POLISH JEWS EN ROUTE TO PALESTINE BELIEVED MASSACRED NEAR POLISH-CZECH FRONTIER

VIENNA. May 10. (JTA) -- A group of 27 Polish Jews, who disappeared last week while attempting to cross the Polish-Czechoslovak frontier, were reported here today to have been massacred by "unknown bands."

The group was one of three totalling 89 who left Cracov in the last days of April with the intention of eventually getting to Palestine, according to Jacob Wisnis, leader of one of the groups, who arrived in Vienna yesterday,

Thirty-two men, women and children, led by Wisnia, crossed the Polish frontier on the night of May 1, and reached Kreismarkt, Czechoslovakia. From there the group made its way to Bratislava where it awaited the other two. The second section, with 30 members, arrived a day later, but the third group never turned up.

From couriers sent back to the frontier to check, as well as from other sources, it was learned, Wienia reported, that the entire group was murdered on the night of May 2 in a wood between Szczawnic and Nowy Wies about one and one-half kilomsters from the Czechoslovak border.

Wisnia, 31-year-old native of Brest-Litovsk, was a lieutenant in the Polish army, and fought with the Red Army until 1943 when he was transferred to Polish units serving under Marshal Zhukov. After his demobilization late last year, Wisnia became head of the Zionist movement in Galicia.

TWENTY WOUNDED IN CAIRO DURING DEMONSTRATION AGAINST ANGLO-AMERICAN REPORT ON PALESTINE

CAIRO, May 10. (JTA) -- About twenty people, including two policemen, were wounded here today when a mob stoned police who attempted to break up a demonstration against the recommendations of the Anglo-American inquiry committee. Fifty persons were arrested.

Most of the shops in Cairo were closed and street cars were not running as a result of the general strike proclaimed by certain Moslem organizations in protest against the committee's report favoring the immediate admission of 100.000 Jews to Palestine. The city was out of bounds to British troops.

A report from Regulad said that the protest strike in Iraq, which was called in sympathy with the Arabs in Palestine, will be maintained until noon on Saturday. Shops, theatres and other public services here closed at noon today. Publication of daily newspapers has been suppended. Police squade are patrolling the streets and the Government has ordered that no more than fire persons can gather in any place in Eagdad, in order to prevent demonstrations.

Palestine Arabs Cable Protests to Truman, Attlee, Stalin

JERUSALTA, May 10. (JTA) -- The Palestine Arab Higher Committee today announced that it has sent cables to President Trussn, Prime Minister Attlee and Marshal Stalin, describing the report of the Anglo-American inquiry committee as "an absolute and a complete repudiation of all principles of freedom of salf-determination and democracy.

"The recommendations of the inquiry committee will enable the Jews of the world to invade our country under the protection of the armed forces of Britain and America," the cable continued. The Arabs will oppose enforcement of the recommendations to the last man. This policy will endanger peace in the Middle East and the world."

Jemal Husseini, chairman of the Palestins Arab Higher Committee, addressing more than 6,000 Arabs at Jaffa today, called for Arab solidarity in the fight against the admission of 100,000 Jews and urged "complete boycott of everything Jewish." Police stood by in Jaffa from dawn, but after listening to Husseini's speech near the Grand Mosque, the crowd dispersed quietly.

U.S. WILL CONSULT JESS AND ARABS BEFORE ACTING ON ANGIO-AMERICAN REPORT ON PALESTINE

WASSIMPTOF, May 10. (JTA) -- The United States Covernment is studying the recommendations of the Anglo-American inquiry committee on Palestine and intends to consult with Arab and Jewish leaders before making any definite decision on the report, Acting Secretary of State Dean Scheson told the diplomatic representatives of five Arab states who called on him today to protest the committee report.

Acheson told his press conference that the Arab diplomate pointed out that on a number of occasions the United States Government had informed the Arab Governments that in its view no change should be made in the basic situation in Felestine without prior consultation with both Arabs and Jews. They further expressed the hope, the Acting Secretary declared, that the American Government would not adopt any pelicy calling for change in besic policy without such consultation.

Asked whether any negotiations are proceeding between the United States and British Governments to implement the recommendations of the committee, Acheson said that we are in committation with the British Government on matters of procedure relating solely to the premised committation with Arabs and Jews.

