#### G FOUR RESUME PALESTINE TALKS; SHERTOK PRESENTS PLAN FOR JEWISH GOVERNMENT TO U.N.

LAKE SUCCESS. Mar. 17. (JTA) -- The Big Four late tonight resumed their conlitations on the Palestine question in an effort to prepare final recommendations the Security Council session on Friday. (At the time the Bulletin went to press, information as to the results of tonight's consultations was available.)

Moshe Shertok, head of the Jewish Agency's political department. today resented to the U.N. Palestine Commission the plan for the establishment of a evish Provisional Council of Government agreed upon in Palestine by the Jewish gency and the Jewish National Council. He proposed that the Provisional Council e composed of 31 or 32 members, with a Cabinet of 13. He also renewed the Agency's rgent request that the Commission appeal to governments to supply arms to the evish militia.

COMMISSION DISCUSSES THE ESTABLISHMENT OF FROVISIONAL JEWISH GOVT. WITH SHERTOK

LAKE SUCCESS, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- The bogging down of the Big Powers consultas on Palestine did not prevent the U.N. Palestine Commission today from conferwith Moshe Shertok, Jewish Agency representative, on the establishment of a Jew-Provisional Council of Government by April 1. as provided by the partition sion of the General Assembly.

The Commission is undeterred by the feeling that the events of the past 24 s have weakened faith that the United Nations will be able to take any strong on of its own in Palestine. This feeling developed after France reneged last t from the position it took earlier that the present situation in Palestine contutes a threat to peace.

The American delegation at the United Nations today refused to either confirm meny a report that Warren Austin, head of the delegation, has similarly changed attitude on the subject of reporting to the Security Council that a threat to se exists in Palestine because of the armed invasion of Arabs from neighboring tries. Asked by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency for comment on this report, a kesman for the U.S. delegation replied: "No comment."

#### Arab Countries Say Truce Is Possible If Partition Is Not Enforced

Acting on the recommendation of the Big Powers, Dr. T.F. Tsiang, president of Security Council, today consulted with representatives of the Arab states on the ent to which they would be ready to help in efforts to achieve an Arab-Jewish truce Palestine. The six Arab delegations gave him an almost identical reply, expressing diness to cooperate in truce efforts providing the partition decision is not immented.

No reply has been received as yet from the Palestine Arab Higher Committee to Big Powers' call for a truce. Jewish Agency leaders in New York continued today ir consultations with members of the Agency executive in Jerusalem regarding a reto the Big Powers on the truce question.

A statement released today by the Jewish Agency takes issue with the declaran made yesterday at the Security Council by Syria's delegate Faris el Khouri that Arab states have not intervened in the Palestine fighting. Emphasizing that this claration "does not square with the facts," the Agency charged that six Arab regiats which have taken up positions in Palestine are under the command of three ofters from Syria and three from Iraq. "There is documentary evidence that recruiting es on openly and publicly in Syria, officially organized by the Syrian Ministry of fense," the Agency statement said.

The Jewish Agency also ridiculed the address of the Lebanese delegate yestery at the Security Council in which he again brought forward his proposal for estabshing Palestine as a federal state with guaranteed rights for minorities. "Developmts in Lebanon discredit its spokesman," the Jevish Agency statement declared. "As all other Arab countries, Joss in Lebanon are now the victims of open persecution." NEWS

## ARABS APPROACHED IN JERUSALEM FOR TRUCE NEGOTIATIONS; AGENCY CLARIFIES ITS STAND

JERUSALEM, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- Acting on the armistice call issued by the Big s, Richard Graves, British chairman of the municipality of Jerusalem, today took nitiative and approached leaders of Jewish and Arab Institutions with a view toinducing them to agree to a truce.

Commenting on this move, a spokesman for the Jewish Agency said: "The Agency sedy, nay, eager, to agree to a truce for any length of time on conditions which is discussed. However, it will not accept a truce which will rely solely on Arabiess and will in the meantime leave the Jews in Jerusalem, or in any other part accountry, unprotected."

The Jewish Agency inquiry committee which has been investigating the circumces surrounding the explosion Feb. 22 on Ben Yehuda Street here--which caused the h of 56 Jews--today issued a ten-point report attributing the explosion directly ritons.

The report establishes that the armored car which was blown up was a police and that the trucks used in the blast were military vehicles. The cetting off of osives in one or more of these trucks, the report said, caused the casualties.

The Jewish Agency inquiry committee also ascertained that the persons who seen in the trucks end in the police car were British; that there is no evidence tarabs were occupants of the vehicles; that it was possible for the police to went the car from entering the area before the blast and it was also possible for a to prevent the escape of the terrorists from Jorusalem after the explosion.

#### 19 Arabs Killed, Many Wounded in Explosion; Four-Hour Battle Near Nazareth

Nineteen Arabs, believed to be Syrians, were killed and 36 wounded when an b convoy, trying to break through a Jewish road block near Kiriyath Motzkin, was red on by a Hagansh force. An Arab truck in the convoy apparently filled with exsives, blew up, resulting in the casualties. The block dug a crater 40 feet deep. allitary truck which arrived from the opposite direction was hurled over by the lat. More than 30 Jews were reported injured and one killed.

