IN SUB-COMMITTEE ON ARAB PROPOSALS TO PRESS BI-MATIONAL STATE AS "COMPROMISE"

IARE SUCCESS, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- A "compromise" solution of the Palestine while, involving the ostablishment of a bi-national state, is taking shape within the United Nations sub-committee studying Arab proposals to the Ad Eoc Committee, it as learned here.

The latest "compromise" is known to have originated with the Colombian chairen of the sub-group, Dr. Genzales Fernandez, who is the only non-Moslem on the body.

Members of the committee who favor the scheme argue that a recommendation for a bi-national state rather than a unitary Arab state would place the Arabs in a better light since it would make them appear willing to compromise. It is considered possible that such a proposition could receive a two-thirds majority vote because many mentral" delegations which are now inclined to abstain from voting might favor it.

Also, the proponents of the scheme hope to be able to obtain the support of the Soviet delegation which was originally in favor of a bi-national state. Finally, it is expected that Britain might also support it as a solution acceptable to both peoples and therefore would be willing to remain in Palestine alone during the transition period.

# TRISION MOUNTS IN PALESTINE AS IRGUM, HAGANAH CLASH; THREATS OF "WAR" EXCHANGED

JERUSALEM, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- Tension mounted within the Jewish community of Palestine tonight following a week-end of verbal and physical clashes between members of the Irgun and Haganah.

An Irgun communique charged Devid Ben Gurion of desiring fratricidal warfare and threatened that "he will have it." Among a number of incidents reported today and year fights between rival groups of leaflet distributors and the abminion of a driver of a truck and the hijacking of the vehicle and its contents. Although the Irgun insisted that its members have only defended themselves, even to the extent of firing several shots, it was reported that in Relocoth extremists beat we 62-year-old man when they invaded his home in search for his son, an active member of the Histadruth.

The Haganah is understood to have instructed its members to fight the dissidents by "legal means only"--without the use of firearms.

Following strong representations from the Jewish Agency, the Palestine Government today sent high police officials to Syria to obtain the release of five Jews continued yesterday by the Syrian authorities, it was learned tonight. According to an official communique, the five Jews were captured north of the Palestine frontier and were alleged to be in possession of arms at the time of their capture.

Ahorn Satzman, 25, a Jewish supernumerary policemen, was found shot to death last night. Thirteen British soldiers died in an accident involving two military trucks near Haifa.

# PAR CEPOSITION TO JEWISH STATE IN PALESTINE MUST NOT BE MINIMIZED. SHERTOK WARNS

ATLANTIC CITY, Oct. 25. (JTA) -- Arch opposition to a Jewish state in Palmine must not be minimized if the Jews are to be successful in building their own fatt there, Moshe Shortok, political chief of the Jewish Agency, declared this weekand at the 33rd annual convention of Madassah. The parley, which is being atlanted by some 3,000 delegates, is slatted to close Tuesday.

The vehemence of the Arab opposition to Jewish statehood is in a small meamre evidence of the Arabs' conviction of the practicability of a Jewish state, Sherba insisted. "It is because the Arabs know how real and practical our claim is, and that force our advocacy of Palestine has created both in the Centile and Jewish worlds that they can make so desperate a bid for the overthrow of claims to Jewish statebood," he declared.

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the American section of the Jewish Lency, who preceded Shertck, asserted that the United Nations faces a "major victory of a major defeat" over the Palestine issue. "It will enormously increase its restige and authority if it succeeds in solving the Palestine problem. It will be which to its very foundations if it fails to back up the recommendations of its own iming committee," Rabbi Silver said.

For the Jewish people, an affirmative decision will mean the "beginning of new epoch in its history, a turning away from the Valley of the Shadow of Death, to new life and a new hope. The manner in which the Arab proples will react to the decision of the United Pations will also have great consequences for them," he continued. "It may mean prolonged and costly conflict which will benefit no one, or it by mean cooperating for the regeneration of the entire Hear East for the blessing of all end the burt of none."

