FORS OF TEL AVIV AND RAMAT GAN RELEASED FROM LATRIN; NATHANYA MAYOR STILL DETAINED

JERUSALEM. Sept. 11. (JTA) -- The Palestine Government today released Mayor ael Rokach of Tel Aviv and Mayor Abraham Krinitzi of Ramat Gan from the Latrun tention Camp, where they had been held for more than six weeks. Mayor Oved Ben of Nathanya, as well as the heads of several smaller municipalities, were not eed.

With no more explanation than was given at the time of their arrest, Rokach d Krinitzi were informed this afternoon that they were to be released. For a time was stated that they would refuse to leave without Ben Ami, but 55 minutes after e announcement by the government that they had been freed, the two men left the mp.

In an exclusive interview tonight with the JTA, Rokach described the events this afternoon as "not a release, but a kidnapping." He said that the Acting Chief the Criminal Investigation Department, Brigadier S.B. Johnson, arrived at Latrum is afternoon and invited Rokach outside the enclosure, where Johnson announced that was being released. Rokach asked: "Where's Krinitzi and Ben Ami?" Johnson relied that Krinitzi was also being released but that Ben Ami would remain.

Rokach then said: "I am also remaining. We are as guilty as he." The CID nief replied: "You can't do that." He asked Rokach, who was dressed in shorts, be usual camp garb, to enter his car. Rokach's belongings were left behind and he as not given an opertunity to say goodbye to the other detainees. Johnson proised to convey Rokach's and Krinitzi's protests at Ben Ami's continued detention the authorities. Rokach pointed out tonight that he was never charged with mything and the police and camp authorities never replied to his queries as to my he was detained.

Jewish Youth Kidnapped In Jerusalem; Second In Two Days

The police car that brought Rokach home entered the city without any fanfare. nd none of the residents, aside from his immediate family and the top officials of he municipality, knew that he had been released. He appeared to be in good health, Ithough indignant concerning his incorporation. This evening delegations of proinent residents and many friends came to his home to welcome him back.

Haim Khakhar, 19, was kidnepped this afternoon in Jerusalem by a party of men ho escaped in two taxis. Meanwhile, no word has been received concerning Eliahu odes, 18, who was abducted yesterday. It is reported that the Haganah is behind he kidnappings.

DOUS REFUGEES VOW THEY WILL DEFY BRITISH ATTEMPTS TO SEPARATE THEM; LEADERS FREED

POPPENDORF CAMP, Germany, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- The 4,400 Exodus refugees confined this camp and at nearby Am Stau today voiced their determination to defy any ritish efforts to separate them.

At a mass meeting at Am Stau today, more than 1,400 refugees who were taken of the Empire Rival pledged themselves to stay together until they reach Palestine. If Expendorf the leaders of the refugees, as well as persons questioned at random, pressed that it was vital that uteps he taken to prevent their being separated. One pokesman said: "We have gone through so much together that we feel hite one family. Editional parties have almost been forgotten, so that we can act as a single unit."

All of them were agreed that the Eritish will attempt to break them up into all groups, and by distributing them to various camps, free themselves of any inancial responsibilities, at the same time demoralizing the refugees so that their stemination to return to Palestine will be weakened.

Possible disturbances were averted today when the British moved all of the 62 leders arrested during the disembarkation on Tuesday to Poppendorf from the Hamburg tock area, where they had been held under heavy military guard. All were promised by the authorities that they would not suffer any reprisels.

Mordecai Rosman, 30-year-old Polish Jew, whom the British have sought to portray is the agitator who caused all the viclence on the Runnymede Park, scoffed at the barges that his "fenaticism" caused the passengers on the ship to resist. "That wouse is pure Downing Street protaganda," he said, "aimed at persuading the world hat we Jews wouldn't really want to go to Palestine, were it not for a few zealots." ball wiry Rosman waved aside questions concerning his personal buttle with the British troops, which resulted in his being brought off the Runnymede Park bloody and monscious. He reluctatly displayed a heavily bandaged knee, a badly twisted elbow and several scalp wounds.

Deportees Continue To Sabotage Efforts To Screen Them; Reject IRO Aid

The refugees at this camp and nearty Am Stau were continuing today to subctage British efforts to acroen them, and were also refusing to submit to clumtary acreening by representatives of the International Refugee Organization.

