#### IRGUN BLASTS MILITARY HEADQUARTERS IN JERUSALEM'S "SEALED AREA"; ONE BRITON KILLED

JERUSALEM, Mar. 12. (JTA) -- British military headquarters in the "sealed area" of Jerusalem was heavily demaged in an Irgun attack early this morning in which one British officer was killed and eight wounded, three seriously. The building housed Brig. Cen. Edmund Davise, commander of the area; and his staff.

At about 4:20 a.m., a large hole was blasted in a wall surrounding the building, which was once a Syrian orphanage. Under covering fire of automatic weapons and small arms, a number of raiders placed four charges of explosives against the walls of the building itself. The explosions rocked the building and brought most of it crashing down. Home of the raiders was apprehended, although large troop forces were rushed to the area and flares lit up the night skies.

A short while after the attack correspondents received telephone calls informing them that the Irgun had carried out the attacks and that "all our soldiers returned safely to their bases." The Irgun, however, has ennounced that it was not responsible for the attacks in Tel Aviv Saturday night.

A new ourfew was clamped on the Jovish area of Jerusalem later in the day. It will be in effect from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily. A duck-to-dawn curfew was also put into effect in the North Felestine coastal area.

Several other attacks occurred during the night in various parts of the country, it was officially reported today. A military came at Karha, near Hadera, was attacked at midnight by a small group of men using rifles, pistols and hand grenades. There were no cancalties and no arrests. Near Thikarm, coutheast of Hadera, two military vehicles were fired upon. One soldier was wounded. Another was seriously injured when a jeep was blown up near the police came at Sarona, on the outstirts of Tel Aviv.

A Jewich girl, Esther Tobi, 19, was ceriously wounded last night by a soldier in the downtoin section of Jerusalem. The soldier opened fire with a submachine gmm on a crowd of people who had gathered to listen to a dispute between him, anothem, soldier and a Jewich bus driver. The hall of bullets also struck a man, wounding him less seriously then the girl. Both soldiers have been arrested pending a military inquiry.

The Palestine Supreme Court today rejected an application for an order hisi to show cause why imposition of martial law in Tol Aviv should not be set aside and why courts there should not reopen. The petition was brought about by R. Turjeman, secretary of the Sephardic Community of Tol Aviv.

It was reliably learned here today that the military authorities are planning to extend and tighten their restrictions should the attacks on military installations continue. The situation will be discussed in detail at the planary session of the Jouleh Agency executive which opens here temorrow.

WARRAW, Mar. 12. (JTM) -- Rudolf Hoses, former commandant of the Oswiscian death camp, today testified at his trial before the highest Polish court that Heintrich Himmler, Gestepo chief, had ordered him to exterminate 6,000,000 to 7,000,000 Jews, but that he was smable to carry out this order because the crematory ovens could only reduce to aches 10,000 persons a day. Hoses is charged with responsibility for the murder of 4,000,000, st least 75 percent of whom were Jews.

He stated that Oswiscim had been constructed specifically to destroy all the Jews in Europe and that plans for routing and healing millions of human beings were drawn up by Adolph Eichmann, Himmler's "expert" on Jewish affairs. He said Eichmann was the only man in the world who had exact figures on the number of Jews murdered by the Nazis.

Hoose reported that the gas chambers and ovens operated treaty-four hours a day until October, 1943, when, he said, Himmler ordered him to cease because negotiations were being carried on in Turkey and Switzerland with Jewish representatives. He declared that Himmler hoped to exchange Jews for arms to continue the war against the Allies.

Hosse' testimony had a terrifying effect on the audience. Speaking calmly and quietly, the man who has been described as "the greatest mass murderer in history" recounted tales of burned bodies as though he was listing an inventory of merchandicin a shop.

When the prosecutor asked him whether he had a "bad conscience" concerning the murders, he replied: "Gestago men have no human feelings; Gestago men were trained at a special school in Dachau where all human feelings were stamped out of them. For showing pity to a prisoner, a Gestago men was liquidated."

The only time he attempted to refute a charge egainst him was when the presecutor declared that he would call two witnesses to prove that Jewish children were tossed into the evens while still alive. This Hoess denied, insisting that they were all dead before being consigned to the flames.

#### 1.100 JEWISH REFUCEES IN ITALY CALL OFF HUNGER STRIKE AFTER EXCETY HOURS

ROME, Mar. 12. (JTA) -- The hunger strike of 1,100 Jewish refugees at Camp Adriatico was called off today after UMRNA officials compiled with the Jews' request for improved conditions. The strike lasted 80 hours.

Italian Foreign Minister Carb Sforza today received Jacob Trobe, director of the Joint Distribution Committee in Italy, and assured him that the 25,000 refugees in this country need not fear loss of their rights of asylum as a result of a census of foreigners which is now being conducted.

The census, the Minister said, is not directed against Jewish refugees. He pointed out that Italy's acceptance of 400 Jewish orphans from Poland demonstrates the goodwill of the Italian Government and that the country is free of anti-Cenitian. Mr. Trobe thanked the Minister in behalf of the refugees and assured him that they appreciate the hospitality afforded them by Italy.

#### JUNIEH CONCRESS DEMANDS HEARING AT MOSCON CONFERENCE ON PEACE TREATY WITH GERMANY

NARHIMION, Mar. 12. (JTA) -- The World Jewish Congress has demanded that the Conference of Foreign Ministers which is now taking place in Moscow, hold a formal bearing on Jewish demands on the German peace treaty before negotiations on the pacture concluded, it was reported at a press conference here today by Dr. Maurice L. Ferlaweig, head of the political department of the organization.

