EMISE AGENCY HEADQUARTERS WRECKED BY EXPLOSION; 10 REPORTED KILLED, 90 WOUNDED

JERUSALEM, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- The American Consulate here today launched an investigation into an explosion which partially wrecked the Jewish Agency building mi killed ten persons and wounded 90 others. Witnesses established that the ex-Mosives which blasted the heavily guarded building were brought into the Agency courturn by a car flying the American flag and probably driven by the regular Arab

The chauffeur, Anton Daoud, has disappeared. He reported to the consulate this morning and picked up the car, despite the fact that this was his day off. although many persons saw him before the blast, no one at the consulate has seen him since. Consular officials also revealed that one of the staff cars was stolen vesterday and another last week.

The major damage was inflicted on two stories of one wing of the building. The offices of the Palestine Foundation Fund were completely demolished and Leib laffe, 72, its director, was killed. Jaffe was well-known in the United States where he worked for the Foundation Fund during the war years. Isaac Ben Zvi, president of the Jewish National Council, who was in the Council's office in another wing of the building was unscathed.

no member of the Agency executive was among the casualties. All of them have been in Tel-Aviv for a number of days meeting on plans for the formation of a Provisic ual Jewish Government.

Immediately after the explosion Haganah squads were rushed to all strategic areas of the Jewish sections of Jerusalem and took control. All passersby, including drivers and passengers of vehicles, were halted and their identities were checked. among the thousands temporarily detained were a number of newspapermen who came under aspicion because according to one rumor the car which transported the dynamite carried a "press" ticket.

Work Resumed In Undermaged Sections of the Building; Valuable Documents Safe

Within several hours, workers in the undamaged sections of the structure were back on the job : and repairmen had reconnected telephone lines and were hard at wirk returning other installations to service. Thousands of valuable documents pertaining to the history of the Zionist movement were safe in an underground vault.

Eye-witness accounts told of a number of persons being buried under falling manny as parts of the building collapsed in the midst of a terrific flash of flame. Almost immediately, the structure, one of the most closely guarded in the city, was on fire. But firefighters managed to subdue the flames within a short time. the witness said that the scene was similar to that of the Ben Yehuda Street blast on February 22.

An official version said that two explosions badly damaged the interior of the building. The car was checked through the guard post in front of the agency

adquarters without inspection because the driver and an Arab passenger were wearg arm bands identifying them as "Consular Corps" employees. They placed two boxof explosives in the hall of the buildings and fled. The car in which the exhajves were carried was completely destroyed.

## Twelve Arabs Killed in Jerusalem Battle; Jews Evacuated from Suburb

Shortly after the blast an Arab band attempted to penetrate the Mekor Haim tion of Jerusalem, but were driven off with twelve dead after a several-hour-long tile. The clash was finally ended when British troops arrived on the scene and red on both the Jews and the Arabs. There were no Jewish casualties.

Haganah units were kept on the alert tonight following the receipt of reliis reports indicating that the Arabs were massing for attacks on the Talbiya arter of Jerusalem and areas facing the Jewish Rehavia section of the city. Several wish houses in the Talbiya quarter were ordered evacuated for 24 hours today by the tal British commander who set up gun posts in the buildings to guard against possible tacks.

# VIET AND U.S. REPRESENTATIVES CLASE ON PALESTINE AT U.M. ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL

IAKE SUCCESS, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- Sharp differences of opinion developed today them the American and Soviet delegates at the U.N. Economic and Social Council on Proposal to elect three members of the Joint Economic Board for a partitioned lestine at this session.

The proposal was introduced by Soviet delegate A. Arutiunian. The American elegate Loroy Stinebower argued against it and urged that the elections be held at a next session of the Council in July. After severe attacks against the U.S. policy a Palestine by the delegates of the U.S.S.R., Poland and Byelorussia, the Council atta 9 to 3, with six abstentions, to postpone the elections.

## ONYKO TELLS BIG FOUR HE WILL NOT PARTICIPATE ON ARAB-JEWISH CONCILIATION TALKS

NEW YORK, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- Sotiet representative Andrei Gromyko today made clear at a meeting of the Big Powers on Palestine that he would categorically fuse to participate in direct talks on conciliation with the Jewish Agency, or Palestine Arab Higher Committee.

Growko argued that all efforts to bring about Arab-Jevish conciliation we been exhausted. In addition, he pointed out, the Security Council eliminated mailation from the U.S. resolution which turned over the Pelestine issue to the grour-to establish whether the present situation in Pelestine constitutes a rest to peace.

Gromyko's point-blank statment widened the existing gap between the United ates and the U.S.S.R. on implementation of the U.N. partition decision. The erican delegation is still proceeding with its plans in the hope that Arab-Jewish mollistion may be possible.

