ARABS. 7 JEWS DIE IN PALESTINE AS VIOLENCE FLARES AFTER SHORT PERIOD OF QUIET

JERUSALEM, Dec. 21. (JTA) -- At least 20 Arabs and seven Jews died in Palesthis week-end as the uneasy quiet which reigned throughout most of last week ed in staccato blasts of submachine guns and the roar of bombs. In addition two ish officers were shot down on a crowded Jerusalem street this afternoon and are hospital in a critical condition.

Eight Arabs died and 16 were wounded today when Jews fired at an Arab bus th failed to halt at a Haganah road block between Ramleh and Ramallah. The two, Gideon Gelobter, 25, and nan Possek. 28, were stabbed and beaten to death when an oil tank truck which they e driving was captured by an Arab band. In another attack on the same road four ish settlement policemen escorting a convoy were wounded when Arab guerrillas ned fire.

The Jewish hospital in Safad was attacked by Arabs who had taken up positions a nearby building. They were eventually beaten off after one of their number was led and several were wounded. Two Jewish guards were injured, but none of the pital staff nor any petient was hurt. The building from which the Arabs attacked, highest in the town, was occupied by the Arab Legion several days ago. A curfey imposed on Safad.

Max Schneider, a Jewish police sergeant, was shot and killed by a Legionnaire at night. The shooting took place near the Allenby police barracks. Robert Stern, employee of the Palestine Information Office and a former Jewish Telegraphic Agency respondent, was shot dead tonight as he walked from his office.

Irgun Shoots British Soldiers in Revenge for Rape of Jewish Girl

The shooting of the two British soldiers in this city was acknowledged by Irgun tonight, which stated that the attack was in reprisel for the rape of a wish girl by British soldiers last week. The underground group pointed out that had carefully chosen members of the Lifeguard Regiment, of which the attackers of a girl were members. The Haganah immediately denounced the Irgun attack as a "procation."

A Haganah unit raided the Arab village of Deirajoub, damaging several houses t injuring no one. The Arabs were told that the raid was a warning and not a prisal for the killing of a Jew in the area last weak. If further attacks occur, e Jevish militia stated, the Arabs will suffer more severs damages and casualties.

In the Tel Aviv-Jaffa border area last night the Haganah blew up deveral Arab rongholds, killed a number of Arabs and a British soldier. A Haganah spokesman ologized for the doath of the soldier, asserting that he was mistaken for an armed

BUDAPEST, Dec. 21. (JTA) -- Implementing its decision to change the emphasis of its program in Hungary from relief to reconstruction, the Joint Distribution Commutee, in cooperation with the Jewish community, this week established two credit eoperatives, it was reported at a press conference here by Noel Aronovici, J.D.C. representative.

A recently-established Reconstruction Advisory Committee, composed of J.D.C. representatives and community leaders, this week-end mapped plans for the creation a series of producer cooperatives as the best means of aiding Jews who have still of found their place in the economic set-up and to fit in best with the country's tree-year plan. Aronovici stated that the plan has the approval of Zoltan Vas, thereal secretary of the powerful Supreme Economic Council.

TITISH GOVT. CHANGE OF ATTITUDE ON STRONGER LEGISLATION TO CURP ANTI-SEMITISM SEEN

LONDON, Dec. 21. (JTA) -- Indications were seen here this week-end that the everyment which up to now has been content to attempt to control anti-Semitic agition within the framework of existing legislation is about to change its attitude.

It was announced that the Labor Party's ratical executive has asked Home cretary James Chuter Ede to receive a delegation from the executive on the matter curbing fascist activity. TRIMINATION IN EDUCATION DEPRIVES JAM'S OF EQUAL OPPORTUNITY TRUMAN COMMISSION SAYS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21. (JTA) -- Discrimination against Jewish and Negro stuts in obtaining higher and professional education is assailed by the President's mission on Higher Education as depriving them of equal opportunity with non-Jewish idents in certain fields of advenced study.