"Such a hearing," he said, "would help to re-establish the confidence of the Josish people in the process of democratic justice." The Congress' request has been forwarded to the governments of France, Eritain, Russia and the United States; he said, together with a number of recommendations for clauses to be embodied in the westry, which include:

- 31. Judicial decisions made by German civil or oriminal courts between Jan. 31, 193 and May 8, 1945, and based solely or predictionally on wastal, political or relations grounds, should be recognized as contestable by any person injured by such a decision or by the spouse or the descendants of such a person. The contesting party should have the right in such an action to claim compensation for damage inscultably suffered.
- 2. The Peace Treaty should oblige Cormany to enact logiciation making it a criminia Offense to foment racial or religious natura. It should also contain special provisions for the protection of the human rights and fundamental freedoms of the surviving Jews in Germany, with efficient and effective instruments for their implementation and emforcement.
- 3. DP's compelled to remain in Germany should not be subject to German jurisficial, but should be under the countries authority of the cocupying forces or an appropriate agency of the United Nations.

Another clause proposed for inclusion would incorporate into the treaty and guarantee by the signatories the basic right of German Jews to restitution of their property, regardless of any laws which may have been put into affect by provincial German officials under the authority of occupying powers. The memorandum also demands that Germany be required to surrender heirless Jewish property to representative Jewish agencies for rehabilitation of the surrivors.

Also urged is guarantee of the right of emigration of German Jevs still in the country, examption of the property of German Jevs outside of the country from being seized for German reparations and examption of Jevs within Germany from teachion for the payment of German reparations or war damages claims against the country. Finally, the Congress memorandum requests that Germany be forced to pay reparations to "an authorized agency of the Jevish people" for the massacre and aproofing of millions of European Jevs.

## LEADERS OF JUNIOR PEDERATIONS ASK ADMISSION OF JEWS TO PALESTINE, UNITED STATES

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Mar. 12. (JTA) -- Action on the admission of Jewish refugees to Telestine, the United States and other countries, on the present critical states in Palestine, the development of the Wattonal Community Relations Advisory Council, coordination of fund-raising activities, and meeting overseas Jewish needs, highlighted discussions conducted by the Western States Regional Assembly of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds which concluded its three-day session here.

Over 250 leaders of communities in the ten state area computaing Arizona, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming and Western Canada, unanimously elected Max E. Elock of Seattle, president of the region; Judge Jacob Weinberger of Los Angeles and Marcel Hirsch of San Francisco, vice-presidents, and Ivying Schneider of Long Seach, treasures.

Action on Palestine followed the address by Hartley C. Grum, member of the Anglo-American Commission to Palestine, and was unminous. The assembly called upon the United States Government to use its good offices to open Palestine to Jevish immigration within the limits set by the Jevish Agency; condemned acts of terrorism in Palestine whether by Jevs, Arabs or British officials; applanded "the resolute spirity and patience displayed by the Yishuv in face of unconscionable trials;" and condemned the British Government for its policy of penaltring the entire Jevish population of Palestine for acts committed by a few, and for its delaying tactics "which are keeping 250,000 victime of Naziem Dehind Darbed wire enclosures in Germany, Austria, Italy and Gyprus."

## State Bepartment Is Urged to Publish Its Files on ex-Mufti

Other resolutions called upon the U.S. State Department to publish its files "relating to the Grand Mufti's partnership with Harism and his orimes of murder;" requested U.S. intervention to help jetish immigrants to be admitted to the various countries of the world; and endorsed the program and objectives of the Hatichal Community Relations Advisory Council, recommending that it undertake a national study of anti-Semitism in cooperation with its constituent bodies and called upon N.C.R.A.C. to push vigorously all programs of social legislation such as F.E.P.C.

The conference endorsed the 1947 United Jevish Appeal campaign and called for the realization of all its objectives. It commended also the non-Jevish contributions which were made to the 1946 drive and the development of women's and youth's dividicas. The Budget Clinic held during the conference urged the national coordination of related fund-raising drives and supported a special study of tuberculosis needs and services by the Council of Jevish Federations and Welfare Funds.

The various sessions noted the strengthening of central community organization, national coordination, local and national planning for community relations fund-raising methods, family velfare and vocational services. The speakers included Henry Epstein of New York, chairman of the N.C.R.A.C.; Philip Bernstein of New York, associate director of the Council; Joseph Beck of New York, executive director of the United Service for New Americans; and Lee Gallin, executive director of the Lee Angeles Jewish Community Council.

#### JENISH MASS MEETING IN MEXICO BACKS JENS ON PALESTINE: ASKS FREE INMIGRATION

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 12. (JTA) -- A resolution pledging support of Mexican Jevry to the Jeve in Palestine in their fight for free immigration and land acquisition was adopted here at a mass meeting marking the opening of a fund-raising campaign for the Histadruth.

Don Pines, special representative of the Histadruth and one of the editors of the Falestine Hebrew Labor newspaper, Pavar, was the principal speaker at the meeting. He reported on the progress of Feviet work in Palestine in the face of present political difficulties. The resolution alopted at the meeting assured the Palestine Jewish Community that "your fight with enemies outside and with destroyers inside is our fight." It declared that "despite all difficulties we shall see a Jowish state in Palestine."