IRO aides said that as of this afternoon none of the deportees had appeared for screening, which is mandatory if they wish to receive aid from the organization. British officers in charge of the compulsory screening report that most of the Jews claim that Palestine is their home and give biblical and Palestinian names. One officer admitted that the registration was "in a bit of a mess."

Meanwhile, Jewish organizationScontinued to stay away from the camps. However, Kurt Levin, head of the Jewish Agency activities in the British zone, was scheduled to visit the camps today to determine what the people want. Some medical aid will probably be sent in tomorrow.

LONDON, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- The British Foreign Office revealed today that the U.S. request that the Exodus refugees not be returned to Germany was made orally by Under-Secretary of State Robert Lovett to Lord Inverchapel, the British Ambaseador in Washington. A spokesmen confirmed that British's reason for rejecting the plea was based on its inability to find any other place to accommiss the Jews.

THICH RETURN HOSPITALITY OFFICE TO EXODUS JEWS; SET TERMS FOR ACCEPTANCE OF VOLUNTEERS

PARIS, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- The French Government has decided to renew its offer the hamiltonian to the Exocus refugees, a representative of the French Foreign Office mounted at a press conference today.

At the same time, he revealed the conditions which France had proposed to the fitish to govern the admission of the refugees. The British would have to furnish mes and particulars of the volunteers. Although the Foreign Office representative said that the Jews would be granted regular entry visas rather than transit papers, he added that the number of Exodus migrants who entered would be subtracted from the total number of DP's who are printted to enter France en route to other countries. When the Jews arrive in the country they will be accommodated in "holiday" camps by Entre Aids Francaise, a DC supported voluntary relief agency. Facilities will probably be readied for hem by the end of this month.

Medical examinations and other formalities required before the immigrants can after France will be carried out by British doctors and other personnel, although reach officials may be assigned to observe the proceedings. The French will establish control station at the border at Remagen to check the identity of the Jews and to take certain that each prospective immigrant is actually a volunteer.

In response to questions by newsmen, the French official revealed that France ad suggested to Britain that the Jews be offered some sort of priority in the manting of Palestine immigration certificates, else they would refuse all offers ade by the British and the French Government. However, the British have not replied to therrocosal.

Finally, the spokesman revealed that the French legation in Hamburg and French laison officials in the British zone were "cooperating" actively with British officials in an attempt to conclude the Exodus affair.

PIDEMICS MAY RESULT IF EXODUS REFUGEES ARE NOT CLEARED OUT OF CAMPS, WJC AIDE SAYS

LONDON, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- A warning that epidemics may break out in the Poppenforf camp where most of the Excdus refugees are concentrated unless the Jews are twoved in three weeks was sounded here today by Dr. Noah Barou, secretary of the forld Jewish Congress.

Speaking to a press conference following his return from Germany where he sitnessed the forcible disembarkation of the Jews from their prison ships and later visited the camp where they are interned, Dr. Barou declared that the centers were unfit for human habitation and that local authorities had told him that epidemics were likely if the Jews were forced to remain there for long.

He charged Britain with having violated international agreements by carrying but the landings without the assistance of the International Refugee Organization.

CONCRESSMAN DEMANDS U.S. WITFROLD AID TO BRITAIN UNTIL IT ACCEPTS UNSCOP REPORT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Congressman Adolph Sabath, Democrat of Illinois, in a letter to President Truman today, asked that any further financial aid to Great Fritain be withheld until Britain agrees to accept," without delays or reservations," the recommendations of the United Nations Special Committee on Palestine.

RECOMMENDS U.N. ASSEMBLY SET UP SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER PALESTINE REPORT

IAKE SUCCESS, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- A special committee of the U.N. General Asnly to consider the UNECOP report located as a possibility, following a statement Secretary-General Trgyve Lie today.

At his weekly press conference, Lie confirmed that he had forwarded such a remendation to the General Committee - subject to approval by the Assembly. As extined by Lie, there appears to be no reason why his proposal should not meet with proval, since it has been put forth with no political motives, but as part of a retariat plan to shorten what appears to be at this moment a three-month agenda still growing.

