FIVE KILLED IN THREE ATTACKS IN JAFFA AND TEL AVIV; EIGHT WOUNDED JEWS ARRESTED

TEL AVIV, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- One Jew, two policemen and two Arabs were killed in Haifa today when two armed groups of men attacked the city's central police station and held up a bank there. Simultaneously, six other men held up a bank in Tel Aviv.

In Jaffa 14 Jews in three jeeps drove up to the police station and opened fire with submachine guns and pistols, while a second group set off a home-made gasoline bomb near the Berclay Bank on the main street and then invaded the building. In the half-hour gun battle outside the police station, the Jew and the two constables were killed.

As the remaining thirteen attempted to retreat they were enriced by mobile police forces and a crowd of Arabs. The Arabs surrounded three of the raiders in one jeep and almost succeeded in Lynching them before the police arrested them. Five more Jews were captured by the mob, while five others escaped. All eight captured men were wounded.

At the bank, the other raiders wounded the bank manager who ran away from them, but were forced to leave the bank before they could obtain the keys to the vault. Another Arab mob attempted to halt them, but they made good their escape after throwing a hand granade at the Arabs, killing two. Seven other Arabs were injured in the two bettles. Later a sack of bank notes was discovered near the bank.

In the Tel Aviv hold-up no guns were fired, but a cashier was beaten when he attempted to resist the attackers. They made off with approximately \$10,000.

All inter-urban traffic was cut off by police and hastily summoned troops, and traffic on the roads from both oities was halted and the vehicles searched. In Jaffa the Arabs aided the police in blockeding side streets with barbed wire entanglements in preparation for a detailed search.

CZECH COVERNMENT DENIES ORDERING DEPORTATION OF CZECH JEWS CLASSIFIED AS GERMANS

PRACUE, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- The Czechoslovak Ministry of the Interior today denied reports broadcast by foreign radio stations that Czech Jews who registered as of German nationality in the pre-war census are being expelled from the country.

(A report to the JTA from Prague last week said that the wholesale expulsion of such Jews from the Sudeten city of Litomerice was prevented by the intervention of the Jewich Community Council. The report emphasized that the expulsion was postponed temporarily. The Jews were given the choice of "emigrating" voluntarily before Sept. 8, or being deported after that date.)

BRITISH OFFICERS IN PALESTINE WARNED AGAINST JUNISH WOMEN "SPYING" FOR HAGANAH

JERUSALEM, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- The British military staff in Palestine has issued a secret order warning British officers not to associate with Jewish women, who may be spies for the Haganah, it was revealed here today.

The order says that the underground movement is operating "an efficient and detailed intelligence service, making use of Jewish women who are paid to extract information" from military personnel. "These women naturally make full use of their powers of seduction," the secret order warns, asserting that investigation has proved that military information was obtained by the underground in this fashion.

The warning pointed out that the efforts of the Jevish women were directed primarily at officers who were in a position to know British military plans. It also said that men of unquestionable loyalty have thus unintentionally given information to the resistance forces.

JEWISH OFFICIALS OF PALESTINE GOVERNMENT REQUESTED TO RESIGN FROM THEIR POSTS

JERUSALEM, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- Jewish members of government advisory committees were requested today to resign from their posts in accordance with the policy of non-cooperation with the Pelestine Government adopted by the Jewish National Council of Pelestine. The request was made in the form of a letter addressed to cach of the Jewish officials.

The non-cooperation program is now being carried out under the direction of a special committee consisting of representatives of the Council and Jowish municipalities and town councils. Another committee is now engaged in preparing plans for the launching of the \$400,000 drive for the continuation of Jewish immigration into the country.

BRITISH RELEASE DETAINED PALESTINE JEW AFTER TWO WEEKS OF CONTINUED HUNGER STRIKE

JERUSALIM, Sept, 13. (JTA) -- Jacob Mori, 21, a Yemenite Jew, was released today from the Latrum camp after 14 days of continued fasting in protest against his detention. He demanded an immediate trial or release, and refused to permit a medical examination after he was brought to a hospital yetterday in a serious condition.

Nineteen detained Jewish women at the Bethlehem prison declared a 24-hour strike in sympathy with Dr. Wolfgang von Weisl who today entered the 13th day of a hunger strike in protest against his being hold without any trial in the Latrun camp. His condition was declared poor at the hospital to which he was transferred several days ago.

Isaac Gruenbaum, a member of the executive of the Jewish Agency who has been detained at the Latrun camp since June 29, was inscribed today in the Golden Book of the Jewish National Fund of the Council of General Zionists "as a sign of solidarity."