He declined to comment on an alleged statement by Bartley Crum, an American member of the committee, asselling the former Grend Mufti as a var orininal and one of the twenty-five most dangerous Mosless.

(bir. Gree yesterday retterated his charge that Foreign Minister Bevin had promised the members of the committee that his dovernment would adopt their recommendations, if they were unanimous. Barlier, a Foreign Office spokemen had stated that there was no record of such a statement by Mr. Bevin.)

PRANCE REPTERATES MOPPLE THER TO LEAVE; TORORDE BEITTISH REQUEST TO DECALS HIM

PARIS, May 10, (374) -- A Trench foreign office spokessan today referenced that the ex-Marti of Serusales, who is now living in a villa outside of Paris, is free to leave the country snytime he wishes, or envise some country specifically requests his presence. Up to now, he added, no country, ancluding the Arch states, has asked for the Marti.

The spokessian dealed recent reports that France had agreed, following a British request, to prevent the Arab leader from leaving. He confirmed that a note had been received from the British Government, but said that it had not asked France to retain the North, but had a realy stressed the dangers inherent in the present 7-leating situation, and suggested the advisability of keeping the Mufti in France.

ALLIED AUTHORITIES IN FIALLY TO INVESTIGATE ANTI-JEWISH RIOTS IN REFUREE CAMP

ROME, May 10. (JTA) -- Allied military authorities today promised to initiate a detailed inquiry into the circumstances under which two displaced Jews were tilled and thirteen injured last week in anti-Jewish riots by Ukrainian fascists in the Reggio Emilia comp for displaced persons.

The Ukrainians, a number of whom served as Gestapo guards in Mazi extermination camps in Poland, and therefore fear to return to the Ukraine, were permitted by the Allied authorities to live side by side with the displaced Jews at the camp, which is located about 45 miles from Belogna. Representatives of the Joint Distribution Committee and of the Central Committee of Jewish Refugees in Italy are seeking permission to participate in the promised inquiry.

A special correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency who visited the camp today was refused information by Major Lewis, the British commandant, and Lt. Eyston, his assistant. However, the correspondent learned the following details from the Italian police and the Jewish refugees:

Nearly a thousand Jews arrived at the camp the last week of April. The camp already held 25 national groups, including Finns, Casche, Hungarian members of the rescist Arrow Cross; White Russians and 130 Ukrainians from Glasgow who were said to be passists. The Hungarian fassists were promptly removed, but the others were not.

Mordecai Lowenberg of Poland, leader of the Jevish Camp Committee, and sole survivor of his family of a father and mother, five brothers and three sisters, a wife and three children, said that the Ukrainians threy vater at the Jews from second story vindows of the building as they were arriving. Some Ukrainians were identified by the arriving Jews as guards from the notorious Osviceim extermination camp and had the SS stam on their arms.

Knives Thrown At Charmed Jews; Commandant Justifies Murder

Preparing for a May Day rally in the recreation hall, the Jews decorated the walls with the Zionian flag and the rad flag with hasser and sickle, and the portraits of five Jewish poets. A verbal permit was believed to have been granted by the camp authorities, and 500 Jews gathered in the hall. The Brainians began to congregate outside.

According to the refugees, Lieut. Byston strode into the hall, with five Drainians, and desanded that all the fings and "pictures of Commists" be removed and the neeting dissolved. The refugees refused because they thought they had peralssion to seet. Byston personally tore down the red fing. The Jews agreed to dispute if the Organians were sent way from the door. Sovewer, as they left the Drainians three indices at the marmed refugees and large-scale fighting broke out. Byston vanished, saying he would get the police, but was not seen again.

When the Italian police restored order, nine Jews were found to be wounded. Innel Emplan, 19, died later of bilife wounds.

Fight Flares Anew When Ukrainians are Identified by Jews

Jews inside the camp surged against the Ukrainians and another free-for-all ensued. One Jew eadd later in an affiderit that he and his companions did not want to injure the Ukrainians, but to hold them for a trial before competent authorities, feeling that if they went to Modena they would evade justice. A uniformed guard at the gate shot into the crowd through the gate.