In the second volume of its report to President Truman, "Equalizing and Exding Individual Opportunity," released today, the Commission declares the situation has been aggravated in recent years and recommends the removal from application as of educational institutions "of all questions pertaining to religion, color, and tional or racial origin."

Terming the Negro "the most frequent victim of racial discrimination," the most cites the experience of Jewish students as "a second significant oddy of illustrative evidence regarding discrimination.

"It is well to repeat the warning," the report states, "that in determining opertunities for education, it is not sound democratic doctrine to invoke the arment of maintaining the same ratios of minority group numbers enrolled in colleges total population numbers. One only defensible basis is that total ability and interest rather than quotas or ratios, however determined, be the criteria of admission institutions of higher learning."

The Commission urged compulsory legislation in the form of "Fair Educational actices Laws," similar to the fair exployment practices measures enacted or considered by several states, particularly by Now York. Rejecting the idea of voluntary ation as inadequate, the report stresses "the "urgency" of the issue of discrimination in American national life. It labels a "national phenomenon" discrimination against Negroes, Jews, Catholics, Orientals and others.

Educational institutions, despite private control and support, are acknowliged to have a vital public interest "and as such are morally obligated to abandon estrictive policies.

Report Urges Legislation to Cutlaw Bias; Cites N.Y. Proposed Measure

"In order that this mandate of public obligation shall have equal force berywhere," emphasizes the report, "end not lead marely" to passage pronouncements y individual colleges, the passage of legiclation along lines of the proposed legislation against discrimination in New York seems the legical way. The Commission concludes that to assure a universal and equal regard for a policy of indiscrimination the legal method becomes both fair and practical.

"Moreover a universal legal mendate can be a helpful defense for admission officers against undue pressure of alumni groups and of professional associations which may attempt to influence admissions policies...in accordance with an established tradition."

Citing a decennial study made by the Vocational Service Bureau of B'nai B'rith, the Presidential Commission reported a sharp decline in the percentage of B'rith, the Presidential Commission reported a sharp decline in the percentage of Jevish law students, and a decrease also in the proportion of Jevish engineering, medical end dental students, as well as in teaching, architecture, social work, commerce and fine artis. A sharp rise from 9.1 percent in 1935 to 20.3 percent in 1946 of Jevish students in osteopathy resulted chiefly, according to the report, "from the blocking of opportunity in medicine."

PLACES ITS FACILITIES IN EUROPE AT DISPOSAL OF JEWISH AGENCY IMMIGRATION PROGRAM

NEW YORK, Dec. 21. (JTA) -- The 18th annual convention of the HIAS Council prgmizations adopted a resolution today to place at the disposal of the Jewish not partially the property of the Jewish and personnel in Europe to facilitate the edy emigration of Palestine-bound Jews from Europe.

Isaac L. Asofsky, HIAS executive director, reported that the organization incurred a deficit of \$700,000, notwithstanding the fact that in 1947 it reject more than \$2,000,000 in contributions, the largest amount in its history. Legates to the conference voted unanimously to double the 1947 allocations in order enable the HIAS to spend \$4,000,000 in 1948 in carrying out an expanded program.

ON JEWS APPEAL FOR EMERGENCY AID; J.D.C. DISPATCHES RELIEF FUNDS

NEW YORK, Dec. 21. (JTA) -- Acting on an urgent plea for assistance from the Jevs of Aden, about 75 of whom have been killed and more than 100 wounded in second Arab attacks, the Joint Distribution Committee has forwarded \$11,000 for mergency aid to the British colony in addition to its regular relief program in then.

The call for help was relayed in a cablegram from Dr. Judah L. Magnes, resident of the Hebrew University and chairman of the JDC Middle East Advisory committee, following an Arab attack upon the small Jewish community in the portity of Aden. "Overnight hundreds became homeless and destitute," Dr. Magnes resorted. "Schools, synagogues, about 30 buildings and most Jewish shops were burned and looted." He said the violence has "totally paralyzed" Jewish business in Aden, and most of the Jewish community there is now living on relief.

NO-DAY CONFERENCE OF RABBINICAL ASSEMBLY ON JEWISH EDUCATION OPENS TODAY IN N.Y.