British representative Sir Alexander Cadogan, appearing today at the meeting behalf of the Mandatory Power, seemed to support the Soviet rather than the America view. In answering six questions put to him at the meeting, he indicated that itain believes that no modification of the details of the partition plan would be ceptable to the Jews or the Arabs. Britain, he said considered all bridges between a Jews and Arabs destroyed when she brought the Palestine case to the United Nations.

#### British Representative Doubts Partition Can Be Implemented Peacefully

Sir Alexander also expressed doubt that partition can be implemented by steeful means. He reiterated Britain's determination not to charge its time-table braceution from Palestine. He informed the Big Four that about 7,000 foreign has have invaded Palestine. Two days ago, he said the figure was about 1,7000.

Fletcher Cooke, Palestine advisor to Sir Alexander, told the parley that on v15 there will be no funds left in the Palestine treasury for the use of the U.N. lestine Commission which is to take over the administration of the country. He wealed that, despite reports to the contrary, the Arab Legion has not yet been thoram and would not be withdrawn until April 15.

The meeting then formulatled ten questions to the U.N. Palestine Commission questing further clarification of several issues and adjourned till tomorrow. U.S. bleate Warren Austin asked many questions about the establishment of a jewish little, indicating that the American delegation is greatly interested in this problem.

## U.S. Delegation Denies America Wants Palestine Federalization

The American delegation at Lake Success today denied press reports that the lited States is inclined to support a federalization scheme in Palestine instead of artition. "No hints of a change in the U.S. policy have been made by any U.S. spokasen, because the policy has not been changed," the statement said. "The policy realms as stated by Sen. Warren Austin in the Security Council on February 24 and subquently."

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver conferred with Sen. Austin prior to the opening of the setting of the Big Powers. The substance of the conversation was not disclosed.

## Jewish Agency Issues Statement Rejecting Federalization as Compromise

A statement issued by the Jewish Agency expressed satisfaction with the crican delegation's denial. The Agency added: "The position of the Jewish Agency Falestine on any proposal to alter the partition resolution was made perfectly lear by Dr. Silver and Mr.Shertok -- spokesmen of the Agency -- in their statement fore the Security Council.

"The Partition plan was a compromise which the Jewish Agency accepted as the reducible minimum. Beyond that it cannot go. It should be made clear that the term described in a misnomer to conceal the true character of what is intended. It buld in fact be an Arab state where Jewish immigration and territory would be sharply stricted and the Jewish sovereignty denied. The Jewish community would be a permanim minority at the mercy of the Arab majority. No such plan is acceptable to the wish Agency."

RIMAN DENIES ANCRILY FRESS REPORT THAT HE SAID NEW YORK JEWS WERE DISLOYAL TO U.S.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- President Truman opened his press conference day with an emphatic and angry denial of what he termede victous statement by a clumnist in a New York paper that the President had said the Jews of New York were islovel.

The President, flushed and with extraordinary vigor, said he had thought he wild not have to add another liar's star to the crown of the fellow who made the statement, but found it necessary to do so. He reiterated that it was just a lie out if whole cloth.

## A MAMBERS OF CONGRESS ASK MARSHALL FOR CLARIFICATION OF U.S. STAND ON PALESTINE .

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- Forty-one Democrats in the House and Senate have written a joint letter to Secretary of State George C. Marshall asking that he clarify the present attitude of the U.S. Government towards the Palestine situation.

The letter charges that U.S. Delegate Warren Austin's statement before the U.N. Security Council "appeared to make distinctions so fine as to leave unanswered the question of our willingness to participate in the implementation of the Partition decision."

The letter asked the Secretary to clear up the apparent contradiction between this statement and the one made by U.S. Deputy Delegate to the U.N. Herechel Johnson to the General Assembly last fall, "which clearly indicated our recognition of the possibility of using force and indicated as clearly our villingness to do so."

The letter states that there have been reports that the U.S. Government has add informal representations to certain foreign governments and to the Jewish Agency with a view to slowing down Jewish immigration into Palestine.

# - 5 -TICAN CONSULATE IN AUSTRIA READY TO REVIEW REJECTED APPLICATIONS FOR U.S. ENTRY

V. ENNA, Mer. 11. (JTA) -- American consular officials here today inated that they are willing to review the case of DP's who have been denied imation applications for reasons of error or possible injustice.

The consular authorities again listed the necessary qualifications of a desiring to enter the United States under President Trumsm's order facilitating togation of rerugees. Primarily, the applicants must prove that they have been ing continuously in the American zone of Germany or Austria or the American or tich sectors of Berlin or Vienna since April 21, 1947.

