EXTREMISTS KIDNAP BRITISH JUDGE IN PALESTINE: FORCE POSTPONEMENT OF GRIEFIER'S EXECUTION

JERUSALIM, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The execution of Dov Gruner, member of the Irgun Zvai Leumi who was sentenced to death by a military court for participating in an attack on a Palestine police station, was today postponed for an indefinite period following the kidnapping by Jewish extremists of Judge Ralph Windham, who was anatched from the Tel Aviv District courtroom.

The hanging of Gruner was originally scheduled to have taken place tomorrow. The postponement was granted by Lt. Gen. Sir Evelyn Barker. British commander-inchief. in order to enable Gruner to appeal to the Privy Council, highest court in the British Commonwealth.

Meanwhile, High Commissioner Sir Alan Cunningham summoned Jewish leaders and told them that he may impose martial law on certain sections of the country. if the kidnepped judge, as well as former Major H.J. Collins, who was kidnepped by extremists resterday in Jerusalem, were not freed by an undisclosed deadline, reported to he 48 hours.

A curfew of indefinite duration has been imposed on the Jewish quarters of Jerusalem and Haifa and a dusk-to-dawn curfew is in effect in all of Tel Aviv and on virtually all roads. Hundreds of heavily armed, helmeted troops were combing the three cities in a hunt for the four youths and a girl who seized Collins at his home Testerday, and the ten men who invaded Windham's court this morning and escorted him into a waiting car at gun-point.

Windham's kidnappers brandished tomyguns and revolvers at all those in the court, forcing them to line up egainst the valle. The judge was still wearing his black judicial robes and his white wig when he was led from the courtroom. Sirens were sounded almost immediately and the courthouse was cordoned off by police.

Radio Warns British Civilians Not to Appear in Street

Tension prevailed throughout the country today as a result of the kidnappings. The Palestine radio at periodic intervals instructed all British civilians to stay at home. warning them that "you are in danger of kidnapping."

A Jevish Agency spokesman told a press conference that the Agency would issue a vigorous demunciation of the kidnappings, because "they were an uncivilized procedure" and added that other leading Jevish bodies would issue similar statements.

The threat to impose martial law was made to Mrs. Goldie Meirson, head of the political department of the Jerusalem section of the Agency, Eliezer Kaplen, Agency treasurer, and Mayor Israel Rokach of Tel Aviv, who were called to Government House to meet with the High Commissioner.

Chief Rabbi Isaac Herzog, who has been on vacation, returned to Jerusalem today to join in the activity on behalf of Gruner. Both the Rish Commissioner and

Chief Secretary Sir Henry Gurney yesterday refused to see a delegation of the Agudas Israel and advised them to submit their statements in writing. It is learned that the appeal sent yesterday by Isaac Ben.Zvi, Jevish Mational Council president, followed an unsuccessful effort to see the High Countestoner.

The "Voice of Zion," secret radio of the Irgun, went on the air today with a warning to the authorities that if Gruner is executed, "there will be no atomesant for such a crime but the shedding of the perpetrators' blood. You will have to pay a high price for our captive brother's life," the broadcast continued.

The search for Windham centered around Remat Gan this evening, where the car in which he was abducted was found abandoned, and which was the scene of the reald for which Gramer was condemned.

Gruner's Sister Asks State Department Aid

MARHIMOTON, Jen 27. (JTA) -- Mrs. Helen Friedman, sister of Dov Grunor, today called on Loy Henderson, chief of the Near East Division of the State Department, to ask him to intervene in her brother's behalf.

When she emerged from the interview she said that Henderson had premised that the State Department would do everything it can in behalf of Gruner, but that since he was not an American citizen it appeared that there was little that could be done. Mrs. Friedman will carry her appeal to Lord Inverchapel, British Ambassador to the U.S., temorrow.

A cable, urging commutation of Gruner's death sentence, has been sent to Sir Alan Cunningham by the American League for a Free Palestine.

British Parliamentarians Ask Commutation of Gruner Sentence

LONDON, Jen. 27. (JTA) -- Several members of Parliament and Max Seligman, attorney for the Jove interned in Eritres, today called on Colonial Minister Arthur Creech-Jones, urging clemency for Gruner.

JENS AND ARABS MOUNDED DURING CLASH OVER PLOUGHING OF LAND OWNED BY J.N.F.

