POWER AGREEMENT ON THREAT TO TRACE IN PALIFITIES COLLAPSES; FRANCE BELIEVED TO REVEGE

LAKE SUCCESS, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- Big power agreement on a declaration that the tation in Palestine constitutes an immediate threat to the peace collapsed tonight a Big Three meeting of the United States, China and France.

The Big Three meeting took place in U.N. Secretary-General Trygve Lie's office the end of the Security Council session, after Andrei Crowko of the U.S.S.R. said did not understand that a meeting had been called and that he could not attend. mirary to U.N. protocol the other Big Three powers met without him in a three-quarter-an-hour session in which a representative of one of the Big Three powers reneged at the position he took this morning in favor of an immediate declaration that Paltine peace is in jeopardy.

This was a closed meeting but the power, it is generally believed, is France. though the U.W. press officer who covered the meeting could not identify the various are of the individual powers, other sources revealed that French delegate Parodi was pressed with the statement of Syria's delegate el Khouri at today's Comhoil meeting. I khouri said that the Arab states had not interfered and would not interfere in the elestine fighting so long as no other outside force took part.

The Big Four will meet again tomorrow evening after the afternoon Security puncil session on Czechoslovskia.

THREE ESTABLISH THREAT TO PEACE EXISTS IN PALESTINE; SECURITY COUNCIL TO MEET FRIDAY

LAKE SUCCESS, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- The United States, the Soviet Union and France ay agreed that a threat to the peace exists in Palestine because of the armed invah of Arabs from neighboring countries. The Big Three also agreed that the Security heil should ask the parties responsible for this invasion to withdraw their invading ces at once.

Full agreement of the Big Four on presenting a report to this effect to the mrity Council could not be reached in the morning because China insisted on a broadcondemnation to include Arabs and Jews within Palestine, Dr. T.F. Tsiang, the hese representative at the Big Four consultations on Palestine, argued that the kings establish that elements within Palestine are also responsible for the threat beace there.

Since the Big Three could not accept the Chinese modification, they decided to er their report to the Security Council which was to have been submitted today. At rief afternoon session of the Council, U.S. delegate Warren Austin merely reported t the Big Powers require more time to reach an agreement on the result of their contations on Palestine. The Council thereupon adjourned till Friday.

Arab Delegate Urges Council to Abrogate Partition "At All Costs"

The main speaker at today's Council session was Camille Chamoun, the Leianese agate, who appealed to the Council to "stop at all costs" the implementation of the eral Assembly's partition decision which, he said, was "illogical, unjust, and conry to the principles of the U.N. Charter.

He accused the Zionists of attempting to throw the United States "into a wild litery adventure with all its tragic consequences." The Zionists, he continued, ile appealing to the Council to hasten the formation of an international armst force insure partition, had asked the United States for an "American expeditionary force" the lifting of the embargo on arms shipments. Referring to U.S. "economic and commial transactions" in the Middle East, Chamoun warned that the friendship between s U.S. and the Arab mations and "real cultural cooperation" were "completely jecrdized because Zionist pressure has driven the American Administration to follow the ine it has taken."

Faris el Chouri of Syria made a brief statement to the effect that the Arab tates would not interfere in any fighting in Palestine as long as there was no weign armed force on Palestine soil.

In attendance at the Council meeting was a capacity growd of spectators -- newsm and visitors -- demonstrating once again the deep interest of the public in the fuwe of Palestine.

COMMISSION CHARGES BRITAIN WITH IMPEDING FORMATION OF JEMISH GOVERNMENT

LAKE SUCCESS, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- The British Government was accused today by U.N. Palestine Commission of hampering the establishment of a Jewish Provisional moil of Government in Palestine by April 1, as provided by the partition decision the General Assembly.

In its second monthly report submitted today to the Security Council, the Paline Commission charged that the position of the Mandatory Power "precludes any poslity" of fulfilling by April 1 that part of the partition plan which provides for ablishment of Provisional Councils of Government, although some preliminary steps and the selection of a Provisional Council for the Jewish state have been taken by commission.

The Commission emphasized that as a result of the British attitude, the Jew-Council "will not be able to carry out its functions" prior to the termination of Mandate on May 15. In stressing the impossibility of establishing the Council thin the prescribed time limit, the Councils accounty Council.

The Commission revealed that it asked the British Government to facilitate its it is establishing the Commils by April 1. The British reply said: "Subject to its erriding responsibility for the maintenance of law and order, the Mandatory Power ald not impede any preliminary steps taken by the Commission with this object in sm, although such Council could not exercise any authority prior to the date of the maintain of the Mandate."

Establishment of Economic Union Affected by British Delaying Tactics

The impossibility of establishing the Councils by April 1 also makes it impossible to carry out the U.N. decision to establish an economic union within the preribed schedule, since the resolution of the General Assembly requires that such an intertaking must be entered into by the Councils by April 1.

