### 10.000 JEWISH DP'S GO ON STRIKE IN BELSEN CAMP: DEMAND DAMEDIATE TRANSFER TO PALESTINE

LONDON. June 13. (JTA) -- More than 10,000 displaced Jews at the Bergen-Belsen camp in the British some of Germany have gone on strike against a British military order to move from their present quarters, it was reported today in the London press. The Jews demand that they be moved to Palestine immediately.

British military authorities ordered the Jews to move in order to make room for a new army training school being established at the camp. The DP's refused, in sisting that they will leave the camp only to go to Palestine. No further details of the strike are available.

### army will leave borders of U.S. zone in Germany open to jewish refugees from East

FRANKFURT, June 13. (JTA) -- A top-ranking American military official today told a Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent that the borders of the U.S. zone of Germany will remain open to Jewish refugees from Czechoelovakia and other countries.

The officer said that the Army was taking "absolutely no action" to prevent the entremes of displaced Jews and was giving the new arrivals the same status and privileges as the older DP's, thus abandoning the policy of establishing separate comps for "infiltrees." Although asserting that the DP's now have more living room than individual Germans, the officer admitted that the constant flow of refugees vill probably necessitate the opening of new camps.

From another source the correspondent learned that the Army will soon open five new entry stations along the eastern border of the zone and that UNRW. will establish three reception comps on the border. He was also informed that a camp accommodating 3,000 persons will be opened late this month in Windsheim, near Nursaberg.

# Jews Who Live Outside of Camps Will Get Increased Food Rations

The Army today authorized UMERA to issue 500 calories of additional food daily to all Jawa living in communities which are not attached to regular displaced persons camps. This order will increase the ration of the so-called "frae living persons" to 2,200 calories daily, 200 more than is allotted to residents of DP camps.

However, the only food essured these "free living" Jews is the 500 calories supplied by UNDA. The remaining 1,700 must be bought on the open German market where very few items exist and where the storekeepers are reluctant to sell those rationed foods which they do have. It is believed that the Army's move is designed to encourage the Jews to resain in independent communities instead of flocking to the already overgrowded IP centers.

### TWO JEWISH YOUTHS SENTENCED TO DEATH IN PRITISH MILITARY COURT IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, June 13. (JTA) -- Joseph Simkhon, aged 19, and Itzchak Michael Azbel, aged 2h, were sentenced to death by a British military court here today on the charge of participating in a raid by an armed Jewish group on the Sarafand camp, the biggest army base in Falestine.

The verdict is subject to confirmation by the general officer in command. The two vere also charged with participating in the seizure of a large quantity of sumunition during the raid and with firing at British soldiers. The raid took place on March 6.

The Irgun Zwai Leumi, Jewish extremist underground group, tonight acknowledged responsibility for the attacks last Monday on three passenger trains in the Ivdda district. Broadcasting in Hebrew, French, English and Russian over the secret radio "Voice of Fighting Zion," the announcer declared that the Irgun will prevent Palestine from becoming a British base.

John V. Shaw, Chief Secretary of the Palestine Government, told a press conference today that the censor ship imposed by the Government on reports concerning the escape of the ex-Mufti was "in the interests of both the Jevish and Areb communities."

The Demascus newspaper "Al Wahda El Arabia" today said that the Mufti "arrived in Damascus" Tuesday night and tas now staying in the city "at the home of a high personality." It added he was "safe and under protection."

# AUSTRIAN CABINET APPROVES RESTITUTION MEASURE: JEMS SEEK RETURN OF 4,600 PROPERTIES

VIRNA, June 13. (JTA) - The drafting by the government of the first of a series of restitution measures was approved by the Austrian cabinet today and will go before Parliament semetime before the end of the present session on July 15.

This first measure provides that properties which were confiscated and held directly by the Mazi regime, and which are now being administered by the Vienna Government, should be returned to their rightful owners. If enacted, therefore, the measure will mark the first step in the way of restitution to Austrian Jews, and will affect 4,600 properties stolen from them. Most of it is real estate.

These stolen propert'ss will be claimed by the pre-Wari comers or their heirs. The draft does not mention Jova expressly, but obviously they will be the chief penaficiaries of the measure.

At a series of meetings held by the Jevish community here in support of the measure, various speakers made the point that Jevs would remain "citizens of second rank" until such time as restitution was made to them.

# PRACHE JEHLER COMMENTET STARTS DECOSING TAX OR JENS; J.D.C., HELPS REMLY-MARRIED

PRACUE, June 13: (JTA). The Progue Jevish Community, for the first time since liberation, today decided to impose a community tax on its members in order to meet its budget which at present is supported by the Joint Distribution Committee.

The local office of the J.D.C. today amnounced special grants to aid newlymarried Jewish couples, and to support needy Jewish families with new-born babies. The newly-weds will get a one-time grant of 5,000 crowns (about \$100) while the parants will receive 3,000 crowns, on condition that the baby is registered as lewish.