JERUSALEM, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- A clash in which a number of Jews and Araba were wounded occurred today in the Emel Heffer district when a group of Arab lend-owners attempted to drive off Jews who were ploughing J.N.F. land which had not been cultivated previously.

The land-owners secured the assistance of neighboring peasants, while residents of nearby Jewish settlements came to the aid of the ploughmen. The arrival of police dispersed the Arabs.

ERITAIN TO ISSUE STATEMENT ON PALESTINE WITHIN TEN DAYS; MAY AGREE TO PARTITION

JERUSALIM, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The British Government will issue a statement on Palestine within the next ten days independently of the course of the Conference on Palestine which was resumed today, it was learned here.

The statement will indicate that Britain is inclined to adopt a partition plan for Palestine; it is beliaved in informed circles. The partitioning of Palestine into separate Jevish and Arab states is firmly advocated in editorials by the Munchester Guardian and the Times.

LONDON CONFERENCE ON PALESTINE RESUMED; ARAB DELEGATE WARMS AGAINST PARTITION

LONDON, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The Palestine Arabs will reject partition and fight it with all means at their disposal, Jamal Husseini, leader of the Palestine delegation, today told the Conference on Palestine, which resumed after a 16-week adjournment.

Today's session, which was attended by 25 Arab delegates, representing the seven Arab League states and Palestine, lasted for an hour, adjourning immediately after Husseini's speech. A British spokesman said that it would probably not recovers until towards the end of the week.

The British, whose delegation was headed by Foreign Minister Ernest Bovin and Colonial Secretary Arthur Creech-Jones, apparently want some time to diget the Arabb' demands, and, at the same time, consult informally with the Zionist. The next step will probably be a reply by the government to both Husseini and the proposals of the Arab League, which were outlined before the conference adjourned last October.

Jewish Agency Declines to Comment on Arab Statement on Parley

The Jevish Agency office here declined to reply to Eusseini's statement, declaring that the Agency is familiar with the views of the Falestine Arabs and does not intend to engage in an exchange of polemics. An Agency spokement disclosed that David Ben Gurion expects to meet with members of the government within a few days, probably Wednesday.

Husseini's statement, which was in English, denounced British rule in Palestine, as denying the right of self-government and having the "primary aim of assisting the Jove in their invasion." He described the Balfour beclavation as "vague and one-sided" and said it was made to "alten Jove in the absence and complete ignorance of the Arab owners of the country." He traced the growth of Joveths settlement in Palestine, declaring that their claims were inflated from the modest demand for a "spiritual home" to that of a Jovieh state, which the Jove are now seeking to enforce by a campaign of terrorium.

The "Autility, injustice and impracticability of partition" was indicated by a special commission of British experts," Russeini added. "It is foregone conclusion that the Palestine Arabs are determined to reject partition and resist it by all means at their disposal." Creation of "an alien Jevich state," he continued, "means the destruction of territorial continuity and national homogeneity and creation of a running core that would undoubtedly become a permanent source of trouble in the Middle East. Such a move, which in fact entails the creation of another Balkans in the Middle East. the Arabs can never tolerate."

The Araba, all of whom were in western dress, with the exception of the head of the Saudi Arabian delegation and the three Yemenite delegates, arrived at St. Jemes Palace, where the conference is meeting, shortly before noon and ren a heavy gauntlet of guarda and Scotland Yard detectives. Bevin, Orecon-Jones and the rest of the British delegation arrived a little later, and ethered by a separate entrance. A third entrance, which had been reserved for the Jewish delegates, was described.

Dr. Isaac Levin of New York, personal representative of Jacob Rosenheim, world president of the Agudas Israel, arrived today in connection with the projected talks with the government on Palestine, which Agudah circles here expect will start this week-end.

II.N. COMMISSION ON HIMAN RIGHTS MEETS: WILL ESPABLISH BODY FOR PROTECTION OF MINORITIES

LAKE SUCCESS, N.Y., Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The Commission on Human Rights of the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations, composed of representatives of 18 nations, opened its first meeting today with a discussion of its terms of reference. Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt was elected chairman, and Dr. Charles Malik of Lebanon, rapporteur.

Addressing the session, Henri Laugier, Assistant Secretary-General of the United Nations, said that the Commission would have to establish a sub-commission for the protection of national minorities, and another group for the prevention of racial and religious discrimination. Pointing out that it would also have to "determine the drafting" of an International Bill of Rights, he said: "The struggle for human rights is the very struggle of the United Nations in their efforts towards a batter future."

