquarters later. for an undisclosed reason, this morning addressed a crowd of students at the El Area Mosque. He is reported to have urged the demonstrators to remain calm, because the time for violence had not yet arrived. The students who shouted "Down with Britain," and "Down with America," carried banners inscribed "Palestine is an Arab State and Mast Remain So Forever."

Although a procession of several thousand Arabs paraded through Jerusales, as Arab shops and places of extertainment remained closed, the only violence reported was at the Demascus Cate where an angry crowd of more than 2,000 stoned British troops. her were quelled, however, by the arrival of six armored cars and a headful of police and troops who slipped into the Old City and threw a barbed wire barricade across the gate. A verning volley by British townygumners compassized the police order to the beanstrators to disperse. The police carried only shields and clubs.

Jevish Buses Stoned; Fire in Jevish Settlement Causes Heavy Damage

Several Jouish buses were atomed in other parts of the country and one Jev us alightly injured in Remleh, but in general the strike was without incident elsethere in Palestine.

- A large fire of systerious origin, however, broke out last midnight in the levish settlement of Kibbutz Ruhens, in the extreme southern part of the country, and and sabotage was suspected. The blaze destroyed a tractor and several other pieces of farm machinery. The damage is estimated to exceed \$10,000. Four settlers were injured, three of whom required hospitalization.
- A report from Demandus said that Arabs in Syria also demonstrated today. In lagical, the National Democratic Party published a demand that the Iraq Government best off relations with United States and Britain if they adopted the report. Its statement said the Arab League must submit the Paleatine problem to the United Sations Security Council as adoption of the report would threaten the peace of the Middle East and the world.

JENSE RESISTANCE PROUPS PLEDGE PEACE DURING INCICRATION OF 100,000 . TO PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, May 3. (JTA) -- All three groups within the Jevish resistance novement today joined in pled ing that they would not violate the peace "necessary to hring our brethren" into Palestine, but would, on the contrary, take measures to guarantee the maintenance of such a peace. The statement was made on a broadcast of the Toice of Israel," underground radio of the Jevish resistance forces.

The radio, replying to Prime Minister Attlee's statement that the Jevish "illegal armies" must be disarmed before 100,000 Jews could be admitted to Palestine, said on behalf of all resistance groups that "the Jevish community will not surrender the arms which defended it against recurring dastardly attacks throughout the period of Jevish settlement, and which continue to protect Jevish lives, rights and future pace. The Jevish forces will continue to remain independent and will not accept orders from foreign rulers.

"Attlee's demand for the disarming of the Jevs is only a ruse designed to get the British Government out of fulfilling the inquiry committee's compromise recommendations, particularly immigration.

"We emphatically reject Attlee's libel that we are obstructing the immigration if 100,000 Jews--the only obstruction to this continues to be Attlee, his Government, and his shortive policy," the broadcast declared. It pointed out that the Jewish people "aspire to complete national independence and are not content with the immigration of 100,000 Jews, even if the recommendation is implemented promptly and faithfully."

Responsible Jewish circles today told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that surredering arms as the British Frime Minister had demanded means saticide for the Jewish community in Palestine. "Atther's pergain with lives, which is a form of political blackmail, will not have any effect on the Jewish community's determination to save the remnants of European Jewy and bring them to Palestine by any and all means, each it involves the loss of innocent Jewish lives, a Jewish spokeman said.

He declared that the "spark of hope" offered by the inquiry committee's report and by President Truman's statement had been "artinguished ruthlessly" by Attles's statement. "Every child in Palentine move that neither the Arabs now the Jew will lay down their arms. The former because of love of opportunities—political opportunities included—that arms offer, and the latter because they remember only too will the bitter experiences of years past, when they were unarmed and exposed to the servy of murderers, while the British administration was incapable of protecting lives and property."

MRICE, May 3. (JEA) ... Wires were sent today to Secretary of State James F. Symes and Foreign Minister Ernest Bevin by the Central Committee of Liberated Jews of Commany warring that any datay in the acceptance and implementation of the Anglo-Seriem Inquiry committee's report granting 100,000 Falestine certificates to Europe-th Jews will lead to further tragedy for the displaced Jews.

