ADJOURNMENT OF LONDON PARLEY WILL HEIGHTEN TENSION IN PALESTINE, JEWISH AGENCY SAYS

JERUSALEM, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Members of the executive of the Jewish Agency met today to consider the sudden adjournment of the London conference on Palestine. A spokesman said that the postponement came as a complete surprise to the Agency.

The spokesman expressed the opinion that "we are as far from a solution as ever," and warned that the new delay will tend to increase tension and endanger peace and security. "It is extremely difficult to see how this postponement, this inability to come to grips with the problem, can be welcomed by or be beneficial to anyone."

The Agency, he stressed, is as anxious as ever to find a solution with the British Government's cooperation, but looks forward to the next few months with despondency and alarm.

Palestine-wide conferences held today by the Mizrahi and Hashomer Hatzair adopted resolutions against partition. The Hashomer Hatzair also adopted a resolution condemning terrorism.

The Haganah radio "Voice of Israel," commenting on the adjournment of the London conference, said tonight that the Jewish resistance movement will continue its activities.

NON-AGENCY GROUPS PREPARING TO SUBMIT VIEWS ON PALESTINE TO BRITISH GOVERNMENT

LONDON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Jewish organizations not affiliated with the Jewish Agency are preparing to submit their views on the Palestine issue to the British Government coincident with the new talks which began this week between the Agency and the Government, and which are expected to continue during the period the conference is recessed.

The Anglo-Jewish Association is of the opinion that the time to begin these discussions will be when the preliminary question of the basis for the participation of the Jewish Agency in the conference is settled, and the negotiations are extended to a discussion of matters of substance.

The Association would prefer to see a united Jewish front maintained. It hopes that the consultations with the British Government at the conference will be conducted by a single Jewish delegation incorporating all shades of opinion, but it would not refrain from placing its views before the government if this should prove impossible for technical or political reasons.

On the other hand, the Agudas Israel, while maintaining friendly contacts with the Jewish Agency, insists that the view of the non-Agency bodies must be considered now and on all issues, including matters seemingly concerning the Jewish Agency itself, such as the release of the detained Agency members. "Every aspect of conversations with the British Government is to be considered as a problem of general Jewish concern," a spokesman for the Agudah said today.

ARABS BACK BRITISH PLAN TO CALL INTERNATIONAL PARLEY TO SOLVE JEWISH PROBLEM

LONDON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The Arab representatives at the London Palestine conference agreed with Britain on the necessity for convening an international conference to seek a solution of the Jewish problem, Abdul Rehman Azzam Bey, secretary-general of the Arab League and chief Arab spokesman here, told a press conference today. He said that all the Arab states had agreed to participate in such a conference.

The Arabs had rejected the British federalization scheme, he said, because "it would be bad for both the Arabs and the Jews." Cooperation between the two peoples is possible only in an independent state which would have some Jewish ministers and, perhaps, a Jewish representative in the Arab League, Azzam Bey stated. He disclosed that the head of the British delegation told him that both the British and Arab plans were still on the agenda of the conference.

The Arab League official claimed that the Arab demand for a ban on Jewish immigration was not discriminatory, "but necessary in view of the political aims of immigration." For this reason the Arabs also objected to limited immigration during the transitional period before a final solution is arrived at.

Azzam Bey revealed that the Palestine Arabs have not accepted the Arab plan presented here, but expressed the hope that they would not be "intransigent."

JEWISH NATIONAL COUNCIL REJECTS PROTEST OF PALESTINE GOVERNMENT ON NON-COOPERATION

JERUSALEM, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Replying to a government letter which declared that the Jewish National Council's decision to raise an immigration fund and to withdraw Jewish representatives from government bodies was beyond its authority, the Council today said that the official argument was "of little avail and consequence."

The Council, in a formal letter to the government, said that it was impelled to withdraw Jewish representatives from official agencies because "it cannot and will not share responsibility with the government for action taken against the Jewish community and refugees."