# JEWISH DP'S IN ITALY DEMONSTRATE AGAINST LATEST UNERA EMICRATION POLL

ROME, June 13. (JTA) -- The 1,100 immates of the Torino camp for displaced Jews in Italy today held a protest demonstration against the attempts of local URRA officials to influence them against choosing Palestine as the country to which they wish to emigrate, it was reported here. The incident occurred when URRRA instituted a new poll to determine the emigration desires of the Jewish DP's in Italy.

The mass meeting was called off after the officials agreed to permit the camp committee to conduct the poll. The results revealed that only ten of the camp's population desired to go anywhere other than Palestine. In the Gremon EP camp the Jews refused to participate in the poll insisting that they had indicated their choice many times previously.

From a camp near furin it was reported that 60 newly-born children have been structured these recently.

### JEVISH EXPATRIATES IN LOWER SILESIAN PACTORIES, MINES OUTSTRIP GERMAN PRODUCTION

WARSAW, June 13. (JTA) --Polish Jews repatriated from the U.S.S.R. and resettled in Lower Silesia are establishing better production records in heavy industry and mining than the Germans who worked there before the province was saized by Poland, according to the Polish press.

Gaos Ludu, organ of the Polish Workers Party, points out, that in some factories, Jevish workers have doubled the production figures set by the Germans. It also reports that 400 Jevish miners are already employed in the Velbrzych district and that their number is increasing daily.

The Contral Committee of Polish Jews has appealed for more financial aid for its relief and rehabilitation program for Jews being resettled in Lower Silesia. In its appeal, the committee cited the case of 1,700 Jews being settled in the town of Swidnice, where there is still insufficient housing for at least one-third of the repatriates. It said that the financial burden of repatriation was too great for Polish Jews to bear alone, and sexed for help from Jews throughout the world.

### WHITE BOUNE PROPATES FROM COMMENTING ON MEVIN'S OTHE AT U.S. INTEREST IN PALESTINE

WASHINGTON, June 13. (JTA) -- The White House today had no comment on British Foreign Secretary Devin's statement under gesterday at Rougnemouth that the United States application for the admission of 100,000 Jews into Palestine was "because they do not want too many of them in Sew York."

Presidential press secretary Charles G. Ross, when asked if President Truman had seen the story of Berin's reserve, said that the President had seen the headlines but he did not know in he had read the story. Asked how the story was received at the White Bouse, Ross said that he did not know and that he had no comment at this time.

Compression Scolph J. Educth and Resmel Celler in press statements today bitterly decounced Bevin for his statement. "It is the lowest level he has reached in all his obvious managements to keep the homeless 100,000 Jess cut of Palestine," Geller declared.

# CONFUSION DEEPENS OVER ANGLO-U.S. NEGOTTATIONS ON INPLRAGATION OF PALESTINE REPORT

LONDON, June 13. (JTA) -- Confusion over the state of Anglo-American negotiations on the implementation of the report of the Palestine committee of inquiry was deepened toky when the Foreign Office retierated its amountement that a joint expert committee to study technical questions connected with the report will start work in the near future.

Yesterday evening, a State Department spokesman in Washington denied that any such committee had been established. "Docay, United States official quarters in London said the advance party of the United States element of the committee which had been expected to arrive in Britain by air today, would be delayed.

British official quarters in London say that the function of the joint committee is to work on the practical problems of transport and settlement of Jewish inmigrants should Britain agree to admit 100,000 Jews to Palestine. But it is emphasizet that no decision on policy has yet been taken by Britain. Informed quarters here do not expect that one will be taken before July.

### AMERICAN JEWISH COMMITTEE, AMERICAN JEWISH CONCRESS ASSAIL REVIN'S PALESTINE STATEMENT

NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) - The American Jevish Committee and the American Jevish Compress today assailed the statement made yesterday by British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin indicating that he would reject the Anglo-American inquiry committee recommendation for the admission of 100,000 displaced Jevs to Falestine.

Judge Joseph M. Proskauer, president of the American Jevish Committee, said in a statement: "It is impossible to accept as a finality Mr. Bevin's refusal to abide by the findings of the Amglo-American committee for the immediate admission into Palestine of 100,000 displaced Jevs. Hor can it be believed that the people of Frest Britain will support a decision which would result in an inhumane and needless sacrifice of human life and a complete departure fro. what is best and finest in british tradition. There have been other departures at times, but none more flagrant than this. Mr. Bevin should realise that the deep interest of the American people in the implementation of the proposal with respect to the 100,000 Jews flows in no egree from any selfish motive. It is born of the intense desire of the American scople to save these sufferers by Bitler's tyramy from further misery, wretchedness and death, and from a complete conviction that fair play demands that Great Britain hide by the decision concurred in by all six of its own representatives on the inglo-American committee."