RABBINICAL STUDENTS EN ROUTE TO PALESTINE ARRESTED IN EGYPT FOR ALLEGED ILLEGAL ENTRY

CAIRO, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- Three rabbinical students en route to Palestine from Shanghai have been arrested by Egyptian authorities at Port Said where they were charged with illegal entry, it was learned here today.

U.N. COUNCIL GETS BRITISH AND ARAB PROPOSALS FOR ACTION ON REFUGEE QUESTION

LAKE SUCCESS, N.Y. Sept. 13. (JTA) -- A suggestion that all governments who recognized Nameen passports for stateless people after World War I be urged to continue such recognition now, thereby enabling the United Nation's International Relief Organization to issue identity papers to refugees so that they could travel to countries where they could obtain employment, was made at today's session of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations by Philip Noel-Beker, representative of Great Britain.

The session, at which the Council began consideration of the question of refugees and displaced persons, also heard the following suggestions from the British representative:

- 1. Arrangements for the legal protection of refugees could immediately be made at little cost, on the pattern of the work of the High Commissioner of the League of Nations.
- 2. Distribution centers should be set up both in the countries where the refugees are now, and in those where they could be received. Here again, the pattern set up by Nansen might be followed.
- 3. Actual movement of refugees to countries of re-settlement might begin almost immediately with specialists, doctors, dentists, etc. Family units might follow shortly after.

The British representative expressed his preference for the re-settlement of refugees and displaced persons in small units, as against mass-resettlement. As to the funds for an immediate initiation of long-term solutions, he reminded the committee that not only has the Inter-governmental Committee for Refugees certain resources for re-settlement, but the UNRRA council authorized its administration in August to use certain funds for re-settlement, and not only for care and and maintenance, as originally planned.

Nr. Neel-Baker expressed his conviction that if the nations of the earth rightly understood their own interests they could absorb all the refugees into new lives and new work in new lands.

U.N. Must Solve Entire DP Problem Within Three Years, Delegate Declares

Another proposal for immediate action was made by Dr. Alberto Arca Parro of Peru. Making himself the spokesmen not only of his own country, but of other Latin-American nations with projects of economic development, Dr. Parro suggested that a census of the average age, professions, skills and intentions of prospective immigrants be taken forthwith. Insofar as such figures were not available, the statistical commission of the United Nations could immediately undertake this work in cooperation with the proposed interim commission.

On the basis of such a census, Dr. Parro said, absorption of refugees could take place in a much shorter time than appeared to be envisaged in the constitution of the proposed International Relief Organization. The Economic and Social Council, he said, must prove itself able to solve the refugee problem in its entirety within two or three years, or else it would forfeit its right to exist.

A proposal that the Economic and Social Council should immediately send a cable to all nations of the world to ascertain their attitude towards the reception of refu-

gees and displaced persons was formally put forward by the delegate of Lebanon, Dr. Charles Malik, but voting on this suggestion was postponed.

Dr. Malik listed questions which should be asked of all courtries in order to find out: 1. Which countries are willing to receive refugees; 2. How many refugees will they take; 3. What categories and what numbers in each category of refugee will they take; and 4. How soon can they receive their quotas.

UNRRA WILL ASK TRUMAN FOR ADMISSION OF 150,000 DISPLACED PERSONS TO UNITED SPATES

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- UNRRA Director-General LaGuardia today told a press conference that UNRRA would recommend that the "fixed number" of refugees that President Trumen indicated he would ask Congress to admit to this country be raised from 50,000 to 150,000 additional refugees. "We could use 50,000 for housemaids in New York City alone." he said.

Australian Ambassador J.O. Makin told a news conference today that his country wanted, in time, to take in many displaced persons. At present, he said, Australia is epsecially interested in taking children. He said his government was hoping that some of the refugees would be tradesmen who could help in the Australian housing crisis.

200 REFUGEE RABBIS ARRIVE IN SAN FRANCISCO FROM SHANGHAI; TO SETTLE IN U.S., SO. AMERICA

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- More than 200 refugee rabbis and rabbinical students arrived here today from Shanghai where they were strended for more than five years during the war. Part of the group will continue on to various destinations in South America while the rest will be settled in the United States.

At San Francisco they will be temporarily housed at a special center arranged for them by the United Service for New Americans, which will meet the costs of transportation for the refugees from this city to various parts of the country. The organization is also preparing a special center on Long Island, N.Y., where many of them will be housed and cared for.