Declaring that the report had been smalled with great injustione by the displaced Jews of Germany, the wire pointed to recent events at Statigart, Diessen, and industry, where DF's clashed with German, and said that conditions easing the Jews had reached a critical point. These disturbances, the wires asserted were indicative of the rising nurses assent the Jews tho a full year after liberation are "still implemed in a land which cannot afford them any saytum."

NEW YORK, May 3. (JTA) -- Arab leaders in the United States today indicated that they are considering having the Palestine issue raised before the United Nations Security Council by Arab states which are members of the United Nations on the basis that the present situation in Palestine 1 as a threat to the peace of the Middle Rest.

At the headquarters of the U.N. a spokesman for Secretary-General Trygve Lie declared: "The present situation in Paleatine is certainly a threat to peace in the Middle East. There can be no doubt of that. Therefore, the Paleatine question definitely comes under the jurisdiction of the Security Council."

Under the Charter, any member of the United Nations can call the attention of the Council to a situation threatening international peace and security. The same nower also is vested in Secretary-General Lie.

SUBSTANTIAL AMERICAN LOAN TO PALESTINE URGED AS MEASURE TO SECURE ARAB COOPERATION

LONDON, May 3. (JTA) -- A substantial lean by the United States, or other mations, to the Palestine Administration would go a long way towards securing Arab support for the recommendations of the Anglo-American committee, it was stated here today by the Economist, influential financial weekly. It urged the United States to assume some responsibility for Palestine.

Meanwhile, it is reported here by Reuters that if direct discussions on Palestins develop in Paris between Secretary of State Byrnes and Foreign Minister Bevin, as a result of the British note handed to Byrnes last night, Bevin will ask for large-scale financial aid to cover the cost of the proposed Jevish immigration and cultural and economic development of Palestine; U.S. military reinforcements to double the resent Palestine garrison; and talks on the possibility of a joint Anglo-American trusteening for the country.

The Manchester Guardian suggests today that peace in Palestine could be secureet by a combination of British and Jewish intelligence and security forces. In a letter to the Times this morning, Neil Malcolm, former League of Nations High Commissionor for Refugees, said that the recommendations of the Anglo-American committee on immigration were very specific and that the Palestine Government is not given discretion to determine the pace at which the 100,000 Jews should be admitted, but rather to exments its judgment in allowing subsequent Jewish immigration.

British Military and Neval Chiefs Assembling in Palestine

The War Office announced that Sir Evelyn Barkon was on route to Palestine fru Britain to assume command of British forces there. From Jerusalem it was reported that Admiral Sir Algermon U. Willis, new commander in chief in the Mediterransan, had arrived there from Alexandria to confer with High Commissioner Sir Alan Cunningham.

British troops in Palestine were reliably estimated here today to number two and a half divisions. They are supported by a number of Royal Air Force units and Beal Coastal Patrols and in an emergency would have behind them 15,000 members of the Palestine police and prison services. Aircraft with searchlights, neval craft patrolling the coastline, and land forces have all cooperated in recent actions against "illegal" attempts to land Jewish emigrants.

JULISH PRESS IN U.S. UNITED IN ATTACKING ATTLEE'S CO. DITIONS ON PALESTINE METRY

MEN YORK, May 5. (JEA) -- The entire Yiddish press in the United States takes issue today with Prime Minister Clement R. Attlee's stipulation that 100,000 displaced Jevs will be admitted to Palestine only if the "illegal armies" there dished and surrender their arms.

The Jevish Day terms Attlee's statement "England's nevest treachery against Jeva" and points out that "never before did England demonstrate its hypocrisy with regard to the Jeva as in this statement." Commenting on the report of the Anglo-American committee, the paper says that by rejecting the idea of a Jevish state "the members of the committee demand a high price from the Jevish people" for the recommendation to sant 100,000 Jeva to Falestine.

The Jevish Morning Journal says that Attlee's statement "cannot be interpreted as envising but an indication that Britain is far from agreeing on the recommendations of the inquiry committee, especially the recommendation to immediately adant 100,000 Jews to Pelestine." It warms England not to make the Pelestine issue a "political ball." The report of the inquiry committee "constitutes a heavy blow to the Jews" because it goes further than any reports previously issued in depriving Jews of their rights in Pelestine, the paper declares.

The Jewish Daily Forward points out that the strongest point of the committe's papert is its proposal to admit immediately 100,000 Jews to Falestine, while its weakest point is the negative attitude to Jewish statehood. "Notwithstanding this megative attitude, it must be said that in weighing the good and the bad points of the report from a general Jewish standpoint, the former will outweigh the latter."