In addition, they must be able to prove that they fall under one of following categories: 1. That they are non-German nationals involuntarily brought Germany or Austria for forced labor; 2. That they are aliens of any nationality are victims of a Nazi, fascist or Axis-dominated government; 3. That they are ens who have reasonable grounds for fearing to return to their native lands suse of the likelihood of persecution on account of race, religion or political ws; or 4. That an alien is the wife, unmarried minor child, minor dependent, wher or sister of an alien eligible under one of the first three categories.

### CH JEWRY SHOCKED BY MASARYK'S DEATH; PURGE OF JEWISH COMMUNITY LEADERS STARTED

PRAGUE, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- Czechoslovak Jewry, deeply shocked by the ath of Foreign Minister Jan Masaryk, in propaging to participate in the official tion-wide mourning ceremonies. It was learned here today that Masaryk had made ans for a visit to Palestine in the near future.

Meanwhile, the Actions Committeesorganized within the Council of wish Communities and the Prague Jewish community have made a number of changes in e leadership of the organizations. Ernst Frischer, chairman of the Council, has m removed and the position has been offered to Julius Lederer. Frischer remains member of the Council's executive board. Kurt Wehle, former secretary of the until and chairman of the Czech-Moravian Zionist Federation, has left the country. ree representatives of Sub-Carpathian communities have resigned from the Council.

Karel Stein, former official of the Prague community, has been named ecutive vice-chairman of the Council. Stein is a Zionist leader. Hashomer Hatzair aler and Prague representative of the Jevish Agency Eugene Fischgrund has been letted to the actions Committee.

## Jews Fleeing Czeshoslovakia Will Not Be Considered Displaced Persons

MUNICE, Mar. 11 (JTA) -- Officials of Jewish relief organizations here may said that they knew of only a "handful" of Jevs who had fled from Czechoslovakia to Getmany during the past week, following the Communist seizure of the Prague wemment. They declined to venture a prediction whether much larger numbers could expected to slip across the heavily guarded frontier.

These arriving here will be treated by United States army officials h the same manner as German refugees who arrived from the Sudstenland from which by were expelled. They will not receive any kind of favored treatment, officials aid, and will have to earn a living within the German commun. Just like the Purnian and Hungarian Jews who arrived here after April 21, 1947.

## S. JEWS MUST ASSUME FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR JEWISH RECOVERY, DR. SCHWARTZ SAYS

NEW YORK, Mar. 11. (JTA) --Declaring that although the future of Europe's wish survivors will in the last analysis be determined by the effectiveness of the I. Palestine decision, the Marshall Plan and the passage of legislation which admit additional displaced persons to the United States, Dr. Joseph J. hartz, European director of the Joint Distribution Committee asserted yesterday set Marrican Jevs must be prepared to assume major financial responsibility for plementation of these developments.

#### MERICAN GROUP PLANS TO ESTABLISH \$5,000,000 RAYON PLANT IN PALESTINE

NEW YORK, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- A \$5,000,000 rayon factory using the most modern berican machinery, will be established in Palestine as soon as engineering experts are determined the site of the plant, Leo Rosenstein, president of the Palestine aren Corporation, declared today at a press conference at the Hotel Rosewelt cllowing his return from a two-month study of industrial conditions in Palestine. It is also that land options have been taken by his corporation in Rehovoth, Petach lither and Hedera.

"The need for a rayon plant in Palestine becomes obvious," he stated, "when ne considers that the country now grows no cotton or wool, and that the entire resent textile industry is based upon imported basic ray materials. The only presseary import for rayon manufacturer would be wood pulp. All other requirements a variable within Palestine."

## EBBY MORGENTHAU PRESENTS MAYOR O'UNIER WITH SILVER BIBLE SENT HIM BY BEN GURION

NEW YORK, Mar. 11. (JTA) -- Mayor William O'Dwyer today received a hand-tooled aliver Bible sent to him by David Ben-Gurion, chairman of the Jeviah Agency and remis-Designate of the Provisional Jevish Government. The presentation was made at the Mayor's official residence by Henry Morgentham Jr., general chairman of the United Jevish Appeal.

The gift for O'Dwyer was given by Ben Gurion to the U.J.A. delegation which returned recently from a month-long tour of the Jevieh DP camps in Europe and of Ralestine. Mr. Morgenthau was accompanied by David Ba-Cohen, Palestine's leading milder who constructed Britain's Middle East defense during the war and who is now towing the U.S. on behalf of the ourrent U.J.A. campaign.

## THE DAY CEREMONIES MARK IMAUGURATION OF DR. MELSON GLUBOX AS B.U.C. PRESIDENT
