ALESTINE HIGH COMMISSIONER ISSUES TRUCE CALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH U.N. RESOLUTION

JERUSALEM. April 18. (JTA) -- Acting in accordance with a resolution adopta by the U.N. Security Council in the early hours of Saturday morning urging the isor of the armistice. High Commissioner Sir Alan G. Cunningham today issued a new ruce call.

He appealed to "all groups and individuals desirous of peace to use their offluence to the utmost to secure acceptance of the resolution's provisions." Preiously, the High Commissioner made one or two appeals for peace on his own authority. ut made no attempt to support them by concrete action.

ECURITY COUNCIL TRUCE RESOLUTION ADOPTED; JEWS HIT BRITAIN AS SUPERVISOR OF TERMS

LAKE SUCCESS, April 18. (JTA) -- The General Assembly will resume its pecial session on Palestine tomorrow morning following adoption during the week-end f a Security Council resolution calling on both the Jews and Arabs in Palestine to ccept a truce under supervision of the British until May 15.

The Council did not decide, as originally planned, to appoint a U.N. commision to supervise the carrying out of the truce. Moshe Shertok, speaking in behalf of the Jewish Agency, declared that if the British were left in charge of supervising the armistice it would be regarded by the Jaws "as if no arrangement whatever had een made to insure the effective implementation and observance of the truce proviions."

The Agency, meanwhile, this week-end revealed charges it had submitted to the U.N. that "murderous attacks by heavily-armed military formations against Jewish rillagers and Jewish transport must be placed at the door of the Arab Legion." The statement was contained in a letter to the U.N. Palestine Commission in reply to a british Covernment declaration that investigations of Legion-Jewish exchanges of fire established that in no instance did the Arabs fire first.

"The gravity of the situation with reference to the Arab Legion will be realized in the light of repeated statements in the Arab press that upon the termination of the British Mandate, the Legion will be available for action against the Jow-ish Community in Palestine," the Agency statement said. "The matter is greatly aggravated by the fact that, according to authentic information received from Palestine, the British authorities, in the process of evacuation, are turning over to the Arab Legion large quantities of military stores, ammunition and equipment for the latter's own use." the statement emphasized.

The Agency said the British had, within the past few weeks, turned over to the Arab Legion 60 armored cars, 8,000 morter bombs, 100,000 rounds of ammunition and nearly 1,000,000 gallons of gasoline. "Stocks now held by the Arab Legion are abnormally high and there is also evidence that equipment of the disbanded Transjordan Frontier Force is being transferred to the Legion," the Agency declared.

GANAH REPULSES TWO ATTACKS IN JERUSALMA AREA: POALE MIZRACHI SETTLEMENT SAFE

JERUSALEM, April 18. (JTA) -- Jewish forces in the Jerusalem area today pulsed two major Arab attacks and in at least one instance sent the guerrilla roes reeling back.

The major Arab defeat came at the Foale Mizrachi settlement of Neve Yaacob, we miles north of Jerusalem. The raid, led by Emil Ghoury, member of the Palestine B Higher Committee, Murti henchman and newly-appointed military commander of the rusalem Arab forces, resulted in a number of casualties for the Arab forces in-uding the death of one Briton and several Arabs who led the attack in a captured wish armored car.

The armored car opened the attack on the settlement. With a few well-placed rtar shells the Jews blew up and burned the vehicle, killing four of its crew and unding the others. Then for several hours the Arabs kept charging the defense ruseter of the colony. Finally, Ghoury ordered the Arabs to retreat from the field.

The second attack took place simultaneously on the approaches to Hadassah spital atop Mt. Scopus and the nearby Jewish quarters of Shimon Hazadik and Beth read. The Arabs used mortars and machine guns, but feiled to penetrate Eagenah fenses. Casualty figures for this action are not yet known. Iast week the road the hospital was the scene of a massacre of 54 Jews, mostly medical personnel, by rebs who ambushed an eleven-car convoy.

(At Lake Success today the Jewish Agency released the text of a cable which as sent to Secretary General Trygve Lie and Earel Lieicky, chairman, of the U.N. lostine Commission by Chaim Salomon, president of the Jewish Community Council in brusalem, charging that British military personnel failed to intervene when Arabs tacked Jewish doctors and nurses in a convoy to the Hadassah Hospital and that the ritish prevented Haganah forces from coming to their rescue. The protect was outpled with an appeal for action to prevent repetition of British sabotage of Jewish Blf-defense.)

The latest casualty lists released by the government revealed today that aree British soldiers were killed and five wounded yesterday when the Irgun held up British ammunition train near Eaders. The Irgun claimed that the munitions were stined for the Arabs. Three Jews were reported killed in the battle. Thirty tons ammunition were carried off by the attackers, estimated to number over 150.

The largest food convoy--300 three and five-ton trucks--to reach Jerusalem on Tel Aviv since the recent Arab attempt to cut the vital supply highway entered his city yesterday. The government information office was evacuated following a elephone warning that the building was about to be blown up. However, no explosives are found.