Mrs. Roosevelt, on taking the chair, emphasized the importance of the Commission on Human Rights. She revealed that she had received "a considerable number of speels from people and groups concerning human rights. The Commission, she said, was faced with a formidable task since its members did not really know how they could enforce its measures. "The members have a mandate to write a Bill of Human Rights, but they do not have any way to enforce their decisions," she declared.

ANTI-SEMITIC POLISH STUDENTS DISRUPT PLAY DEPICTING ROLE OF JEWS IN WAR

WARSAW, Jen. 27. (JTA) -- Anti-Jewish demonstrations have been taking place every evening in a Polish theatre in Cracow during the performance of the play "Melkonoo" which is devoted to the promotion of good will between Poles and Jews by domitting the role of Jews during the revolt against the Mazis in the Warsaw ghetto.

The demonstrations are carried out by groups of Polish students who attend the performance for the sole purpose of creating a disturbance. The first demonstration took place during the premiere, when the auti-Semites in the suddence interrupted with shouts and booing. The theatre management, nevertheless, decided to continue staging the play until the auti-Semitic students tire of their disruptive activities.

The author of the drama is a young and gifted Polish playwright, Stefan-Otwinowsky. When the play was presented in Lodz, the Polish population there received it very coldly. Many Poles Left the theatre before the end of the performance and on many subsequent evenings the show played to a nearly empty theatre. On account of heavy financial losses, the Lodz theatre was finally campelled to withdraw the play.

FRENCH COURT VOIDS WILL WHICH BARRED BEQUEST IF BINEFICIARY MARRIED A JEW

PARIS, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- A will barring a legates from a bequest in the event that she married a Jow has been voided by the Tribunal of the Seine, as running counter to the spirit and principles of the new French Constitution, which guarantees the equality of all citizens under the law.

The will of a certain Madams B left all her property to how grand-daughter, with the provise that if the grand-daughter married a Jew, the bequest was to go to an orphan asylum fund. The young woman, who is unmarried, challenged the terms of the bequest and was upheld by the court. Her attorney was Andre Blumel, president of the Jewish Mational Jund of France.

CONFISCATION OF NAZIS' FUNDS TO AID VICTIMS URGED BY BAYARIAN OFFICIAL

MUNICH, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Confiscation of the savings banked by active Mazis between 1933 and 1945 for use in rehabilitating Nazi victims was urged today by Dr. Philip Ausrbach, director of the Office for Political and Racial Persecutees in the Bavarian Government, addressing the first conference of the "Union of the Victims of Nazism," which comprises representatives from all political parties.

Dr. Auerbach also demanded the arrest of Dr. Arthur Dinter, who joined the Mazi Party even before Hitler and who is reported to have been a key figure in introducing anti-Semitiem into the party's doctrines. Dinter is free in the French zone of Germany, according to German newspapers. Author of "The Crime Against Blood," which was one of the early anti-Jevich volumes, Dinter held party card number 5, while Hitler had card number 7. Dr. Auerbach charged that Dinter still favored official action against Jews.

AIDE OF MUFTI SENTENCED TO JAIL IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA FOR ANTI-SENTTIC ACTIVITIES

PRAGUE, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Mohamed Abdul Brixius, a friend and aide of the ex-Mufti, has been sentenced to eight years imprisonment, confiscation of all his property and loss of civil rights by a Frague court which found him guilty of propagada activities on behalf of the German Nazi party and membership in Cach fascist organizations. During the German occupation Bruxius served as a commissioned officer in the Facisit squards corps Svatopulk and contributed anti-Semitic articles to the quickling papers.

In court, Bruxius denied that he ever attacked Jovs on racial grounds, asserting that this was forbidden by the Koran, but only for "historical and Pelestinian reasons." If he wrote against the Allies, it was because he objected burtish imperialism in the Near East, he said. Bruxius settled in Prague before the war, coming from the Balkans. He had traveled extensively in the Near East where he had been converted to Islam and made friends with the Mufti.

A Peoples Court at Litemerico yesterday sentenced Elfrieda Ruebsch, an overseer at the Theresienstadt ghette, to fifteen years imprisoment. Suebsch's task was to search all Jews arriving in the ghette for valuables.