A four-hour battle between Arabs and Jews took place today in the Nazareth e, when a large unit of Arabs attacked Jewish settlers in the neighborhood of th Keshet. The settlement had been surrounded by about 300 Arabs until Jewish inforcements arrived and engaged the guerrillas. Casualties among the Arabs are lieved to be high.

Arabs today attacked Jevish convoys on the way to the Hadassah Hospital. ter midnight, Haganah units penetrated the Arab village Castel, from which an Arab and conducted attacks on Jevish convoys between Jerusalem and Tel Aviv. They amashthe inner defenses of the village, demolished the band's headquarters and killed breal of the terrorists.

Fifty-four Jews, including women, were released today from the Athlit detenion camp, where several of the women had been confined for four years.

Dr. Fritz Bernstein, head of the Jewish Agency's Department of Trade and Inustry, told a press conference in Tel Aviv last night that the Agency is speeding up lans to create a monetary system for the Jewish state that would be based on the excitent dollar. Dr. Bernstein said that Soviet Russia is ready to establish trade escitations with the Jews of Palestine. He also reported that a recent statistical wrey disclosed that not only was there no economic crisis in Jewish Palestine, but here was actually a shortage of manyower:

# IN EVADES ANSWER ON WHETHER ARAB INFILTRATION CONSTITUTES THREAT TO PEACE

LONDON, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- The British Government today evaded answering the tion as to whether the infiltration of Arab terrorists from neighboring countries Palestine constitutes a threat to peace.

The question was asked in the House of Commons by a member of Parliament. ead of giving a direct reply, Colonial Secretary Arthur Creech-Jones said that British Government made representations to the governments of Syria, Lebanon and adordan when the incursions took place. All possible steps, he told Parliament, taken by the authorities in Palestine to prevent such incursions, but added that is not always possible to control the Palestine frontiers because of their geometrical set-up.

The Manchester Guardian, long a champion of the Zionist cause, today urged Jews to reconsider their position on Palestine since, it said, it is generally adted that the present form of partition for Palestine is unworkable.

"If the Jews put the lives of the Jovish men and women of Palestine and one above the symbol of a state or the letter of the General Assembly's resolution, y should be prepared to make concessions," the newspaper said. It suggested that Jews might give up the Hegev. "No one doubts the courage or ability of the Jews defend themselves in Palestine, but even victory might be bought at too high a cost Jewish lives and prosperity," the cditorial declared.

The first contingent of families of Pritish officials in Palestine evacuated in the country arrived here today. Most of them are families of British policemen Palestine. The group told newsmen that the fighting in Palestine was a matter for 9 Jews and Arabs to settle among themselves. Most of them said they would be will-g to return, adding that "there is no place like Palestine."

# S. COVI. IS GIVING "AID AND COMPORT" TO ARABS, LEHMAN CHARGES IN WASHINGTON ADDRESS

WASHINGTON, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- Charging that American policy on Palestine is ving "aid and comfort to the Arabs," former Governor Herbert H. Lehman, speaking at s formal lawnching here of the Washington drive on behalf of the nationwide 50,000,000 United Jewish Appeal campaign, tonight demanded that the United States captly lift its embargo on arms for Palestine.

At the same time, Gov. Lehman called upon the U.N. Security Council to esablish and send to Palestine an international police force "to prevent breach of the sace and nullification of its own decision," and urged the Council to invoke "other assures for the maintenance of peace and security."

Stressing that the Arabs "can without difficulty get all the arms they need" rea countries adjacent to Falestine, Leiman called upon the U.S. Government "to remain the effects of its embargo and to see that we do not give aid and comfort to gressors who constitute a threat not only to peace in Falestine but to peace everywhere,"

## MERICAN COMPANY WILL NOT LAY PIPELINE IN PALESTINE EVEN THOUGH IT HAS RIGHT OF WAY

WASHINGTON, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- The Trans-Arabian Pipeline Company, affiliated with the Arabian-American Oil Company, will not try to put a pipeline through Palestime at the present time, even though the company has a right of way, James T. Duce told the Senate Small Business Committee today.

Duce, who is vice-president of Arabian-American, made this statement in reply to a question whether the company would use Palestine as an alternative if Syria refused to ratify a pending agreement to grant his company permission to go through.

## DETAINED IN KENYA BEGIN 24-HOUR HUNGER STRIKE PROTESTING REPATRIATION DELAY

LONDON, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- The approximately 300 Jews detained in the Gilgil emment camp in Kenya have begun a 24-hour hungor strike, according to a cable n the detainess received here today by the Assirei Zion committee. The message at the Jews are protesting the delay in their repatriation to Pelestine.

Meanwhile, Viscount Samuel and MP's Sidney Silverman and Elwyn Jones have ormed the committee they are making representations to the Colonial Office on bef of the imprisoned Jews. It was simultaneously reported that the International Cross will intercede with the Colonial Office on behalf of the Kenya detainees, lowing a request by the Assirei Zion committee.