1,000 ORPHANED JEWISH CHILDREN TRANSFERRED FROM POLAND TO FRANCE; MORE TO FOLLOW

NEW YORK, Sept. 1.. (JTA) -- Charles Ullman, treasurer of Rescue Children, Inc., arrived here today from a mission in Europe where he has been engaged for the past two months in transferring 1,000 orphaned Jewish children from Poland to France.

Ullman said he conducted his work under an arrangement with the French Government which, he revealed, permits a total of 7,000 such children to enter France. He estimated that about 5,000 orphaned Jewish children are still in Poland, adding that to date 600 Americans have become sponsors for the maintenance of the children.

SWEDEN GRANTS 400 MORE TRANSIT VISAS TO POLISH JEWS EN ROUTE TO PATESTINE

STOCKHOIM, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- The Swedish Alien Commission today granted 400 additional transit visas to Polish Jews en route to Palestine. The visas are valid for a short period, and, as a rule, cannot be extended.

FORMER HEAD OF MAIDENEK CREMATORIUM ARRESTED BY SECURITY AUTHORITIES IN POLAND

WARSAW, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- Scourity authorities today arrested P. Dalecki, special executioner and one-time head of the Maidenek crematorium, where tens of thousands of Jews perished. Dalecki will be tried by a special court.

NEW YORK FEDERATION OF JEWISH PHILANTHROPIES LAUNCHES \$12,000,000 CAMPAIGN

NEW YORK, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- The Federation of Jewish Philanthropies of New York launched its 29th annual fund-raising campaign with a goal of \$12,000,000. The increase of \$3,000,000 over last year's goal was attributed to rising living costs, with food prices showing an increase of from 27 to 53 percent over those a year ago, Louis M. Loeb, campaign chairman stated.

Opening the drive at a luncheon at the Hotel Astor, Mr. Loeb said price rises "have pushed upward the operating costs of hospitils, femily welfare, vocational guidance and child care agencies, nurseries, old age projects, community centers and other welfare institutions, affiliated with the Federation." Norman S. Goetz, Federation president, also spoke.

WORLD FEDERATION OF Y.M.H.A.'S CREATED BY JEWISH GROUPS FROM U.S., CANADA AND EUROPE

NEW YORK, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- A world federation of YMHA's end Jevish Community Centers, one of whose aims will be to develop YMHA's, Jewish community centers, and Jevish youth work in Jevish communities throughout the world was formally created here this week by national leaders of Jevish youth-serving organizations with a policed membership of more than 500,000 in the United States, Canada, Great Britale, astralia and France.

The organization was established by accredited representatives of the National Jewish Welfere Board, national association of the 288 Jewish community centers and YM-WHA's in the United States; The National Council of YM-WHA's of Canada, representing 11 centers in the Downino; the National YMHA Council of Australia, representing Y's in Sydney and Melbourne; the Association for Jewish Youth of Great Britain, representing 70 Jewish youth centers in the British Isles; and Eclaireurs Israelites of France.

JEMS IN VENEZUELA ACTIVE IN JEWISH AFFAIRS; YOUTH ENJOYS EQUALITY IN ALL ECHOOIS

NEW YORK, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- Jews in Venezuela, numbering only 1,000 families, are taking a very active interest in world jewish affairs and are developing their own communal and cultural life, Israel Sonnenschein, Venezuelan Jewish leader, now on a visit here, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today.

Half of the Jews in Venezuela came to the country during the last ten years as refugees from Europe, but the basic component of the Jewish community are Sephardics who trace their existence in Caracas, Maracaibo and Velencia back almost 400 years, Mr. Sonnenschein said.

"The principal occupation of Venezuelan Jews is centered in the textile and furnishing industries," Mr. Sommenschein declared, "Jewish youths are admitted freely to all educational institutions where the policy is one of complete equality, and are welcomed into the student associations and activities. Among the organizations which benefit from compaigns carried on in Venezuela are the World Jewish Congress, Keren Hayesod and Keren Kayemeth," He stressed that "very enthusiastic activity is carried on in behalf of Pelestine."

BELGIUM FRECTS MEMORIAL FOR 30,000 BELGIAN JEWS KILLED BY NAZIS IN CAMPS

ERUSSEIS, Sept. 13. (JTA) -- The foundation stone of a memorial to Jevish victims of the German occupation in Belgium was laid in the Etterbeek cemetery here today. Only 1,500 out of 32,0000 Jews deported from Belgium by the Nazis have come back from the concentration camps.