Throughout the immigration fund, the letter continued, the Council sought to demonstrate clearly the community's dissatisfaction with the government's attitude towards immigration, and its sympathy and solidarity with the victims of this policy.

"Faced as the Yishuv is with irresponsible elements which maintain that dissatisfaction can only be demonstrated by violence and the government induced to change its attitude only through acts of terror," the Council rendered a service towards restoration of order and tranquillity, which can be achieved only by settlement of the Jewish people's legitimate claims," the letter concluded.

PALESTINE MILITARY COURT TRYING SYNAGOGUE CARETAKER CHARGED WITH HIDING ARMS

JERUSALEM, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The trial of Eliezer Neumann, caretaker of the Great Synagogue in Tel Aviv where British troops discovered a cache of arms and ammunition on July 31, opened here today before a military court. Neumann is charged with "unlawful possession of weapons."

TRUMAN CONFERS WITH ARMY ADVISER ON JEWISH PROPERTY MATTERS IN GERMANY

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--President Truman today conferred with Max Lowenthal, an adviser on Jewish property matters to Lt. Gen. Lucius D. Clay, deputy military governor of U.S. zone in Germany.

Upon leaving the White House, Lowenthal said that the President was "very sympathetic" to the problems of the persecuted Jews in Europe. Lowenthal is here to confer with War and State Department officials.

Earlier today, the President Truman refused to comment when asked at his press conference whether there has been any progress in securing the admission of 100,000 Jews to Palestine. He said that he had nothing to say at this time.

POLISH DEPUTY FLAYS GOVERNMENT FOR NOT EDUCATING PEOPLE TO DANGERS OF ANTI-SEMITISM

WARSAW, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Bundist deputy Dr. Michel Szuldenfraj, speaking in Parliament, accused the Polish Government of failure to organize a large-scale educational campaign informing the Polish people of the dangers of anti-Semitism, following the Kielce pogrom.

The deputy stressed that Kielce was not an isolated incident, but only one in a series of continuing attempts to provoke pogroms throughout the country and encourage attacks on Jews in trains and on highways. Jews are beginning to doubt the possibility of reestablishing themselves in Poland, he declared, after describing the general unrest of the Polish Jews who are moving toward the frontiers to investigate the possibilities of emigration.

Pointing out that anti-Semitism is being used as a weapon to destroy Polish democracy by the same elements who were responsible for anti-Jewish excesses before the war, Szuldenfraj recalled that those pogroms were "justified" by the alleged Jewish preponderance in the trade and professions while now various groups in the Polish population are "saturated" with Jewish possessions seized during the Nazi occupation.

Szuldenfraj concluded by calling on the Jews not to give way to despair, but to take up the fight against the remnants of fascism. He appealed to the Polish Government and the people to take effective measures against anti-Semitism.

RAID UNCOVERS HUGE QUANTITY OF STOLEN BRITISH UNIFORMS IN ARAB VILLAGE

JERUSALEM, Oct. 3. (JTA)--A huge quantity of uniforms recently stolen from military stores at Tel Litvinsky was discovered today in a neighboring Arab village, revealing the increased activities of illegal groups among the Arabs.

The Haganah radio asked tonight for an investigation into the manner in which the several hundred refugees who arrived here last month were deported to Cyprus. It demanded to know the fate of 12 who were hospitalized after the battle between the Palmach and a British destroyer and accused the authorities of using gas which caused painful burns and blinded many of the immigrants for several hours.

Mystery surrounds the death of 16-year-old Moshe Yemini, who was found killed by a train on a railroad track in a Jerusalem suburb. His parents said that he disappeared last night after a surprise check-up by police near his home.

BRITISH MILITARY IGNORE UNVEILING OF MEMORIAL IN BRITISH ZONE TO MURDERED JEWS

LUNEBURG, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The absence of representatives of the British military authorities aroused bitter comments today at a ceremony here marking the unveiling of a memorial to Jewish prisoners of concentration camps buried in the nearby woods.

