LONDON, Mar. 11. (FM) -- The Frity Council, highest appellate tribunal in the British Empire, today gave counsel for Dov Cruner, condemned Falestine extremists and the attorneys for the Jerusalem superintendent of prisons two weeks to determine whether there is any precedent in Falestinian court practice to permit his mode, Frank Cruner, who reades in New York, to be deard before the Privy Council.

The Council's judicial committee requested that counsel determine whether there were any grounds for Frank Gruper to appeal for his nephew before the Palestinian High Court. If precedent, practice or law gave him that right, the judicial committee ruled, it would also be extended to his appeal to the Privy Council. The attorneys' for the Palestine Coverment challenged the older Gruper's right to appeal on the basis that he was a foreign citizen, residing outside of Palestine, the had no connection with the case except that he has a nephew who is a Palestinian citizen.

Before Bosss testified the chief prosecutor stated that the trial was taking place at a very appropriate time in view of the Big Four meeting in Moscow. He urged that the Moscow conferess observe the proceedings carefully and balance the accounts of what happened at Oswiscim with the Germans't place for mercy. He charged that Hoese has responsible for the murder of 4,000,000, seventy-five percent of whom were Jews.

The trial which is expected to last three weeks is attracting great attention because of its international character. Many governments are involved, since the recolle murdered by order of Hoese included men and women of many nationalities. In addition to Polish Jove who vill appear as witnesses, many foreigners will be among those who vill testify.

Seven U.S. Prosecutors Attending Trial as Observers

Jewish physicians and scientists from France, Ozeohoslovekia and Moreay have been summoned to testify both as experts and eye-vitnesses. AMERICAN HIGHER STANDARD OF LIVING LINKED TO IMMIGRATION, ECONOMIC SURVEY FINDS

MEW YORK, Max. 11. (JTA) -- Immigration to the United States has brought with it a higher standard of living for the American people and increased employment according to an economic report released last night by the Maticaal Committee on Immigration policy, which is headed by Earl Harrison, former U.S. Commissioner of Immigration and Maturelization.

The report points out that these facts are important in the light of present moves to liberalize immigration quotes. It adds: "Fears among Americans that immigration tends to displace native-born workers from their jobs and to create unemployment are not supported by scientific analysis. Immigrants have not only as workers increased the labor supply in this country but have as consumers increased the demand for more goods and thus the total number of workers needed."

Citing the experience of Canada and Australia, the report asserts that the economic problems of the two countries "are believed to be rooted chiefly in the sparaity of their population." It also declares that the United States is "entring upon a period of declining growth of population," and that "American prosperity has in the past always been linked with an expending population."

The report was prepared by Prof. Henry Miller, assistant director of the Social Research Laboratory of City College, and Dr. Carolyn Zeleny, research assistant of the Committee. The Committee is already preparing another study on the relationship between immigration and population.

GUARDS PLACED AROUND SALONIKA CEMETERY FOLLOWING A.J.C. INTERVENTION

NEW YORK, Mar. 11. (3Th) -- The American Jewish Committée téday aunounced that following representations made in Greece, to the Minister of Justice and to former Regent Archbishop Damaskinos, by Dr. Max Gottschalk, director of its foreign affairs department, steps are now being taken to halt the wandalism that had been practiced in the Joutsk cemetery of Salonika.

A message from Salonika to the American Jewish Committee states that the Governor General of Macedonia has authorized the hiring of two guards for the cemetery to be designated by the Jewish temmunity and paid by the government. A further message to the American Jewish Committee from Athens states that 41 bexes, weighing 15 tons, of archives and publications looted by the Mazis, have been returned from Germany and unloaded at Piracus.

SPONSOR OF BILL BARRING EDUCATIONAL BIAS IN M.Y. RENEWS FIGHT FOR MEASURE

ALEANY, N.Y., Mar. 11. (JTA) -- Assemblyman Bernard M. Austin today announced his intention of continuing the fight to have the current session of the New York State Legislature take favorable action on the Austin-Mahoney Bill before it adjourns this month.

Denying reports that he had withdrawn sponsorship of the bill which would surlaw discrimination in education on the basis of race, color, or mational origin, Assemblyman Austin, in a propared address for the State Assembly declared: "I may not withdrawn my sponsorship. Quite the contrary. I believe more than ever that is urrent that this bill be enacted into law."

The Assemblyan said that he was "utterly unable to share the views of those who say that this matter should rest until the temporary commission to study the need for a Ctate University has made its report. I am a member of the latest Commission. I say extendedly that both problems are virtually independent of each other.

ERRORS COMMITTEE APPROVES RESOLUTION FOR UNLIED STATES PARTICIPATION IN I.R.O.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- The Senate Foreign Relations Committee below approved the joint resolution, providing for United States participation in the International Refuges Organization.

The key medification states that membership in the deganization chall not a any way authorize "any temporary emergency or other immigration or admission to the United States or its territories or possessions of any refugees or displaced personal referred to in the constitution of the IRC." The President, "or any officer, resentative or against of the U.S.," is likewise prohibited, by the amendment, from authority to conclude any agreement with the eigenization. The amendment also provides that authorization for membership shall not be construed to affect in any way any other matter requiring action by Congress.

Instead of a blanket authorization for necessary funds for the American contribution to the IRO, another smendment limits the sum to \$75,000,000.

The proper care and effective resettlement of 'European var refugues and displaced persons depends upon United States cooperation in the problem, State Department and Justice Department officials told the Mashington section of the National Commoil of Jewish Women today.

George L. Warren, Advisor on Refugees and Displaced Persons to Gen. John H. Hilldring, Assistant Secretary of State for Occupied Areas, said he had "great confidence" that four more nations would soon sign the IRO constitution, completing the total of fifteen required before the organization can function. He suggested Deligium, Sweden, Switzerland, Australia and "two or three" South American countries as possibilities.

54,000 JEMISH CHILDREN MUST BE TAKEN TO PALESTINE, HADASSAH CONFERENCE IS TOLD

MEW YORK, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- There are 54,000 Jewish refuges children in Europe who are documed to become an international social problem unless they are true-ferred to Palestine, 100 members of the national board of Hadaseah were told here to day during their mid-winter conference at the Park Central Hotel by Mrs. Valuatill Hastings Sharp, of Reston, who made her first address in this country after a modific intensive survey of conditions among child refuges in the Holy Land, Czechoalovakie and Poland.

Mrs. Sharp, a well known relief worker for the Unitarian Service Cosmittee, the United States Cosmittee for the Care of European Children, and the President's War Helief Control Board, was sent arread two months ago by Edeassah to gather material on the needs and problems of Jewish child refugees in Europe, and returned to this city last week.

"If we wait two more years to resolve the excrusiating problems existing among what is left of a whole generation of Jevish youth in Europe, these cililides will disappear.