The American Jewich Congress, in a statement issued by Dr. David Petegorsky, irector, said: "The American people will certainly not misunderstand Mr. Bevin today by more than they misunderstood his mide reserves about the Jews in the House of commons of rew months ago. Unite the contrary. Today, they understand him better han they have ever understood him before. For months, Bevin has been trying to tir up anti-Jewish feeling and political tension in the Mear East as an excuse for the nti-Jewish policy of the British Government on Palestine. Today, he is trying to tir up anti-Semitium in the thited States to help him in his vicious plot. This country may import mean Artitlah products. But it certainly does not want to import the anti-Semitium and bigotry of the British Foreign Secretary. The American people ill witherly repudiate Mr. Jewis's unprecedented naturales as we hope the Eritish cople will repudiate his unprecedented inhumanity and ill-will to the Jewish poople."

The Hon-Secretarian Anti-Mari League has sent a cable to Bevin declaring: a an organization long engaged in exposing Mari-like and anti-Semitic propaganda, are deeply shocked by your statement which parallels similar canards by agitors like the American Gerald L.K. Smith and the British Oswald Mosley.

## E.Y. PRESS UNFAVORABLE TO BEVIN STATEMENT ON PALESTINE: "MALET REMARKS" HOTED

HEN YORK, June 13. (JTA).—The statement on Palestine made yesterday by British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin before the annual convention of the British Labor Party in which he said that people in America insist on the admission of 100,000 Jews to Palestine "because they do not want too many of them in New York," is videly commented upon in today's New York press.

The New York Times points out in an editorial that "it is to the Labor Party, and not to the House of Commons, that the Foreign Secretary announced that the Government does not intend to send any more troops to Palestine--already very like an armed camp."

The New York Sun says that while much of what Bevin had to say on issues other than Palestine will gain endorsement in the United States, he is less likely to win support of his "blunt remarks" on Palestine. "But even if some of the things he said were unpalatable or wholly unjustified, fair-minded persons must agree that it is asking a lot to expect the British alone to shoulder the heavy financial and moral responsibility for putting the recommendations of the Anglo-American inquiry committee into effect," the paper declares.

The New York Post in its editorial says: "The fraud, deceit, trickery that has enveloped British policy in Palestine almost since the Balfour Dealestine was proclaimed, got a rare, publicilly-enunciated fillip from the Foreign Secretary. He trotted out his latest evil weapon, anti-Semitiem, and made a bid for the support of the racists. The agitation in the U.S. for 100,000 Jews to be put into Palestine-and I do not want the Americans to misunderstand me-is because they do not want too many of them in Jew York. We don't 'misunderstand' the Foreign Secretary any longer. At last he has spoken so that all can clearly understand him."

The newspaper FM, commenting on the statement, says that London has left the Zionists only two alternatives. "One of them is to insist that the British get out of Falesting--where they are hated both by the Jews and the Arabe--and hand over the mendate to the United Rations. The other course is to imitate the Irish and fight."

# N.N. Post Offers \$5,000 Reward for Bringing Mufti to Trial

HEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- T. O. Thackrey, editor and general manager of the New York Post today asnounced that a series of rewards, from \$5,000 up, would be offered by his newspaper for finding the "escaped" ex-Mufti of Jerusales and bringing him to trial as a ver original.

He pointed out, however, that the real trouble was not the finding of the Marti, but in locating an official agency that really wanted to try him. It is questionable, he said, whether any of the powers involved in the Palestine question want to find the ex-Mufti.

Similtonocusly with the sunpuncement, the N.T. ### JEMS IN POLAND SUFFER UNPRECEDENTED HUNCER; BEG BREAD FROM CERMANS IN SILESIA

NEW YORK, June 13. (JTA) -- Jews in Poland are suffering unprecedented starvation, Dr. Joseph Tenemboum, president of the American Federation of Polish Jews, reported at a press conference today following his neturn from a visit to Poland.

Even in Lover Silesia, where thousands of Polish Jevs repatriated from Soviet Russia are taying to start their life answ by working on the land and in mines, their position is so bad that many of them are forced to beg for bread from the Germans, Dr. Tenenbung said.

"A great many Jews want to leave Poland," he stated. "The majority of them want to go to Palestine and many of them wish to seek their relatives in the United States." He charged the British with being "at the bottom of the fascist terrorism in Poland," and said that Jews there "are killed by the fascist elements not for any political motives, but are simply singled out because they are Jews."

### PREPART OF LATE JUSTICE BRANDEDS PRESENTED TO UNITED STATES SUPPRISE COURT BY HADASSAH

WASHINGTON, June 13. (JTA) -- The perfect of the late Justice Louis D. Brandsis was presented today by Hadassah to the U.S. Supreme Court at special ceremonies attended by many Senators. Congressmen and Supreme Court justices.