Although the U.N. resolution provides alternatively that if the Councils have of entered into an undertaking by April 1, the Commission shall put the undertaking mto force, the Commission report stressed that "this is impracticable, in any case, wing to the policy of the Mandatory Power not to relinquish any authority prior to be termination of the Mandate." (Other conclusions of the Commission, emphasizing hat partition is impossible unless peace is restored in Palestine, were reported in reterday's issue of the J.T.A. Bulletin.)

Commission Considering Loan for Food Stockpiling in Palestine

The Commission is considering negotiating for an international loan to be used as a working capital fund for food stockpiling in Palestine during the period when it berres as United Nations administrator, the report disclosed. As a security pledge for as loan, the Commission would offer the future revenues of the country.

The Commission reported that a serious food shortage, especially of break cerede, oils and fats, will develop in Palestine after the termination of the Mandate, unless effective arrangements are made for additional imports within the mext few weeks. The arrangements suggested thus far are inadequate, the report suppassized. Further plans we being considered, the Commission added.

EH AGENCY READY TO WELCOME TRUCE IF IT WILL NOT ENCROACH ON JEWISH STATE

JERUSALEM, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- The Jevish Agency would welcome a truce in Palhe as requested by the United States, France and China yesterday if there is "a rantee that it will not encreach in any way on the Jevish State and will not be aly a device to give the Arabs time to make further preparations for ver," an Agenspokesman told a press conference here today. "We did not start this fight," he

As soon as members of the Agency executive abroad have approved the recent anal-Irgun agreement Jewish leaders here will initiate action toward a pact with stern Group, it was reliably learned today. Several of the Agency members here urging that preparations for the negotiations be speeded up because they believe the talks will be drawn out and they hope to see an accord reached by the time a high State is formally proclaimed.

Mayor Israel Rokach last night revealed that work will soon begin on enging the port of Tel Aviv to handle deep draft vessels. The project, which is setted to have a tremendous effect on the economic life of the Jewish State, is setted to be completed by August 1. Present plans call for dredging operations to gin in the estuary of the Yarkon River.

Following a meeting of all members of the consular corps in Jerusalem the body sued a statement expressing "shock" that the national colors of a foreign nation he United States) were used to cover the plenting of explosives in the Jewish Agency edquarters which led to the death of 13 persons, the wounding of 90 others and the iss of considerable property. The statement also protests repeated Arab breaches of consular immunity and announces that the consuls will draw the attention of their spective governments to the situation which is preventing them from discharging beir normal duties.

Day Passes Quietly in Palestine; Heavy Snow Falls in Jerusalem Area

Today passed comparatively quietly with only a minor attack on Mekor Haim, outide Jerusalem, and a train robbery near Tulkara reported. The lull in fighting was thributed in large measure to the heavy blanket of snow that covered Jerusalem and and of the surrounding country yesterday in one of the rare snow storms to occur in alsetime. The snow reached a depth of several inches in the Hebron hills, while say rains were reported in other parts of the country. The last snow fell here in brany. 1846.

Arabs in Jeruselem today stole a press car from the Palestine Information Office, while a group of Irgunists held up the assistant district commissioner of Lydda har Tel Aviv and stole his car, but gave him a safe conduct to the Arab lines. An afficial announcement revealed that the TWA plane, which was fired on Saturday night, has attacked with tracer bullets over the Arab village of Yehudia, near Jaffa. The attack caused the American airline to cancel all service in and to Palestine.

A prominent Arab political leader, who recently arrived in Jerusalem, has remaled that King Abdullah of Transjordan is making large-scale preparations for an inmaion of Palestine and the cocupation of the Rebron and Bearaheba areas immediately dirt the termination of the Mandate on May 15. The British-officered Arab Legion will be in the vanguard of the invading force, according to the Arab leader.

Arabs who sell food to Jews will be subject to the death penalty, according to t "deree" issued today by Arab guerrilla headquarters somewhere in northern Palestine. The "decree" states that thebs caught dealing with Jews will be tried in special military courts and if found guilty will be summarily executed.

SH ACTIONS COMMITTEE ISSUES ORDER RESTRICTING SERVICES IN PRAGUE SYNAGOGUE

FRAGUE, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- The Jewish Actions Committee which has been formed to practically control the activities of the Prague Jewish Community and of the oli of Jewish Communities in Bohemia-Moravia, today ordered the Orthodox High gogue here to restrict its religious services to one-hour periods in the morning evening, respectively. The synagogue is to remain closed for the remainder of day, the order stated.

Meanwhile, dissatisfaction with the composition of the Actions Committee was resed here at a meeting of the executive board of the Council of Jevish Communi-, Charging that neither Zionists nor provincial Jevish communities can be satisfy with the present make-up of the Actions Committee, Judge S. Lanaky, Rashcmer air leader, pointed out that the only Zionist member on the Committee did not have right to vote.