Representatives of the Belsen Jewish central committee and anti-Fascist organizations spoke at the ceremony while two youthful Jews wearing concentration camp clothing and holding burning candles flanked the memorial as a guard of honor. German municipal authorities sent representatives.

The Jewish victims were part of a group of concentration camp inmates on their way to Belsen from another camp a few days before the liberation. When Allied planes attacked their train, some of the prisoners escaped, only to be shot down by SS troopers.

Bodies of 29 Jews Killed By SS Guards Returned and Reburied in Bavaria

MUNICH, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The bodies of 29 Jewish victims of the Flossenburg concentration camp were reburied today in Neunburg-Vorn-Wald in northern Bavaria after they were exhumed from a mass grave in a neighboring forest.

The bodies were discovered by a displaced Jew from the local community. Jewish DPs recalled to a military government officer that 29 inmates of the Flossenburg camp were shot by SS guards during a death march 24 hours before the camp was liberated by American forces.

The American officer ordered the German burgermeister to hold the exhumation in the presence of Jewish witnesses and American troops. Some bodies were still covered by camp uniforms, and their identification numbers were still discernible.

The bodies were buried in a special cemetery, and each grave was marked by a white wooden tablet with a blue six-pointed star.

GERMAN NEWSPAPER IN MUNICH FACES LOSS OF LICENSE FOR PUBLISHING ANTI-JEWISH ARTICLE

MUNICH, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The editors of the Sueddeutscher Zeitung published here faced the loss of their publication license today as the result of an article libeling Jews.

The libelous article discussed the black market and mentioned "kinky-haired persons with hooked noses" always being found dealing in illegal operations. A military government spokesman said that the loss of the license would not be caused by this article alone, but also by other violations unrelated to this one.

HUNGARIAN PROTESTANT BISHOP URGES PASTORS TO PURGE COUNTRY OF ANTI-SEMITISM

BUDAPEST, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Addressing a pastors' convention here, Bishop Laszlo Ravasz of the Protestant Reformed Church today urged that the ministers endeavor to purge the Hungarian body politic of "miserable anti-Semitism." He condemned the "silly stories" of ritual murder by Jews.

JEWISH REFUGEES RELEASED FROM CAMPS IN INDIA; ALLOWED TO REMAIN IN COUNTRY

LONDON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--British authorities in India have released from detention camps practically all the Jewish refugees from Germany and Austria who were interned in India as enemy aliens, it was disclosed today in a cable from the Jewish Relief Organization in Bombay to Samuel Silverman, Labor MP, who intervened on behalf of the refugees during a recent visit to India.

Although the refugees will not be returned to Germany and Austria, the message stated that it is difficult to find jobs for those who are being allowed to remain in India. The relief organization said that it would arrange for the emigration of those who are not allowed to stay.

UNRRA DIRECTOR ADMITS BAD CONDITIONS AT CAMP WHICH JEWISH DP'S REFUSED TO ENTER

FRANKFURT, Oct. 3. (JTA)--UNRRA camp director Albert Goldman has admitted that conditions at the Babenhausen camp, which led to a sit-down strike by 2,000 Jewish DP's this week, were bad, but said that every effort was being made to improve them.

The DP's, most of whom recently arrived from Poland, refused to leave the trains carrying them from a transient center at Landshut when they saw the condition of the Babenhausen camp, which formerly housed prisoners of war.

After pleas by Jewish chaplains, relief workers and Lt. Gen. Geoffrey Keyes, commander of the U.S. Third Army, most of the refugees agreed to detrain. About 150 who refused will probably be compelled to return to Poland.

MOSLEY ANNOUNCES PLANS TO REVIVE FASCIST MOVEMENT IN ENGLAND; TOURING PROVINCES

LONDON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Sir Oswald Mosley, leader of the outlawed British Union of Fascists, served notice today that he intends to revive his fascist movement.