Other Jews stormed after the Ukrainians, yelling "fascist," attacking them and UKRRA officials with stones. Levis, Eyston, and Supply Officer Melitsanos were thrown to the ground. Melitsanos grabbed a temmy-gun from an Italian policemen but Major Levis kept him from using it. Major Levis ordered the Italians to fire at the crowd but they refused. Italian infantry then arrived with two light tanks. In the ensuing gunfire, Major Kipot, a Polish Jew, was killed and five others were wounded.

The rooms of the Jews were searched. One man was arrested as the owner of a revolver, another because he had a camera, a third because he was alleged to have written a telegrem to the Soviet Military Mission at Rome asking that troops be sent to the came. Two are still held by the British Field Scourity Service.

Major Levis has refused to comment, saying that he is under military orders of the British Asmy not to talk about the riots. The 16 Ukrainians are said to be free at Modena.

RIMANIAN JEW FREED ON COLLABORATION CHARGE; SENTENCES OF TWO OTHERS CONFIRMED

BUCHARISM, May 10. (JTA) -- S.M. Grossman, a former member of the "Central Union of Rumanian Jews," who was convicted of collaboration with the pro-Mazi regime last February, was today freed by a People's Court after a higher court had ordered a retrial.

The People's Court confirmed its previous sentences in the case of two other Jevish defendants, whose earlier convictions were also set aside by the appellate body. They are Mandor Chingold, head of the Union, who was sentenced to life imprisonment, and Jack Leon, who received a 12-year sentence. Grossman's original sentence was 15 years. At the first trial fire Jews were accused and convicted of having sided the Anteneson Covernment in carrying out anti-Jevish measures.

REES DISCUSSES PROBLEMS OF CZECH JEWS WITH LEADER OF JEWISH COMMUNITY

PRAGUE, May 10. (JTA) -- President Eduard Benes yesterday received Ernst Frischer, chairman of the central council of the Union of Jerish Communities in Bohemia and Moravia, with whom he discussed some of the urgent problems facing Czech Jesry. Mr. Benes is reported to have expressed a desire to aid the Jess in overcoming these difficulties.

Herry A. Goodman, political secretary of the Agudas Israel in England was veloced to Prague at a dinner last night arranged by the Vand Hatzala. He will study the relief measures for Greck Jaws which have been instituted by Jevish organizations in Britain and will then proceed to Slovakia for a visit to the Jevish communities there.

GERMAN NAVAL CHIEF CHARGED BY BRITISH WITH PARTICIPATING IN PERSECUTION OF JEWS

NURRMERG, May 10. (JTA) -- Admiral Karl Doenitz, former chief of the German navy, was charged today with being equally responsible with other Nazi leaders for the persecution of Jews.

British Prosecutor Sir David Maxwell-Fyfe quoted an address by Doenitz in March, 1944, in which he urged the officers and men of the German navy to join in driving every vestige of Jewry from the German nation. The former naval chief, who headed the short-lived post-ditler German Covernment, replied that he had feared that the Jews might have an adverse effect on the morale of the Germans, who were being heavily bombarded by Allied air fleets.

U.S. ARMY WITHDRAWAL FROM CHINA COSTS JEWISH REFUGEES IN SHANCHAI THEIR JOBS

SHANCHAI, May 10. (JTA) -- The majority of the 1,500 Jevish refugees who found employment in the offices and wavehouses of the U.S. Army installations in Shanghai have been laid off as a result of the decrease in American military forces stationed here. Most of the refugees were employed for about six months.

With the withdrawal of American troops set for this month and with the transfer of American military headquarters to Nanking, once again China's capital, the remaining few refugees will be out of a job. There are few steady positions available now, but it is hoped that once world shipping and trade return to normal, the port will again provide sufficient opportunities for all.

TWO JENS SENTENCED IN AFTERMATH TO ATTEMPTS TO LAND VISALESS IMMIGRATUS LAST MARCH

JERUSALEM, May 10. (JTA) -- Two Jews were sentenced today by a Palestino military court for participation in an unsuccessful attempt to land 240 visaless imagrants at Tel Aviv on the night of March 25-26.

The two were Arieh Klapper, 34, who was sentenced to four years, and I. Shraga, an 18-year-old youth, who received a three-year sentence. Both were charged with passession of two detonators and two small containers of explosives.