The discussion was precipitated following an announcement by Mrs. Laura Simkochairman of the Jewish Actions Committee, of the ouster of Dr. Hamus Rezek, secregeneral of the Frague Jewish Community and assistant chief rabbi of Frague, who teld as a chaplain with the Czechoslovak Army in Falestine, from his posts on the los of both the Commoil of Jewish Communities and the Frague Jewish Community.

Dr. Alexander Knapp, secretary-general of the Actions Committee, told the meetthat the discussion of the Committee's opposition was not the business of the rd, since the Actions Committee was a "revolutionary body elected in a revolutionmanner."

Knapp said that the Zioniste were not cmitted intentionally from membership on Committee. After several board members urged the Committee to reconsider its decima casabi Rezek, they were informed that the decision could not be changed. The mittee assured the meeting, however, that the rights of religious Jews would be ly respected and that there would be no interference in religious affairs.

A black flag has been raised over the Jevish "Town Hall" here in memory of Masaryk, long considered a friend of the Jevish people and of Palestine. At a sting of the Commoil of Jevish Communities, vice-chairman Frantisek Fuchs paid libre to the memory of the late Foreign Minister. Many Jevs attended the burial rices, while an official delegation of 20 participated in the official ceremonies.

LISE COURTS IMPOSE. DEATH SENTENCES ON UKRAINIAN, POLE FOR WARTIME MURDERS OF JEWS

WARSAW, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- The Wroclaw district court today sentenced Sylster Krzanowski, a Ukrainian member of the Gestapo charged with participating in a 19th pogrom against the Jews of Schodnica, near Borislav, to die by hanging. te defendant served in the Gestapo from 19th to 19th and was active in the prolatit Ukrainian renegade movement.

The court in Radom today imposed a sentence of death on Stahislav Wiktoroict, a Pole, for the morder of four members of a Jewish family. The Pole allowed is Jews to remain hidden in his house after they succeeded in escaping from the trovice slave labor camp, exacting huge sums of money from them all the time they are hidden. Ten days before liberation, Wiktorowicz murdered the family and threw heir bodies into a deep well.

GROUP OF JEWISH ORPHANS IN BRITISH ZONE OF GERMANY TO LEAVE FOR PALESTINE MONDAY

RELSEN, Germany, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- A special transport of some 460 Jewish orns will leave here for Merseilles next Monday en route to Palestine, the Joint Disbution Committee, which arranged the transport, announced last night.

This is the last group of Jewish orphans left in the British zone of Gormany. er an agreement between the British and the Jewish Agency immigration priority is ng given to orphans and young children. Their certificates will be deducted from regular immigration quota.

ASSADOR GRANADOS SAYS ARAB TERRORISTS INFILTRATE PALESTINE WITH BRITISH CONSENT

MEM YORK, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- Dr. Jorge Garcia Granados, retiring Guatemalan asseador and chief delegate to the United Nations, charged today that Arab bands is been permitted to enter Palestine on the condition that they delay the opening their attacks upon the Palestine Jows until May 15th, the date when the British matte ends. "This," he added, "is invasion by consent--and the blame for it falls on the shoulders of the British."

The Guatemalan Ambassador issued his statement at a press conference and reption given in his honor at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel by the Zionist Organization of crica. Dr. Emanuel Neumann, ZOA president, presided and paid tribute to Dr. Granados.

Calling attention to the fact that he was a member of the U.N. Special Committee on Palestine and that he had signed the majority report, Dr. Granados denounced rest Britain's "policy of obstruction against the United Nations' decision to partific Palestine despite her specific promises."

The Guatemalan diplomat cited the answer of Sir Alexander Cadegan that Great ritain "as a good member of the United Nations would not obstruct partition." Dr. tanados also deplored the "lack of desire on the part of the United States and other premments to implement this United Nations' decision despite the firm position she ook in the fight for it and, third, the current trend of thought which suggests that eccuse there is now violence in Palestine, partition is impracticable and not the roper solution."

TERRIST LEADER IN U.S. NAMES TWO ERITORS RESPONSIBLE FOR LAST MONTH'S JURUSALEM BOMBING

NEW YORK, Mar. 16. (JTA) -- The names of two British Palestine police deserters charged with responsibility for the Ben Yehuda Street bombing in Jerusalem February 22, in which 54 Jews lost their lives, were today made public by "David Yardeni," self-styled head of the Stern Group in the United States. Speaking at a press conference, the Sternist leader said the two Britons were George Ross, 24, and George Anthony White, 21.

"Yardeni," who admitted that that was not his real name, said that Sternists who occupied a British police station discovered photos of British police desertors saong whom were Ross and White. He said that eyevitnesses "positively identified" the two as having perticipated in the bombing outrage.

He also stated that Arabs in Palestine were using Moslem houses of worship as suping posts and warned that the Sternists will not respect the sacredness of the mosques if snipers are found operating from them. "Yardeni" said he was a deputy commander in the Stern Group, and is working in the United States with the American Priends of the Fighters for the Freedom of Israel.