As visualized by Lie, the special ad-hoc committee on Palestine would be a full nation working group, paralleling the Political Committee under which the report now scheduled. If approved, the Secretariat's plan would speed up the General membly machinery, and at the same time, facilitate a decision on the Palestine re-

LIBRING TO BE NAMED ADVISER ON PALESTINE TO U.S. DELEGATION AT UNITED NATIONS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Former Assistant Secretary of State John H. Hilling will be special adviser on Palestine to the American delegation to the United lattons, it is reliably learned here today.

General Hilldring is considered in high official circles in Washington to be all equipped to act in this capacity, in view of his close acquaintance with many asticts of the Palestine problem. In the State Department he was intimately concerned the question of displaced persons and refugees. His experience in this field tes back even further to his previous service as chief of the Civil Affairs Dividuo of the War Department.

BRICAN NEWISH COMMITTEE URGES U.S. GOVERNMENT TO BACK U.N. PARTITION PLAN

NEW YORK, Sopt. 11. (JTA) - The American Jewish Committee today urged the United Sates Government to "vigorously and speedily" endorse the majority recommendation the United Nations Special Committee on Palestine which provides for the partitioning of Palestine into Jewish and Arab states.

In a telegram to Secretary of State George C. Marshall, the Committee emphasized hat it has "never been a part of the Zionit movement but has always been deeply uncerned with the development of Jewish settlement in Palestine." Signed by Joseph Froskauer, president, and Jacob Blaustein, chairman of its executive, the telegram Thressed confidence that the American people will back the government in supporting he UNSCOP majority recommendations.

"The UNSCOP, an impartial international body, has come to substantial agreement me the dangerous and difficult problem in a troubled area," the telegram pointed out. Acceptance of this report would in our judgment tend to bring about the quickert possible beneficial results in the handling of the problem. It offers immediate for relieving the desperate situation of 150,000 of the Jews in the displaced persons camps of Europe. We express to our Government our wholehearted endorsement of the spirit enimating the majority report and our confidence that the American people, impelled by a love of fair play and justice, will back our Government in supporting it."

ICIAN COURT SENTENCES TWO STERNISTS TO 20 MONTES FOR POSSESSION OF EXPLOSIVES

BRUSSELS, Sept.11. (JTA) -- Elizabeth Lazarus, 21, and Elias Jacob, 29, admitted fermists, were today sentenced to 20 months imprisonment by a Mons court for transpring explosives which they allegedly planned to use against high officials of the Palostine Government.

The court said that Miss Lazarus, a heroine of the French resistance and a candaughter of the Russian composer, Alexander Scriabin, had in her possession when rested 14 "letter bombs" addressed to officials of the Palestine Government, from the High Commissioner down. Both she and Jacobs had detonators in their luggage.

Attorneys for both announced that an appeal would be rade. Meanwhile, it as learned that the French Government has asked for their extradition.

9 PFRSONS SHOT BY RUMANIAN BORDER GUARDS WHILE ATTEMPTING TO CROSS FRONTIER

EUCHAREST, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Minoteen persons, a number of whom are believed to be Jews, were killed by Rumanian border guards in the first week of this month, it as disclosed today. The 19 were attempting to cross the border into Eungary clanastinely when frontier patrols operating out of Arad, Transylvania, shot them.

ECRETARY OF PARI JEWISH COMMUNITY FOUND MURDERED IN HIS OFFICE

ROME, Sept. 11. (JTA) - Kamli Zakiel, secretary of the Jewish community council in Bert, was found murdered in his office last night, it was learned today. About 100,000 lire were missing from the community funds, and it is agrued that Zakiel was the victim of a robber.

ARRIVAL OF TWO TRANSPORTS OF DP'S FILLS AMERICAN-SPONSORED CAMP IN AUSTRIA

VIENTA, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Camp Ebelsberg, the American-sponsored Jewish DP ecumunity near Linz, was brought to full strength today with the arrival of 270 persons from Bad Ischl and 430 from Bad Gastein. Previously the occupants of the Braunau Camp were transported here. The DP's have formed their own administrative ecumittee.