The United States was the first of the great powers to endorse a Jewish to in Pelestine, and it now should insist that similar action be taken by the little Nations, Mrs. Rose Helprin, the only American woman member of the Jewish Agency mention, said in an address last night.

Mrs. Halprin pointed out that the United States promised to help implement koncuically, financially and along security lines the establishment of a Jewish state. It us continue our creditable and historic role on this question by pushing for a melusive solution now." she said.

This evening, Judge Morris Rothenberg, president of the Jewish National bud, told the delegates that the creation of a Jowish state would not alone solve be problem of expension of Jewish settlements. The land will remain the property fits Jewish or Arab owners and "every inch" needed for expansion will have to be purchased, he stressed. Earlier today, Rev. Carl Herman Voss, chairman of the executive number of the American Christian Committee for Palestine, warned the parloy against bing misled by Arab threats.

# FICH AUTEOPITIES IN AUSTRIA TIGHTEN CONTROLS AT ITALIAN AND GERMAN FRONTIERS

VIMMA, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- The French military authorities in Austria have the most stringent border control at the Austro-Italian and the Austro-Gern frontiers in the French zone, in order to prevent further "illegal" travel of wish groups from Austria, it was revealed hore during the week-end.

The French move followed a British protest regarding the continuing transtration of Jewish refugees through Austria to parts where they hope to sail for listine. French sources dony that the move is an unfriendly act toward Jews. They sert it is the result of a recent incident in a DP camp near Innsbruck where one DP is Milled during a fight between two groups of Jews--one led by extremists and the ther by the Eaganah.

Newly arrived groups of Rumanian Jews are temporarily stranded in Vienna. resports into the United States zone so far have been halted because of housing and the beauting difficulties in DP camps in that zone.

Two Canadian missions have arrived in Austria to select immigrants for and among the DP's and refugees. The missions will choose 950 textile workers, if of the number to be Jews. They are scheduled to leave for Canada in December.

### O VESSELS REPORTED EN ROUTE FROM ITALY TO PICK UP VISALESS JEWS FOR PALESTINE

RCME, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- Two vessels flying the Turkish flag sailed from the Italian port of La Spezia earlier this month, presumably to pick up a contingent of visaless Jewish immigrants for passage to Palestine, it was reported here during the week-end.

Reports reaching here say that new mass sailings to Palestine are being reported in Italy. According to these reports, Jowish communities located on the test are crowded with new arrivals. This is particularly true of Genoa, Savona and & Spezia, in the north, and of Ladispoli, near Salerno, and Gesta and Ostia, near test.

# I.S. DELEGATE AT I.R.O., PARLEY CLASHES WITH OFFICIALS OVER BUDGET FOR DP SETTLEMENT

GEMEVA, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- A clash developed between George Warren, Ameriwn delegate to the Preparatory Commission for the International Refugee Organizain, and officers of the commission this week-end during a discussion of the oremization's proposed budget.

When Sir Arthur Rucker, assistant secretary of the commission, asked for finds than the organization is expected to have available this year, Warren missed vigorous objections, declaring that the United States Congress would not be likely to increase its contribution to the I.R.O. He also dicagreed with Rucker's malysis of the problem as being one of merely finding new homes for the refugees and Dris.

# THINH PLEADS FOR TOLLERANCE, ADMISSION OF DP'S AT CEREMONY HONORING JEWISH DIPLOMAT

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- A strong plea for tolerance among religious groups and for the addission of displaced persons was made here this afternoon by President Truman in a brief, extemporaneous speech. The President addressed some 1,200 jersons attending a coremony at which a memorial honoring Oscar S. Straus was presenting to Truman for the United States:

Speaking of the accomplishments of the famous American Jewish statesman and diplomet, who served as Ambassedor to Turkey under the administrations of Presidents Cleveland, McKinley and Tart and who was Secretary of Commerce and Labor in the Cabi-int of Theodore Roosevelt, Truman said Straus was a "great statesman, diplomat and pariet." The monument, he said, would be a "monument to tolerance and reason for which there Straus stood."