ROF. EINSTEIN AND RARBI BARCK SUPPORT MACNES STATEMENT ON PALESTINE TRUSTEESHIP

NEW YORK, April 18. The Magnes statement urgad acceptance of a temporary trusteeship or Palestine.

JEWISH REFUGEE CHILDREN BAPTIZED IN BRITAIN, BOARD OF DEPUTIES MEETING HEARS

LONDON, April 18. (JTA) -- Because British Jevs did not respond fully to seals for accepting Jevish refugee chilèren into their homes at least 129 Jevish hans of some 9,300 who found haven in England since 1933 have been baptized, it reported here today at a meeting of the Board of Doputies of Eritish Jevs.

The children were placed in non-Jewish homes and were baptized by their ster parents. As of July of this year a new legal guardian, a rabbi, will be soluted for the Jewish refugee children.

The Board also adopted a resolution, recommended by the executive committee, nouncing the activities of the Rebrew Legion, a force being organized in Britain 1 the U.S. to fight for the Jews in Palestine. The resolution condemned these tivities of the Legion which "give the false impression that the Jews of this antry are anything but loyal citizens."

Another resolution expressed full support of the struggle of Palestins ry in behalf of a Jewish state and expressed "amazement" at the American reversal magnesian partition to international trusteeship. The Palestine Government was ged to withdraw the Arab Legion and the Transjordan Frontier Force from Palestine to open a port for Jewish immigration.

It was announced that Prof. Selig Bredetsky, president of the Board, has ted Prime Minister Clement R. Attlee to change his decision concerning a number suggestions Brodetsky recently made toward the end that when the British administion ends in Pelestine the Jeys will be in a vesition to defend themselves.

WISH PARTISAN HERCES KILLED BY NAZIS IN POLAND REBURIED WITH RELIGIOUS SERVICES

WARSAW, April 18. (JTA) -- Eighteen Jews who took part in the Warsaw Chetto wolt and managed to escape the fate of most of the Chetto inhabitents by fleeing gough underground sewers with the assistance of the Polish resistance movement were ried today in the Jewish cemetery here on the eve of the unveiling of the Chetto morial tomorrow, commemorating the fifth anniversary of the revolt.

The 18 Jews fought as partisans after their escape and were later killed by zis in a forest near Wyszkov. Their bodies were exhumed from a mass grave and ried in the traditional Jewish manner today. Representatives of the Polish rabmate, the Central Jewish Committee, partisan groups and delegations from foreign untries here to attend the unveiling coremonies took part in the burial ritual.

REE-POINT PROGRAM FOR CIVIL RIGHTS OUTLINED AT RABBINICAL CONFERENCE

ST. LOUIS, April . (JTA) -- A three-point program for Jewish congregations participate actively in the movement to implement and extend civil rights was outsed here at the opening session of a two-day meeting of the Commission on Justice 1 Peace of the Central Conference of American Rabbis by Rabbi Roland B. Gittelsohn, member of the President's Civil Rights Commission.

Speaking at the Commission's Institute on Judaism and Civil Rights, Rabbi tleschin urged that the pulpit relate civil liberties to the basic religious princiss and point out violations of them. Secondly, he suggested "the formation in my congregation of an action committee, consisting of laymen who will translate pulpit exhortations for civil liberties into specific action." Finally, he coasted "the organization of joint inter-faith civil rights committees for synauss and churches to serve as the voice of prophetic religion, Judaism and Christity together."

NEW YORK, April 18. (JTA) -- The Federation of Jewish Philanthropies began rive here over the week-end to contact 50,000 employers in business, industry and fessions in the metropolitan area to find employment for middle aged and older sons.

Representatives of the Federation Employment Service, an affiliate of the .P., said it would ask local industrialists and business men to study their anizations to determine whether jobs could be made available to persons over 45 are of age. They will urge employers to try and find new positions within their anizations for older persons who cannot work at their original tasks, rather than miss them.

.C. SPENT \$17,500,000 FOR RELIEF, RECONSTRUCTION OF POLISH JEWRY SINCE END OF WAR

NEW YORK, April 18. (JTA) -- More than \$17,500,000 has been spent by the nt Distribution Committee since V-E Day for relief, reconstruction and resettle-to of the estimated 100,000 Jewish survivors in Poland, according to a report issued the United Jewish Appeal, on the eve of the fifth anniversary of the Warsaw ghethorising which is being observed temorrow.

At the beginning of 1947, nearly 65,000 Polish Jews depended upon the Joint stribution Committee for all types of relief aid. Today, according to J.D.C. there, only one-third of the country's Jews, consisting of the sick, invalids, the sa and other persons unehic to work, are primarily dependent upon the agency's sistance program. Among them are 16,000 children, many of whom receive care in the 100 J.D.C. -supported house, J.D.C. also maintains 35 dispensaries, hospitals, ternity centers and manatoria in Poland.
