s. Soldiers kill jewish refugee in DP camp in cermany: 38 jews arrested

MINICH, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- A Jewish refugee died today as a result of being aymetted by American soldiers when he resisted arrest during a search in a Jewish camp at Heidenheim, near Stuttgart.

U.S. Army headquarters said the Jew was stabled after he had hit a guard ad attempted to escape. It was reported that so far 38 Jewish DP's have been rrested as a result of the raid.

III. COMPLISSION VOTES TO ESTABLISH ARMED MILITIA IN PALESTINE: ACCEPTS AGENCY PLAN

LAKE SUCCESS. Jan. 29. (JTA) -- The U.N. Implementation Commission today voted manipously for the earliest possible establishment of an armed wilitia in Palestine wen before the creation of Provisional Councils of Governments there.

The Commission not only accepted in principle the recommendations of the evish Agency for the establishment of such a militia but decided to accept the help the Agency in this endeavor. The question of arming the militia was also disussed by the Commission.

To implement its decision, the Commission appointed the Philippine representaive Senator Vicente Francesco as a "committee of one" to contact the Jewish Agency ad the mandatory power concerning the setting up of the militia. The Commission lao designated Panema's Eduardo Morgan to establish immediate contact with the ritish on the disposition of the 30,000 displaced Jews on Cyprus.

NO EXPLOSIVES ROCK JERUSALEM; 15 HAGANAH MEN ARRESTED; SPORADIC SMIPING CONTINUES

JERUSALEM, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- A loud explosion behind the water tower in the evish quarter of Romema here today rocked the entire area. Simultaneously another plast shook the Old City where 1,800 Jews have been besieged for several weeks. o details of either explosion were available immediately.

An entire Haganah unit comprising 15 men was arrested today at the children's settlement, Armon Yeladim, on the outskirts of Jerusalem. The settlement is now empletely defenseless. While the Haganah members were being disarmed, a sharp rolley of automatic fire was directed from the Arab village of Lifta towards Jerusalem.

Sniping by Arabs in scattered sections of Palestine continued today, resulting in three Jove so loughly wounded and 10 slightly. Six Jove were injured in the Abu Kebir area after the withdrawal of British troops and two Jews driving near an Arab Legion camp at Bet Maballah were hurt when their car touched off a land mine.

Two British policemen were shot and killed today on Ben Yehuda street, one of the city's main thoroughfares, by members of the Stern Group.

HTAIN IS ATTEMPTING TO TURN PALESTINE INTO A DEATH TRAP, JEWISH AGENCY CHARGES

LAKE SUCCESS, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- The British Government was charged here today the Jevish Agency with attempting to turn Palestine "into a death trap in which is Jeva vill be forced to surrender to England's own Palestine scheme, or go down ighting for their very lives." A statement issued by a spokesman for the Agency as a follows:

"The declaration of the British Foreign Office spokesman in London yesterday see page & of today's Bulletin) that the United Nations plan for Palestine did not untemplate the creation of a Jewish militia is another step in a calculated protate to obstruct and nullify the United Nations decision.

"The pretext that 45 percent of the population in the proposed Jewish state a replication in the Jewish state are willing solist in the militia to be organized for its defense on the basis of the United attens decision, their services will be accepted. But their refusal to cooperate amount render the entire plan inoperative and makes effective Jewish defense even we urgent. Hence, speculation about the intentions of the Arabs and mathematical schulations about the composition of such a militia are obvious propaganda.

"The British are trying to obscure the fact that the immediate organization and equipment of such a militia is imperative and that it was clearly authorized by the United Nations. The United Kingdom is apparently determined to do its utmost to block it.

The effect of the Eritish Foreign Office strategy is to render the Jews of elestine defenseless. The United Kingdom's program is in violation of its duties as a good member of the United Nations. While continuing on its own admission to supply arms to the Arab states, it at the same time denies them to the Jews. The ritish are attempting to turn Palestine into a death trap in which the Jews will be forced to surrender to England's own Palestine scheme or go down fighting for their very lives."