The Jevish Moraing Freiheit, a Communist paper, urges the rejection by Jevs of the "imperialistic report" of the inquiry committee. It demands that Palestine be transferred to a temporary tri-partite trusteeship of the United States, the Soviet Union and Fritain, on behalf of the United Nations.

American Press Divided on Attlee's Demands for U.S. Support

Leading American newspapers were divided today in their comment on the Attles request for American financial and military aid in carrying out the recommendations of the inquiry committee. While some newspapers justified attles's demand, others suggested that the entire Palestine Issue be transferred to the United Wattons for decision.

The New York Pines said: "Fair-minded Americans will agree that this country cannot ask Great Britain to abrogate the white Paper, which represents British policy in Palestine, without assuming some responsibility for imposing a substitute policy in-miring grave risks of violence and disorder. After talking loadly and long about wat should be done, after joining is an inquiry to find out if the American-proposed solution is practicable—for this is what the joint investigation amounts to—we cannot tary well wash our hands of the consequences of our advice and our sotion."

The New York Hereld-Ordrens commented: "It seems impossible for American spoteness to go on much longer trying to make political capital out of the miseries of the July and the tragedies of the Palestine dilema without accepting any responsibility in the premises. If this metion is influence is to produce snything says catastrophs, then it will have to place its power, prestige and if need be its troops behind the lasts solutions which it is prepared to advocate."

WISE SAYS ATTLEE STATEMENT CANCELS ENTIRE REPORT OF ANGLO-AMERICAN COMMITTEE

NEW YORK, May 3. (JTA) -- Charging that Prime Minister Attlee's statement 'cmcels in advance the entire report of the Anglo-American Committee," Rabbi Stephen S. Wise said today that Attlee has dealt with the problem "not in the mammer of statesmaship, but after the fashion of a huckster dealing with some matter of exchange and barter.

"In a word, we are asked to barter the Haganah, our security, for the possibility of getting one hundred thousand displaced persons into Palestine," Dr. Wise said, in a statement to the press. "It cannot be done. It will not be done. We stall not barter away the immediate jewel of a people's security in return for what is eridently to be the vague and perhaps remote possibility of saving 100,000 displaced persons, voice safety after their advant into Palestine may depend upon the continuance of the Haganah. The 100,000 displaced persons would not, in our judgment, ask that of Palestine nor even permit the so-called "dissrming" of their brother Jews, which might men that the Mishab, sugmented by 100,000 displaced persons, would stand helpless in the presence of a large Arab population in Palestine and in neighboring States.

"Prime Minister Attlee's proposal is utterly unworthy. It does him no honor, nor is it worthy of the great people whom he misrepresents. The report calls for the drain repeal of the White Peper. If offensive and insulting conditions are to be attached to the entry of the displaced persons into Palestine, the Jewish people and, we deresay, our own Government will respond with the firmset negative.

"Prime Minister Attlee's insistence upon so qualifying the acceptance of the report as virtually to annul it is bound up with a further suggestion which is likewise designed to annul the substance of the Committee's report. It is England which, through the Mandate, has secured an invaluable foothold in Palestine wherein to place a mighty army for the defense of the Sucz Canal and for other military and imperialist atvatages. The Prime Minister calmly proceeds to ask for American military articipation in an undertaking to which the American Government is and will continue to remain morelated. One cannot imagine a more meanly huckstering response to a great proposal than that of Prime Minister Attlee. It cancels in advance the entire report of the Anglo-American Committee. To that cancellation the American Government and people will not assent."

Zioniste-Revisioniste Reject Report; Term It "Cruel Hoar"

The recommendations of the report of the Anglo-American inquiry commits we were attacked today for completely ignoring the needs of the majority of the Jeys of Europe as well as the Jeys in Arab lands and those scattered elsewhere throughout the world, in a statement issued by Meir Grossman, president of the United Zioniste-Revisionists of America, which represents the membership of the New Zionist Organization and the Jeysah State Party.