Elapper and Shraga were arrested during an attempt by several thousand Jevs in and near Tel Aviv to distract the attention of police and military forces while the materthip Orde Wingate attempted to land its mman cargo. However, the strategy was memocessful, and the Wingate and the Tel Hai, carrying more than 700 refugees were captured. One Jewish woman, Baracha Falid, was killed during the diversionary attacks. The visaless ratugees were everywally released.

In a statement to the court before sentence was passed, Klapper said "All my life I have devoted to work in defense of my brothren, but never have I attempted to attack anybody. On the night when I was accessed refugees were expected to arrive, contrary to existing laws. It was necessary to land and shelter them. All Palestinian Jess are ready to sacrifice their lives to bring their brothren into this country and to defend them. I, like every Jes, was also ready to bear these responsibilities."

POLISH PARLIAMENT HEARS PLEA FOR SUPPORT OF JENISH AIMS IN PALESTINE

WARRAW, May 10. (FFA) -- Pointing out that Transjorden, which he said was only a British puppet, was being mentioned for membership in the United Nations while the Jews of Falestine were denied such representation, Dr. Adolf Berman, former partisen and a leader of the Left Poale Zion, urged the Polish Government and the Polish people to support Jewish aspirations in Palestine.

PRESIDENT OF N.Y. BOARD OF EDUCATION DROPPED BY MAYOR: WAS DEFOSED BY LIBERAL GROUPS

NEW YORK, May 10. (JTA) -- Maximillian Ross, a trustee of the Jevish Education Committee and chairman of the Brooklyn division of the Federation of Jevish Charities, today was named a member of the New York City Board of Education to replace Mary Dillon, whose respectivent had been opposed by the American Jevish Congress and other agencies.

Mayor William O'Dwyer did not explain why he had not reappointed Miss Dillon, who had served two terms as president of the board. She had been under fire from several groups for her alleged failure to sponsor an effective inter-racial program in the schools.

K.K.K. REVIVES OPEN ACTIVITIES IN GEORGIA; KLANSMEN GATHER AROUND BURNING CROSSES

ATIANTA, May 10. (JTA) -- The Ku Kluk Klan came out into the open here for the first time in many years last night; when 1,000 hooded klamamen and women gathered around burning crosses on Stone Mountain during the initiation of several hundred new members.

Dr. Samuel Green, Grand Dragon of the Klan, asserted that the organization had more than 20,000 members in Georgia alone. He admitted that the Klan favors "white supremacy," but denied that it had religious or recial bias.

Opposition to the revived Klan was voiced by religious, social and labor groups. The Christian Council of Atlanta protested against "a misguided patrictism that clothes itself in secrecy." The Georgia Legislative Council charged that the Klan is attempting to discourage labor organization in the South by terrorism, while the Southern Regional Council, a joint Negro and white group working to improve race relations and economic conditions in the South, declared that the Klan "is not likely to get far in the awakening South."

CLOSHING WORKERS CONVENTION SUPPORTS INQUIRY CONGLISTED REPORT ON PALESTINE

ATLANTIC CITY, May 10. (JTA) -- A resolution calling upon the British Government to implement the Anglo-American inquiry committee's recommendation for the immediate transfer of 100,000 displaced European Jovs to Palestine was adopted at the biennial convention of the Analgameted Clothing Workers of America, which is meeting here.

The union also urged the United States to ease the immigration laws so as to permit more displaced and refuges Jews to enter this country.

AMERICAN PALESTINE CONDUNATION LAUNCHES \$2,200,000 ISSUE OF NEW SHARES AT N.Y. MEETING

HEW YORK, May 10, (JPA) -- A new issue of \$00,000 shares, with par value of \$2,200,000, was launched here today by the American Palestine Freding Corporation at its annual meeting held under the chairmanship of Edmand I. Kaufmann. Approximately \$75,000 worth were sold at the meeting.

Reporting on the progress of the comporation, Abraham Dickenstein, manager, said that the comporation has lossed \$500,000 for the development of Palestine projects, has facilitated shipments to Palestine valued at \$1,000,000 for Palestinian purchasers and has imported from Falestine to this country goods worth \$600,000. The meeting was addressed by Robert R. Batham, Anysh Shanham, president of the Manufacturers' Association of Palestine, and others.
