IN. APPOINTS GROUP TO FORMULATE PLANS FOR PROVISIONAL REGIME TO GOVERN PALESTINE

LAKE SUCCESS, May 4. (JTA) -- The United Nations today turned over to a 12amber sub-committee the task of trying to formulate plans for a provisional regime to govern Palestine when the British Mandate ends.

This action, proposed in an amendment submitted by Dr. Guillermo Belt of Cuba, was approved by a vote of 33-7, with 13 nations abstaining. The Slavic bloc and Uruguay voted against. Most other pro-partition countries abstained.

The sub-committee will consist of delegates from Argentina, Belgium, Canada, China, Cuba, Guatemala, France, India, Norway, Foland, Soviet Union, and United States. It is therefore considered as essentially predisposed against partition, since only three of its 12 members -- Russia, Guatemala and Poland -- are firmly committed to uphold the Assembly decision of last November 29.

Three possible courses lie before the sub-committee, which is scheduled to start work tomorrow. They are U.N. trusteeship, the British proposal to establish a "neutral" custodian administration that would take ever assets and essential sertices of the outgoing Palestins Government and partition.

The new body is also directed to take into account which of the alternatives "will commend itself to the Arab and Jewish communities," whether the proposal 's "overable and can be implemented, and what its approximate cost will be. No time limit was set for the sub-committee's report back to the Political Committee. The sub-committee is authorized to consult representatives of the U.N. Palestine Commission, the Mandatory Power, the Arab Higher Committee, the Jewish Agency as well as secretariat and other experts on Palestine.

The Political Committee failed to accept a challenge by Andrei Gromyko to expel Arab invaders from Palestine if the United Nations seriously intended to bring peace and pave the way for a lasting settlement. Gromyko attacked the British sugsestion advanced yesterday by Colonial Secretary Arthur Creech-Jones. The British plan, he declared, is a veiled attempt to sidetrack partition.

King Abdullah of Transjordan today warned the United Nations that events in Palestine will reach a "pinnacle of horror" after May 15. In a telegram received here by Secretary-General Trygve Lie, the King restated his readiness to "give the Jew in Palestine full Arab nationality in a unitary state sharing all that we share while yet enjoying a special administration in particular areas." He deplored useless billing in Palestine and declared that he was persuaded the Jewish community as a whole vishes to live in amity with the Arabs.

RABS RENEW ATTACK ON KFAR ETZION; JEWS REPULSE NEW ARAB INVASION FROM SYRIA

JERUSALEM, May 4. (JTA) -- A strong force of Arabs today launched a renewed tack on Kfar Etzion, strongest of a chain of colonies in the Hebron Hills, south of crusalem. The force, composed chiefly of frab Legionnaires, reinforced by a company f Iraqi troops and local Arab guerrillas, opened fire at dawn. Late reports stated hat the Jews have repulsed the Arabs, despite the fact that the raiders were supported y armored cars, field guns and heavy machine guns.

Meanwhile, a government broadcast stated that a new invasion attack by foreign rabs on Jevish settlements in Upper Gelilee has been boaten off by the Jevs. A agamah report said that a Lebanese artillery unit was seen crossing the Palestine frontier in the direction of Ramath-Naphtall, near the Syrian border.

(British War Minister Emanuel Shinwell today told Commons that the Haganah and Irgun are believed to possess about 100 armored cars, mostly vehicles to which armor plate was recently attached, a very small number of track vehicles such as Bren gun carriers and a number of half-tracks. The gun carriers have been stolen from the British, Shinwell said, but the origin of the half-tracks is not yet known.)

Although the cease fire agreement in the Katamon quarter of Jerusalem expired at 4 P.M., quiet reigned in the area pending further negotiations for a renewal or extension of the truce. It is believed that the U.N. Consular Truce Commission is active in the latest attempts to maintain the peace.

Plan to Convert Jerusalem into Red Cross Security Zone

International Red Cross representative Jacques de Reynier told a press conference that the Red Cross has been contacted by various non-political, non-military organizations who are interested in converting the entire city into "a security zone mater the Red Cross." Under such a set-up, he asserted, non-combattents would be admitted to the city which would be supplied with food and water by the Red Cross.

Northwest of the city two Jevish settlements, Atarot and Neve Yacob, were shelled last night by Arab artillery in positions in the Judean Hills. The Jevs reported that some 30 shells fell on the settlements. The Haganah raided a group of buildings near the Hebrew University from which snipers were active yesterday.