Referring to the history of the Straus family, which came to this country turing the 1848 revolutionary wave in Germany, the President called it "a magnificent family." He pointed out that the mombers of the family had come to this country "because they believed in the freedom of the individual and the things which this country stood for. They were a great family," he said. "And they were displaced persons." he added in clear emphatic tones.

"I wish we could have the same tolerance now that we had in 1854 when they are here, the President continued. "Just think how we would have lost the services of these people if we had followed the same policy then as we are following now," he this the audience. "I hope we can overcome this prejudice and do our part toward testing the situation with which we are now faced," he said.

The President pointed out that Straus, a champion of religious freedom, had the nore for Christians in Turkey while he was Ambassador to that country "than all the mbassadors we had there up to that time put together." He also recalled that there had written several books on the development of religious liberty in the U.S.

The benediction was given by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, who made the plea that tatever his faith or race or ancestry let every dweller between our borders be free to serve his country in whatever manner he sees best."

# PALESTINE HAMIGRATION "INDISPINISABLE" TO SOLUTION OF DP PROBLEM, RADRI BENNSTEIN REPORTS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- The opening of Palestine to large-scale immi-Stion is "indispensable" to the solution of the Jewish DP problem in Europe, Rabbi Filip S. Bernstein, former advisor on Jewish affairs to the American command in Europe, said today in a report of his activities in that post. The report was sublited to Secretary of the Army Kenneth C. Royall.

"We will continue to face indefinitely the costs and the dangers of this mastling situation," Rabbi Bernstein said, "until they are permitted to enter Palestine," Although he advocated the enactment of the Stratton Bill to admit 100,000 displaced persons from Europe yearly for four years, Rabil Bernstein said "it is my estite that no more than about 60,000 of the Jewish DP's wish to come to the United Sates.

"The overwhelming majority of the displaced Jews desire to settle in Pelestine," the report added. "Facing closed doors everywhere else, at least 90 percent at this time would migrate to Palestine if given the opportunity. If the U.S. should liberalize its immigration lays about 25 percent of the Jewish DP's would choose to make here and about 75 percent would continue to prefer Palestine. Even if Palestine about remain officially closed most of the Jews will still be determined to go there and will brave hardships and dangers to reach their goal."

# E OF JEMISH INVIGRANTS SAILS FOR PALESTIME FROM RUMANIAN BLACK SEA PORT

BUCHAREST, Oct. 26. (JTA) -- Seventy Jewish immigrants left for Palestine in the week-end. They sailed from the Black Sea port of Constanza aboard the liner Taylvania.

The Ministry of Agriculture has granted a Jevish agricultural school, near 5, the right to issue diplomas for high school and college-level engineering course the diploma will rank equally with those granted at state-maintained schools. It was made as a training center for young Jews preparing to emigrate to Palestine and wrily supported by the Joint Distribution Committee.

## THAN PEOPLE STILL STRONGLY ANTI-SEMITIC, AMERICAN CHURCH LEADER REFORTS

MAN YORK, Oct, 25. (JTA) -- Two years after the fall of the Hitler regime for out of every ten Cermans are still bitterly anti-Semitic and the remainder show frong signs of anti-Jewish sentiment, Dr. Carl Hernan Voss, extension secretary of the Church Peace Union and World Alliance for International Friendship Through the Churches, declared here at a press conference during the week-enc.

Rev. Ross, who recently returned from a tour of Europe, the Middle East and south Africa, visited the DP camps in Germany and consulted with German church leaters. He said he was convinced that Jewish DP's had no future in Europe and that they should be permitted to enter Palestine and the United States.

### THIS COMMUNITY IN MONTREAL PREPARES TO ACCUST 400 REFUGEE CHILDREN FROM EUROPE

MONTRDAL, Oct. 25. (JTA) -- The local Jewish community has taken steps to find proper accommodation for nearly 400 refugee children from Europe who will be brught to Canada within the next few months under the austices of the Canadian Javish Congress. Rolinson to discuss placement of the children.