Karl Rehm, former commander of the Theresienstedt ghette and concentration camp, has been handed over to Czechoslovakia by American authorities who had been holding him in outcody. Rehm will be tried by a Czechoslovak War Crimes court.

ITALIANS WHO BETRAYED JEWS TO GESTAPO ATTACKED BY SPECTATORS DURING TRIAL

ROME, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Enraged spectators yesterday attacked members of a six-man gang at the opening of their trial for betraying Jews to the destape after robbing them of their valuables.

Two hundred and two Jevish refugees left Genoa yesterday aboard the steamer Sam Giorgio for countries in South America. Some vill settle in Brazil, while others are bound for Argentina, Feru, Chile and Paraguay.

ARREST NAZI WHO PLAYED LEADING PART IN 1938 POGROMS FOLSOWING FOR RATH KILLING

LONDON, Jan. 26. (JTA) -- Erwin Killmeyer, a Mazi leader who played a leading part in the pogrous of 1938 which followed the assassination of Mazi diplomat Ernst wom Rath in Paris, has been captured near Heilbronn, in the province of Wussterners, it was reported here yesterday.

BULGARIAN GOVERNMENT GRANTS AID TO JEWISH CCOPERATIVES IN REHABILIZEATION MOVE

SOFIA, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The Eulgarian Government today granted 2,000,000 levas (approximately \$7,000) worth of materials to two Jewish cooperatives established by the Joint Distribution Committee as part of its program for the economic recommunity of the Jewish population.

The materials went to a tailoring and a shoe making ocoperative. The reconstruction program calls for the importation of large quantities of machinery and equipment to establish many more cooperatives and rehabilitate Jewish economy this year.

ITALIAN GOVERNMENT WILL ASSIST ORT SCHOOLS FOR FORMER JEWISH PARTISANS

ROME, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- The Italian Government will furnish buildings, instructors and raw materials for ORT schools which will train former Jewish partisans, Minister of Rehabilitation Sereni today told Dr. Aaron Syngalowski, ORT vice-president.

Dr. Syngalowski revealed that UNERA had assigned to ORT a large studio at Cine Citta, the former Italian Hollywood. It will be used to train 150 students.

CZECHOSLOVAK HEALTH MINISTER THANKS J.D.C. FOR GIFT OF 30,000,000 UNITS OF PENICHLIN

PRACUE, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- A gift of 30,000,000 units of penicillin by the Joint Distribution Committee to the Czechoslovak Government was revealed here today with the release of a letter by Health Minister Adolf Prochazka thanking the J.D.C. Commenting on the gift, the Prague daily Pravo Lidu said that this proves the J.D.C.'s understanding of the problems facing all Czeche, Java and non-Java alike.

PALESTINE IMPORTERS PLACE \$2,000,000 ORDERS FOR MACHINERY IN UNITED STATES

NEM YORK, Jan. 27. (JFA) -- Orders for over \$2,000,000 worth of American machinery and capital goods have been placed in the United States for Pelestinian importers by the Pelestine Furchasing Service, which is a partnership of the American Pelestine Trading Corporation "Ampal" and the Pelestine Economic Corporation, it was amounced today.

The Ampel also feedilitated the importation of Falestinian manufactured goods valued at close to \$1,000,000, the announcement said. It added that the Ampal will next month pay the fifth consecutive dividend of four percent to its 6,000 shareholders and that during 19% the registered capital of the corporation was increased from \$1,100,000 to \$3,300,000. The actual paid up capital was increased from \$1,100,000 to \$1,750,000.

EXHIBITION OF PALESTINE INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTS COMING TO UNITED STATES

JERUSALEM, Jen. 27. (JTA) -- An industrial exhibition of Palestine products will be shipped to the United States next week, it was amounced here today. Representatives of the Jewish Industrialists Association will come to New York to open the show.

MAURICE SCHMANTZ, NOTED ACTOR AND PRODUCER, AWARDED LOUIS D. BRANDEIS MEDAL FOR 1947

MEW YORK, Jan. 27. (JTA) -- Maurice Schwartz, famous Yiddish actor and producer, has been awarded the Jowish Forms's Louis D. Besadais Medal for 1947, it was announced here over the week-and. The presentation of the sward, which was given to Schwartz for his "contribution to Jawish culture as the amount and interpreter of the best in dramatic literature," will be made reb. 18 at the Kaurice Schwartz Thestre.