The Sternists charged that the recall of British troops to Palestine means the end of all evacuation plans, and warned that they will strike at the British. There will never be peace and order with the British in Palestine," the underground edded.

A Jewish Agency sp desman in Tel Aviv revealed that the Agency has established a custodian for Arab property. He said the move was necessitated by the fact that Arab evacues abandomed a good deal of property behind when they filed the scenes of fighting in various parts of the country. He also revealed that the Agency has gratted a safe conduct to an Egyptian convoy which will evacuate Egyptian citizens from Jerusalem and return them to their native land.

The "chadow" government of the Jevish State today began a seried of closed asstings to decide on the form for proclaiming the Jevish Republic May 15. Other important items under discussion, as the end of the British mandate draws near, are a name for the Jevish State, the selection of the capital, deciding whether the legislature should have one or two houses and the formation of a militia to replace the Esgansh.

MAN CONFERS WITH LEHMAN ON PALESTINE; LIMITED ARAB-JEWISH TRUCK URGED BY LEHMAN

WASHINGTON, May 4. (JTA) -- Gov. Herbert H. Lebman today discussed the Palesse question with President Truman at the President's request. He later refused to close the results of the conversation and denied that he was considering taking position that would make him advisor to the President on Palestine.

President Truman is deeply interested and concerned about the situation in hestine, he told reporters after leaving the White House. Asked for his own views, been said that he considers the Palestine situation "very unfortunate" and that he fill believes in partition with an international force to maintain peace. He also lieves that steps must be taken by the U.N. to set up a trusteeship for the entire as of Jeruselem.

"Since time is so short," he stated, "I would like to see a limited truce of both three or four months, under which there would be no final determination with red to partition or trusteeship, and which would provide for substantial immigration had land purchase, and permitting free passage throughout Palestine for all persons passed in peaceful pursuits." He thought immigration should be set at approximately ,000 persons monthly.

EVIN CALLS FOR SWIFT ESTABLISHMENT OF MACHINERY TO BRING JEWS AND ARABS TOGETHER

LONDON, May 4. (JTA) -- Foreign Minister Ernest Bevin today told Parliament hat "there is still time for mcderation and reason to win Palestine, but in a few ags it may be too late." The vital requirement now, he said, is that shooting cease as come machinery be established of which the Jews and the Arabs could make use.

Bevin emphasized that the British Government has used all of its influence to prevent the invasion of Pelestine by Arab countries. The British authorities also wanted the Jews and Arabs that until May 15, no aggression would be telerated in Palestine.

The Foreign Minister reiterated that Britain does not intend to retain the Mandate after May 15 and will not use any of its resources after that date for the Purpose of enforcing any settlement against the vishes of either the Jews or the Arabs. He said that reports of Arab invasion of Falestino during the last few days have not been confirmed by British military advisors.

Parliamentary circles expressed surprise that Bevin failed to mention the reinforcements sent to Palestine from Cyprus and Malta this week. Opposition speakers stressed that the dispatch of reinforcements caused great confusion as to what the swemment's Palestine policy is now. They disagreed with Bevin's view that the British Covernment has made real attempts to bring peace to Palestine.

U.S. HRITAIN ACREED TO FORCE JEWS O . OF GALILEE AND NEGEV. JEWISH LEADER CHARGES

IONDON, May 4. (JTA) -- The charge that the United States and Britain have reached a secret agreement to force the Palestine Jews out of Galilee and the Negev and confine them in a small coastal "ghetto" strip was made here today by S.Z. Shragai, where of the Jewish Agency executive, who told a meeting of Mizrachi leborites that this agreement was "behind" the American trusteeship plan.

Shragai asserted that the British were calling in foreign Arabs to fight in latestine because the local population would not war upon the Jews and that the Palestine Arabs will "take Bevin to task" for attempting to interfere with progress in the Middle Rast. He also said that the Palestine Jews will not be deceived by the trusteeship plan and would no longer place their faith in any of the great powers.

REPOPEAN POLICE FORCES ASKED TO JOIN IN SEARCH FOR FARRAN BOMB PERPETRATOR

LONDON, May 4. (JTA) -- The International Police Commission in Paris was asked Scotland Yard today to have all police forces in Europe join in the search for the rean or persons responsible for mailing a parcel bomb to Capt. Roy Alexander Farran ich yesterday accidentally killed his brother, Rex, who opened the package. Meanille, Capt. Farran has left his home at Wolverhampton for an unknown destination.