Publicly announcing his future plans, Mosley told newspapermen: "My views have not been modified by my experience. On the contrary, they have been intensified. The whole world is crying out for a new civilization. I believe I can supply it when the right time comes."

The "book club" movements which the Mosleyites have launched as a means of spreading their subversive doctrines is reported growing rapidly throughout the country. Mosley, who has already toured northern England addressing secret meetings, is now busy in London on a new book, "The Alternative," which he said will outline the creed for his new civilization.

200 JEWISH ORPHANS TO BE BROUGHT TO BRITAIN FROM POLAND IN CHARTERED VESSEL

LONDON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Two hundred Jewish orphans from Poland are expected to arrive here aboard a chartered ship sometime this month, it was reported today.

PRAGUE JEWS SUSPECT TORAHS STOLEN FROM CZECH SYNAGOGUES BEING SOLD ABROAD

PRAGUE, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The Jewish Community Council here today issued a warning against buying torahs from Czechoslovakia, on suspicion that torahs stolen from damaged synagogues in Karlebad and Usti are being sold abroad.

CANADIAN LABOR BODIES REFUSE TO VOTE FOR ADMISSION OF 100,000 JEWS INTO CANADA

MONTREAL, Oct. 3. (JTA)--Resolutions condemning racial intolerance were adopted by the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada and the Canadian Congress of Labor, which held their annual conventions, simultaneously in Windsor and Toronto, respectively.

The Trades and Labor Congress endorsed unanimously a resolution condemning "any and all attempts to create division in the ranks of labor through race, creed or language," after Claude Jodoin, chairman of the committee on racial tolerance told the convention that "dissension along the lines of race and religion is the enemy of the trade union movement."

The same convention referred back to the executive a resolution petitioning the Dominion government to "allow the admission of 100,000 Jews and refugees into Canada." The resolution also asked the Dominion government to petition the British Government to "rescind the White Paper of 1939 which restricted the entry of Jews into Palestine and restricted the buying of land in the Holy Land by Jews."

The Canadian Congress of Labor, which is affiliated with the C.I.O., also did not vote on the Palestine and refugee resolutions.

JEWISH PARTISANS OF POLAND SEND HIGH HOLIDAY GREETING TO HAGANAH IN PALESTINE

WARSAW, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The Union of Jewish Partisans has issued a New Year manifesto greeting their comrades-in-arms throughout the world, particularly the Haganah fighters in Palestine who are "defending their honor and their right to organize a free national life." The manifesto hoped the New Year would see "the triumph of democracy and justice over the forces of darkness and reaction."

ENGLISH PRESBYTERIANS TURN OVER LONDON CHURCH TO JEWS FOR YOM KIPPUR SERVICES

LONDON, Oct. 3. (JTA)--The Presbyterian church in Marylebone will be placed at the disposal of the London Jewish community for Yom Kippur services, it was reported today. The capacity of the nearby West London synagogue is only 1,000 while the church will hold another 1,100.

GROVES WILL BE PLANTED IN PALESTINE TO HONOR ORTHODOX LEADERS IN UNITED STATES

JERUSALEM, Oct. 3. (JTA)--At a farewell ceremony here for Leon Gellman, president of the American Mizrahi Organization, who is returning to the United States, Dr. Abraham Granovsky, managing director of the Jewish National Fund announced that three groves of trees will be planted shortly with funds raised by the religious department of the JNF in the U.S.

The colonies will honor Rabbi Wolf Gold, Palestine Mizrahi leader; Rabbi B.D. Levinthal, dean of Orthodox rabbis in the U.S. and the late Dr. Bernard Revel, former president of Yeshiva College in New York. Mr. Gellman praised the activities of the JNF and expressed gratification that it has received the cooperation of all sections of the Zionist movement.