CANADIAN UNION OFFICIAL LEAVES FOR EUROPE TO HELP CHOOSE DP IMMIGRANTS

MONTREAL, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Bernard Shane, manager of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union of Cenada, left for Europe where he will serve as member of a Canadian delegation to select some 2,500 skilled DP needle trades workers from camps as immigrants to the Dominion.

The majority of the 2,500 needle workers will take up residence in Montreal and Toronto, where most of the factories in the industry are concentrated. It was amnounced that the former German submarine tender Huascaran which was awarded to Canada as reparations will be placed in service this winter transporting DP immigrants from Europe.

HEBREW UNION COLLEGE ESTABLISHES FELLOWSHIPS FOR CHRISTIAN CLERGYMEN

CINCINNATI, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- The Hebrew Union College today announced the establishment of two graduate fellowships for Christian clergymen. The recipients of the fellowships which are sponsored by the Louis and Mary Horowitz Foundation of New York City, are Dr. Charles L. Smith, a Beptist clergyman in Indianapolis, and Rev. Gus W. Van Beek, a Presbyterian of Tulsa, Okla.

The H.U.C. also announced that Dr. Sheldon H.Blank, professor of Bible, has been appointed chairman of its faculty.

YORK U.J.A. REOPENS \$65,000,000 DRIVE FOR SEPTEMBER; SEEKS TO RECOUP \$9,000,000

NEW YORK, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Two hundred leaders of New York's Jewish community officially reopened the \$65,000,000 compaign of the United Jewish Appeal of Greater Jew York for the entire month of September at a special emergency meeting held at the Hotel Astor today.

Edward M.M. Warburg, a chairman of the Greater New York drive, pointed out that the unprecedented September campaign was necessitated by the fact that the 1947 effort in the metropolitan area was begun more than a month later than usual. As a tonsequence, he said, the United Jewish Appeal had been unable this year to reach a considerable number of contributors who last year donated a total of \$9,000,000 to the UJA campaign.

The entire September effort, he explained, will be devoted to two major projects:

1. A concentrated effort on the part of campaign leaders and volunteer workers to recoup the \$9,000,000 donated by men and women last year and which has not yet been contributed in 1947.

2. To gain the support of thousands of new contributors who are interested in the welfare of the 1,500,000 Jewish survivors abroad.

The September campaign was made possible by a special agreement with the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies which ordinarily launches its annual campaign during this period. In view of the grave emergency situation abroad, the leaders of the Federation drive have agreed to the special UJA September effort.

Although no exact figures are as yet available, Mr. Warburg revealed that at the current moment the Greater New York campaign had already gone over the \$32,000,000 raised in 1946. He pointed out, however, that in view of the tremendous programs which the United Jewish Appeal agencies have had to carry out during this year, nothing short of the \$65,000,000 campaign goal will suffice to meet the needs of the Jewish people abroad.

RABBINICAL COUNCIL ISSUES STATEMENT ON AMERICAN SOCIAL PROBLEMS; HITS DISCRIMINATION

NEW YORK, Sept. 11. (JTA) -- Expressing the hope that the new labor law will be reasonably administered without reversing the course of progress in labor-management relations, Dr. Manuel Laderman of Denver, Colorado, chairman of the Social Justice Commission of the Rabbinical Council of America, organization of some 350 Orthodox Rabbis, today issued a statement on the views of the Commission concerning social problems prevalent in American life.

The statement stresses the need of "a critical approach to our own deficiencies" and urges Americans to encourage the attempts being made throughout the country to eliminate discrimination because of race, color and creed in the industrial and educational fields of endeavor, deplores the removal of barriers against high prices and urges cooperation with the government to bring the cost of living within the reach of most people.

"Old sources of ill-will in the field of race relations, from which Americans have too easily turned their eyes, are receiving international attention," the statement says. "Those whose purpose it is to malign America use the discriminations against some of our citizens as a brush to tar our country's good name. The noble intention of being helpful to the less fortunate nations elsewhere is being obscured by revelations of the inequalities that have existed unchallenged within our borders. A more critical approach to our own age-old deficiencies would lift American prestige everywhere and would improve the democratic status of our people. It must, therefore, become our duty to encourage the attempts to improve the lot of the negro, to remove quotas in our colleges, to open up areas of employment, to eliminate restrictions on housing and the great host of discords which mar the American scene."