SPURTY MEMBERS OF CONGRESS CONFER ON PALESTINE SITUATION; CABINET MEETING EXPECTED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- A delegation of Senators is being formed to take we the question of Palestine on the highest Administration levels, it was learned tidy, following simeeting last night of 70 Senators and Representatives with Dr. Benuel Neumann, president of the Zionist Organization of America. There is reason to believe that the Palestine question will be discussed in the near future at a meting of the Cabinet. Dr. Neumann said.

Dr. Neumann reiterated his warning to the Senators and Congressmen that the situation in Palestine would deteriorate further if it is not firmly checked now, malting in a much more serious situation for the United States. He urged on the Congressional gathering the necessity of these five steps: 1. Lifting of the embargo; 2. Recognition of Haganah as a defense force; 3. Working out the problem of an intensticual price force through the Security Council; 4. U.S. leadership in the Sourity Council in organizing such a force; and 5. Diplematic action through result displacatic channels to check aggression against Palestine by the Arab States.

"Situation In Washington Is Bad," Dr. Neumann Reports; Warns Against Panic

HEW YORK, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- "The situation in Washington is bed, but we should not lose our heads and give way to panie," Dr. Emanuel Neumann reported today upon his return from the Capital.

Speaking at a press conference, the ZOA president said that during his visit in Washington the gained the impression that "the most influentual advocate of a

inual reversal of the United States policy with regard to Palestine is Secretary of Defense Forrestal." He emphasized that Secretary Forrestal "has never been riendly towards the cause of Zionism and he is now pressing forward very strongly."

In his report, Dr. Neumann said that influential circles in Washington seem to have accepted the inevitability that if the present developments in Palestine outline, Britain might be asked to stay on and continue to occupy the country, the IM. Implementation Commission would get-nowhere, and nothing would happen. "I pointed out that this was a very naive conception; that the chances were that the security situation in Palestine would deteriorate, and whereas now they would have to deal only with a small blaze, in three or four months they will have a full-scale conflagration, which would take much more effort to deal with," he declared.

"A great deal of confusion has been created in the minds of people in Washington regarding the consequences of the partition plan and the possible consequences of the shipping of American arms to Palestine," Dr. Neumenn said. "The most intastic conclusions are drawn by Congressmen who believe, or were made to believe, that a mere modification of the embargo or permission for arms to reach the Haganah wald inputably result in war," the Z.O.A. president reported. "How was that to come about and who was to declare war upon us--Syria, Lebanon or any other comptry-no one knew.

"Another argument was that this was tied up with the Marshall Plan. The Marshall Plan involved the industrial rehabilitation of European nations. Such reabilitation was dependent upon fuel oil which would have to come from Mrab surces; this could be brought into Europe only if a pipeline were built; and somewhere this pipeline would be interrupted—and in that way the partition plan would styme the Marshall Plan," he said.

U.N. Charged With Setting Up Jews As "Targets For Genocide"

Louis Bromfield, co-chairman of the American League for a Free Palestine, today called upon President Truman to issue an executive order permitting the sale of arms for defense to Palestinian Jews.

Eremfield also accused the United Nations of "having virtually set up the Berew People as targets for genecide" by virtue of the partition plan and "now appears to be abandoning them." The Security Council has only a few weeks to act, be said, "since it is now definite that a date early this spring has been set for the measure of the 800,000 Hebrews in Palestine and the million more residing in Ambian countries."

FOREIGN OFFICE DENIES BRITAIN PLANNING TO ALLOW ABDULLAH TO CCCUPY PALESTINE

LOMON, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- A Foreign Office spokesman denied today that Britain is planning to allow King Abdullah of Transjordan to occupy a large part of Palestine sets for itself Haifa, the port of Agaba and the Negev area.

"Britain has no such plans," he declared. He also revealed that talks between the british and Syrian Governments on the recent illegal entrance of Arabs into Palestine from Syria are continuing, and that no answer had been received from Transjorant the British note concerning the entry into Palestine of 750 soldiers from from Stransjorant.

A government spokesman said yesterday that Britain does not consider the Jewish Agmoy's demand for the establishment of a Jewish militia in Palestine to be in seed with the U.N. partition decision.