(From Jerusalem it was reported that the "Jewish war prisoners" whom the tien are planning to take with them when they evacuate Palestine will include a up of recently-returned detainees from Kenya. The report was broadcast by the gun radio and warned that British officials responsible for the plan will "pay their lives" if it is carried out.)

#### -ZIONIST GROUP IN BRITAIN OBJECTS TO ZIONIST BEING PRESIDENT OF BOARD OF DEPUTIES

LONDON, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- Acting on behalf of a group of non-Zionists, rille Laski, former president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews, today subted a resolution to the board declaring it undesirable, under the present circumances, that the president of the board should also be a member of the executive the Jewish Agency.

"The continuation of this situation," the resolution said, "is fraught with mger to the Anglo-Jewish community." Prof. Selig Brodetsky, the present president the board, is a member of the Jewish Agency executive.

Zionist circles, commenting on the resolution, said: "Prof. Brodetsky's setige is so high in the community that only a small section will follow the lead those who, if they pursue their course, will commit an act of irresponsibility wards the wider interests of Anglo-Jewry and the cause of Zion."

#### LISH COVY. WILL FINANCE CHAIR IN JEMISH HISTORY AT HEBREW UNIVERSITY IN JERUSALEM

WARSAW, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- The Polish Government will finance the establishment of a chair in the history of Polish Jewry at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, twas amnounced here today. At the same time it was made known that, with the co-peration of the Ministry of Culture, the Jewish Central Committee assembled about 0,000 scholarly volumes, chiefly of religious content, for shirment to the Hebrew miversity.

Approximately 28,000,000 zlotys have been collected by local Jewish communities in Poland for Haganah, with the quota set at 70,000,000 zlotys. The funds were alsed chiefly at mass meetings held in all parts of the country. The "Polish-Palesinian Friendship Society," in which several ministers, deputies, university processors and writers are members, has also been active in behalf of the Haganah ampaign.

# SUDAREST COMMANDANT RESPONSIBLE FOR DEATH OF THOUSANDS OF HUNGARIAN JEWS ARRESTED

BUDAPER, Man. I. (FIR).—Ture Nidossy Szalasi, former commandant in Budapest during the pro-Nazi egime, who was responsible for the death of thousands of Hungarian Jews during the war, was arrested today in a provincial town. Szalasi issued the deportation orders which sent thousands of Jews in Hungary to their death in the Nazi extendination comps in Poland.

# A URGES JEWISH PARTENTS IN ARGENTINA TO REMOVE CHILDREN FROM CATHOLIC INSTITUTIONS

BUENOS AIRES, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- Jewish parents in Argentina were urged today take whatever steps may be necessary to remove their children from Catholic bools. The call was issued by the DATA, central representative body of Argentine ry, which urged that Jewish children in Argentina be encolled in Jewish education-institutions.

Meanwhile, it was reported here from Santiago, Chile, that Roberto Bunge, the Commissioner to Combat Speculation, has charged that "the refugees, mostly we, have abused the hospitality of Chile," and have abandoned positions in the county's economy to which they were originally assigned. A number of Jewish immigrants this entered the country as agricultural workers.

Bunge issued a statement asserting that the refugees are working as "commernl intermediaries" and competing for the business of established firms. The comissioner also charged that the refugees were leasing apartments at exorbitant prices, reting a situation of "real strangulation." However, the report from Santiago bints out that the economic crisis in Chile is a result of the government's "irsponsible policy of over-industrialization."

#### MENT OF U.S. REVISIONISTS CONDERNS PARTITION DECISION; JEWISH AGENCY POLICIES HIT

NEW YORK, Mer. 17. (JTA) -- Resolutions strongly condemning the U.N. General ssembly partition resolution and the policies of the Jevish Agency were adopted at convention of the United Zionists-Revisionists of America which concluded here body.

The convention also adopted a resolution lauding the Irgun Zvai Leumi for its historic struggle for Jewish statehood." Dr. Joseph Schechtman was elected resident of the organization, after it was announced earlier that Meir Grossman had esigned from the post.

Discussions at the parley centered around the need for more "aggressive and independent political action in the international field." Dr. B. Netanyahu, executive director of the organization, B. Epstein and Dr. Harry Levi were elected to repease the group at the forthcoming world meeting of the Revisionist Party.

#### ASHOMER HATZAIR CONFERENCE URGES U.S. JEWRY TO CONTRIBUTE MANPOWER TO JEWISH STATE

NEW YORK, Mar. 17. (JTA) -- A call to American Jewry to "give its manpower and its political assistance, in addition to financial support," to the Jewish community in Palestine in order to help in the establishment of the Jewish state was raise at the first annual conference of the Progressive Zionist League-Hashomer Hatlair which concluded here last night.

Delegates from all sections of the United States and Cenada attended the parley which lasted three days. The gathering adopted resolutions expressing solidarity with the Jews of Palestine and emphasizing that the future of Palestine depends on the creation of Jewish-Arab cooperation in the economic, social and political fields.