Simultaneously, Scotland Yard instituted one of the greatest manhunts in recent ritish police history in an effort to find "Jewish terrorists" in Britain, who they blieve may be responsible for the mailing of the bomb. Capt. Farran was acquitted at year of charges of killing an 18-year-old Palestinian Jew. Alexander Rubovitz. In Stern Group, which claimed the murdered Palestinian youth as a member of the organization, vowed to avenge his death at the time Farran was freed. One report said the error word for revenge was found in the parcel's markings.

Scotland Yard announced, meanwhile, that it is on the track of an Arab band ormised in this country for the purpose of smuggling arms into Palestine via Lebanon. Instans officials over the week-end seized two packages containing a large sum of mall-denomination currency addressed to persons resident in Britain, presumably for the nament of arms.

U.N. COMMITTEE COMPLETES DISCUSSION ON HUMAN RIGHTS; SOVIET DELEGATE DISSATISFIED

LAKE SUCCESS, May 4. (JTA) -- General discussion on the draft declaration on hman rights was completed today by the drafting committee of the U.N. Commission on hman Rights to be followed up tomorrow with a review of the draft covenant which is to be submitted, together with the declaration, for approval to the U.N. Economic and Social Council.

Soviet delegate A.P. Pavlov stated that his delegation considers the draft declaration in its present form as unsatisfactory. The document, he said, falls estiffy three basic requirements considered essential by his delegation: first, adequate safeguards of human rights; second, guarantees of implementation; third, clear definition of the obligations of the individual to his state. Furthermore, he said, the document fails to condemn discrimination, or incitement to discrimination, for reasons of sex, race, nationality or religion.

Mrs. Eleanor Rocsevelt, speaking for the U.S. delegation, said that the United States was anxious, as a starting point, to produce a short and concise document which would appeal more to the people. The declaration, she added, should contain a statement of the standards for which they are striving. But since the declaration carries no legal weight, the spelling out of the legal obligations, she declared, should be done in the covenant. The basic attitude to be taken in regard to the covenant is to agree on provisions having the widest acceptance, although not necessarily covering all rights, she argued.

ARABS EXPELLED FROM JEWISH MEETING IN PARIS AFTER ONE ATTEMPTS TO STRANGLE SPEAKER

PARIS, May 4. (JTA) -- Some 30 Arabs were expelled from a hall here last night after one of them attempted to strangle a Jevish speaker at a meeting sponsored by the French League for a Free Palestine. The police ejected all the Arabs who had intended the Jevish meeting, because they heckled the speakers and interfered with good order before the attack on the speaker took place.

164 JEMISE REFUGERS SAIL FROM SHANGHAI DE ROUTE TO U.S.; AIDED BY JDC, USRA

TICE DEPT SAYS SUFFEME COURT RESTRICTIVE COVENANT RULING APPLIES TO RELIGIOUS GROUPS

WASHINGTON, May 4. (JTA) -- The Department of Justice today interpreted yester's Supreme Court decision rendering court enforcement of restrictive covenants based

tioned only private real estate agreements which barred groups on the basis of

"It is the opinion of the Department of Justice that the rulings of the Sume Court are applicable with equal force to similar agreements based on creed," the partment said. "It would now seem certain that no state through its courts can superforce private agreements which are designed to do what the state itself prohibited from doing."

Leading Jewish Groups Laud High Court's Decision

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- The U.S. Supreme Court decision forbidding court inforcement of restrictive real estate covenants was hailed today in a joint state issued by Joseph M. Prosksuer, president of the American Jewish Committee, and such Grumet, chairman of the civil rights committee of the Anti-Defamation League of hat Birith. The statement by the two Jewish Leaders was released also on behalf fit the Jewish Lebor Committee and the Jewish War Veterans.

"The unanimous decision of the U.S. Supreme Court, forbidding enforcement by state or Federal courts of racially restrictive real estate agreements, is a milestone in the democratic effort to eliminate discrimination in the enjoyment of basic civil and political rights by all groups, regardless of race, color, religion or national origin," the statement said. "Restrictive covenants have been a major weapon in the segregation of racial and religious minorities," the statement continued. "Such segregation inevitably is a threat to democracy. For this reason, the American Javish Committee, the Anti-Defemation League of B'nai B'rith, the Jevish War Veterans and the Jevish Labor Committee, on Dec. 1, 1947, filed a brief as 'friends of the Court' in the cases upon which the Supreme Court has just ruled."

