#### MIL UNT ON HIPLIMENTATION RECESSES WHILE SOVIET DELEGATES AWART INSTRUCTIONS

IMED SUCCESS, Nev. 5, (JTA) -- The four-nation group which is working on the scrimation of American and Soviet proposals for implementation of a United Nations putition decision today cancelled its scheduled meeting apparently because the Soviet slegation was awaiting instructions from Moscow on the extent of the compromise acceptable to the Soviet Government.

The Soviet delegation was also believed to be waiting for guidance from Moscow where replying to three questions put forward last night by the Canadian delegation at the meeting of the working group, which is composed of representatives of the U.S., Rasha, Gustemalarand Canada. The cuestions were aimed at establishing whether the brist proposals provide for the use of the veto power on docisions of the implementation commission, if the commission is made responsible to the Security Council.

The Canadian delegation also sought clarification from the Soviet representathe on whether unanimity will be required among the representatives of the "Big Five" at the implementation commission. Canada asked further what forces will be available to the commission to keep order.

Meanwhile, Canadian delegate Lester B. Pearson, is refraining from making any fatement concerning the compromise proposal which he announced will be placed before the group shortly. He is evidently waiting until the Soviet proposition is paidrant, before precenting the Canadian plan which has been touted as an attempt brecomcile the U.S. and Soviet positions.

#### Jewish Agency Circles Optimistic on Possibility of U.S. - Soviet Agreement

Soviet delegate Semyon Tsarapkin indicated last night to the working group that its government might not accept a compromise which would provide for appointment of the implementation commission by the General Assembly, with the commission functioning with the jurisdiction of the Security Council. ## Araba Feer Scriet Aims At Berring Mufti From Govt. of Arab State

There is a definite suspicion among the Arab delegations that the Soviets are determined to keep the Mufti and other Axis collaborators from participating in the immation of an Arab government in the Arab state of partitioned Palestine or from Indicating the formation of this government. This belief is based upon the stipulation in the Seviet proposal that the implementation commission is to consult "democratic parties" on the election by the commission of a provisional government council. ## UL APPROVAL OF PARTITION WILL BE MEANINGLESS WITHOUT JORDAN VALLEY PLAN, WALLACE SAYS

HAM YORK, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- United Nations approval of Palestine partition will men little unless it is implemented by a Jordan Valley Authority which could provide thep power for industry and water for the Negev, Henry A. Wallace said tonight, adiresing a Dinner on Palestine sponsored by the Progressive Citizens of America.

"Large financial interests should cooperate with the World Bank in making the 1782 reality and the northern Negev a garden as soon as possible after the majority react of UNSCOP has been adopted," the former Vice-President said.

He reported that he had found no expectation in Palestine that "there would be serious conflict between the Jewish and Arab peoples of Palestine once perittion was an accomplished fact. No matter what top-flight Arabs may say, there is no indication that the rank and file of the Arab people are preparing to use any type of violence," he continued. Wallace said that without adequate U.N. enforcement, King Abdulla of Transfordam might move into the Arab section, but there is no danger of invasor from north or the east.

Abdullah told him that he planned to visit the U.S. within the next year or two, Vallace said, expressing the hope that when the Transjordan monarch is here a program can be worked out for a JVA. He said that Abdullah has little interest in developing himstry in Transjordan, but would like to develop the port of Acuaba to enable him to export grain without using the Suez Cenal.

Other speakers at the dinner included Michael M. Misselson, president of the kalamated Bank and tressurer of the FCA, and Ira A. Hirschann, former representative if the War Refugee Board and UNRRA. Mr. Misselson said that the U.S. holds the key to solution of the Palestine problem and that if a compromise between the American and Russian implementation plans is not reached, "we shall have the final proof that which all our protestations of good faith, is nothing but the determination to bring electine within the meaning of the Truman Doctrine and to continue stubbornly on the rest to wer."

## MISTINE GOVERNMENT EXPECTED TO ISSUE 3,000 VISAS FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN ON CYPRUS

JENUSALEM, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- Three thousand immigration certificates for women and children among the Jewish internees on Cyprus are expected to be issued shortly as a result of current negotiations between the Jewish Agency and the Palestine Governant, it was learned here today. The visas would probably be deducted from the small monthly quote of 1,500.

One speaker brought forth whistles and catells when he referred to "our friend Bidault who wants us to believe that France is Switch. We will believe that only when he gives independence to 25,000,000 Arabs Liott Africa."

H.B. Khoury, Paris representative of the Palestine Arab Higher Committee, said but France has a large part in the solution of this (Palestine) problem. By tradiim she should act as a mediator and make France again a defender of freedom."

While spokesmen for the Hebrev Committee for National Liberation have publicly waterlated the French Government for refusing to support partition of Palestine, statement thanking those nations support partition.

## THE 1,000,000 POUNDS OF SUPPLIES COMPRIBUTED IN OCTOBER TO SOS CAMPAIGN

MM YORK, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- More than 1,000,000 pounds of relief supplies were received in the month of October by the SOS (Supplies for Overseas Survivors) Collection of the Joint Distribution Committee, it was announced today by Mrs. Isaac Cilman, rational SOS co-chairman. The SOS Collection launched a fall campaign on Sept. 5 for 5,000,000 pounds of food and clothing to tide Europe's needy Jews through the mains winter months.

October's record receipts of food and clothing brought the total collected thus in the fall campaign to more than 1,300,000 pounds and the total collected in the first ten months of 1947 to more than 5,400,000 pounds. Approximately 5,000,000 pounds as sometimeted relief supplies have been shipped overseas in 1947 for distribution by the JDC.

#### EN DENIES N.Y. DAILY NEWS FM BROADCASTING LICENSE; DISCOUNTS CHARGES OF RACIAL BIAS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- The Federal Communications Commission yesterday reversed a previous "tentative" decision to grant an FM radio channel to the New York belly News, but announced that its decision had not been affected by charges made by the American Jewish Congress that the paper showed racial bias in its news reporting.

The decision was based on an FCC policy that the public interest is better served by preferring non-newspaper applicants to newspaper applicants since this promotes greater diversity in the ownership of the channels of mass communication and the dismination of news and information. Commissioner Clifford J. Durr, however, in a disminating opinion said he thought the A.J.C. testimony "was entitled to weight and sould have been considered adversely to the News Syndicate Company, Inc., in a committive hearing of this kind."

#### MERICAN ASSOCIATION OF ENGLISH-JEWISH NEWSPAPERS TO MEET IN CHICAGO ON NOV. 20

DETROIT, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- Problems affecting editorial content, circulation and startising of the English-Jevish nowspapers in the United States will be discussed at a conference of the American Association of English-Jevish Newspapers, to be held at the Palmer House, Chicago, Nov. 28-30.

Philip Slomovitz, editor of the Detroit Jewish News, president of the Association, amounced that a large percentage of the English-Jewish weeklies in this country already have signified their intention of being represented at the meeting.

#### SOUTH AFRICAN ORGANIZATION OF REFORM JEWS HOLDS SECOND NATIONAL CONFERENCE

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, Nov. 5. (JTA) -- The second national conference of the South African Union for Progressive Judaism was held at Springs, near here, with selegates and visitors from all parts of the Union attending. Observers from the South African Board of Deputies, the Zionist Federation and the Union of Jevish Women were also present.

Rabbi M.C. Weller, president of the Reform organization, reported that the Capetom congregation has risen to 1,060 members one year after the arrival of its new spiritual leader, Rabbi David Sherman, while the Johannesburg membership is 2,000. It was also announced that Rabbi R. Brasch of Britain had agreed to accept the leadership of the Springs congregation.