Fointing out that the committee recommended relief for only one out of every liften Jeve in Europe, Grossman termed the report a "ornal hour on Jevish homiless-inse," asserted that the committee had "utterly failed in its attempt to frame a ling-tem policy for Pelestine," and declared that the Zioniste-Revisioniste would not accept the findings. The statement charged that the American members of the committee. In their engarness to secure acceptance of President Trusan's humanitarian proposal for the admission of 100,000 displaced Jeve into Pelestine" had succumbed to the presence of their British collesques and had been "trioked into subscribing to a series of far-reaching anti-Jevish statements and recommendations."

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THAL OF LANDSBERG SMISH REFUGEES TRANSFERRED TO HIGHER AMERICAN MILLIPAY COURT

LANDSBERG, Germany, May 3. (JTA) -- The American Military Government court at Kausbeuren today referred the case of the 20 Jevish DP's arrested after Sunday's rioting here to the General Court at Augsburg, headquarters of the Ninth Division, on the grounds that it did not have the authority to mete out sufficiently heavy sentences, if the defendants are convicted.

Capt. Seymour Lubin, who presided, emphasized that the transfer, which was made on a prosecution motion, was based on the fact that he believed that the prosecution had showed that there was substance to its charges, which include participation in a riot, resisting arrest and assaulting troops. The trial is expected to open at lassburg on Thursday.

Presenting its arguments for transfer of the case to a higher court, the presenting introduced three witnesses: Maj. Clair Thurston, division provost marshal; 1/5 William Pietz, Thurston's jeep driver; and Lieut. John Becker, assistant provost mental.

Thurston testified that when he arrived at the scene of the disturbance on Smday he sav about 200 RP's milling about the camp area and three German civilians on its ground. He said that the only reason that more of the NP's were not arrested was because the others broke out of the cordon which was established and in order to avoid nother bloodshed he did not want to order the troops to fire. He admitted under demes questioning that he had seen only one of the 20 defendants assault German sivilians. He also said that when the 20 were searched by the MP's only one had a inife in his possession. Thurston denied a defense statement that he had offered to release all but one of the DP's.

Pietz testified that he saw two of the DP's throw rocks, but added that they saw into one. He said that he was forced to fire into the air to prevent 19 of the isfendants from escaping. Licut. Becker, who arrested the twentieth man, Fifa Seligman, charged that the latter had beaten a German woman.

Defense attorneys, Dr. Semmel Grinzaus, former judge at Nemel and leader of the Landsberg camp, and Shelms Orenstein, argued against referral of the case to the ligher court, asserting that the incident was not a riot against the military forces, mt "public disorder" against the Germans, Dr. Grinzaus said that the delay in trying the case would cause serious unrest in the camp.

The court room was james with vitnesses who were brought from the camp, as well as high ranking military observers. The 20 defendants were brought from the jail there they are being held in an army truck and returned the same way. They same cheerfully on both trips, mainly palestintan songs, and waved to the spectators.

Bodies of Kidnapped Jewish Guards Believed to Have Been Thrown into Lake

MMMICH, May 3. (JTA) — The Jewish refugees at the Landsberg camp believe that the bodies of the two Jewish guards the disappeared mysteriously from their postests a bibute of 40 persons in Dissen, a Landsberg suburb, have been thrown into nearby form lake by German Eddaspers.

A correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency who returned from Diesen totay reported that all telephone and electric wires were out at the Diesen camp on the night of April 28 when the two guards disappeared. Twenty-four former members of the lati party are under observation.

JUISH DEPUTY IN POLISH COUNCIL UNGES STRONGER COVT. ACTION AGAINST ANTI_SEMPTISM

WARSAW, May 3. (JTA) -- Adolf Berman, Jewish deputy in the Polish National Commotl and former pertisan leader, denouncing the continued murder of Jews and Polish descrats has called for more vigorous Covernment action to suppress the anti-Semitic and anti-Covernment terror.

Premier Eduard Osubka-Morawski, opening the tenth session of the Council called on the Polish people to take up the struggle against anti-Semitic bands which, he said, threaten not only the Jews but the entire Polish nation. He declared that while Poland needed the hands and brains of every citizen the Government would not stand in the way of Jews who desired to emigrate to Palestine and realize there their actional aspirations.

Describing the effects of anti-Semitism in Poland. Dr. Berman declared: "Once spain we face new graves. We day passes without Jewish victims. During the past few wests forty Jews were killed. Polish democrats, too, fall. Jewish youth cannot stand by passively and see these murders. The youth has a glorious tradition—it fought in the Warsaw and Bialystok Chettoe, and having fought against the enemy, it wants to fight these Pascist bandits too. We have urged that we be given weapons for our defense.