Commenting on reports that Moshe Shertok, head of the political department of the Agency, told the U.N. Implementation Commission that the British refusal to must the setting up of an armed Jewish militia defies the U.N. Palestine decision which Britain promised not to obstruct, the spokeaman emphasized that the Assembly's attendid not provide for a Jewish militia but for a force which would be recruited for the ppulations in both states. Since the area of the Jewish state contains by percent of Palestine's Arabs, it would be expected that the militia would be against on a similar ratio.

Shertok was, therefore, the spokesman said, "not on solid ground" when he cumplained about Britain's attitude to the Jowish militia. At the same time, the spokesman admitted that it would be up to the Implementation Commission to decide stout the actual composition of the militia in view of the fact that certain sections of the population are opposed to the U.N. decision.

Egyptian Air Force Preparing to Operate Against Jews, London Hears

Stressing that "non-intervention on the Spanish model is in fact in full adag in the Holy Land," the leftist weekly Tribune called today for a Government statement on British armament exports to the Middle East. Such a statement, the welly declared, might be reassuring in view of persistent reports that the Egyptian is force, with the knowledge of the British, is preparing to operate against the Jews hm airfields in southern Palestine immediately after the British mandate is re-limitated on May 15.

CHEVA PARLEY APPROVES RIGHT OF INDIVIDUAL REFUGEES TO APPEAL AGAINST I.R.O. DECISIONS.

GENEVA, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- The right of a refugee to appeal against any decision of the International Refugee Organization declaring him ineligible for assistance or protection was approved today by the Preparatory Commission of the I.R.O. my in assign here.

It also approved Secretariat proposals for creating procedures for determining eligibility and establishing semi-judicial machinery to review the decision of field eligibility officers. This directive is based on standards within the I.R.O. constitution which declared as eligible persons displaced from their homelands, slave laborers or victims of Nazi racial, religious and political persecutions.

This directive will permit refugees to appeal from adverse decisions before a special review board for eligibility appeals. The board consists of chairman kerel de Beer, former Justice of Appeals at Brussels and at present law professor is Brussels University; Henri Tremaud, former prefect of Haute Savoie, and one other maker not yet selected.

The review board will make policy decisions on appeals in individual cases only. The executive secretary will make policy decisions on eligibility matters, consulting, when necessary, the members of the board. Members will visit the field on circuits, traveling separately in each area, hearing appeals and after consultation with the legal and eligibility officers in the field, will take appropriate decisions. When issues are doubtful or far-reaching, or an important policy question is involved, the member may postpone decision for submission to the full board at Geneva.

Voluntary agencies which are assisting in caring for refugees in Germany, austria and Italy were invited to submit written recommendations on I.R.O. policy and operations for consideration by an informal Ad Hoc committee at yesterday's meting. The Ad Hoc committee is composed of Brazil, France, Netherlands, United Lingdom and the United States.

21 OSWIECIM GUARDS EXECUTED; UKRAINIAN SENTENCED TO DEATH FOR KILLING 13,000 JEMS

WARSAW, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- Twenty-one Germans who served as guards in the noterious Deviceim concentration camp were executed today in Cracow, it was announced here.

At the same time, it was reported that Wasyl Pierce, a Ukrainian who was repossible for the death of 13,000 Jews from Borislav, has been sentenced to death. Fixec succeeded in hiding out in Lower Silesia for three years, but was seized by the police when two Borislav residents recognized him in the Breslau railway station.

TIMEA JENISH COMMUNITY ASKS AUSTRIAN COVERNMENT TO BAN FILM ON RITUAL MURDER CASE

ROF. ALEXANDER MARK HONORED AT JEWISH THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY ON 70TH BIRTHDAY

MEW YORK, Jan. 29. (JTA) -- Professor Alexander Marx, librarian and Jacob - Shiff Professor of Ristory at the Jewish Theological Seminary, was the guest of mor tonight at a celebration marking his 70th birthday. The celebration, which as attended by more than 250 of his colleagues, students and friends, was held at a Sminary.

Prof. Marx has been a member of the Seminary's faculty since 1903 when he came to this country from Germany at the invitation of Dr. Solomon Schechter, then president of the Seminary. When he became Seminary librarian, the library collection contained of 5,000 volumes and three manuscripts. Under his direction, it has developed to what is today recognized as the world's foremost Jewish library, with a collection of almost 145,000 books and 8,000 manuscripts.