The statement points out that while the Supreme Court decision does not void all discriminatory restrictive covenants, it does make it impossible for persons entering into such agreements to invoke the aid of the courts in enforcing them. "As such, it is another step in the recent series of Supreme Court decisions, state statutes, and Federal recommendations which reaffirm and strenghten the civil rights of every citizen, regardless of race, creed, color or national origin. These decisions and recommendations add impetus to the campaign of education which aims to eliminate prejudice and bigotry," it concluded.

FREEMAN ADMITS IN COURT HE SPENT \$100,000 FOR ANTI-ZIONIST NEWSPAPER ADVENTISEMENTS

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- Benjamin H. Freedman, founder of the League for Peace with Justice in Palestine, who is a principal witness in a libel suit action now taking place in Mid-Manhattan Magistrates Court, said today that although his parents were Jewish, his wife and children are Catholic and he attends church services regularly. He has not been able to be baptized, however, he said. He added that he has studied at length "under Jesuit Fathers."

Appearing today at the libel suit trial brought against the Non-Sectarian Anti-Mati League by Hellam Richardson, attorney for his group, Freedman admitted that he has spent \$100,000 in newspaper advertisements which espoused his groupe's arti-Zioniet views. He said, under cross-examination, that he had "frequently been in touch" with the representatives of various Arab states in this country during the less few years. Yesterday he confirmed that he had extended in a cable to Cairo "full encouragement" to the ex-Mutti of Jerusalem.

ENS WHO ENTERED MEXICO AS TOURISTS ARE GRANTED FULL IMMIGRANT STATUS

MEXICO CITY, May 4. (JTA) -- A group of Jewish tourists and visitors in Mexico as been granted full immigrent status with full rights of employment in the country, it was revealed here today following the publication of a special decree issued by president Miguel Aleman.

This is the second such Jevish group which has been "legalized" thanks to the efforts of the Jevish Committee for Legal Affairs, which was set up last year by the featual Jevish Committee and the JDC and HLRS offices here.

CANADIAN GOVERNMENT WEIGHING POSITION ON PALESTINE TRUSTEESHIP, MINISTER SAYS

OTTAWA, May 4, (JTA) -- The Canadian Government vill not adopt a final position on trusteeship for Palestine until it has had an opportunity to study the question of whether trusteeship will produce a "constructive solution" to the Palestine proles and whether it is an enforceable proposal, Minister for External Affairs Louis St. Laurent declared in Parliament today.

Criticism of Canada's earlier pro-partition policy was made by M.P. John T. Esclet, Conservative, who asserted that Canada had entered the Palestine controversy with too little experience and too much enthusiasm. He charged that Canada supported partition without inquiring as to the plan's chances for implementation.

MEARLY 100 PALESTINIANS. MOSTLY YOUNG STUDENTS. SAIL FROM U.S. TO JOIN HAGAWAH

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- A contingent of nearly 100 Palestinians, most of them young men, sailed today for Haifa aboard the S.S. Marine Carp to join the Haganth. Made up chiefly of students, the group is returning voluntarily to Palestine "to aid their embattled countrymen fight against the Arab aggressors," a statement ismed by Americans for Haganah said.

HADASSAH OPENS BLOOD DONOR STATIONS IN NEW YORK, PHILADELPHIA AND CHICAGO TODAY

NEW YORK, May 4. (JTA) -- Blood donor banks for Palestine will be opened by Eddssah in New York, Philadelphia and Chicago tomorrow. Similar blood banks will be established by the organization in Boston, Los Angeles and San Francisco shortly, it was announced here today.

MAJOR WEISER OF HEBREW LEGION REGISTERS WITH JUSTICE DEPARTMENT AS FOREIGN AGENT

WASHINGTON, May 4. (JTA) -- Major Samuel Weiser, founder of the Hebrew Legion of Britain and member of the Hebrew Committee of National Liberation, has registered with the Justice Department as a recruiting agent for service in Palestine under a regulation governing the activities of foreign agents, the Department announced yesterlay. Weiser said he was assisting recruiting for the "George Washington Legion for Rulestine."