"We realize that the new wave of anti-Semitic terror is part of the Fascist program in its fight against the Government, and that the murders are inspired by folish reactionary centers outside the country. We think that the time is at hand for the folish working class and the whole people to take the offensive and attack Fascism."

Calling for stronger Government measures, Berman asserted that "indulgence by the Government is mistaken by the Fascists as weakness. They need to be shown the contrary."

He said that the Jewish people who desire to reconstruct their lives have created a new economic life based on cooperative workshops and that the Jewish masses "ant to fight for their own state." Thanking the Premier for his support for Jews desiring to build their homeland in Pelestine, Bernen said "the Jewish people will remember the assistance greated them in this historic moment."

Fremier Osubka-Moraveki pointed out that in Poland the Fascists were still tring to marder the surviving Jews, at the same time as the creators of the doctrine of racist ideology and hatred between men were being tried at Muremberg. Declaring that the Government has already taken measures to deal with terror and the spreading of racial hatred, he called on the antire Polish people to back the Government program of squality of all citizens without distinction as to race, nationality or religion. Is insisted that the state must grant equal protection and rights to all citizens as well as expecting equal duties from all.

DELECATION OF CENTRAL JUSTISH COMMITTER OF POLAND LEAVES LONDON FOR UNITED STATES

LONDON, May 3. (JTA) -- A delegation of the Jewish Central Committee of Poland, headed by Dr. Bril Sommerstein, its chairman, and consisting of representatives of the General Zioniste, the Poule Zioniste, the Hashomer Hatzair, and Jewish paraisms, left here today for the United States to comsult with American Jewish leaders.

U.H. REFUGEE BODY ESTABLISHES COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER JEWISH MEMORANDUMS

LONDON, May 3. (JTA) -- The United Nations Committee on Refugees and Displaced Persons today unanimously adopted a proposal by Polish delegate Joseph Winiewicz that it set up a sub-committee to examine the memorands submitted by Jewish organizations. Chinese delegate K.T. Telen, who was named chairman of the sub-committee, urged that representatives of UNERA and the Intergovernmental Refugee Committee attendits sessions.

In brief addresses supporting the establishment of the sub-committee, the delegates from the United States, the Soviet Union, the Netherlands, France and the Daminican Republic paid tribute to the sufferings of the Jews under German occupation.

The full committee voted yesterday to adopt the Russian and American proposal that the new international refugee body to be established should be independent of the U.M. but should cooperate with the U.M. Social and Economic Council.

FRANCE MAY OFFER FRONTIERS TO 250,000 JEWISH REFUGERS, LONDON MEMSPAPER REPORTS

IORDON, May 3. (JTA) -- France may take the initiative in attempting to solve the European refugee problem by opening her frontiers to homeless Jews, the Billy Mirror reported here today from Paris.

The newspaper said that Foreign Minister Georges Bidault favors the idea and has discussed it with representatives of French Jewry. Moreover, the Mirror asserts, there is support among all coalition political parties in the country for the opening of large refugee camps capable of accommodating 250,000 Jews. It has been pointed cut in France that such a move would recruit needed manpower as well as win wide sympthy, especially in America, for Franch requests for financial aid.

THIMAN URGED TO PROVIDE FACILITIES FOR TRANSFER OF 100,000 JENS TO PALESTINE

WASHINGTON, May 3. (JTA) -- The recommendations of the Anglo-American inuity counittee were termed "rescomptable as a whole" by Feber Bergson, chairman of the Mebrew Committee of National Liberation, in a letter sent yesterday to President Truman and released by Bergson today at a press conference.

Declaring that the committee offered "no solution whatsoever but merely encored the continuation of the status quo of the British military conquistion." Bergson rote the President' "eregard it as significant that you have withheld approval of the rague and humanil recommendations of the committee which serve only to snoowage unagonism and conflict between Hebrews and Arabs." He expressed the gratitude "of the Enver people" for the President's "sympethy and understanding" and conflictnee that "we can rely on your wisdom and state-manuable to support a just, effective and permanent long-range policy."

The letter suggested that the American Army Occamender in Europe be given responsibility for the most expeditions evacuation of the 100,000 refugees to Falestine, with shipping to be made available by the War Shipping Administration and Maritime Commission.
